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## REGIONAL EDUCATION AGENCIES.

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Basic needs of children and youth which cannot be provided by small rural schools could be realized by combining the resources and pupils of a number of local districts. Four types of organization are presented as possibilities for providing cooperative educational services: (1) autonomous districts with line functions; (2) semi-autonomous districts with line functions; (3) semi-autonomous districts without line functions; and (4) non-profit corporations. Strategies required for the establishment of regional service agencies are outlined. Data by county from Appalachian states indicates the median years of school completed for persons 25 years of age and over, and the number of persons enrolled in school by age group. A summary and recommendations are included in addition to a bibliography. (SW)

## REGIONAL EDUCATION AGENCIES

Economic development is dependent upon a trained manpower supply which, in turn, is dependent upon a pool of workers with a good basic education.

This paper outlines the difficulties that small rural schools encounter when they try to prepare boys and girls for a productive career in the modern world. Many of these difficulties are caused by sparse population and geographic isolation coupled with a meagre tax base. A most promising solution that has been recommended by the Education Advisory Committee to the Appalachian Regional Commission is some form of formal cooperative action by local education agencies.

The State education agencies of the Appalachian Region are aware of the benefits of such educational service cooperatives. Some of them have plans underway to implement the idea. In addition the Appalachian Regional Laboratory at Charleston, West Virginia, an ESEA Title IV agency as well as many Title III, ESEA centers are promoting school district cooperatives.

This paper is intended to supplement the specific plans of these agencies and to provide them with information and support for people and organizations interested in the topic.

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## I BENEFITS IN SMALL SCHOOL SIZE

Figures reported in a study made by the Department of Agriculture Economic Research Service show that in 1960 45% of all school districts in the U.S. employed 9 teachers or fewer. In 1961 there were 13,000 one-teacher schools and most of them were rural. This figure represents 12% of all schools and one percent of all school children.<sup>1</sup> Raw figures alone do not give a picture of what a rural school is. There is a lack of data and interest in rural students demonstrated by the fact that many studies are out-dated and few new studies are being made.

The nature of the small country town is such that all institutions are closer to the people in terms of involvement with the every-day activities of the institution. A rural school is no exception. The residents, parents and others, have continuous relationships with the personnel of the school, not only in the operation of the school but also as fellow citizens of the community. Often the teacher is a native of the area with many close, personal relationships. This makes for an identification of the school as an integral and important part of the community. Local pride in the school is traditional.

The school building is often the only structure capable of housing meetings. As a consequence it is the physical center of community activity. The principal is generally the highest paid and the best educated person in the community. For these reasons and for reasons of tradition, he has considerable prestige. Many times he is called the "professor" and can exercise influence in affairs other than education.

The small size enables the rural school to be much more flexible in scheduling classes and for varying the school routine to adjust to special situations. The Catskill Area Small School Project in New York State, demonstrated many devices that small schools can use to present a varied teaching program. A few of these are: multiple subject matter classes, correspondence courses under the direction of a teacher, flexible scheduling, exchanging teachers between schools, exchanging pupils.

This close feeling of identity is shared by those pupils who stay in school. The teachers know the pupils outside of the school setting and can adjust their instruction to individual differences. The pupils also know each other better. A much higher percentage of rural boys and girls participate in the extra curricular activities of the school.

It should be emphasized that these benefits accrue only to those who stay in school. It must also be admitted that few rural schools take advantage of these positive factors for a variety of reasons.

## II DEFICIENCIES IN RURAL SCHOOLS

A critical problem in rural schools is the dropout rate. By comparison, the dropout rate for 18-19 year olds in central cities is about 25.8% and that for all urban areas is 23.7%. For students in rural areas it is about 33.4%. 39.3% of the non-farm rural dropouts completed at least 10 grades of school in contrast with 29.8% for farm students. Almost half of the urban dropouts completed 10 grades in school. Rural areas have higher incidences of school retardation. In 1960 6.9% of urban youth between the ages of 8-13 were retarded in school compared with 11% of non-farm rural youth and 11.2% of farm youth. Additionally, only about one-third of all rural students go on to college.<sup>2</sup>

Part of the dropout problem is the environment of the child outside of the school. This environment is related to the educational attainments of parents. Data abstracted from the 1960 Census recorded in a table which follows entitled: Median school years completed by persons 26 years of age and over...1960<sup>3</sup> shows that in rural areas the educational attainment of parents is significantly lower than that of urban parents. This is reiterated by the fact that the Appalachian county data taken from the same source indicating the median years of school completed for persons 25 years of age and over by county and the number of persons enrolled in school by age group indicates that in Appalachian counties a large proportion of persons 25 years and over have completed less than the eighth grade. By number enrolled it can be seen that there are few children in 5-6 year and kindergarten groups. There is also a decrease in number of students enrolled in school between the ages of 15 and 18 years.

