SIGNIFICANT PROGRAM OPERATIONS DATA ARE SUMMARIZED FOR PUBLIC LAWS 874 AND 815, AUTHORIZING RESPECTIVELY, FEDERAL PAYMENTS TO LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES IN FEDERALLY AFFECTED AREAS FOR CURRENT OPERATING EXPENSES OF SCHOOLS AND FOR CONSTRUCTION OF SCHOOL FACILITIES. BRIEF REVIEWS GIVE PROVISIONS OF THE AUTHORIZING LEGISLATION, ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITIES AND PROCEDURES REQUIRED IN IMPLEMENTING THE LEGISLATION, AND TRENDS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS DURING THE YEAR. CHANGES IN LEGISLATION, NEW DEVELOPMENTS, AND MAJOR PROBLEMS ARISING DURING THE YEAR ARE ALSO DISCUSSED. A REVIEW OF THE 15 YEARS OF OPERATION SHOWS A STEADY GROWTH IN THE PROGRAM AUTHORIZED BY P.L. 874, AND AFTER THE FIRST THREE OR FOUR YEARS, A LEVELING OUT AND GRADUAL TAPERING OFF OF THE SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM AUTHORIZED BY P.L. 815. INCLUDED IN THE REPORT IS A DESCRIPTIVE OUTLINE OF PROVISIONS AND APPROPRIATIONS MADE UNDER THE FIRST YEAR'S OPERATION OF PUBLIC LAW 89-313, AUTHORIZING FEDERAL DISASTER AID FOR SCHOOLS. TABLES AND ACCOMPANYING CHARTS INDICATE AGGREGATE NUMBER OF APPLICANTS AND PROJECTS AND GIVE AN EXTENSIVE BREAKDOWN BY STATES, COUNTIES, AND LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT RECORDS DATA WITH RESPECT TO NET ENTITLEMENT, CURRENT EXPENDITURES, APPROPRIATIONS, AND FEDERAL FUNDS RESERVED FOR CONSTRUCTION OF SCHOOL FACILITIES. ## HIGHLIGHTS

### Public Law 874--Maintenance and Operation

- \$2,749,504,788 has been appropriated for this program from its beginning in 1950 through fiscal year 1966. \$388 million was appropriated for fiscal year 1966, as compared with \$332 million appropriated for fiscal year 1965.
- The number of applications filed in 1966 was 4,190, an increase of 14 above the number filed in 1965. The number found eligible decreased from 4,107 in 1965 to 4,080 in 1966.
- Federally owned properties containing 271,382,615 million acres were claimed as a basis for entitlement in fiscal year 1966. The number of different Federal properties claimed as a basis for payment totaled 5,509, an increase of 116 from 1965.
- The total number of pupils in the 4,080 eligible districts was more than 15.6 million, a little more than one-third of all pupils attending public elementary and secondary schools in the Nation. Federally connected pupils totaled more than 2 million and represented, as in past years, close to 15 percent of the total attendance in eligible districts.
- Entitlements of more than \$350 million resulted from pupils who resided on Federal property, or resided with a parent employed on Federal property, or both. Total entitlements of approximately \$372 million constituted about 4.7 percent of current operating costs of eligible districts which approximates the 5-percent average ratio of Federal to non-Federal funds. Payments of more than \$21.6 million were made for Federal operation of schools for more than 48,314 pupils residing on 50 Federal installations, chiefly military bases.

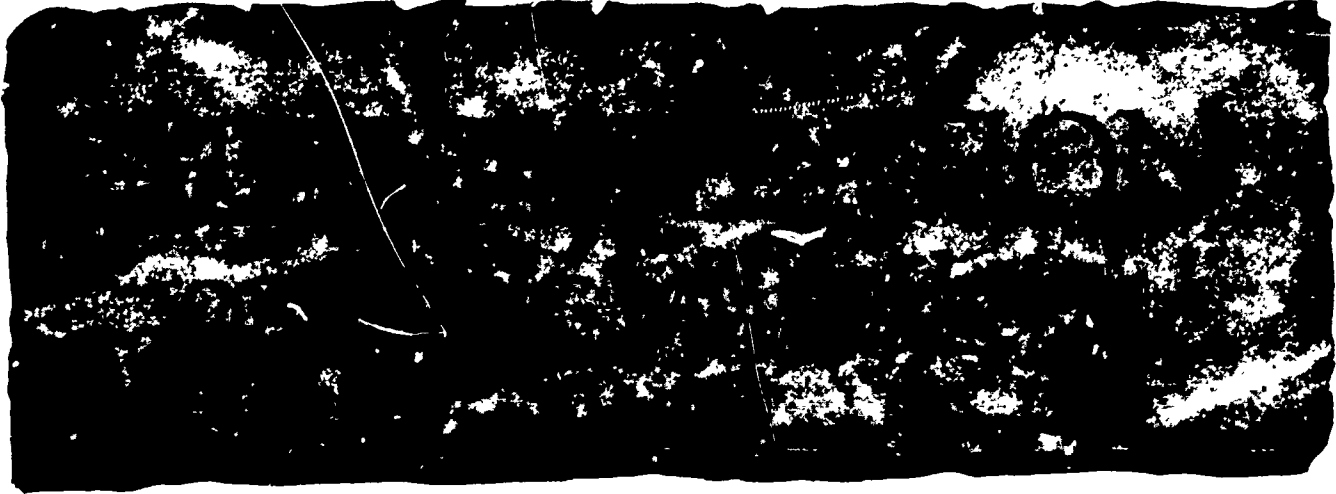
### Public Law 815--Construction

- \$1,284,643,000 has been appropriated from the beginning of the program in 1950 through fiscal year 1966.
- \$1,093 million in Federal funds has been reserved for 5,572 construction projects submitted by approximately 1,956 different local school districts. Of these projects, 1,460 are new elementary schools and 2,160 are additions to elementary schools; 510 are new secondary schools and 986 are additions to secondary schools; and 456 are for improvements to existing facilities, such as equipment and heating plants. 5,118 of these projects are completed, 362 are under construction, and 92 are in the pre-construction stage.
- To the Federal funds, school districts have added an estimated \$780 million exclusive of site, off-site improvements, and other costs for a total of more than \$1.9 billion used to construct 59,789 classrooms and related facilities for more than 1.7 million children.
- Of the total granted to local school districts, \$54 million has been allocated under section 14 (formerly Title IV) to 289 projects to provide 1,725 classrooms for 47,372 pupils (primarily children living on Indian reservations) and funds for 61 projects costing \$8.3 million have been reserved for construction of temporary school facilities housing 16,338 pupils.
- In addition to the funds granted to local school districts, more than \$159 million has been allocated for Federal construction of 403 projects on Federal property, comprising 4,058 classrooms and related facilities for 122,045 pupils living on Federal property.

### Public Law 874 and 815--Disaster Assistance

- Of 11 declared disasters, school districts in 8 different States filed for assistance as a result of 7 of the disasters. 33 applications were filed under P.L. 874 and 3 under P.L. 815. Federal funds estimated at June 30 for these disasters are \$938 under subsection 7(a) and nearly \$4 million under subsection 7(b) of P.L. 874, and \$780,225 under section 16 of P.L. 815.

## INTRODUCTION

PUBLIC LAWS 874 and 815 have been in operation 16 consecutive years. Enacted in the fall of 1950, they authorize financial assistance to local educational agencies in federally affected areas for current operating expenses of schools and for construction of school facilities, respectively.

The tables in this report summarize significant data on program operations during fiscal year 1966. The text presents briefly the provisions of the authorizing legislation, administrative activities and procedures required in implementing the legislation, and trends and accomplishments during the year. It also discusses the changes in legislation, reports new developments, and calls attention to major problems that arose during the year.

The text is presented under three major headings: "Providing Financial Assistance for Maintenance and Operation of Schools," "Federal Property," and "Providing Financial Assistance for Construction of School Facilities." Summary tables and charts appear in the text. Appendix tables present detailed tabulations for applicant school districts, for counties, for States, and for different sections of each Act, as well as statements of appropriations and disbursements.

Because program activities are much the same from year to year with only minor change in legislative authorization, the material in each Annual Report generally covers the same ground and is presented in substantially the same format.

### Major Program Trends

When Public Laws 815 and 874 were enacted, the Federal Government in effect embarked on a new Federal policy for assisting school districts experiencing financial burdens as a result of Federal activities. It was not known at that time how long the programs would be needed or on what scale, or what the initial or continuing costs would be. A review of the 15 years of operation shows a steady growth in the program authorized by P.L. 874, and after the first 3 or 4 years a leveling out and gradual tapering off for the school construction program authorized by P.L. 815.

### Public Law 874

In the first year of operation 1,172 school districts were eligible for assistance on

account of 512,000 federally connected children in average daily attendance, at a total cost of \$29.6 million. The eligible districts had a total average daily attendance of 2.9 million, their total current expenses were more than half a billion dollars, the average per pupil cost was \$176.76, and the local contribution rate was \$106.82.

There has been an increase in every one of the 16 years the program has been in existence in each of these items of program activity, except in the number of applications filed. Slightly smaller numbers since 1963 reflect the large number of consolidations and reorganizations currently taking place rather than a smaller number of areas eligible for assistance. There were 4,080 eligible school districts in fiscal year 1966 with more than 15.6 million pupils in attendance, of whom 2 million were federally connected. Total cost of the program was \$372 million and total current operating expenses in the eligible districts were \$7.4 billion. The cost per pupil in the eligible districts was \$476 and the average local contribution rate was \$287.06.

This continued substantial program growth is due to the increase in number of school children, both federally connected and non-federally connected, liberalization of the legislation, continued high Federal expenditures for national security and domestic development, and the increased cost of education.

Growth in the impacted areas program reflects national trends to a substantial degree. The average for the 16-year federally connected enrollment has held close to 15 percent of the total enrollment, and the Federal payments approximated 5 percent of the operating costs in the eligible districts.

### Public Law 815

A large backlog of needed school construction had developed in federally affected areas prior to 1950 because only the most urgently needed school facilities were constructed in these areas during and immediately after World War II. Thus, the 1,128 applications filed and the more than 900 applications found eligible during the first 2 years of P.L. 815 operation, the 1950-52 increase period, was the largest number of applications and the largest number found eligible during any 2-year increase period.

The number of applications filed averaged between 700 and 800, and the number found eligible averaged nearly 500 for each 2-year increase period from 1952 through 1958. During the same period, program requirements averaged \$81.8 million a year. There was a decrease in requirements after 1958, and for the last 3 or 4 years program costs have remained relatively stable, ranging from \$60 million down to \$50 million a year.

