

# Modern Foreign Language Enrollments in Four-Year Accredited Colleges and Universities, Fall 1958 and Fall 1959\*

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This report, "Survey of Modern Foreign Language Enrollments in Colleges and Universities," is the fourth in a series of eight on aspects of foreign language teaching and learning within accredited institutions of higher learning in the United States. It presents foreign language enrollments for Fall 1958 and Fall 1959. It has been preceded by three reports: (1) "Foreign Language Entrance and Degree Requirements for the B.A. Degree in Accredited Colleges and Universities," published in *PMLA*, Vol. LXXV, No. 4, Part 2, September 1960; (2) "Certification Requirements for Modern Foreign Language Teachers in American Public Schools (1959-60)," available in preprints of *PMLA*, Vol. LXXVI, No. 2B, May 1961; and (3) "Modern Foreign Language Faculties in Colleges and Universities (1959-60)." It will be followed by four additional reports: "Teacher Education Curricula in the Modern Foreign Languages," "The Teaching of Modern Foreign Languages in Colleges and Universities," "Modern Foreign Language Enrollments in Colleges and Universities, Fall 1960," and "Survey of Modern Foreign Language Teaching in Junior Colleges, Fall 1959, Fall 1960." Information collected from these eight surveys will present in a comprehensive manner the status of modern foreign languages within the institutions of higher learning in the United States.

The present report shows that there were enrollment and per cent gains during the one-year interval from the fall of 1958 to the fall of 1959 in the five principal modern foreign languages taught in 1,039 four-year institutions of higher learning in the United States. The highest per cent of increase (56.5) was in Russian, which went from an enrollment of 16,290 in 1958 to 25,491 in 1959. Enrollment and per cent gains in the other four languages were as follows: French, from 157,730 to 179,756 (14.0%); German, from 107,900 to 121,855 (12.9%); Spanish, from 125,905 to 137,487 (9.2%); and Italian, from 9,566 to 9,975 (4.3%). However, in terms of actual modern foreign language enrollments in 1959, French led in per cent of the total with 37.1; Spanish was second with 28.5; German third with 25.2; Russian fourth with 5.2; and Italian fifth with 2.1.

The overall increase in modern foreign languages (including the five above) was 58,316 or 13.7 per cent, which is considerably larger than the total "degree-credit student" increase in the 1,039 colleges and universities covered in this report, which was 93,020 or 3.8 per cent.

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Section IV and Addendum A present enrollment data on unusual modern foreign languages taught in four-year colleges and universities. In approximately 60 of these languages the total enrollments increased 14.3 per cent, from 8,013 in 1958 to 9,156 in 1959. Addendum A gives the specific enrollment in each language. Highest enrollments in 1959 in this group of languages were in Modern Hebrew (3,123), Japanese (1,202), Chinese (891), Portuguese (754), and Arabic (441).

The conclusions to be drawn from this survey are on the whole encouraging: undergraduate, graduate and "special" enrollments in modern foreign languages have increased by 13.6%, 16.9%, and 15.0% respectively. The per cent of increase in graduate enrollments (16.9), however, represents a total enrollment increase of only 2,247. This raises a point of speculation, for presumably from these students will come a needed corps of future teachers. In the national interest this small number only approaches foreseen future needs. Ways by which to increase this number will be a matter of concern for the language profession.

A final point for national concern is that raised by the relatively small number of students in the fields of the neglected languages—even though there have been increases.

The Modern Language research staff extends sincere thanks to the registrars who furnished enrollment data for the 1,039 institutions of higher learning included in this report.

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**I. National Data:** Modern foreign language enrollments for 1959 in four-year accredited colleges and universities of the United States were 483,720. In 1958, they were 425,404. The increase of 58,316 is 13.7 per cent over the 1958 enrollments.

The total institutional enrollments in the 1,039 institutions of higher learning covered in this report were 2,462,360 in 1958 and 2,555,380 in 1959. The college population thus increased by 93,020 students, or 3.8 per cent. A comparison of this per cent (3.8) with the 13.7 per cent rise in modern foreign language enrollments shows that modern foreign languages had a considerably greater part in the American higher education curriculum in 1959 than in 1958.