Fairly recently, Patricia Sexton<sup>3</sup> conducted a study which indicated that in an urban public school system, in cases where the family income was above \$7,000 the average achievement in school was above the student's grade level. Students from families where incomes fell below this amount were underachievers. There is no reason to assume that this phenomena would be any different for rural areas.

Health Services

Health services are less numerous in rural areas, this is only partly due to sparse population, it may be a consequence of insufficient financing. 30% of the American people live in rural areas and have only half the access per person to doctors, nurses, dentists and other health resources compared to urban Americans. Only 12% of the physicians, 18% of the nurses and 14% of the pharmacists in the Nation are located in rural areas.<sup>4</sup> In one state twenty-seven of forty-nine Appalachian counties provide no funds for health services. When funds are provided they tend to be insufficient for a comprehensive health program.

Of course, there are some health services available through other sources but they are not sufficient to provide very much of an educational or remedial nature.

A school nurse should be available not only to take care of emergency situations and accidents but also to conduct vision and hearing tests, classes in health practices, home visits for follow-up of defects uncovered in the health examination and the screening tests and to consult with other personnel such as cafeteria workers and teachers on general conditions affecting the health of school children. The nurse can also be helpful in suggesting methods by which teachers can observe significant symptoms of illnesses or defects in children so that a proper referral can be made. Rural schools seldom provide such a comprehensive school nurse program.

Physicians are generally part-time as far as the average school is concerned. Their function is generally limited to conducting a superficial examination that will uncover gross defects once a year. The school is rare which is inspected regularly by a physician to locate health and safety hazards. The dependence of rural schools on other public health services is a limiting factor in the provision of proper health services.

The school lunch program is generally better when it is supervised by a trained dietitian. It is true that many states furnish sample sequences of menus to school lunch personnel, which, if followed, will provide a lunch that is well balanced nutritionally. But, when the specific foods are lacking that are suggested in the sample menus, the average cook would not be able to substitute the proper ingredients.

Lack of health services is not the only deficiency in most rural areas. The size of the school precludes the offering of a sufficiently varied curriculum so that each pupil will have a choice of subjects suited to his abilities and to his educational goal. For instance, if a pupil wants to major in a foreign language he is apt to find either no offerings at all or only two years of the subject. It is generally felt that, to be effective, and to provide verbal fluency, a language should be offered for at least four consecutive years. Other instances of the result of small school size could be listed in all curriculum fields. It may be that the poor scores of rural children on standard tests are partly at least a result of this restricted curriculum.

### Effects on Students and Teachers

In a study made by Kowitz and Sayres<sup>5</sup> for the New York State Department of Education, it was found that efficiency in terms of cost is a function of school size. For secondary schools, smaller schools provide fewer courses at higher costs than schools of "optimum size" (688-756). There are also fewer types of offerings, fewer types of activities and a smaller number of student oriented services. Small schools were found to offer fewer classes of 10-35 students at higher cost than schools with the optimum population. There were also deficiencies such as fewer volumes in school libraries.

Another effect of limited choice of subject matter may be to increase the dropout rate. When there are restricted choices the poor student and the gifted student may both drop out of school from boredom. The needs of neither can be met by standard textbook oriented instruction.

Teachers are affected by small school size in several ways. A teacher may be requested to teach outside of his area of competence because a "warm body" is needed, this is not necessarily bad but many times, because of over-work, the teacher regards this as an imposition and not as a challenge and an opportunity. As a result the class is approached as a chore to be done - the pupils are the sufferers as well as the teacher. A small school does not offer stimulation through an exchange of ideas between teachers in the same discipline, a science teacher is apt to be the only one in the school. He does not find much help in exchanging ideas with the Social Studies teachers or the English teachers. Professional magazines and books can help to bridge the gap but the lack of opportunity for dialogue with other Science teachers results in boredom for him.

There are also few opportunities for in-service courses in the rural school. Generally the teacher must wait until summer when his urban-suburban colleagues are either working at supplementary jobs or travelling, in order to take the courses necessary to keep abreast of current educational thinking.