### Legislative changes

Numerous amendments have been made to P.L. 874 and P.L. 815 since their enactment. These changes have been described in some detail in the various annual reports of the U.S. Commissioner of Education for the fiscal years in which the amendments became effective. In fiscal year 1966, entitlements were determined and payments made under essentially the same legislative provisions that had been in effect for the 4 preceding years except for amendments to both Public Laws 874 and 815. P.L. 89-313, approved November 1, 1965, added a new program of assistance to school districts affected by natural disasters. P.L. 89-77, approved July 21, 1965, liberalized eligibility requirements and made minor changes in the provisions relating to Federal construction of school facilities in certain territories and to operation of schools located on Federal property. All of the amendments to P.L. 874 are to title I of that Act.

### Amendments made by P.L. 89-77

#### Section 10 of P.L. 815

Public Law 89-77 amended section 10 to authorize the construction of school facilities on Federal properties in Puerto Rico, Wake Island, Guam, and the Virgin Islands, for children residing with a parent employed by the United States but not living on Federal property, if English is not the primary language of the schools of the locality, and if such facilities are necessary to carry out the purposes of the Act or to provide suitable free public education for such children. The purpose of this amendment primarily was to authorize construction of school facilities on Federal property in Puerto Rico for children of employees of the United States stationed on the Island because instruction in the schools operated by the Puerto Rican Government is in the Spanish language and the public schools are extremely overcrowded. As a result of this amendment, the Commissioner proceeded to construct additional school facilities on base for the additional children.

### Section 6 of P.L. 874

P.L. 89-77 also amended section 6 of title I to exempt the personnel employed in federally operated schools from certain Federal requirements regarding compensation, hours of work, leave, tenure, and other incidents of employment. The purpose of this amendment was to make it possible for the federally operated on-base schools to operate under policies which, as nearly as possible, were comparable to comparable communities in the same State as is required by the Section. This Act became effective upon enactment.

### Amendments made by P.L. 89-313

#### Reducing eligibility for large districts

Since P.L. 874 was enacted, large districts, defined as those having an average daily attendance of 35,000 or more children, have been required to have enough federally connected children in average daily attendance each year to equal 6 percent of total average daily attendance in order to be eligible for assistance. Other districts were eligible if their federally connected children equaled 3 percent of total attendance. P.L. 89-313 reduced the eligibility requirement for the large districts from 6 to 3 percent. This amendment was effective for fiscal year 1966.

#### Waiver or Reduction of Minimum Number of Federally Connected Children

This amendment to subsection 5(e) of P.L. 815 authorized a waiver or reduction of the minimum number of 20 federally connected children in increased membership required for eligibility for payment under the Act.

#### Payment of Entitlement in Case of Base Closings

Section 17 of P.L. 89-313 directed the Commissioner, in determining payments to local education agencies made under P.L. 815, to disregard the announcement made November 19, 1964, by the Secretary of Defense of a decrease or cessation of Federal activities in certain areas.

#### Disaster Assistance for Repairing or Restoring School Facilities

P.L. 89-313 amended Public Laws 815 and 874 to authorize the Commissioner of Education to provide assistance for repair or restoration of elementary or secondary school facilities, equipment, and supplies damaged or destroyed by a natural disaster. The Commissioner is authorized to provide such assistance only to school districts located in whole or in part in an area declared

by the President, pursuant to section 2(a) of P.L. 81-875, to be a major disaster area. No assistance may be provided under these amendments unless a local educational agency is making a reasonable tax effort and exercising due diligence in availing itself of State and other financial assistance available for repairing disaster damage and does not have sufficient funds available to it from all other sources, including State, local, and other Federal funds and the proceeds of insurance, to restore or replace minimum school facilities, equipment, and supplies destroyed or seriously damaged, or to meet the cost of providing free public education. In addition, the local educational agency must certify that it has made provision for the conduct of programs under public auspices and administration in which children enrolled in private elementary or secondary schools which have been seriously damaged or destroyed may attend and participate. In general, these amendments follow the pattern of administration and the definitions currently used for Public Laws 815 and 874.

The amendment added section 7 to title I of P.L. 874. Subsection 7(a) authorizes assistance for a period of not to exceed five years for current operating expenses if such assistance is needed to provide a level of education equal to that maintained by the local educational agency during the first full year prior to the disaster. Such assistance is to be reduced to 75, 50, and 25 percent, respectively, the third, fourth, and fifth years.

Subsection 7(b) authorizes the provision of Federal assistance to repair or replace equipment, furniture, materials, or supplies damaged or destroyed by a disaster; to make urgent and minor repairs to school buildings; and to establish and operate temporary school facilities while school buildings seriously damaged by disaster are being repaired or restored.

Section 16 was added to P.L. 815 authorizing Federal assistance to restore or repair school buildings having major structural damage and to replace facilities that were destroyed, including the provision of sufficient additional space for children in nonpublic schools that were destroyed or damaged if the nonpublic schools are not to be rebuilt. If the Commissioner considers it to be in the public interest, assistance for reconstruction or repair of damaged facilities may be in the form of a repayable advance rather than a grant.

These amendments were made retroactive to August 30, 1965, to cover damage by

Hurricane Betsy to school facilities in Florida, Mississippi, and Louisiana, and are in effect until July 1, 1967.

#### Federal-State-Local Relations

Public Laws 874 and 815 authorize Federal payments directly to the eligible local educational agencies. Applications for assistance under both laws are submitted to the U.S. Office of Education through the State educational agencies which certify that the data contained therein are accurate insofar as records in State offices are concerned.

Each Chief State School Officer has designated one or more State Representatives for the school assistance program to work with the local educational agencies and with the regional and field representatives of the Office of Education in the administration of the program and in the development of applications for aid. Representatives of the Office are available to assist State educational agencies, and through them, local educational agencies. They advise applicant districts on the maintenance of records to justify claims and the specific pupil and financial data required to support them.

#### Civil Rights Act of 1964

All but six school districts eligible for Federal assistance under title I of P.L. 874 in the 1965-66 school year were certified as being in compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

#### Fair Employment Practices

During fiscal year 1966 applicants were required, as a condition for receipt of funds under P.L. 815, to give assurance that they would comply with the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the President's Committee on Equal Employment Opportunity for all school construction projects eligible for a grant of funds. This assurance was obtained as a part of the application for assistance.

#### Suitable Free Public Education

The eight projects constructed on eight military bases in 1963 in order to provide suitable free public education for on-base children were operated by the Federal Government under section 6 of P.L. 874 during 1966. These projects, all for elementary children, were constructed on: Fort McClellan, Fort Rucker, and Maxwell Air Force Base in Alabama; Fort Stewart and Warner Robins Air Force Base in Georgia;

England Air Force Base in Louisiana; and Fort Jackson and Myrtle Beach Air Force Bases in South Carolina.

The total cost for construction of the eight school facilities was \$4,003,600, and additions to these facilities authorized since the original construction total \$1,598,896 through June 30, 1966. These schools were operated by the respective base commanders beginning in fiscal year 1964 and continuing through fiscal year 1966. The current operating cost during fiscal year 1966 was \$2,325,211 for 5,589 children in average daily attendance.

#### Study of the Operation of Public Laws 815 and 874

By passage of P.L. 88-665 Congress directed the Commissioner of Education to make a thorough study of Public Laws 815 and 874 and to submit to the Secretary of the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare for transmission to Congress by June 30, 1965, a full report of their operation, together with his recommendations as to what amendments should be made to such laws if they were to be further extended. The report of the study, together with the comments and recommendations of the Commissioner, was submitted to the Congress on June 30, 1965. The Administration recommendation for amending Public Laws 874 and 815 for fiscal year 1967 were based in part on the findings of this study.

#### Major Findings

1. Financial burdens are created for local school districts by Federal activities of the types covered by the two Acts. Burdens are created both by "A" category children (those who live on Federal property with a parent employed on Federal property) and "B" category children (those who either live on or whose parents work on Federal property, but not both) whether or not the parent is employed on Federal property located within the district of residence or outside the district of residence. These burdens are not restricted to the initial impact, but are continuing. The financial burdens vary substantially from district to district, depending on the number of federally connected children, the nature and location of the Federal installation, characteristics of the federally and the nonfederally employed families, and a number of other factors.

2. It is possible to determine with considerable accuracy the actual financial burden created in each district and the extent to which Federal payments as authorized compensate, overcompensate, or undercompensate individual school districts.

3. On a nationwide basis, the rate of Federal payment justified for "B" category children is approximately 50 percent of the rate of payment for "A" category children; but the actual burden created by the "B" category group may be substantially above or below this 50 percent rate, depending on the circumstances in each district.

4. Under P.L. 874, as currently in effect, payments just about equal the financial burdens in some districts, overcompensate in others, and undercompensate in still others. Overpayment is more common than underpayment.

5. There is no justification for a higher eligibility requirement for large districts than for small districts.

6. Present eligibility requirements are inequitable because ineligible districts educate federally connected children without Federal payment.

7. The study group concluded that P.L. 874 was a defensible, though somewhat unusual, piece of Federal legislation; that it was properly conceived in terms of relieving burdens imposed upon school districts that educate Federal pupils; and that permanent payments to impacted areas under P.L. 874 are justified.

#### Suggestions for Revisions of the Laws and Procedures

1. To the extent that the Federal Government recognizes an obligation to school districts for burdens imposed by the Federal activity as presently defined, subsection 3(b) should be made a permanent part of P.L. 874.

2. The minimum rate options, permitting payment at half the State or national average current expenses of education, should be eliminated. It is suggested that one of two procedures for calculating local contribution rates be adopted: (a) abandon local option as impracticable, and inaugurate a consistent procedure for district grouping within each State; or, (b) if retention of local option is desired, abandon only the comparable district comparisons and determine the local contribution rate for each district on the basis of that district's local share of current expenses for nonfederally connected pupils.

3. A further step that would more fully capture the contribution of all federally connected families requires household surveys to compare the value per residence and the number of public school pupils per household of federally connected and nonfederally connected families.

4. Definition of a federally connected pupil should be changed from having a parent working on Federal property to having a parent who is a primary wageearner working on Federal property.

5. The differential eligibility requirement between large and small districts based on average daily attendance for fiscal year 1939 should be eliminated, as there is no indication that the large districts are better able to bear the Federal burden than are small districts.

6. The eligibility requirement should be converted into an absorption requirement in terms of the local share of expenses.