Since some students take courses in more than

one foreign language or are enrolled in more than one course in a given language, one cannot determine exactly what per cent of *students* out of the total school population is taking modern foreign languages. The per cent of modern foreign language *enrollments* in 1958 was 17.3. In 1959, it was 18.9. This means either that proportionately more students are studying modern foreign languages or that students are taking more language courses; perhaps both.


The enrollment figures include undergraduate, graduate, and "special and unclassified" students. The increase in undergraduate enrollments in modern foreign languages between 1958 and 1959 was 54,903, or 13.6 per cent. Graduate enrollments increased 2,247, or 16.9 per cent.<sup>1</sup> The increase in "special and unclassified" enrollments was 1,166, or 15.0 per cent.

Note that, although numerically the greatest part of the increase in modern foreign language enrollments was due to the increase in undergraduate enrollments (which represents 94.1 per cent of the total numerical increase in modern foreign language enrollments), the much smaller rise in graduate enrollments (3.9 per cent of the total rise) represents a more rapid rate of growth, 16.9 per cent. This means that more modern foreign language students went on to graduate studies, or that graduate offerings were increased in 1959.

A comparison of graduate institutional enrollments with graduate enrollments in modern foreign languages is, however, less encouraging. The per cent of graduate enrollments in modern foreign languages was 4.5 in 1958 and 4.9 in 1959, so that, although a slightly greater proportion of graduate students were studying modern foreign languages in 1959, it is still true that less than 5 per cent of graduate students were enrolled in advanced modern foreign language courses.

The graduate student population in 1959 represented 12.5 per cent of the total institutional enrollment, whereas graduate enrollments in modern foreign languages were only 3.2 per cent of the total modern foreign language enrollment. In 1958, 12.1 per cent of the total college population was doing graduate work and 3.1 per cent of the enrollments were in modern foreign languages. A slight trend upward is apparent in both total and modern foreign language graduate enrollments, but the gap between them remained the same. The implication is that far fewer students of modern foreign languages take up graduate work in this

field than do students of some other subjects and consequently, that there may not be an adequate number of qualified modern foreign language teachers to satisfy future needs. This is a matter of grave concern to the modern foreign language teaching profession.

In many states, despite a relatively small per cent increase in institutional enrollments, enrollments in modern foreign languages soared. For instance, institutional enrollments in the District of Columbia rose by only 6.6 per cent, while modern foreign language enrollments increased 21.4 per cent, and Michigan had an increase of 20.9 per cent in modern foreign language enrollments, as against only 3.1 per cent increase in institutional enrollments.

**Breakdown by Languages:** The modern foreign languages surveyed are French, German, Italian, Russian, Spanish, and sixty-one special or "critically needed" languages (including Arabic, Chinese, Japanese, Modern Greek, Modern Hebrew, Hindi, Polish, Portuguese, African languages) grouped under "Other."<sup>2</sup>

There was an increase in enrollments, 1958 to 1959, in each of the five languages surveyed as well as in the group of special languages.

National enrollments in 1958 and 1959 and the numerical increase in enrollments in each language are summed up in the table below and illustrated in Graph A. Per cents in column four show the rate of increase of the 1959 enrollments in each language over the corresponding 1958 enrollments; per cents in column seven show the proportionate growth of each language out of the total modern foreign language growth from 1958 to 1959.

Three facts deserving particular attention emerge from this table: the spectacular increase of 56.5 per cent in enrollments in Russian; the greater growth rate of German than of Spanish; and the practical standstill in Italian enrollments. However, both in 1958 and in 1959, the largest enrollments were in French, Spanish, and German, in that order, followed by Russian and Italian.