The Kentucky State Department of Education conducted a teacher turnover study in 1964-65.<sup>6</sup> The findings of this study indicate that in Kentucky over 25% of the teachers who left had from two to three years experience and that the median age of the teachers was between 25-29 years of age. The main reason for any teacher leaving the school system was found to be economic. The third reason given was that of not having enough time away from the students. (24.5%)

The restricted budgets of small schools do not allow for the released time of teachers to work on special curriculum projects, plan classes, make home visits and observe other teachers classes. Revision of curriculum is restricted to single text purchases and seldom has any relationship to the specific requirements of the local school population. Materials such as transparencies, overlays, locally made and assembled slides and strip films are a practical impossibility. Other commercial and institutional films and materials are generally housed at too great a distance to be useful to the small school. The materials which are available are generally focused on the urban or suburban environment and hence have less relevance to the rural child.

Equipment, texts, reference material and media of various kinds are in short supply in the small school. This tends to make the limited offerings even more limited and the teaching options available to the teacher more restricted. When a class is taught only with a text and a chalkboard, it is difficult to arouse the interest of even the good students.

The percentage of pupils with special needs is greater in rural areas than it is in the nation as a whole.<sup>7</sup> Data cited above indicate that poverty is more prevalent and as a consequence the number of pupils with special needs is also greater. Even at the national rates of occurrence of such deficiencies as mental retardation, blindness and hearing loss, there are a large number of pupils for whom no provision is being made at present in many rural areas.

The same factor, restricted budget, that prevents released time programs also works against the hiring of additional personnel to assist in curriculum construction and revision. Creative supervision is a help to new teachers and more experienced ones as well, even though curriculum is not being revised. A continual process of review and updating of subject matter requires the presence of a specialist in each of the fields being taught. Larger schools accomplish this through a departmental organization. Small schools are unable to provide the service.

Modern administration of schools is aided by data processing services. The uses of a computer range from scoring tests to controlling inventory. The storage and retrieval of information is critical to many aspects of the administration of the total school program, not only in the business sector but also in pupil personnel services. Small schools and districts, by themselves, are unable to finance this kind of service.

The housing of pupils in rural areas is generally poor unless there has been consolidation of some smaller districts. Those rural schools which have been built recently compare favorably with schools anywhere. Unfortunately, they are the exception rather than the rule. Often additions are made to inadequate frame structures and the new section is then subject to the fire hazards inherent in the old building. Rural schools generally lack laboratories and other special facilities so necessary to a complete educational program.

One of the most outstanding lacks of the typical rural school is vocational education. It is estimated that an enrollment of about 1,200 to 1,500 secondary pupils is necessary in order to offer a program of five different vocational areas and many sub areas.

The natural tradition in rural schools, abetted by the George Barden Act, has been to offer Vocational Agriculture and Home Economics. The small school was able to afford this course because, in the past, a supplement for the teacher's salary was provided in the Act. Now, however, with declining employment in Agriculture, the relevance of the emphasis in the course is being questioned.

There are several factors which contribute to the lack of vocational education programs in rural areas. One is the school size factor mentioned above, another is the expense of the program both in terms of facilities and class size.

Vocational facilities generally require a much greater allocation of floor space per pupil than an academic course. The generally accepted minimum is about 1800 sq. ft. of classroom space per class as opposed to 700 sq. ft. for the academic classes. Class size is generally smaller in vocational programs which limits the number of pupils per teacher. The vocational teacher is, many times, able to command a higher salary outside of teaching and therefore, is able to demand a higher wage than the academic teacher. A third factor affecting the additional cost of vocational courses is the cost of the equipment and materials necessary to conduct the class. When the above factors are matched against the meagre resources of the rural community, the lack of vocational courses causes no surprise.

A continuing dialogue between institutions of higher education and local school districts is very advantageous to both. The teacher education unit needs the schools in the practicum component of their programs and the schools need the college for in-service training and the



stimulation that comes from association with the higher education institution. A close relationship between two-year junior colleges and community colleges where such exist and secondary schools is even more important since a close meshing of the offerings of each should exist. It is difficult to do this since a multiplicity of small units makes communication and cooperation impractical.

The above deficiencies are inherent in small, underfinanced schools and school systems. Comprehensive long-range planning cannot be effectively promoted. Table 3 shows dollars allotted to each Appalachian state for educational programs sponsored under Federal auspices, FY 1968. More effective use can be made of these dollars through cooperative efforts.