7. In order to remove the present bias toward underpayment of P.L. 815 funds to large districts, and districts with continuous but slow or erratic annual increases in Federal entitlement, further investigation should be made as to the possibility of including in the establishment of eligibility

requirements the increases in federally connected pupils during the year(s) prior to the year of application (perhaps permitting such averaging to take place back to the origin of the law in 1950).

8. Minimum costs of school facilities per pupil under P.L. 815 should at least reflect differences in cost of constructing various types of facilities--elementary, junior high, and high schools. They would also be differentiated between new buildings and additions.

9. A large number of administrative problems that appeared to complicate the administration of these laws were not investigated. Many of these have been the subject of proposed amendments in the past. It was suggested that the Director of the Division of School Assistance in Federally Affected Areas be consulted as to possible improvements, with special attention to those that can be accomplished without materially affecting the purposes of the laws.

# PUBLIC LAW 874

## TITLES I AND III PROVIDING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION OF SCHOOLS IN FEDERALLY AFFECTED AREAS

### AUTHORIZING LEGISLATION

Authorization for the federally affected areas program under Public Law 874 is contained in sections 1 through 6 of title I, and sections 301 through 303, title III of the Act. On November 1, 1965, title I was amended by P.L. 89-313 which added section 7. This provision extends financial assistance to local educational agencies affected by a major disaster. Detail on section 7 and on the program of disaster assistance is treated in Part II of the P.L. 815 text.

Title I authorizes financial assistance for maintenance and operation of schools to local educational agencies on which activities of the United States have placed a financial burden. It recognizes the following categories of burden for payment purposes: (a) reduction in local revenues by reason of acquisition of real property by the United States (section 2); (b) education of children who reside on Federal property or reside with a parent employed on Federal property (section 3); and (c) sudden and substantial increases in school attendance as a direct result of activities of the United

States carried on either directly or through a contractor (section 4). This title provides also for transfer of operating funds to other Federal agencies when no local educational agency is able to furnish free public education for children residing on Federal property (section 6).

Title III provides for reimbursement of Federal agencies supplying custodial, transportation, or maintenance services for children residing on Federal property (section 302).

The analysis of eligibility requirements and entitlement formulas, by section, follows under "Payment Provisions." P.L. 85-620, approved August 12, 1958, made permanent those provisions authorizing payment for children who reside on Federal property with a parent employed on Federal property. Authorization for payment for all other categories of Federal impact has been extended from time to time. The latest extension, to June 30, 1968, was made by P.L. 89-10, approved April 11, 1965.

### ADMINISTRATION

The federally affected areas program under P.L. 874 is administered by the U.S. Commissioner of Education under authority vested in him by section 301, title III. This section requires him to make an annual report to the Congress, including a full account of the administration of his functions and a detailed statement of receipts and disbursements. It also prohibits him from exercising any direction, supervision, or control over the personnel, curriculum, or program of instruction of any school or school system of any local or State educational agency.

#### Functions of the Commissioner

The statute places on the Commissioner discretionary powers and mandatory respon-

sibilities. He may make such regulations and perform such functions as he finds necessary to carry out its provisions. He is required, however, to determine the eligibility and the rate of payment for each applicant. He must estimate the entitlement of eligible applicants and pay from time to time the amount to which they are entitled in his judgment. He is responsible for making arrangements to provide free public education for certain children residing on Federal property. If funds appropriated for payments for a fiscal year are insufficient to meet estimated requirements, he is obliged to prorate to claimants under sections 2, 3, and 4 those funds in excess of the amount estimated for purposes of section 6.

The law requires the Commissioner to make judgments in areas such as degree of financial burden; amount of "other Federal payments" available to the educational agency and deductible from its entitlement; reasonableness of local tax effort; acceptability of "generally comparable districts"; and suitability of free public education. He may make certain of these judgments only after consultation with the State and local educational agencies.<sup>1</sup>

### Payment Provisions

Foreword.--Sections 2, 3, and 4 concern payments to local educational agencies. Sections 6 and 302 pertain to transfer of funds to Federal agencies.

Federal regulations require any school district wishing to qualify for assistance under sections 2, 3, or 4 to file an application, Form RSF-1, with the Commissioner by March 31 of the fiscal year for which payment is requested. Regulations also require the applicant to file a final report, Form RSF-3, by September 30 following the fiscal year for which benefits have been claimed.

Payments go direct to the school district. Estimated fiscal and pupil data in Form RSF-1 serve as the basis for an initial payment, ordinarily 75 percent of the estimated entitlement. Final and actual data for the year submitted on Form RSF-3 are the basis for final payment. An applicant desiring an interim payment, ordinarily 95 percent of the estimated entitlement, may submit Form RSF-3 any time after 7 months of the school year.

Sections 6 and 302 applications, which are commonly called letters of proposal, should be received by the Commissioner on or before 12 midnight of March 15 of the year preceding the year for which a budget is being prepared. Since a majority of projects under these sections are operated by Federal agencies, most payments are made by way of reimbursement. However, payment may be made in advance or in accordance with

<sup>1</sup> For purposes of titles I and III, the term "State" means a State, Puerto Rico, Wake Island, Guam, the District of Columbia, American Samoa, or the Virgin Islands. The term "State educational agency" means the officer or agency primarily responsible for the State supervision of public elementary and secondary schools. The term "local educational agency" means a board of education or other legally constituted local school authority having administrative control and direction of free public education in a county, township, independent, or other school district located within a State. Such terms include any State agency which directly operates and maintains facilities for providing free public education.

the terms of contracts negotiated with local educational agencies.

Section 2. Reduction in local revenue by reason of acquisition of real property by the United States.--A school district may be eligible if (1) the property was acquired by transfer and not by exchange since 1938; (2) the assessed valuation of such property represents 10 percent or more of the assessed valuation of all realty in the district at time or times of transfer; and (3) the acquisition has imposed on the school district a substantial and continuing financial burden.

Maximum entitlement is the product of the applicant's current expense tax rate applied to the estimated assessed valuation of the Federal property (exclusive of improvements since transfer date) less the amount of "other Federal payments" (See Deductible Funds) made with respect to the property and available for current expenditure purposes.

In fiscal year 1966 some 107 school districts claimed assistance under section 2. The Commissioner determined 99 to be eligible. Net entitlements to local educational agencies totaled \$2,427,788 (see table 3).

Section 3. Education of children who reside on Federal property or reside with a parent employed on Federal property.

Subsection 3(a) applies to children who reside on Federal property with a parent employed on Federal property situated in whole or in part in the same State as the school district or within reasonable commuting distance of the district, or who reside on Federal property with a parent in the uniformed services.

Subsection 3(b) applies to children who reside on Federal property or reside with a parent employed on Federal property (located as in 3(a), and under certain circumstances in the Armed Forces.

A school district may be eligible if the number of section 3 children in average daily attendance (ADA) is at least 10 and at least 3 percent of the total ADA.<sup>2</sup> Prior to enactment of P.L. 89-313 the requirement was 6 percent for districts which had an ADA of 35,000 or more in 1957, and which did not qualify for payment on the 3-percent requirement prior to fiscal year 1959. The effect of the amendment was to determine school district eligibility on the basis of the 3-percent factor in all instances.

<sup>2</sup> Average daily attendance is determined in accordance with State law and practice. By definition, the term means the aggregate days of attendance in a given reporting period divided by the number of days school was actually in session.

Applicants which do not meet the percentage requirement may be eligible for payment for two consecutive years following a year in which they met the requirement and received payment. The Commissioner may waive the 3-percent condition of eligibility when exceptional circumstances exist which would make the application of such conditions inequitable and defeat the purpose of the Act.

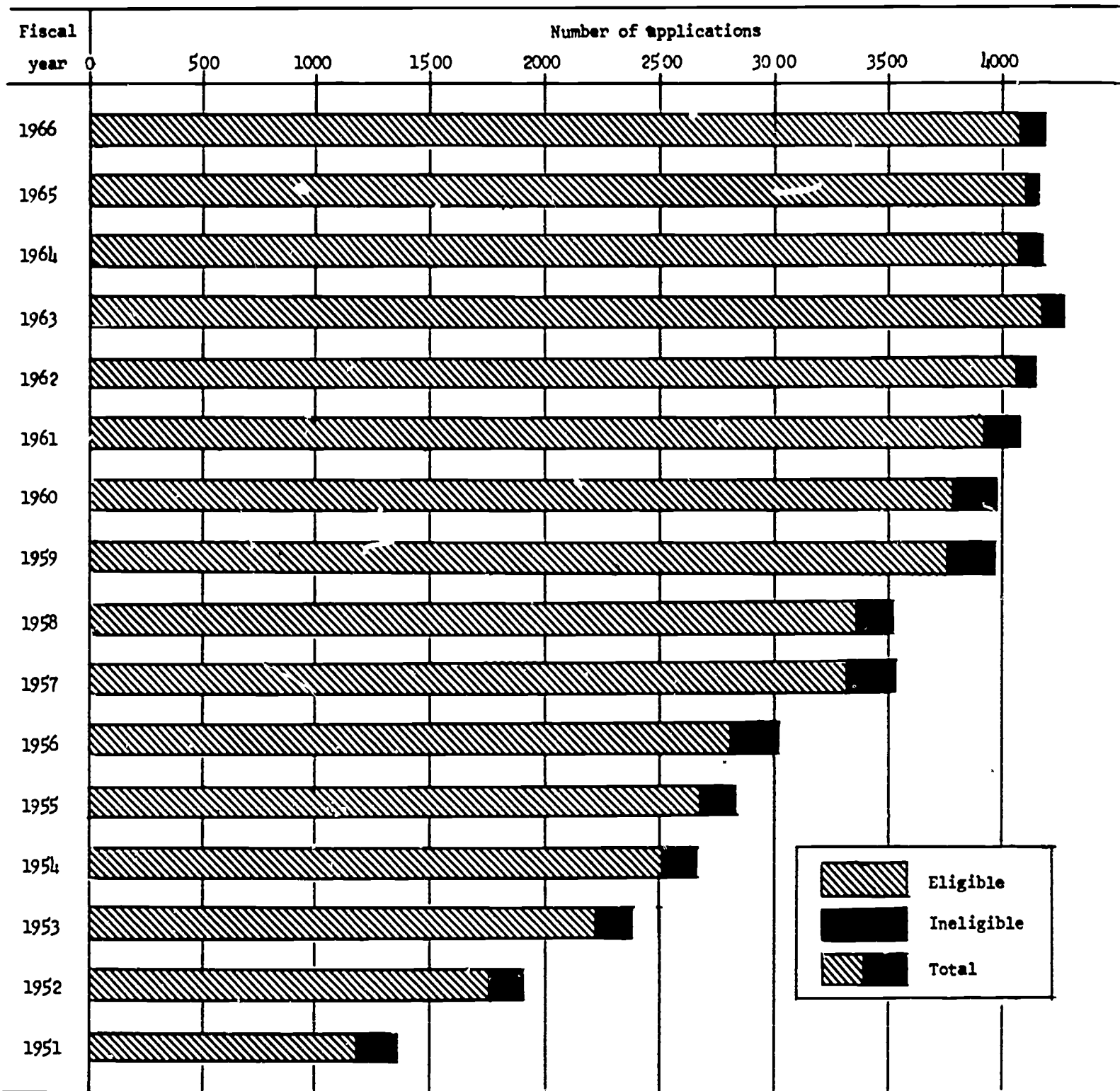
Subsection 3(c)(1) specifies the formula for computing maximum entitlement. It is the product derived by multiplying the sum of 3(a) ADA and half of the 3(b) ADA by the rate of payment (see Local Contribution Rate). From this gross figure the Commissioner

deducts any "other Federal payments" actually available for current expenditure purposes.