A comparison of the per cents in columns 4 and 7 shows the following: although enrollments in Russian have increased by 56.5 per cent over Russian enrollments in 1958, according to which figure Russian registered the most rapid growth rate of any language taught in the U. S., only 15.8 per cent of the total increase in modern foreign language enrollments was due to the increase in Russian enrollments. On the other hand, the per cent of the increase in French appears small (14.0)

because enrollments in 1958 were already high; numerically, however, the increase in French enrollments was higher than that in any other language, and the proportionate growth of French (37.7) out of the total growth in modern foreign language enrollments was also the highest.

Spanish and German, the two languages between French and Russian in gross number of enrollments in 1958 and in 1959, show a virtual reversal of strength in the 1959 growth. German enrollments increased at the rate of 12.9 per cent and accounted for 24.0 per cent of the total increase in modern foreign language enrollments in 1959, while Spanish enrollments went up at the rate of 9.2 per cent and contributed only 19.8 per cent of the total growth in modern foreign languages that year. Note, however, that in both years, the number of enrollments in Spanish and the per cent of Spanish enrollments out of the total modern foreign language enrollment (29.6% and 28.5%) were larger than the corresponding figures for German (25.4% and 25.2%).

Italian, which constituted 2.2 per cent of the modern foreign language picture in 1958, increased 4.3 per cent in 1959, but not enough to keep from slipping slightly to become 2.1 per cent of the whole in 1959. It accounted for merely .7 per cent of the total increase in modern foreign languages the same year.

The special or "critically needed" languages, grouped under "other," constituted only 1.9 per cent of the modern foreign language enrollments in 1959, and were the same 1.9 per cent of that whole in 1958. The most significant fact about them remains their relatively high growth rate from 1958 to 1959, 14.3 per cent, although they contributed only 2.0 per cent of the total increase in modern foreign language enrollments.

**II. Coverage:** The present report gives information on modern foreign language enrollments in

1,039 institutions of higher learning from 50 states and the District of Columbia. Of these 1,039 degree-granting institutions, 993 are accredited by a regional accrediting association and 46 are accredited by a professional accrediting agency. The 993 accredited institutions surveyed represent 99.2 per cent of the 1,001 regionally accredited institutions in the U. S. which teach modern foreign languages. All 1,039 institutions, on which the statistical analysis and tables are based, are listed individually in the state by state survey tables.

**III. Statistical Tables:** Table I presents a summary of total student enrollments and enrollments in modern foreign languages in the four-year accredited colleges and universities of the 50 states and the District of Columbia in Fall 1958 and Fall 1959. It gives the number and the per cent of increase (or decrease) in institutional enrollments and in modern foreign language enrollments, and the breakdown of enrollment increase (or decrease) in institutions and in modern foreign languages by undergraduate, graduate, and "special and unclassified."

Per cent increase in the categories of undergraduate, graduate, and "special and unclassified" enrollments are not given because in many states very small fluctuations from 1958 to 1959, computed on the basis of few enrollments in 1958, result in high per cents which may give a misleading picture. Thus, for example, in Arizona there were 84 graduate students in 1958 and 178 in 1959; this increase by 94 students would show 119.0 per cent increase in graduate enrollments in this state. On the other hand, in New York, where there were 2,322 graduate students in 1958 and 2,541 in 1959, the increase by 219 students would represent an increase of only 9.4 per cent over 1958. The disproportion between the initial figures for 1958 renders the comparison of per cents of increase in these, and many other cases, less sig-

nificant than in a comparison of the figures themselves, given in columns 9-14.

Table II gives a state by state summary of the per cent of enrollments in each language out of the total modern foreign language enrollments in 1958 and in 1959; the per cent of increase (or decrease) in enrollments in each language from 1958 to 1959; and the per cent of enrollment increase in each language out of the total increase in modern foreign language enrollments in 1959 over 1958. These latter two sets of figures should be carefully distinguished, columns 13-18 showing the increase, in 1959, of enrollments in each language over enrollments in the same language the previous year; while columns 19-24 show what per cent of the total increase in modern foreign language enrollments in 1959 in each state was contributed by increased enrollments in each language.

