SPECIAL ATTENTION IS CALLED TO SOURCE MATERIALS, SPECIAL LISTS OF BOOKS AND ARTICLES, AND BOOK REVIEWS. FOR EACH JOURNAL THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS GIVEN—(1) NAME, CALL NUMBER, AND ABBREVIATED TITLE, (2) DATE OF INITIAL PUBLICATION, (3) PLACE OF PUBLICATION, (4) FREQUENCY OF ISSUE, (5) EDITOR'S NAME, AND (6) HOLDINGS IN THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA LIBRARIES. 1886. New York and Menasha, Wisconsin. Formerly quarterly, now usually six issues a year. Editor, John Hurt Fisher. Library has complete file. Indices: 1-50, 1935; 51-60, 1945.

Supplements contain list of members, list of departmental chairmen, list of publishers, learned societies, etc. Annual Bibliography, especially important since 1956. The latter is indispensable to any student wishing to keep up with developments in his field. In recent years the sections entitled "For Members Only", the "FL Program," and the "Cooperative English Program," have been full of important information and lively shop talk. Otherwise this is strictly a research publication printing studies usually highly technical, meticulously documented, upon all branches of the modern languages and literature. Its influence and that of the Modern Language. Association are enormous. Articles in the fields of American and English studies predominate. There are no reviews.

Subject is modern linguistics. Contains book lists, articles, reviews of books. Most articles written in English, but a few are in French. Also publishes occasionally a supplement.

YEAR'S WORK IN MODERN LANGUAGE STUDIES (YWALS)

1931. Cambridge, England. Modern Humanities Research Association. Yearly. Editor, P. F. Ganz. Library has complete file.

An annual critical bibliography of the work done in most European languages. Complete, competent, authoritative. Lists scholarly books and articles. Complements PMLA bibliographies. An essential tool. The M.H.R.A. also publishes a BULLETIN which contains a directory of its members and the annual presidential address.

1947. Berkeley. University of California Press. Quarterly. Editor, Yakov Malkiel. Library has complete file.

Deals with Romance linguistics and literatures of older periods. Articles and reviews by the most competent American scholars. Bibliographies, lists of new publications. Useful to supplement ROMANIA and ZEITSCHRIFT.

Founded by Paul Meyer and Gaston Paris, a giant in the early days of Romance linguistics and medieval studies. Still probably the best quarterly for Romance philology and an abundant source for footnotes. Contains many medieval texts otherwise unavailable. Has tables listing words studied, authors and manuscripts mentioned. Analysis of periodicals and events in the field given at the end of each issue under the headings "Chronique" and "Périodiques."

1910. New York. Columbia University Press. Quarterly. Editor, Jean Hytier. Library has complete file.

Articles, reviews, bibliographies for Romance languages and literatures. Especially good for the Renaissance and the 18th century. Publishes research articles, documents, notes, critical discussions. Ably edited. Book reviews are usually complete and reliable. Indispensable for serious students in the field.

479 ZEITSCHRIFT FUR ROMANISCHE PHILOLOGIE (ZRP)

1877. Tübingen, Germany. 6 numbers a year. Editor, Walther von Wartburg. Library has vols. 1-40; 43 to date. Indices: 1-30; 31-50; 52-65.

With ROMANIA the most important periodical dealing with historical Romance linguistics and earlier literatures. Indispensable for students in the field. Contains documents, texts, articles, reviews, bibliographies, lists of recent publications, including lists of articles in other periodicals. Articles are in German, English, French, Italian, and Spanish.

Publishes also a supplement (BETHEFTE). Library has volumes 1-76; 80-93; 95-108. It contains longer documents and texts.

Also publishes a bibliographical supplement. Library has vols. 1-33; 35-38; 44-57. It should be consulted before exhaustive study of a subject in the field is undertaken (Grisby). See Levy's remarks in Cabeen-Holmes, item 1.

Constantly growing in importance to all students of the Renaissance.