For fiscal year 1966, applications for assistance under subsections 3(a) and 3(b) numbered 4,192. The Commissioner determined 4,030 to be eligible. Gross entitlements totaled \$349,947,872 for 323,794 subsection 3(a) and 1,790,479 subsection 3(b) pupils in average daily attendance (see tables A and 3).

Subsection 3(c)(4) applies to local educational agencies where 50 percent or more of the children in ADA reside on tax-exempt Federal property.

A school district may be eligible if it meets the ADA requirement and if it is making reasonable tax effort and availing itself of State and other financial aid but is still unable to provide a level of education equivalent to that in comparable communities of the State. The law requires, also, that eligibility of the district for State aid and the amount of such aid for the Federal children be determined on a basis no less favorable than for other children in the State.

Maximum entitlement is the product of the accepted ADA multiplied by the per pupil cost in generally comparable districts, less the amount of State aid which the Commissioner determines to be available for these children. Of seven applicants claiming assistance under subsection 3(c)(4) for 1966, the Commissioner determined four to be eligible. Total entitlement amounted to \$264,672 for 5,487 pupils in average daily attendance (see tables A and 3).

Subsection 3(f) applies to those situations where the local educational agency has made preparations to provide free public education to a number of section 3 pupils, and that number has been substantially reduced because of a decrease in or cessation of Federal activity or by failure of such activity to occur.

Maximum entitlement is the amount which, in the judgment of the Commissioner, the school district would have been entitled to receive except for such decrease or cessation. Any reduction in current expenditures which the Commissioner determines has been made because of change in Federal activity is considered in determining entitlement.

Eighteen applicants claimed assistance under subsection 3(f) for fiscal 1966. The Commissioner determined two to be eligible for a total of \$479,185 (see tables A and 3).

Subsection 4(a)--Sudden and substantial increases in the number of pupils in ADA as a direct result of activities of the United States carried on either directly or through a contractor.--A school district may be eligible for first-year assistance if the increase in the ADA of countable pupils over the prior year represents at least 5 percent of the non-Federal ADA of that year. "Countable" pupils may include the increase in section 3 ADA over the preceding year if the applicant so elects. Other conditions of eligibility are reasonable tax effort, diligence of the district in availing itself of State and other financial aid, inability to secure sufficient funds to meet additional costs involved, and a showing of substantial and continuing financial burden caused by the Federal activities.

Maximum entitlement is the product of the accepted ADA and the per pupil cost in generally comparable districts less the amount which the Commissioner determines to be available from State, local, and Federal sources, exclusive of payments under this Act and local source funds needed for the education of other children.

Any district which received first-year assistance in 1965 was potentially eligible in 1966 for second-year assistance. Maximum entitlement is limited to 50 percent of the prior year 4(a) entitlement.

There were 18 claimants for subsection 4(a) first-year assistance in fiscal year 1966. The Commissioner found 13 to be eligible for entitlements totaling \$2,200,502 for 7,231 pupils in average daily attendance. There was 1 applicant for second-year assistance. The Commissioner determined it was eligible for \$74,349.

Subsection 4(d) is analogous to subsection 3(f) in the matter of substantial reduction in pertinent activities. The Commissioner determined the one subsection 4(d) applicant in 1966 to be ineligible.

Section 6. Arrangements for the education of certain children residing on Federal property.--The Commissioner must make arrangements to provide free public education for children who reside on Federal property when

1. No tax revenue of the State or any political subdivision may be spent for such purposes; or
2. It is the judgment of the Commissioner, after consulting with the appropriate State educational agency, that no local educational agency is able to provide suitable free public education for such children.

He may make these arrangements only with local educational agencies or Federal agencies.

To the maximum extent practicable, entitlement is limited to an amount per pupil not to exceed the per pupil cost in comparable communities in the same State (or the District of Columbia in certain situations).

In fiscal year 1966 the Commissioner made section 6 arrangements in 52 instances at a total cost of \$21,537,899 for more than 48,314 pupils in average daily attendance (see table 5).

Section 302. Transfer of funds to Federal agencies for services which they provide.-- Federal agencies may provide custodial, transportation, or maintenance services for children residing on Federal property and attending a school district which, because of State law or other factors, is unable to reimburse the Federal agency. In such instances the Commissioner may authorize transfer of funds to the Federal agencies to

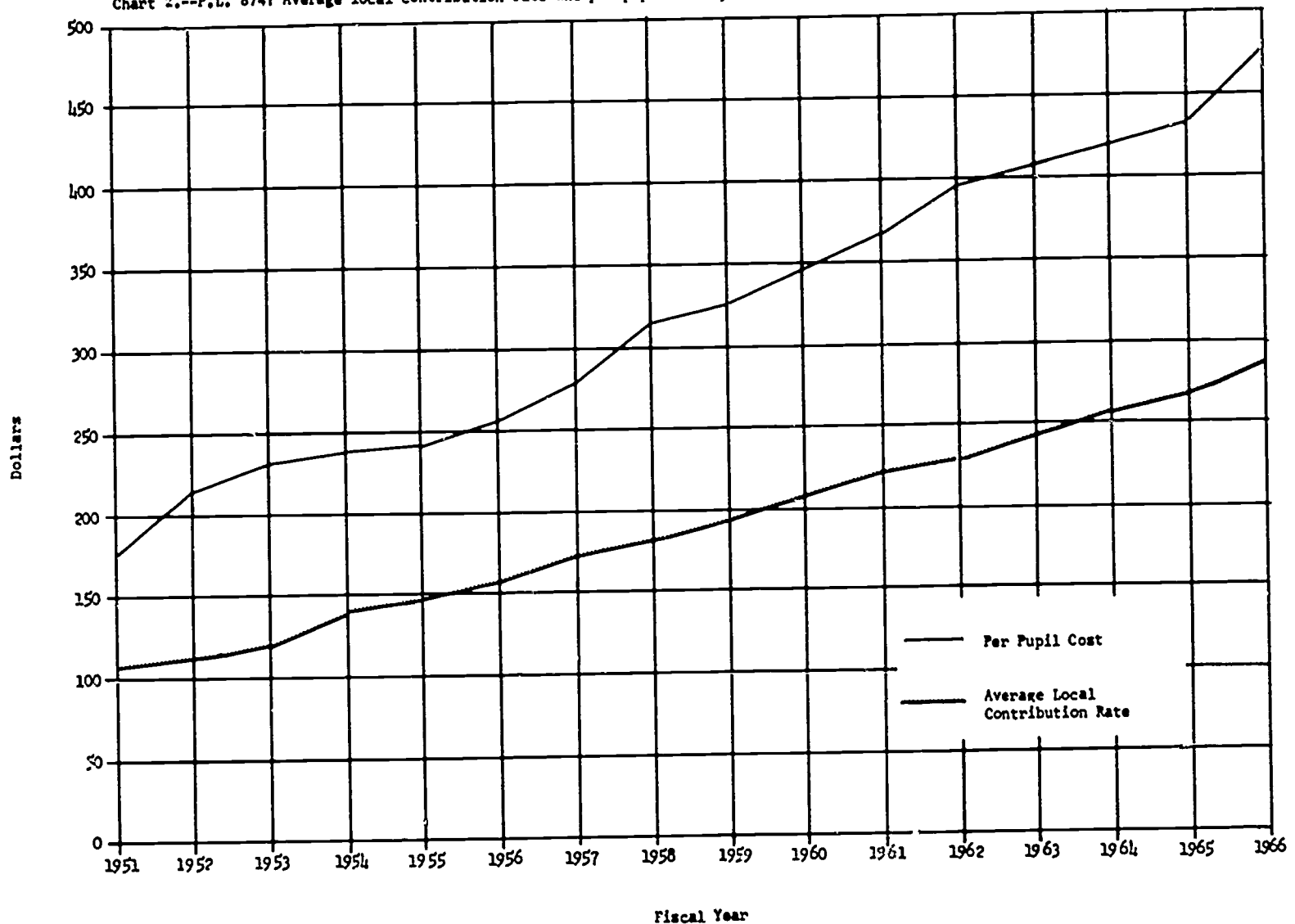
cover the cost of services provided. The same amount is deducted from the section 3 entitlement of the district receiving the services. The maximum amount transferred is the actual cost of such services for the year.

In fiscal year 1966 the Commissioner made eight such transfers at department level for a total amount of \$81,377 (see table 6).

#### Local Contribution Rate

The local contribution rate is the rate of Federal payment per subsection 3(a) pupil in ADA. Subsection 3(d) specifies the formula for its computation. In principle it approximates the current expenditures per pupil from local revenue sources in "generally comparable" school districts in the same State as the applicant. The Commissioner establishes criteria of comparability, and offers to State and local educational agencies two methods of determining comparable districts: (1) selection of individual districts and (2) State grouping of like

districts. It is the policy of the Commissioner to request initial recommendations of comparable districts from State and local authorities.

The local contribution rate for use within the United States is the current expenditure per pupil made from all local source revenues in the second preceding year in generally comparable school districts. The law has established two minimums, however: the rate may not be less than the greater of (1) one-half the State average per pupil cost in the second year preceding or (2) one-half the national average per pupil cost in the 50 States and the District of Columbia in the same year. Item (2) may not exceed the State per capita cost for such year.

Subsection 3(d) contains special provision for an increase in the local contribution rate for an applicant district because of increases in expenditures due to unusual geographic factors which do not affect the comparable districts.