A common sense approach to a solution of some of these problems is to develop some kind of a device which will increase the size of the unit. Consolidation of schools and school districts has proceeded in a regular basis throughout the country for a number of years. Between 1945 and 1966 the total number of school districts in the United States was reduced from 100,223 districts to 21,753. In nine Appalachian states mentioned in the study comparable data shows a reduction from 15,961 in 1945 to 3,266 districts in 1966. Many of these consolidations consisted of establishing a county system of administering schools and did not necessarily result in increasing individual school size. It did, however, result in the streamlining of some of the administration and planning procedures as well as a broadening of the tax base for the support of schools.

The Education Advisory Committee of the Appalachian Regional Commission has recommended that cooperation among school districts could help to solve the problems. Through Title IV, ESEA, the Appalachian Educational Laboratory at Charleston, West Virginia is concentrating on the voluntary establishment of educational cooperatives. Many states have recognized this problem and have developed multi-district organizations to meet some or all of the problems resulting from small school size. Thirty-two states now have some form of the "intermediate district." These districts (the specific nature of a few representative ones will be presented later) range all the way from purely planning mechanisms to operation of specific programs. Many of these units are single county districts which only partly compensate for deficiencies caused by the size factor, while others are multi-county organizations and cover an area as large or larger than some New England States. Many of the states with the single county units have operated under statutory authority that is outmoded. Those states with small counties are finding that for many purposes the units are too small; this is particularly true for the Appalachian States whose counties were formed for the convenience of foot and horse travel to County Court.

There are several general types of multi-county school districts ranging from a well-developed, state-wide network of districts, established by statute such as the Boards of Cooperative Education in New York, to an informal, permissive type of district funded by Title III of ESEA for a specific purpose such as exists in Kentucky. The first type to be described is one established by statute and the list will be organized by proceeding from those established with a highly developed structure to those with fairly limited powers and services.

Many of the multi-school district organizations are called "intermediate" districts in the sense that they are a bridge between the State Agency and the local school district.

State agencies vary widely in organization, purpose, and operation. Some are highly centralized and exert much direct control of schools. Kentucky for instance, operates its area vocational schools through its State Department of Education. Others are practically only advisory in nature and exert very little control of local systems.

All fifty of the state agencies derive their power from constitutional provisions, here the similarity stops. Most of the states have a state board of education, but some do not. In half of the states, the chief state school officer is appointed by the board of education, in some he is appointed by the Governor and in still others he is elected by popular vote. It is interesting to note that as an autonomous public corporation, no state agency is as complete as the local school district. None of the state agencies, for instance, has the power to levy taxes. In general, the only similarity is that most state agencies are charged with enforcing the regulations that are embodied in the state constitutions and statutes as they affect local school districts.

Local systems have powers that are established by provisions in the state constitution and by statute. They go by many names -- common school districts, independent school districts, union school districts, central or consolidated school districts, village or city school districts, county school districts -- but they do not vary as much as state agencies in general corporate structure. All have a board of education or school directors, they may levy taxes with or without, in some cases, a vote, they issue bonds, employ staff, secure state aid, enter into contractual agreements. They are in general public or municipal corporations although in some states they do not have all of the powers of a regular municipal corporation. In New York state, for instance, they may not secure surplus state

owned land free of cost but must pay a sum determined by an appraisal procedure. In many states the local school district is the most highly autonomous of all public corporations.

It is clear from the foregoing that small rural school districts have certain inherent strengths that should be built upon. It is also clear that there are many services needed by the rural child that cannot be provided by each individual school district acting alone. The proposed solution is to combine the local districts to create a larger body of students and to provide a wider tax base or other source of income to support the services needed.

Intermediate or multi-school district agencies exhibit a much greater variation than either of the above two. Twenty-seven state school systems have some form of agency between the state and local system.

The following information and some of the above is taken from a study done for the U.S. Office of Education by the former Department of Rural Education of the N.E.A.<sup>7</sup>

#### New York Educational Cooperatives

The idea, as mentioned above, is not new. New York for many years has provided a District Superintendent for rural schools who provided certain administrative assistance to local districts. They also performed certain of the regulatory functions of the State Education Department. In 1948, a statute was passed which made it possible for the district superintendency to become a Board of Cooperative Education Services (BOCES). During the years since the statute was first passed many of the smaller BOCES units have combined, creating larger areas and greater numbers of pupils to be served.

