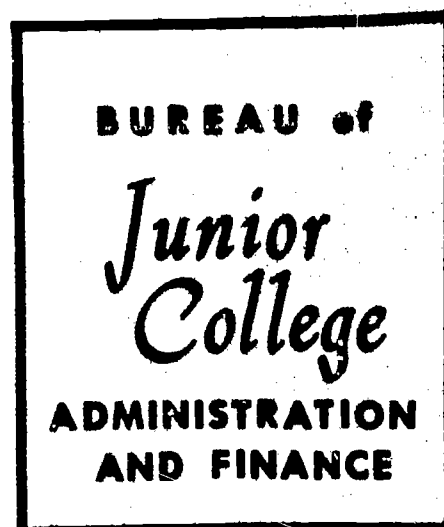

A NOTE ABOUT THE SALARY SCHEDULES

In addition to the steps and classes in which an instructor may be placed on a particular salary schedule, we have added in parentheses following the dollar amount the number of instructors on a particular step within a class.

Other information that may be found following the salary schedules are the number of maximum steps allowed to a new instructor for either military experience or previous educational, business, or industrial experience. A note of caution must be interjected at this point to indicate that not all junior college districts reported this added information; therefore, no reasonable tabulation of the information would be meaningful.

1. Credit for previous teaching experience will be granted on a year-for-year basis up to a maximum of five years.
 2. Those who have an earned doctorate will receive \$478 in addition to placement on Class VI.
 3. Instructors may become eligible for a salary increase at five-year intervals after serving at the 12th step. The increase, called a career increment, will be based on the differential between the 5th and 6th steps in Class IV. Instructors in Class IV may earn one career increment equal to that differential. Instructors in Class V may earn two career increments at the rate of one and a half times the differential. Instructors in Class VI may earn three career increments at the rate of twice that differential.

- Note:**
1. One step on the schedule shall be allowed for each two years of elementary or high school teaching, not to exceed four steps. Previous college or university teaching experience, including junior college, shall be credited at the rate of one step for each year not to exceed five steps.
 2. Credit for experience in lieu of teaching shall be allowed to a maximum of two steps when in the judgment of the president of the college the work was of such a nature as to add to the professional training and experience of the instructor, and provided the work experience has been within a ten-year period preceding assignment. Such work experience shall be certified by the employing agencies and such certificates shall delineate the duties and responsibilities of the applicant.

 2. The term "Vocational Class A" credential may be substituted where the term "SDS" appears.
 3. The holder of an earned doctorate shall be granted an additional amount equal to two step increments.

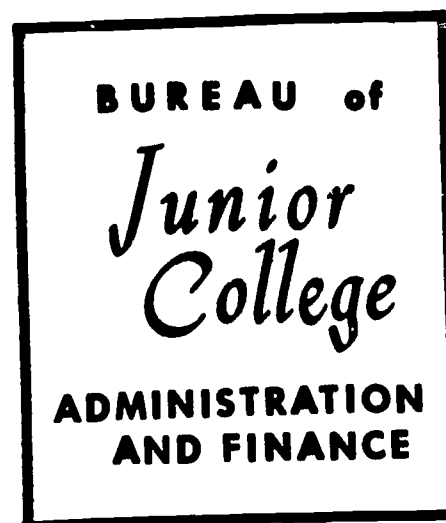

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**OVERVIEW AND SUMMARY OF REPORTED ADMINISTRATIVE SALARY SCHEDULES
AND SALARIES IN CALIFORNIA DISTRICTS MAINTAINING PUBLIC
JUNIOR COLLEGES FOR THE 1967-68 COLLEGE YEAR**

This is the eighth report on administrative salary schedules and current salaries in California districts maintaining public junior colleges which is now compiled by the Bureau of Junior College Administration and Finance. As in the previous reports, the administrative salary schedules have been presented so as to indicate significant methods, policies, or techniques used in developing such schedules.

Administrative salaries for the 1967-68 college year are included primarily to provide an index to the current level of salaries for administrative responsibilities and to facilitate comparisons of salaries for similar administrative positions within junior colleges. Unfortunately, the administrative functions and responsibilities assigned to positions with similar titles in the two types of districts maintaining junior colleges are not uniform or easily identified. Differences in the sizes of the districts or junior colleges, the personnel involved, and terminology have all had their influence on the actual responsibilities and functions assigned to positions with similar titles. To summarize the report, however, it was necessary to arbitrarily group the many positions and titles into nine broad administrative position categories which are described below, following the summary table. In addition, the various districts maintaining junior colleges were grouped according to the average daily attendance as if for apportionment purposes for the fiscal year 1966-67. Eleven such groups were identified. Details of the grouping follow the table below. No attempt was made to combine the groups into one table. Many of the difficulties mentioned in the foregoing regarding differences in administrative responsibilities among the various districts prohibited overall comparisons.

2. Placement on the administrative salary schedule:

- a. A person receiving an administrative appointment may enter his classification at Step 2 if he has had experience parallel to the position he is assuming.
- b. A person receiving an administrative appointment to a higher classification will be placed at a step sufficiently high in his new classification to insure that he receives an appropriate increase in salary.
- c. In the changeover to the new administrative salary schedule, a person will not receive less on the new schedule than he would have received on the old administrative salary schedule.
- d. For exceptional cases, the Board reserves the right to place a person wherever necessary.

3. Professional Recognition Salary Increment for administrators:

- a. Professional Recognition Salary Increments earned by an administrator while holding another position will be added to his contract salary. Administrative and extra time percentages will not be applied to these increments.
- b. When an administrator has served for three years at the top step of his salary class, he will be considered for the Professional Recognition Salary Increment. A careful evaluation procedure similar to that used in determining eligibility for faculty to the Professional Recognition Salary Increment will be employed. Eligibility for the Professional Recognition Salary Increment will not be retroactive and apply to positions formerly held except that those who will have been at the top of their schedules for three years will be considered in 1967-68 to become effective July 1, 1968.