For any local educational agency in Puerto Rico, Wake Island, Guam, American Samoa, the Virgin Islands, or in a State in which a substantial portion of the land is in unorganized territory for which the State agency is the local educational agency, or in a State in which there is only one local educational agency, the local contribution rate for any fiscal year is determined by the Commissioner in accordance with policies and principles approximating those used for determining the local contribution rate in other States.

For fiscal year 1966, the average local contribution rate per State ranged from \$230.70 to \$799.75 (see table 3). On the basis of estimated data available at the time of

compilation of this table, the average rate paid under subsection 3(c)(1) for all 3(a) and one-half the subsection 3(b) pupils was \$287.06.

The per capita cost used in computing entitlement under subsections 3(c)(4) and 4(a) is the per capita cost of the comparable districts accepted for local contribution rate purposes.

#### Deductible Funds

Subsection 3(e) requires the Commissioner to deduct from an applicant's gross entitlement the amount which in his judgment the district received from other Federal payments and actually had available for current expenditure purposes. These deductible funds include any payment made with respect to Federal property pursuant to any law of the United States (other than P.L. 874); property taxes paid on account of Federal property whether or not the taxes are paid by the United States; and the amount which the Commissioner determines to be the value of transportation, custodial, or maintenance services furnished the local educational agencies by the Federal Government. United States Forestry Reserve funds, Taylor Grazing Act funds, and similar funds are deductible only when the Federal property from which they are derived is used in support of the claim of the applicant and in an amount no greater than the gross entitlement for pupils connected with the property.

The law limits deductions under section 2 to payments made with respect to the property for which assistance is claimed under this section.

Funds deducted under sections 2 and 3 of title I in fiscal year 1966 totaled \$81,097 and \$4,740,707, respectively.

## RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS

Several basic tables relating program activity to funds appropriated and expended are contained elsewhere in this report. A general summation, however, follows:

#### Appropriations

By P.L. 89-156, approved August 31, 1965, the Congress appropriated \$347 million for payments to school districts. A supplemental appropriation authorized by P.L. 89-426, dated May 13, 1966, increased to \$388 million the total amount available for fiscal 1966. This total was sufficient to pay in full all requirements of titles I and III. Tables 2

and 4 show the total appropriated for each year the program has been in operation.

#### Net Entitlements

As of June 30, 1966, the Commissioner estimated total entitlements from the 1966 appropriation to be \$371,828,221. Transfers of funds under sections 6 and 302 account for \$21,619,276 of this amount (see table 2). The remainder, \$350,208,945, represents payments of entitlements estimated for local educational agencies which claimed assistance under sections 2, 3, and 4.

## SUMMARY

Fiscal 1966 marked the sixteenth year of the program of maintenance and operation of schools in federally affected areas authorized by P.L. 874. In that year 4,190 local educational agencies in the 50 States, Guam, the District of Columbia, and the Virgin Islands claimed financial assistance under sections 2, 3, and 4, title I. This total included 256 school districts participating in the program for the first time, and the following big city districts:

By June 30, the Commissioner had determined 4,080 local educational agencies were eligible for an estimated entitlement of \$350,208,945. This figure represents 4.72 percent of total current expenditures of eligible applicants (see table B). Entitlements of individual school districts varied from less than \$1,000 to upwards of \$8 million. Federally connected pupils in eligible districts numbered 2,122,912 or 13.62 percent of 15,586,905, their total ADA. The average local contribution rate paid for federally connected children was 60 percent of the average per-pupil cost in the eligible districts.

Payments under title I are available for current expenditures of all pupils in eligible districts. In 1966 they contributed to the

support of the educational program of some one-third of all pupils in public elementary and secondary schools in the Nation.

Table I shows, by State, county, and Congressional district, the name of each eligible school district and the amount of its estimated entitlement. Final entitlements are computed upon receipt of the applicants' final reports, due September 30, and reports of survey of the applicants' records by Field Representatives of the U.S. Office of Education. These reports are not available as of this writing. For this reason entitlements for 1966 are estimates. It is expected that final entitlements for 1966 will be included in the 1967 Annual Report just as final entitlements for 1965, as of June 30, 1966, are included in this report, table 1.

### PROGRAM TRENDS

Since the inception of the federally affected areas program under P.L. 874 in 1951, net entitlements have shown steady growth from \$29 million to \$372.3 million. The federally connected ADA of half a million in the first year multiplied fourfold, reaching 2.1 million in 1966. The average local contribution rate, \$287.06, is more than  $2\frac{1}{2}$  times the rate of \$106.82 in 1951. This growth is attributable to increases in school population, increases in school expenditures, broadened interest in the program by State and local officials, expanded Federal activity, and amendments liberalizing the basic legislation.

For example, P.L. 248 broadened the definition of Federal property and extended the 3(a) category to include children of parents in the uniformed services; P.L. 949 again expanded the definition of Federal property and extended the 3(b) category to include children of members of the Armed Forces; P.L. 85-620 changed the definition of child to include Indian children; and P.L. 89-313 standardized the 3-percent eligibility requirement for all school districts. In like manner, amendments have had the effect of substantially increasing the average local contribution rate of payment per pupil under section 3. Chief among these amendments were P.L. 248, establishing as the minimum rate for payment one-half the State average per pupil cost in the second preceding year, and P.L. 85-620 which set as a second minimum rate one-half the national average per pupil cost of the same year.

Despite marked increases, significant relationships in the program remain substantially the same. For example, although total net entitlements have increased each year, the proportion of total operating expenses in eligible school districts represented by these Federal payments has remained relatively constant. As shown in table B, this percent has ranged from 5.69 in 1951 to 4.72 in 1966, for a 16-year average of 5.02 percent. The major portion of total entitlements has repeatedly been paid to section 3 applicants, advancing from 78.9 percent at the start of the program to 92.9 percent in 1966. The percentage in the ratio of federally connected ADA to total ADA in eligible districts dropped from 14.91 in 1951 to 13.61 percent this year for an overall average of 14.8 percent. The average local contribution rate was 60 percent of the average per pupil cost in eligible districts in both 1951 and 1966.

In 1951 2.9 million pupils were in attendance in eligible school districts. This total approximated one-eighth of the Nation's public school attendance in that year. The 15.6 million pupils in attendance in ineligible school districts in 1966 represented about one-third of the Nation's public school attendance. Thus, Federal payments are now helping to support educational services for more than twice as large a segment of public elementary and secondary school ADA as in 1951.

## FEDERAL PROPERTY

The existence within or near a school district of Federal property on which school children live with their parents or on which their parents are employed is the principal basis on which payments to local educational agencies are authorized under Public Laws 815 and 874. Federal property, as defined by these Acts, is: "Real property...owned...or...leased by the United States...not subject to taxation by any State or any political subdivision of a State or by the District of Columbia." Included in the definition is real property "owned by the United States and leased therefrom and the improvements thereon, even though the lessee's interest, or any improvement on such property, is subject to taxation by a State or political subdivision of a State or by the District of Columbia." However, property used by the United States primarily to provide a service or benefit to the local area in which it is situated is not Federal property for the purposes of these two Acts.

Eligibility under most sections of these Acts therefore is based on the real property of the Federal Government on which school children reside or their parents are employed. It is necessary to determine whether the property is owned, wholly or in part, by the Federal Government; if it is outleased and to whom; ownership of inleased properties; purposes for which a property is used; and if there are permits, grants, or other exchanges between Federal departments which may affect its status.

Under certain circumstances, further qualifying determinations are required. In those instances where a Federal property and a private property are used jointly (commingled) and the employees' working time is divided between both portions, the percentage of time spent by the employees on each portion must be determined. If other Federal payments, taxes, or payments in lieu of taxes are made with respect to prop-

erties otherwise eligible, it is necessary to determine if such monies are deductible from payments under P.L. 874. Examples of deductible items are the payments in lieu of taxes on Reconstruction Finance Corporation real properties transferred to other Federal departments on or after January 1, 1946; payments from revenues collected from Tennessee Valley Authority projects; leasehold interest taxes levied on lessees of Federal property; and payments from United States Forestry Reserve funds, Migratory Bird Conservation Act funds, flood control funds, and similar funds.

The eligible Federal properties claimed by applicants for the 1965-66 school year are listed in table D. The 5,509 Federal properties forming the basis for applicant claims for assistance include approximately 213 parcels of Indian-allotted lands in Oklahoma which have been grouped as one property. Of the total properties, 384 were claimed for the first time this school year.

The summary, by State, of the number and acreage of eligible Federal properties claimed (see table 7) shows that the largest number of acres of Federal property claimed was in Arizona (more than 37 million). Alaska and California were second and third, with more than 30 million and 26 million acres claimed, respectively. Of the total acreage claimed, more than three-fifths (164,138,053 acres) are under the jurisdiction of the Forest Service of the Department of Agriculture, and almost one-fifth (50,657,290 acres) is controlled by the Bureau of Indian Affairs of the Department of the Interior.

According to the most recent report of the General Services Administration, the Federal Government owns 18,651 different "properties" throughout the United States. Applicant school districts have claimed 5,509 of these properties as a basis for payments under Public Laws 815 and 874 during the 1965-66 school year.

# PUBLIC LAW 815

## PROVIDING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR CONSTRUCTION OF SCHOOL FACILITIES

### PART I--FEDERALLY IMPACTED AREAS AID

#### PURPOSE

PUBLIC LAW 815 authorizes Federal financial assistance for construction by local educational agencies of urgently need minimum school facilities in school districts which have had substantial increases in school membership as a result of new or increased Federal activities. Assistance is also authorized for construction of minimum school facilities by local educational agencies for pupils residing on tax-exempt Federal properties, principally Indian reservations, and by the Federal Government on Federal property (such as Army, Navy, and Air Force installations) when no State or local educational agency can legally do so.

Payments may be made to local educational agencies where evidence indicates that there has been or will be an increase in school membership of children residing on Federal property, of children residing on private property with a parent employed on Federal property, or of children whose membership has resulted or will result from activities of the United States, carried on directly or through a contractor. Provisions of the Act are specific regarding the increase in the number of such children in the applicant's schools required to establish eligibility for

aid during any 2-year increase period and the amount of Federal assistance authorized. Congress has amended and extended the provisions of P.L. 815 a number of times since its enactment. Public Law 85-620, which the President signed on August 12, 1958, made permanent certain provisions of the Act concerning children who reside on Federal property. The temporary provisions have been extended several times since 1958 and were last extended by P.L. 88-665 to June 30, 1966. Thus, during fiscal year 1966, the provisions authorizing payment for all categories of federally connected children were in effect.