The governing body of a BOCES is a five-member board of education elected at an annual meeting by the members of the boards of education of the component districts. The annual budget of the agency is also approved at this meeting. The Board of Education of a BOCES appoints the district superintendent who acts as the executive officer of the Board. It also has the authority to hire the staff required and set salaries subject to the approval of the state.

A BOCES is financed by a charge on the local districts for services provided to them on a per pupil basis. The local districts in turn secure state aid for funds expended for both services and administration.

A BOCES does not have the authority to levy taxes but it may build and own property for vocational schools. The project for this purpose is voted on at a special election called by the BOCES, and financed and constructed by the State Dormitory Authority.

As an agency of the state department of education the BOCES, through its executive officer, has certain statutory authority over those component districts that are not super-intendencies. This function is, however, receding as the component districts get larger.

The major purpose of a BOCES is to provide services to local districts which they would not, by themselves, be able to perform. The services provided can be categorized in the following broad areas: Itinerant teacher service, administrative and management services, pupil personnel services, special education and vocational technical education. The following chart, listing some of the New York BOCES districts, identifies the extent of services provided in each of the above categories.

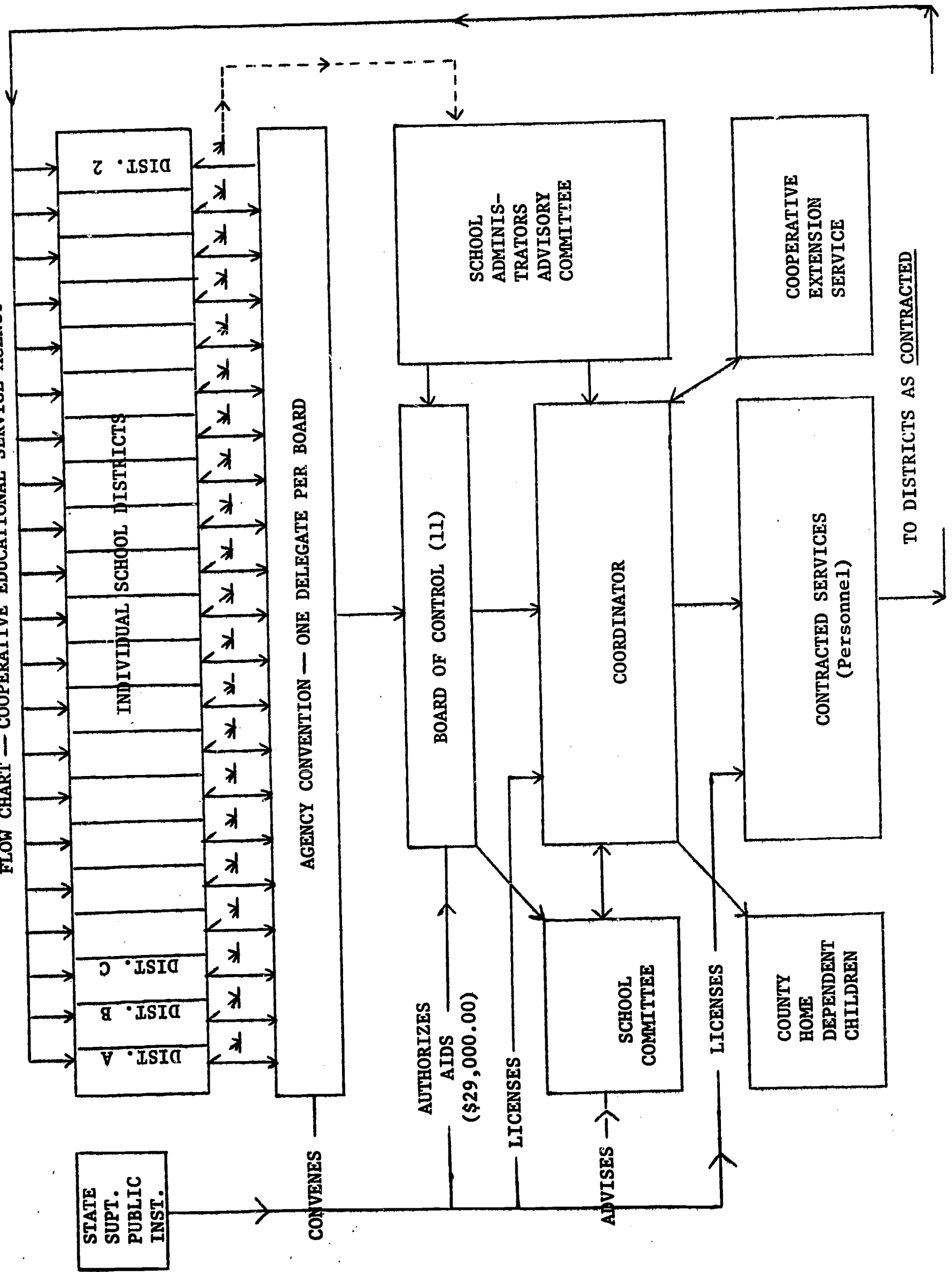

## Iowa - Regional Service Agency

There are three permissive organizational patterns in Iowa: The old county system with an elected superintendent of schools, the 1947 version which gave new powers to the county board and permitted their appointment of a superintendent, and a multi-county system which gave