DISTRICT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR DETERMINING WHICH PUBLIC AND  
PRIVATE SCHOOLS MEET THE LOW-INCOME CRITERIA FOR RECEIVING  
FUNDS. EACH DISTRICT MUST ALSO PROVIDE THE DATA, BASED ON  
ANALYSIS OF THE CHILDREN'S NEEDS, TO SUBSTANTIATE THEIR  
APPLICATION FOR FUNDS. CONSULTATION WITH PRIVATE SCHOOL  
OFFICIALS AND COMMUNITY ACTION PROJECT REPRESENTATIVES IS  
REQUIRED BY ESEA. FUNDS MUST BE USED FOR APPROVED PURPOSES  
ONLY, AND CAREFUL, COORDINATED FISCAL RECORDS MUST BE KEPT.  
THE LOCAL DISTRICT MUST PROVIDE AN EVALUATION OF THE PROJECT  
WHICH STRESSES BASELINE DATA, EVALUATION TECHNIQUES, AND TEST  
RESULTS. THE BOOKLET LISTS THE ADMINISTRATIVE UNIT AND THE  
PERSONNEL RESPONSIBLE FOR ESEA PROJECTS IN EVERY LOCAL  
DISTRICT. THE ABSTRACTS OF INDIVIDUAL PROJECTS OUTLINE  
OBJECTIVES, PROGRAMS AND SERVICES, APPROVED AMOUNT OF FUNDS,  
AND THE NUMBER OF PARTICIPATING CHILDREN. MOST OF THE  
OBJECTIVES FOCUS ON IMPROVING ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE AND  
SKILLS, ATTENDANCE, SCHOOL HOLDING POWER, ASPIRATION LEVEL,  
AND SELF-CONCEPT. IN SOME PROGRAMS PARTICULAR ATTENTION IS

## FOREWORD

In order that Title I, ESEA funds for 1966-67 could be best utilized for programs for educationally deprived children in New Mexico, it was our feeling that we should approve projects at 85% of the total allocation for the previous year.

Amendments to projects will be made as rapidly as possible with a cut-off date of February 15, 1967.

As soon as the exact allocations are known to us, local administrators will be notified and given the procedure to follow in amending the present project to include the entire allocation for 1966-67.

In approving projects for 1966-67 we must all bear in mind that New Mexico is the forerunner in the implementation of projects and we expect that this reputation will be maintained by approving projects that are meeting the most pressing needs of the educationally deprived children in our public and non-public schools alike.

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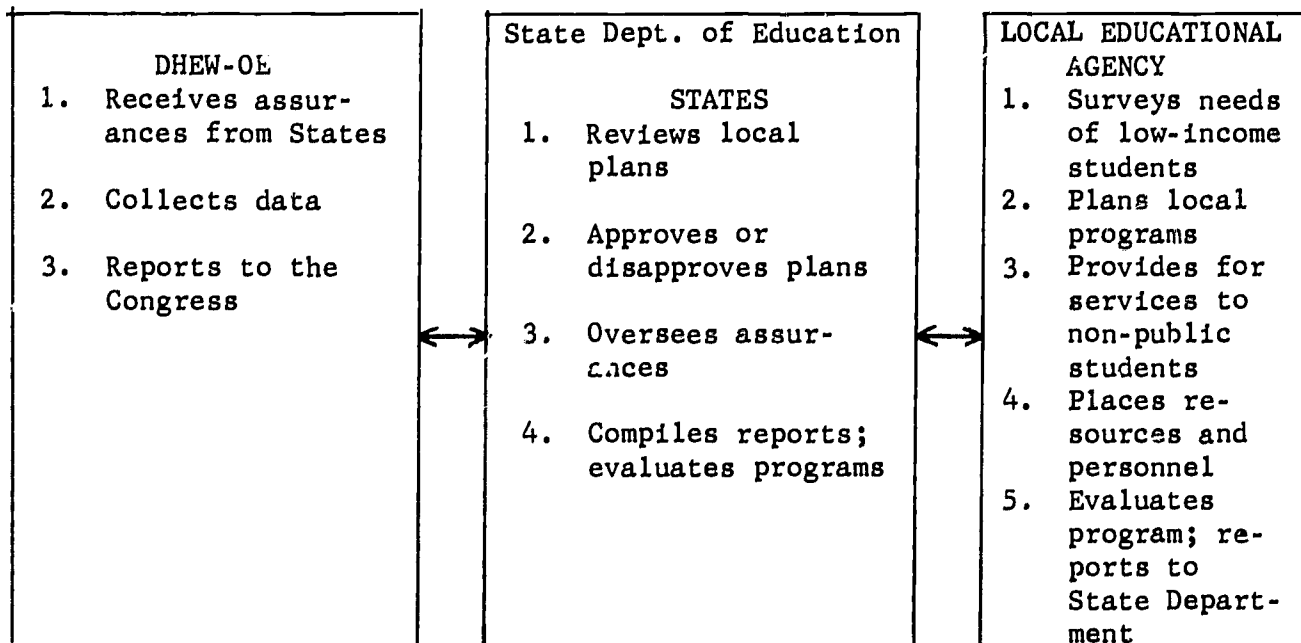

P. L. 89-10--TITLE I

What Is Title I?

Title I provides for a three-year program of Federal grants to improve the education of deprived children and authorizes federal support to local public educational agencies for special programs for educationally deprived children in attendance areas of both public and non-public schools where low-income families are concentrated.

FOR ADMINISTRATION OF TITLE I PROGRAMS

I. Determination of Project Schools

If a district has several schools of the same grade span, the determination of project schools should be made on the basis of low-income data. Documentation of data secured should be made a part of applicant's official Title I records.

II. Analyze The Needs of Children

The U. S. Office of Education requires that applications be substantiated by data to prove that the proposed project meets the most urgent needs of the children. This requirement applies to all project applications, including those submitted by districts where a survey of needs was made last year.

- a. Review all evaluative data from 1966 projects--an analysis and review should provide information to help determine needs for the 1966-67 Title I projects;
- b. Consider all children in the district including those attending private schools, those not attending any school, and those who need special educational help;
- c. Make a survey of the children's needs; enlist the help of those who work with children, such as classroom teachers, guidance counselors, or school nurse;
- d. Classify the needs by type and compile the results--a suggested form, "Surveying the Educational Needs of Children," is included in the ESEA Handbook, prepared by the State Title I Staff.
- e. Study the results to determine those needs which are most pressing.
- f. Make a list of most pressing needs and plan project in keeping with these needs.

III. Consult With Private School Officials and Representatives of Community Action Programs

After the needs of children have been determined, consult with private school officials and with representatives of Community Action Programs (if these exist in the district) to plan a project. ESEA requires such cooperation.

IV. Use of Grant Funds

Grant funds must be used in accordance with approved project budgets and for purposes for which the projects have been approved.

V. Maintain Fiscal Records

Adequate fiscal records on all project funds must be maintained. Reports to the State Department of Education on the use of project funds must be made.

VI. Coordinate Fiscal Effort

The local school district is responsible for maintaining fiscal effort with respect to total current expenditures for education and also with respect to such expenditures in the project areas.

VII. Evaluation:

The local school district is responsible to provide for the collection and dissemination of evaluative data and material, consistent with a valid assessment of stated project objectives. A particular emphasis is placed upon the collection of pertinent baseline data, local evaluation techniques, and where applicable, standardized test results.