The law contains two sets of provisions under which Federal funds for school construction may be granted to local educational agencies. Sections 5 and 9 of the Act authorize grants based on increases in federally connected membership (under section 9 only if the increase is expected to be of temporary duration), and section 14 authorizes grants based on numbers of children who reside on Federal property and for whom responsible local educational agencies are unable to provide needed minimum school facilities.

#### GRANTS BASED ON INCREASES IN FEDERALLY CONNECTED MEMBERSHIP (Sections 5 and 9)

##### Estimating increases in membership

Each application filed by a local educational agency under section 5 or 9 is a claim for Federal assistance for the construction of school facilities based on an increase in federally connected children in the school district in a specific 2-year period. Applicants may file claims at any time during an increase period and the Commissioner is required to estimate the increase in the membership of federally connected children

as of the end of the increase period. By using Federal funds granted early in an increase period, a school district often is able to complete the school facilities by the time the increase actually occurs.

The Act, as currently amended, provides for overlapping increase periods. For example, the 1966 fiscal year covered by this report is the second year of the 2-year increase period July 1, 1964, to June 30, 1966, and the first year of the 2-year increase period July 1, 1965, to June 30, 1967.

### Eligibility requirements (section 5)

Three categories of federally connected school children may be considered in determining the eligibility of local educational agencies for Federal funds under P.L. 815 as amended. Two of these categories (subsections 5(a)(1) and 5(a)(2)) are based on the relationship of the children to Federal property. The children classified under subsection 5(a)(1) are those who reside on Federal property with parents who work on Federal property; the children classified under subsection 5(a)(2) are those who either reside on Federal property or whose parents work on Federal property, but not both. The Federal property on which a claim is based must be in the same State as the applicant or within reasonable commuting distance of the school district.

To be eligible for a grant of funds under subsection 5(a)(1) and 5(a)(2) categories, a school district must have an increase in membership in one or both categories of at least 20 children and equal to at least 5 percent of the district's total average daily membership<sup>1</sup> in the base year; i.e., the school year preceding the 2-year increase period.

The third category of federally connected children is defined in subsection 5(a)(3) to include those children whose attendance in an applicant school district is due to activities of the United States carried on directly or through a contractor. To be eligible for payment under this provision, the estimated membership increase in the 2-year period must be at least 20 in number and at least 10 percent of the total base year average daily membership. In addition, it must be established that the construction of needed minimum facilities for that number of children would impose an undue financial burden on the taxing and borrowing power of the district.

### Number of children counted for payment

In addition to the foregoing minimum requirements for increased membership, school districts are required under section 5 to absorb an increase of 7 percent in non-Federal membership during any 2-year increase period. Should a district fail to meet this requirement, the difference between 107 percent of the non-Federal average daily

<sup>1</sup> Average daily membership is determined in accordance with State law and practice. By definition the term means the aggregate number of days of membership in the applicant school district divided by the number of days school was actually in session.

membership in the base year and the estimated non-Federal membership as of the end of the increase period is deducted from the number of eligible federally connected children in determining the number of pupils counted for payment.

The number of pupils counted for payment is also limited to the number in excess of the estimated federally connected membership as of the end of a 2-year increase period covered by a prior eligible application or of the number of such pupils previously counted for payment.

### Amount of the Federal payment

The maximum allowable grant under section 5 is determined by multiplying the number of federally connected children to be counted for payment under subsection 5(a)(1) by 95 percent of the average per pupil cost of constructing minimum school facilities in the applicant's State during the base year; those to be counted under subsection 5(a)(2) by 50 percent; and those under subsection 5(a)(3) by 45 percent.

The amount is further limited to the actual cost of constructing minimum school facilities in the applicant district for children who would otherwise be without such facilities at the close of the increase period.

### Additional payments (section 8)

When certain conditions exist, payments in addition to the maximum payment under section 5 may be authorized under section 8. If a local educational agency is unable to provide the necessary minimum school facilities for the increased number of federally connected children by utilizing funds from all local and State sources available to it, and from the maximum Federal grant computed under section 5 of the Act, the Commissioner is authorized to make such additional grant as is necessary to construct such facilities. Also, when a project for which Federal funds have been approved is partially or wholly destroyed by flood, fire, or similar emergency during the construction period and the school district is unable to provide funds to rebuild the project, the Commissioner may make an additional payment. An amount not to exceed 10 percent of the appropriation for any fiscal year may be used for the purposes authorized by section 8. In no case will the amount of funds granted under this section exceed the difference between (1) the actual cost of providing minimum facilities for the federally connected pupils eligible for payment under the Act, or

the average cost in the State of providing such facilities, whichever is the lesser, and (2) the Federal funds which have been made available to the applicant under section 5 of the Act.

#### Assurances required

Public Law 815 provides that before Federal funds may be allotted to a local educational agency for the construction of school facilities, the U.S. Commissioner of Education must be assured that the applicant has or will have title to the site and will maintain the completed school facilities for 20 years. The applicant must also have legal authority to undertake construction of the project and be able to finance any non-Federal share of the cost of the proposed project. Assurances must be given that work on the project will be commenced within a reasonable time and prosecuted to completion with due diligence, and that the rates of pay for those engaged in the project will not be less than the prevailing local wage rates as determined by the Secretary of Labor in accordance with the Davis-Bacon Act. The local educational agency must also assure the Commissioner of Education that its school facilities will be available to federally con-

nected children on the same terms, in accordance with State laws, as they are to other children in the district, and that the applicant will supply the Commissioner with any information which he may reasonably require. In addition to the assurances required in P.L. 815, assurances are required with respect to title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Equal Employment Opportunity.

#### Providing facilities for local educational agencies with temporary Federal impacts (section 9)

The increase in school membership in an applicant district may be temporary due to the nature of the Federal activities involved. When this is so, the school district may request the Commissioner to allot to it under section 9 funds which would be equal to the amount necessary for the construction of temporary facilities, but which the district would use to construct permanent school facilities. However, the Commissioner must be assured that adequate school facilities will be provided for the federally connected children whose membership is considered temporary. As an alternative, the school district may request the Commissioner to make needed temporary school facilities available at Federal expense.

### **GRANTS TO PROVIDE NEEDED MINIMUM FACILITIES FOR CHILDREN RESIDING ON TAX-EXEMPT PROPERTY (Section 14)**

Section 14 authorizes grants for construction of needed minimum school facilities to school districts which provide free public education to substantial numbers of children who reside on tax-exempt Federal property but who cannot be counted under section 5 of the Act because they do not represent a substantial increase in the total number of pupils. The pupils covered by applications under this section are principally children residing on Indian reservation lands.

#### Eligibility requirements

An applicant may be eligible for payment if:

(1) The number of such federally connected pupils represents a "substantial percentage" of the total number of children for whom the local educational agency provides free public education. An applicant will be considered as meeting the substantial percentage requirement if (a) the estimated number of children who reside on Federal property as of the close of a 2-year increase period, and who are not otherwise eligible for payment, is in

excess of 15 and is at least 10 percent of the total number of children for whom the applicant is providing free public education at the time the application is submitted; or (b) the applicant is providing free public education for at least 100 children who reside on Indian lands located outside the applicant school district.

(2) The immunity of such Federal property from taxation by the applicant has created a substantial and continuing impairment of its ability to finance needed school facilities. (This provision may be waived if the applicant is providing free public education for 100 or more children who reside on Indian lands located outside its school district.)

(3) The applicant is making a reasonable tax effort and is exercising diligence in availing itself of State and other financial assistance available for this purpose.

(4) The applicant does not have sufficient funds from all other sources to provide the needed minimum school facilities.

### Amount of the Federal payment

The Federal funds that may be granted to a local educational agency is limited to the amount required, in excess of local, State, and/or other Federal funds available, for the construction of needed minimum school facilities for children who it is estimated will reside on nontaxable Federal property at the end of any 2-year membership period.

The Commissioner is authorized to make Federal funds available under this section upon such terms and conditions as he considers to be in the public interest. The method of making payment and of constructing school facilities under this section is the same as that established under sections 5, 8, and 9 of the Act.

## **FEDERAL CONSTRUCTION OF SCHOOL FACILITIES ON FEDERAL PROPERTY (Section 10)**

School facilities for children living on Federal property are usually provided by local educational agencies with such Federal assistance as they may be eligible to receive under section 5 of the Act. However, some State laws preclude the provision of free public education by State or local agencies for children living on some Federal properties. In these cases the Commissioner is directed by section 10 of the Act to construct or otherwise provide school facilities for the children living on Federal property. The school facilities provided under this authority have been constructed on Federal property. School facilities constructed under section 10 usually are requested by representatives of the Federal installations involved and, to the extent practicable, are comparable to the school facilities provided by local educational agencies in similar communities in the State.

In 1954 P.L. 874 was amended to permit the children of persons employed by the United States in Puerto Rico, Guam, Wake

Island, and the Virgin Islands, but not residing on Federal property, to attend the schools constructed on base for school children living on base if the Commissioner determined that off-base school facilities were not available and such attendance was appropriate under the Act. Public Law 89-77, approved July 21, 1965, authorizes the Commissioner, in determining the capacity of the school facilities to be constructed on base in these specified territories, to count children residing off Federal property with a parent employed by the United States under certain conditions. He may count such children, when he determines, after consultation with the appropriate State educational agency, that the construction or provision of such facilities is appropriate to carry out the purposes of P.L. 815; that no local educational agency is able to provide suitable free public education for such children; and that English is not the primary language of instruction in schools in the locality. This amendment applies particularly to Puerto Rico.

## **ADMINISTRATION**

### Participation by State educational agencies

State educational agencies participate in a number of ways in administering the school construction program.

No application from a local educational agency may be approved until the State educational agency assures the Commissioner that the project is consistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities and is fully coordinated with the State program of education.

The participation of each State is essential in establishing the construction costs to be used in computing grants for eligible applicant school districts. For this purpose, information is obtained annually from each State agency showing the total cost, capacity, total floor area, area per pupil, and cost per square foot of elementary and secondary

schools constructed in the State during the year preceding the year in which the data will be used to determine rates of payment. On the basis of this information, an average per pupil cost of construction is computed and submitted to the State agency for concurrence.

The approved 1964 and 1965 average per pupil costs of construction for each State are shown in table 11. These costs were used in determining grants based on applications filed for the increase periods ending June 30, 1966, and June 30, 1967.