essentially the same powers to two or more counties acting as a unit. The pattern permitting multi-county corporations for both legal responsibilities and service functions is the newest. The statute providing for this method of organization was passed as recently as 1965. The first, and only, as of January 1, 1967, multi-county corporation under this statute is the Muscatine-Scott County School System.

The unit has a seven-member board of education elected at large in the two counties on a nonpartisan basis. The board is fiscally independent, can levy taxes and is eligible for and receives state financial support. It is a true municipal corporation. The board appoints the superintendent and sets his salary as well as that of the staff. The Regional Agency operates the schools of the multi-county area and provides other services as well.

This agency is not a cooperative, it is an enlarged school district that can and does provide needed services to the pupils. These services are in the following areas: special education, curricular and instruction services, an instructional materials center, pupil testing services, data processing center and research and development services. Others may be added at the discretion of the board of education.

This agency provides an illustration of the many adjustments that are necessary when two disparate, in terms of size, school systems are merged. Many of the services were not previously available to the smaller county and the many new relationships, consolidation and expansion of staff and other adjustments have consumed a large amount of time. To date it is successful and may be the forerunner of the possible 16 units provided in the Iowa master plan.

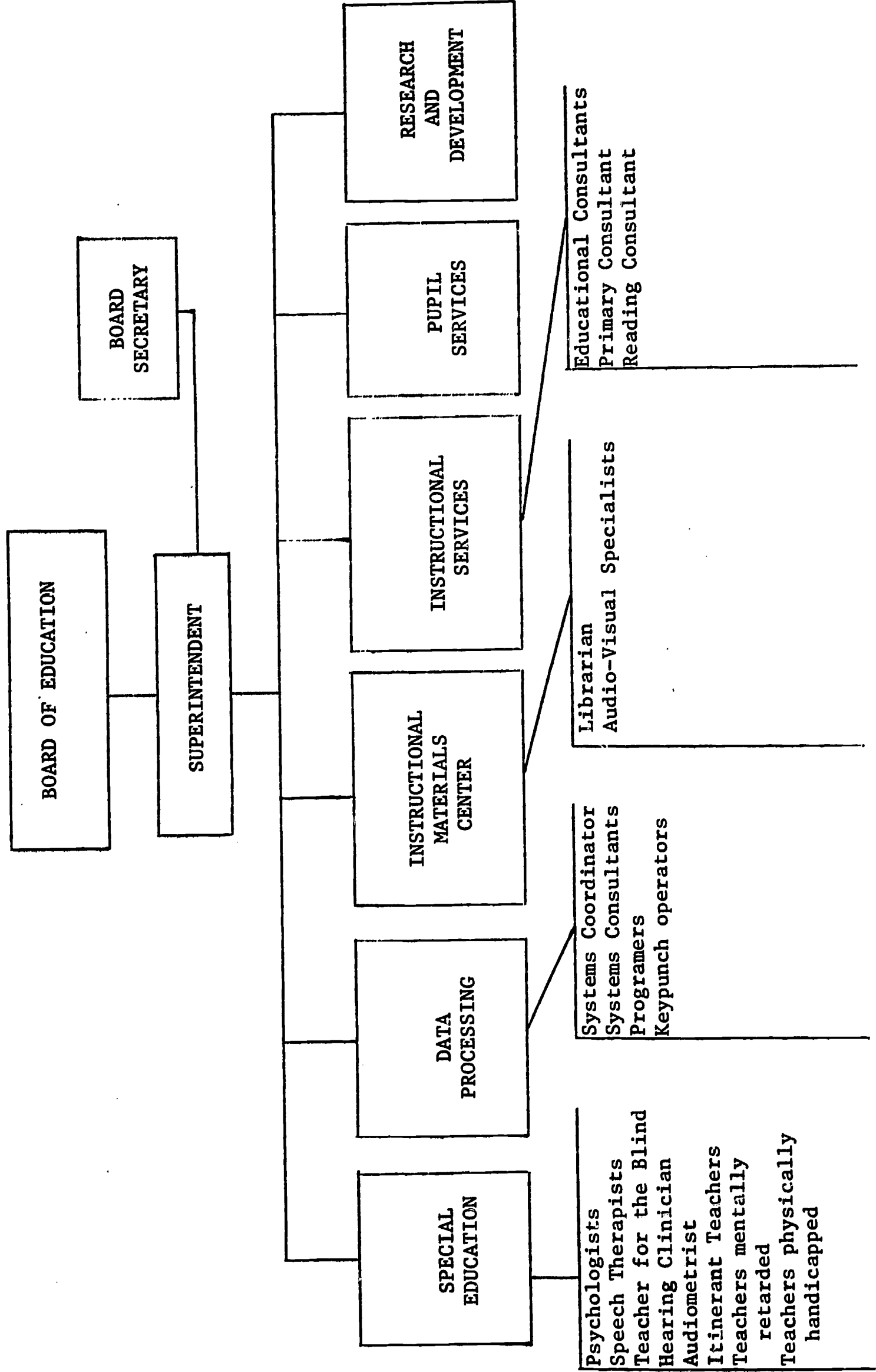
Iowa had originally proposed combining the above function with that of area vocational-technical schools and junior colleges. This was defeated in the legislature. Later the establishment of junior colleges and vocational-technical schools was combined in a permissive