Tables III-VIII give state by state figures on enrollments in French, German, Italian, Russian, Spanish, and "Other" languages in 1958 and in 1959, with the breakdown into undergraduate, graduate, and "special and unclassified" enrollments, the total increase (or decrease) and per cent increase in enrollments from 1958 to 1959 in each language, and the numerical increase in the categories undergraduate, graduate, and "special and unclassified." A summary of the national totals in these six tables is given on the next page.

French was taught in colleges and universities in all 50 states and the District of Columbia (Table III). It enrolled almost half of the total modern foreign language students in 8 states: South Carolina, Maine, New Hampshire, District of Columbia, Rhode Island, Georgia, and North Carolina. In only four states did French constitute less than one quarter of the modern foreign language enrollments: Arizona, South Dakota, Hawaii, and New Mexico. In all other states French enrollments represented from 25 to 45 per cent of the total modern foreign language enrollment.

Undergraduate enrollments in French increased in 1959 by 13.8 per cent over 1958 undergraduate enrollments; graduate enrollments in 1959 increased 21.2 per cent over the corresponding 1958 enrollments; and "special and unclassified" enrollments increased by 8.8 per cent.

Like French, German was taught in institutions of higher learning in all 50 states and the District of Columbia (Table IV). Undergraduate enrollments in German in 1959 increased 13.1 per cent over 1958 enrollments; graduate enrollments increased 9.7 per cent over graduate enrollments in the previous year, and "special and unclassified" enrollments increased 9.5 per cent.

Table V shows that in 1959 Italian was taught

in 41 states and the District of Columbia. Arkansas, Nevada, and New Mexico reported some enrollments in 1958, but none in 1959. Alaska, Hawaii, Idaho, North Dakota, and Wyoming did not report any enrollments in Italian either for 1958 or for 1959.

Undergraduate enrollments in Italian in 1959 increased 3.9 per cent over 1958 enrollments; graduate enrollments increased 5.7 per cent, and "special and unclassified" enrollments increased 11.7 per cent.

Enrollments in Russian in 1958 and in 1959 were reported by institutions of higher learning in all states except Wyoming (Table VI). The states with the highest numerical enrollments in 1959 were New York (4,150), Massachusetts (2,185), Pennsylvania (2,056), California (1,899), Illinois (1,503), Michigan (1,330), Indiana (1,187) and Ohio (1,170).

Undergraduate enrollments in Russian in 1959 increased 57.4 per cent; graduate enrollments increased 28.7 per cent, and "special and unclassified" enrollments increased 78.8 per cent over 1958 enrollments.

Enrollments in Spanish in 1958 and in 1959 were reported by colleges and universities in all states except Alaska (Table VII). Over half of the modern foreign language students in New Mexico and in Arizona, and over one quarter in 35 states, were enrolled in Spanish.

Undergraduate enrollments in Spanish increased

in 1959 by 9.1 per cent; graduate enrollments by 14.1 per cent, and "special and unclassified" enrollments by 6.3 per cent.

**IV. Critically Needed Languages:** Nearly ninety modern foreign languages other than French, German, Italian, Russian, and Spanish were offered in accredited four-year colleges and universities of the United States in 1958 and in 1959.<sup>3</sup> Enrollments reported in sixty of these critically needed languages totaled 8,013 in Fall 1958 and 9,156 in Fall 1959 (Table VIII). The increase in 1959 of 1,143 enrollments was 14.3 per cent.

In many of the most urgently demanded languages, per cents of increase from 1958 to 1959 were high. Chinese increased 44.9 per cent, from 615 enrollments in 1958 to 891 in 1959. Japanese enrollments rose 42.4 per cent, from 844 in 1958 to 1,202 in 1959. Other Far Eastern languages (excluding Indic languages, which will be discussed separately) rose 18.8 per cent from 176 to 209; they included enrollments in such languages as Burmese, Korean, Thai, and Tibetan. The total enrollment in these Far Eastern languages, together with Japanese and Chinese enrollments, was 40.8 per cent greater in 1959 than in 1958. The numerical increase was 667 from 1,635 in

1958 to 2,302 in 1959. All these Far Eastern language enrollments were 20 per cent of the whole enrollment in "critically needed" languages in 1958 and 25 per cent of that whole in 1959.