### Assistance of other Federal agencies

Pursuant to authority granted under subsection 209(a) of the original Act, the U.S. Commissioner of Education arranged with the Administrator of the Housing and Home

Finance Agency, now the Department of Housing and Urban Development, for the Commissioner of Community Facilities, now Metropolitan Development, of that agency to perform certain construction, engineering, fiscal, legal, and related construction functions required in the administration of P.L. 815. These functions include obtaining the assurances required by the Act, examining final plans and specifications, and inspecting and reviewing the progress of construction.

The U.S. Commissioner of Education also delegated additional functions in connection with the construction of temporary school facilities under section 9 and with the construction of schools on Federal property under section 10. The Metropolitan Development prepares cost estimates, arranges for the preparation of plans and specifications, and supervises the construction of each project approved by the U.S. Commissioner of Education under section 10.

Because of this working agreement with the Department of Housing and Urban Development, only a minimum staff, versed in educational administration, is required for this program in the Office of Education.

#### Priority and relative urgency of need

When it becomes apparent that the funds available for any fiscal year will not be sufficient to pay in full the maximum allowance to all eligible applicants which have filed application before the applicable cutoff date, the Act requires that the Commissioner shall by regulation establish a priority listing for the approval of those applications based upon the relative urgency of need. The priority list consists of eligible projects arranged in order from the highest index number to the lowest. Funds are reserved starting with the project with the highest priority and continuing down the list as far as available funds will permit. Those filed after the cutoff date become eligible for approval when additional funds are made available and a new cutoff date has been established.

The priority index of each application is the sum of (1) the percentage that the number of federally connected children counted for

payment is of the total membership and (2) the percentage that the number of children determined to be "unhoused" in the applicant's schools is of the total membership. However, the priority index may not exceed twice the percentage that the number of federally connected children counted for payment is of the total membership.

#### "Minimum" school facilities

The Act does not define "minimum" school facilities. However, the Congressional Committee reports on the bill give considerable legislative history regarding the intent of Congress in this matter. They state that, in general, minimum school facilities are intended to be neither inferior nor substandard in the quality of the materials used in their construction and in the amount of space required for instructional purposes. However, it was not intended that Federal funds be used to construct single-purpose auditoriums, single-purpose gymnasiums, or other single-use rooms that would be used only a small part of each day, or to provide facilities more elaborate than the type of facilities the school districts in the same State in recent years have been constructing with their own funds. Minimum school facilities are defined by Federal regulation as "those instructional and auxiliary rooms (and initial equipment), exclusive of single-purpose auditoriums, single-purpose gymnasiums, and any built-in spectator space, necessary to operate a program of free public education for the school members of the applicant at normal capacity in accordance with the laws and customs of the State."

#### "Unhoused children"

Children who are "unhoused" or "without minimum school facilities" are defined by regulation as those children in membership in the schools of a district in excess of the normal capacity of available and usable minimum school facilities. As indicated earlier, the law requires that the amount of Federal funds approved for payment be limited to the cost of constructing minimum school facilities for a number not to exceed the number of "unhoused" children.

### APPROPRIATIONS

A total of \$1,284,643,000 has been appropriated by the Congress for constructing school facilities under P.L. 815 since its enactment in September 1950 (see table 12).

This does not include a balance of \$96,000 transferred to the Office of Education from the Atomic Energy Commission by P.L. 815.

## SUMMARY OF ASSISTANCE PROVIDED UNDER PUBLIC LAW 815

### Fiscal year 1966

This report reflects accomplishments under P.L. 815 for the period July 1, 1965, through June 30, 1966.

### Construction of school facilities by local educational agencies

A total of 115 local educational agencies filed applications during fiscal year 1966 for assistance under sections 5, 8, 9, and 14 of the Act, based on the 1964-66 membership increase period. When added to the 182 applications filed in fiscal year 1965 for the 1964-66 membership increase period, the total number of such applications for this increase period is 297. Of these, 175 were found to be eligible as of June 30, 1966. Only 21 of the applications filed for the 1964-66 increase period were for assistance under section 14. There were 57 applications filed by local educational agencies which had

not heretofore applied for Federal assistance.

As of June 30, 1966, 64 applications were filed for the 1965-67 membership increase period, including 6 from first-time applicants. Of these, 21 had been determined to be eligible and 23 ineligible.

During the fiscal year, 216 applications were processed or reprocessed and 152 found eligible. The eligible districts had a combined increase of 43,225 federally connected children, an average of 284 per district, counted for payment in 1966. Represented in this increase were 9,238 children residing on Federal property with parents employed on Federal property; 33,252 children whose parents either lived on or worked on Federal property, but not both; and 735 children whose parents were brought into the applicant districts as a result of activities of the United States carried on directly or through a contractor.

During fiscal year 1966, Federal funds totaling \$37,696,427 were reserved for 168 project applications, some filed during the year, some earlier, by 158 individual school districts. After November 1, 1965, the applications on file from 7 school districts were reprocessed pursuant to the "Special base closing provision" included in P.L. 89-313. The reprocessing of these applications resulted in reserving an additional \$434,804 in Federal funds for 8 construction projects. Fifty-six are for new school facilities, 91 for additions to existing facilities, and 21 for other facilities. These projects will provide an estimated 1,690 classrooms for approximately 49,185 pupils.

#### Construction of school facilities by the Federal Government on Federal property

During fiscal year 1966, 23 applications under section 10 of the Act were submitted by Federal agencies for construction of school facilities at 23 Federal installations. A total of \$10,364,287 in Federal funds was reserved during the fiscal year for 28 projects. It is estimated that these will provide 191 classrooms, which at normal capacity will house 5,486 children residing on Federal property for whom State and local educational agencies are unable to provide education. Of these, 4 are for new facilities, 16 for additions to existing facilities, and 8 for other facilities (see table F).

#### Transfer of school facilities constructed on certain Federal property in Alaska

During the year, school facilities constructed earlier under P.L. 815 were transferred to the State of Alaska under authority of the Alaska Omnibus Act, together with a number of Federal Aviation Agency properties. The school facilities were those at Northway, Yakutat, King Salmon, Bettles, Gustavus, and Cold Bay.

#### Summary - Fiscal years 1951 through 1966

During the 16-year period of operations covered by this report, 10,648 school construction project applications have been filed by local educational agencies in 50 States and

4 territories, and by Federal officials on behalf of various Federal installations. Federal funds totaling \$1,252,340,425 have been reserved for 5,980 projects, of which 5,572 were filed by local educational agencies and 408 by Federal agencies. Of this amount, \$1,092,650,071 has been granted to local school districts, and \$159,690,354 has been authorized by the Commissioner to build school facilities on Federal property (see tables 9 and 15).

A total of 1,683,821 federally connected pupils in all categories has been counted for payment on the applications filed by local educational agencies and processed to date. Of these, 275,789 (16.4%) were children residing on Federal property with parents employed on Federal property; 1,145,532 (68.0%) were children either residing on Federal property or residing with parents employed on Federal property, but not both; and 262,500 (15.6%) were children whose parents were brought into the applicant districts as a result of activities of the United States carried on directly or through a contractor. The school facilities constructed or approved for construction by local educational agencies under sections 5, 8, 9, and 14 of the Act are estimated to provide 59,789 classrooms and related facilities to house approximately 1,737,023 pupils. As of June 30, 1966, 5,118 of the projects were completed, 362 were still under construction, and 92 were still in various stages of preconstruction planning or awaiting final approval. The facilities to be constructed include 1,970 new school facilities, 3,146 additions to existing facilities, and 456 other or related non-classroom facilities (see table 15). It is estimated that the local educational agencies have added \$805 million in local and State funds for the acquisition of sites and the construction of the projects provided under P.L. 815. Of the 408 projects for which funds have been authorized for Federal construction of school facilities on Federal property, 324 were completed and 62 were either under construction or being planned for construction as of June 30, 1966. When all of the projects for which funds have been authorized are completed, they will provide an estimated 4,058 classrooms and related facilities to house approximately 122,045 pupils.

## PART II - FEDERAL DISASTER AID FOR SCHOOLS

### AUTHORIZING LEGISLATION

Public Law 89-313, approved by the President on November 1, 1965, authorizes the Commissioner of Education to provide financial assistance under certain conditions for the repair or rebuilding of damaged facilities and for operation of public elementary and secondary schools in areas affected by a major disaster.

This disaster assistance is authorized by section 16, added to P.L. 81-815, and section 7, added to title I of P.L. 81-874. Thus, certain definitions, limitations, and requirements in Public Laws 81-815 and 81-874 apply to the School Disaster Assistance program. These Acts apply to major disasters occurring after August 30, 1965, and prior to July 1, 1967.

Prior to enactment of P.L. 89-313, schools affected by major disasters were provided emergency and temporary assistance under authorization of the Federal Disaster Act (P.L. 81-875), administered by the Office of Emergency Planning. The new legislation enables the Commissioner of Education to provide permanent, rather than temporary, facilities for school buildings destroyed or damaged in a disaster, and, when necessary, to provide current operating expenses for not to exceed a 5-year period on a reduced basis each year. The Commissioner is further authorized to provide public school facilities and funds for operating costs for children from nonpublic schools that were damaged or destroyed by a disaster.

When the President declares a "major disaster" for any area within the meaning of P.L. 81-875, the Office of Emergency Plan-

ning defines the geographical limits of the disaster area and notifies the Commissioner of Education of the disaster declaration and the geographical limits of the area. These determinations authorize school districts located within the delineated area to make application for disaster assistance and the Commissioner of Education to take action with respect to these applications.

#### Determinations by the Commissioner

Before a local school district is eligible for disaster assistance, the Commissioner of Education must determine that:

1. Public elementary or secondary school facilities of such agency have been destroyed or seriously damaged as a result of the disaster;
2. The local educational agency is making a reasonable tax effort and is exercising due diligence in availing itself of all other financial assistance available for the same purpose;
3. The local educational agency does not have sufficient funds available to it from State, local, or other Federal sources, or from the benefits of insurance, to provide for the repair, replacement, or restoration of the facilities destroyed or seriously damaged, or to meet the cost of providing free public education for the children attending the schools of such agency; and
4. The local educational agency has made provision to accept in its schools children who were enrolled in private elementary or secondary schools whose operation was disrupted or impaired by the disaster.

### ASSISTANCE THAT MAY BE PROVIDED

The Commissioner is authorized to provide the additional assistance necessary for a school district to provide free public education and needed facilities upon such terms and in such amounts as he determines to be in the public interest.

#### Section 7, title I, P.L. 81-874

Financial assistance may be provided to a local educational agency under this section to assist, to the extent necessary, in financing the normal operation of elementary and secondary school programs; to repair damaged facilities, replace or repair equipment, materials (including books) and teaching supplies that were damaged or destroyed; to pro-

vide temporary facilities while school facilities destroyed or seriously damaged are being replaced or restored; and to assist in meeting the added operating costs of a local educational agency which accepts children who attended a private school whose operation was disrupted or impaired by a disaster.