statute. At present time, there are four area vocational schools and eleven community colleges.

Each is in a different state of development but all are well on the way to establishing the program in all counties of the state. The seven counties that are outside of the system may very well be, at this writing, a part of the system by now.

The following is a diagram of its organization.

This is an illustration of a "cooperative agreement" among component school districts. It is not incorporated and has no legal standing as a corporate entity, it may not receive tax funds or federal funds. Support is provided by a per-pupil contribution by member districts with a minimum of \$100.00 and a maximum of \$2500.00 for each district.

It has conducted area wide planning under a Title III, ESEA, grant to the Duluth school district, has made other applications for Title III grants and in July of 1966 it submitted two proposals to the Midwest Regional Laboratory.

The services planned are in the areas of curriculum development, a teaching materials library, psychological services and data processing services.

It was organized originally by the chief administrators of the area schools but school board members are eligible to serve on the Board of Directors. It's members are hopeful that this modest beginning will develop into a tight organization serving the needs of the schools in northeast Minnesota.

The following is the organization chart for this cooperative.





\* Texas - Regional Education Service Centers

A more extended discussion of the Texas Regional Education Service Centers is being presented for several reasons: The steps in planning are exemplary for a state initiated project; the subsequent success of Texas in its "packaging" of proposals for Federal funding; the use of advisory groups from the Centers at the state level; the extent of consultation with other area organizations; and the flexible nature of the final statutory authority.

Planning for the eventual division of the State into 20 regional centers began in 1950 with a study by the University of Texas, followed by studies by the Texas County Superintendents Association and the Texas Research League. These studies were culminated by a major study by the Texas Education Agency in 1956. These studies established the fact that a regional approach was needed to provide necessary educational services to local districts. One major fact established was that, even though extensive consolidation of local schools had occurred, fewer than 10% of the Texas school districts were large enough to offer the full range of services necessary for a full educational program.

After a period of planning and consultation the state legislature passed a law in 1965 authorizing the State Board of Education to provide for the establishment and operation of Regional Education Media Centers. The act stated: that each region should have at least 50,000 students (except for those areas where sparsity made it impossible), that it should be governed by a Regional Media Board of from 5 to 7 members which would be authorized to employ a director and prepare a budget. State aid was fixed at up to \$1.00 per pupil to be matched by local district funds.

This established the regional agencies for a specific purpose. The Texas Education Agency in the meanwhile participated in two Title V, ESEA, planning projects with other states. In recognition of the importance of planning the position of Associate Commissioner for Educational Planning was created.

Under Title III of ESEA, the role of the state to prescribe rules and regulations and to coordinate activity was emphasized. Other planning activities of the state had been started in library resources, language disabilities, mental retardation. An addition to the Governors staff was added earlier, the Planning Agency Council for Texas (FACT) was concerned with various projects in the State.