Indic languages (Bengali, Dravidian, Gujarati, Hindi, Hindustani, Malayalam, Marathi, Nepali, Pali, Prakrit, Singhalese, Tamil, Telugu, Urdu, etc.) showed an enrollment increase from 44 in 1958 to 82 in 1959. African language enrollments, which were 13 in 1958 became 41 in 1959. The African languages offered included Berber languages, Bine, Ethiopic, Ewe, Fanti, Gio, Geez, Ibo, Kpelle, Lunkundo, Manyika, Shona, Swahili, Tigrinya, Twi, and Yoruba. Enrollments were highest in Swahili (28 in 1959).

Austronesian languages were represented by enrollments in Hawaiian (48 in Fall 1958 and 41 in 1959), Indonesian (6 in 1958 and 17 in 1959), Indonesian-Malay and Malay (6 in 1958 and 12 in 1959), and Tagalog (1 in each year).

In the Near Eastern area of languages, Modern Hebrew had the largest enrollments, 3,014 in 1958 and 3,123 in 1959. Arabic enrollments increased from 364 in 1958 to 441 in 1959, a rise of 21.2 per cent for that year. Near Eastern language enrollments as a whole rose from 3,677 in 1958 to 3,874 in 1959, a 5.4 per cent increase. The languages included Amharic, Armenian, Egyptian, and several Iranian languages (Kazak, Kurdish, Pashto, and Persian).

Scandinavian enrollments were 1,301 in 1958; and, while they constituted 16 per cent of the whole group of nearly 100 "special" language enrollments that year, they decreased slightly in 1959 to an enrollment total of 1,297. The largest increases in enrollments were in Danish (from 23 to 53), and Swedish (from 344 to 371). In the Ural-Altaic family, these languages were being taught: Azeri-Turkic, Estonian, Finnish, Hungarian (or Magyar), Mongolian, Turkic, Turkish, and Uzbek. Highest enrollments were for Turkish (22 in 1958 and 48 in 1959). Afterward came Hungarian, Finnish, and Mongolian. The total enrollments in Slavic languages (other than Russian) went from 375 to 424. The leaders were Polish (259 and 242), Serbo-Croatian (36 and 47), Czech (36 and 49), Lithuanian (17 in 1959), and Ukrainian (13 in 1959). Bulgarian, Czech-Slovak, Slovak, and South Slovak are also included in the total for Slavic languages.

The 1959 enrollments in "critically needed" languages were concentrated in New York (2,506), in California (1,527), and in such states as Hawaii (where Japanese, Chinese, and Hawaiian enrollments are naturally large), Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Pennsylvania, and

Washington, all of which had enrollments of between 350 and 700. Maryland, the District of Columbia, Illinois, and Wisconsin followed these in numbers of enrollments. The highest numerical increase in enrollments in special languages, 1958 to 1959, was in California (223) and in Hawaii (also 223). Twelve states reported no enrollments in critical languages in either year: Alaska, Colorado, Delaware, Idaho, Mississippi, Montana, Nevada, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, South Carolina, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, South Carolina, West Virginia, and Wyoming.

**V. Data on Puerto Rico:** Four institutions of higher learning in Puerto Rico were also surveyed.<sup>4</sup> The information received is summed up in the chart below. Neither Spanish, which is not a foreign language in Puerto Rico, nor English, which is taught as a foreign language, has been included.

The overall picture indicates that, while institutional enrollments have increased by 547, modern foreign language enrollments have decreased by 41 during the period of 1958 to 1959. The decrease in modern foreign languages occurred primarily in French, at the undergraduate level (-101). Russian, too, had a drop in undergraduate, graduate, and "special and unclassified" enrollments, totaling eight. German, however, increased considerably; and a small rise can be noted in Italian. The "other" language taught in Puerto Rico was Portuguese. In per cent of enrollments out of the total modern foreign language enrollment, French was the largest in all categories.

**VI. Survey Tables:** The information received from 1039 institutions of higher learning in re-