The amount provided for any fiscal year is limited to the amount which the Commissioner determines is necessary to enable such agency, with State, local, and other Federal funds available to it for such purpose, to provide a level of education equivalent to that maintained in the schools of such agency during the last full fiscal year prior to the occurrence of the disaster, taking into account

the additional costs to provide an educational program under public auspices for the children enrolled in private elementary and secondary schools whose program was disrupted or impaired by the disaster.

Additional assistance may be provided for a period not greater than a five-fiscal-year period beginning with the fiscal year in which the President determined that the area suffered a major disaster. When assistance is provided for more than one fiscal year, payments made during the second, third, and fourth fiscal years following the fiscal year in which the President determined that the area had suffered a major disaster may not exceed 75 percent, 50 percent, and 25 percent, respectively, of the amount provided for the educational program for the first fiscal year following the President's determination.

#### Section 16, P.L. 81-815

Financial assistance may be provided under section 16 for replacing or restoring school facilities destroyed or seriously damaged as a result of a major disaster and for construction of additional public school facilities

to house children who attended a private school which was seriously damaged or destroyed and which is not to be rebuilt or repaired.

In determining the amount of additional assistance needed, the Commissioner is required to determine the amount of funds the local educational agency has available from State, local, and other Federal sources (including other provisions of P.L. 815), and from the proceeds of insurance. The additional assistance provided under the Act may not exceed the cost of construction incident to the restoration or replacement of the school facilities destroyed or damaged as a result of the disaster. Where the Commissioner determines that the district is financially able with its own funds to restore or replace a facility damaged by a disaster, but does not have the funds immediately available, he may advance Federal funds to the district for immediate use in restoration or replacement of the damaged facilities, such advance to be repaid by the school district upon such terms and conditions as the Commissioner may determine.

### ADMINISTRATION

The U.S. Commissioner of Education has delegated the responsibility for administering the program for Disaster Assistance for Schools to the Division of School Assistance in Federally Affected Areas. Regulations were published in the Federal Register on March 16, 1966. Staff in the field in the two most disaster-prone regions were given on-the-job training in the actions to be taken when disaster damage occurs to school facilities. Other regions received written and verbal instructions.

The Commissioner's authority to provide disaster assistance was made applicable

retroactively to damage to the public schools in Florida, Mississippi, and Louisiana, caused by Hurricane Betsy, which occurred on September 7, 1965. This retroactive authority made necessary a delineation of responsibilities between the Office of Emergency Planning and the Office of Education in providing disaster aid to schools damaged by the hurricane. It was agreed that the Office of Emergency Planning would complete disaster repair work authorized prior to the passage of P.L. 89-313 and that the Office of Education would provide whatever additional assistance was authorized under the somewhat broader authority of the new legislation.

### GENERAL PROCEDURES

Immediately following the declaration of a major disaster by the President and the definition of its geographic scope by the Office of Emergency Planning, representatives of the Division of School Assistance and of the Department of Housing and Urban Development, in company with local and State educational agency representatives, make an on-site examination to determine the extent of damage to school facilities caused by the disaster. Considerable time is required in making these determinations in cases of extensive or widespread damage.

#### State educational agencies

State educational agencies participate in the administration of the program for disaster assistance for schools in much the same manner as under the "impacted areas" programs. Applications under these programs are submitted to the U.S. Commissioner of Education through the State educational agency. The State-designated representative is required to review the application prior to forwarding it to the Commissioner, and to certify to the accuracy

and completeness of the application. For applications under section 16 of P.L. 815, the State educational agency certifies that the proposed construction project is consistent with overall State plans for the construction of school facilities.

#### Other Federal agencies

In addition to the arrangement with the Office of Emergency Planning for providing notification to the Commissioner of each declared disaster and the geographical delineation of the disaster area, certain functions in reviewing and appraising disaster damage to schools were performed during the year by representatives of Metropolitan Development of the Department of Housing and Urban Development. These are similar to those services performed for the impacted areas program under agreement between the Commissioner of Education and the Administrator of Housing and Home Finance Agency.

#### Applications required

Before payment for disaster assistance may be made to a local educational agency, the agency must submit an application through the appropriate State educational agency in accordance with regulations prescribed by the Commissioner.

#### Reasonable tax effort

In determining whether a local educational agency is making a reasonable tax effort, current tax rates for school purposes, ratio of assessed valuation to true value of property in the school district, per capita costs, bonded indebtedness, availability of State aid, and similar facts are considered. The financial effort being made by the applicant district in making funds available for school facilities and operating programs during the school year in which the disaster occurred, and the preceding years where applicable, is compared with the effort made by other school districts in the State.

#### Available funds

Under section 7 of title I of P.L. 874, in determining the amount of funds a school district has available for urgent repairs to school facilities, or for the replacement of equipment, supplies, and books, or the leasing of temporary facilities, consideration is given to all Federal, State, and local funds that are made available to the local educational agency specifically for disaster assistance, all proceeds from insurance on damaged facilities, equipment, materials, or

supplies, and any other funds available to the local educational agency which are not earmarked for other purposes and which are in excess of the amounts needed for the normal school program for the year.

In determining the funds available for providing free public education for any fiscal year after the first year of application, all Federal, State, and local funds practically available to a local educational agency for providing the basic educational program are considered as available.

In determining the amount of funds available under section 16 of P.L. 815 for repairing, replacing, or restoring school facilities seriously damaged or totally destroyed by a disaster, the Commissioner considers as available (a) all Federal, State, or local funds made available to the district specifically for repair of disaster damage, (b) those funds from the sale of bonds, funds for construction from current revenues, and other building funds committed or earmarked for the replacement of the specific facility that was damaged or destroyed, and (c) all insurance proceeds.

#### Priorities for approval of applications

Whenever the Commissioner determines that appropriated funds available for any fiscal year will be inadequate to provide the financial assistance requested under all approvable applications, he will, as provided by subsections 16(c) of P.L. 815 and 7(d) of P.L. 874, establish an order of priority for approval of applications after considering the relative educational and financial needs of all local educational agencies which have submitted approvable applications.

Section 7, title I, P.L. 874. Priority among approvable applications will be determined by ascertaining the percentage that the total Federal funds for which each applicant is estimated by the Commissioner to be eligible under the Act is of the total current operating costs of that applicant as estimated by the Commissioner, including the increased costs due to the major disaster.

Section 16 of P.L. 815. An order of priority will be determined by the Commissioner for all applications involving the replacement or restoration of school facilities in cases where the relocation of students in another school building or classroom was required because of the destruction of or serious damage to such facilities. The priority index of each application will be determined on the basis of the percentage, in descending order, that the number of children in the school district who are so relocated is of the total membership of all schools in the school district.

Assurances required under section 16, P.L. 815

Subsection 16(c) provides that before payment can be made an application must meet the requirements of subsection 6(b)(1) of the

Act. In addition, applicants are required to give the same assurances as applicants under other provisions of P.L. 815 as to compliance with title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and of the Equal Employment Opportunity Act.

### APPROPRIATIONS

Section 16 of P.L. 815 and section 7 of P.L. 874 both authorize the appropriation of funds for each fiscal year in such amounts as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of these sections. They also authorize the Commissioner of Education, pending such appropriations, to use funds appropriated for expenditure in accordance with other sections of Public Laws 81-815 and

81-874 for immediately providing disaster assistance.

For fiscal year 1966, funds appropriated for title I of P.L. 81-874 and not needed for that year were obligated for all disaster payments during the fiscal year. Separate accounts of obligations and expenditures for disaster assistance are maintained on a current basis.

### SUMMARY OF DISASTER ASSISTANCE - FISCAL YEAR 1966

Between August 30, 1965, the effective date of disaster school assistance legislation, and June 30, 1966, 11 separate disasters were declared, involving 11 States (including American Samoa). School districts in 8 of these 11 States have submitted 36 applications for assistance, and initial payments have been made on 4 of these. To date, one application has been determined ineligible and one has been withdrawn by the school district. It is expected that approximately \$6.1 million will be authorized in payments under the applications which have been submitted to the Office of Education under the new disaster aid legislation.

Major disasters declared since August 30 are listed below in chronological order, together with the number of applicants for disaster assistance, by State. All applications are under section 7 of P.L. 81-874 except two from Louisiana and one from American Samoa which are under P.L. 81-815.

## BASIC TABLES

DATA ON WHICH this report is based are presented as of June 30, 1966, and are primarily for fiscal year 1966 for P.L. 874 and cumulative (1951 through 1966) for P.L. 815.<sup>1</sup> In addition, entitlements for P.L. 874 applicants for fiscal year 1965, adjusted to reflect current figures as of June 30, 1966, are shown. For most applicants the 1965 data are final figures.

In these basic tables, references are made to specific sections and subsections of each of the Acts. The provisions of each law and of the principal sections are covered briefly in the text of the report.

**P.L. 874 Tables:** Show applications submitted, appropriations, net entitlements, and total current expenditures of eligible applicants; number of children eligible for payment, and local contribution rate; deductions from gross entitlements; value of transportation, custodial and other maintenance services provided by other Federal agencies; provision of free public education for certain children residing on Federal property; and number and acreage of Federal properties listed in applications for financial assistance.

**P.L. 815 Tables:** Show appropriations; estimated per-pupil cost of constructing minimum school facilities; applications and projects submitted and processed; increases in school membership eligible for payment and total enrollment; projects approved (those for which Federal funds were reserved, those under construction, and those completed); reservations of funds; number of classrooms

### Symbols and Terms Used:

- (1) Three dashes (---) are used in columns of certain of the basic tables to represent zero.
- (2) "Aggregate United States" as used in the tables includes the 50 States, the District of Columbia, and those outlying areas included under the provisions of each Act.
- (3) In tables 1 and 8, Congressional districts are given for each State. In most States, one Congressional district comprises a county; in some States a county may include more than one Congressional district. In these cases the number(s) of the Congressional district follows immediately after the name of the county. In other cases the State is represented by one or more Congressmen at large. When this is true, the name of the State is followed by "1 at large," etc. In some counties a school district may be situated in one or more Congressional districts. In the latter case the Congressional district number(s) follows the name of the school district.
- (4) "Public Law 874" as used in these tables does not include data for the new title II (Financial assistance to local educational agencies for the education of children of low-income families). That program is administered elsewhere in the Office of Education.