In order to make education more responsive to these efforts the State Board asked the legislature to broaden the functions of the Media Centers. As a result the present law establishing Regional Education Service Centers was passed in March of 1967. Two major additions were made to the 1965 law - 1. Centers were empowered to provide education services and to coordinate educational planning in the Region and 2. The center Boards were empowered to contract with and expend grants from public and private organizations.

Planning had preceded this official action. The State Education Agency consulted with the Governor's Planning Agency Council and combined the criteria with others such as the inclusion of an institution of higher education, a metropolitan area and other cultural resources. The original criteria, that each region contain at least 50,000 pupils was retained. All of these factors were weighed and the boundaries of the 20 Regional Education Service Centers were established

Prior to their establishment the State Agency met with local school officials to explain the plan and to revise the areas based upon the feed-back from the locality.

Since the SEA had been charged in the 1965 law with the responsibility for the selection of the regional centers board members a Joint Committee was established for each Region. This Committee consisted of one representative selected by the school board of each 12 grade district and one representative selected by the county school board to represent the elementary districts. This selection was optional.

The committees were to decide on the number of members on the regional board, to devise a method for their election within the state guidelines and serve the regional center board in an advisory capacity.

The advisory role of this committee was prescribed in order to reflect local opinion in its operation. It was to evaluate the services, to suggest changes in programs, and to recommend new services that should be provided.

The joint committees were also encouraged to develop by-laws for the organization as suggested by a model developed by the State Agency.

The State Education Agency also held meetings in each of the regions to clarify all points in the law and to describe the potentialities of the organization.

The guidelines specified that the Regional Service Center Board of Directors be a lay board, no one presently engaged in higher education or serving a local district in any capacity could be a member. It would be elected on a non-partisan basis so that the interests of all would be represented. These directors would be elected by the Joint Committee for three year terms and authorized to select the executive director, develop policies for the establishment and operation of the center programs and services. Each chairman of a regional board is automatically designated to serve as a member of a Statewide Advisory Commission on Education Service Centers.

The SEA developed materials consisting of guidelines and suggested by-laws and policies concerning government, structure, personnel functions, planning and program responsibilities and business affairs. The state plan also provided that the Board of Directors determine the location of the center but included criteria to be used in the selection. Included were other criteria to facilitate decision making such as the location of one or more service components in a satellite center.

The qualifications of the executive director were suggested in broad terms making it possible for each region to select the type of executive director best fitted to serve its area. He was also designated as his regions representative on the State Elementary and Secondary Education Planning Council. This makes it possible for local and state planning to coordinate their activities since he is given the responsibility to participate with metropolitan planning activities and other planning groups that affect his region.

To summarize, The Texas Regional Education Service Centers have four major purposes:

1. To operate the regional education media center. The first

task of the center staff is to plan for and to implement the education media services. All media services offered by the center will be those identified by a continuing study of media needs and resources.

2. To coordinate and encourage development of projects funded under Title III of ESEA. Familiar with regional needs and resources, the education service center staff will be in a unique position to strengthen the Title III program the region by assisting local district staffs in planning and developing projects designed to pilot innovative ideas and programs. Moreover, provision is made in the rules and regulations of the State Education Agency concerning federally funded projects, whereby projects may be funded as education service centers.
3. To provide a locally-oriented base for regional and state-wide educational planning. In carrying out this function, the center must reflect the needs of the region it serves and must have the capacity for dealing with change. Therefore, the center must provide for continuing study of regional needs based upon collection and analysis of information concerning demographic patterns, economic growth and change, and societal trends. Regional educational planning has a high priority among the criteria established by the State Education Agency for determining projects to be recommended for funding under Title III of ESEA.
4. To provide such additional educational services as may be needed in the region. Major dimensions of this broadly stated function have been identified to include the following:
  - Encourage the development of educational manpower through both preservice and in-service education for school staffs.
  - Provide for pupil diagnostic services--evaluation, treatment, and coordination--not now available in all schools.
  - Supply supporting instructional services, including curriculum development and assistance to school staffs.
  - Provide enrichment programs for a typical pupils.
  - Develop and provide new services as needed and desired in a region.

Progress to date:

- All of the 20 regional center boards of directors had been organized by June 1967.
- Each of the regions has received a grant under Title III of ESEA for planning and to employ essential staff.
- Each regional center board had employed an executive director by July 1967.
- All 20 regional center staffs include at least one professional staff member, in addition to the executive director, to direct the education media program.
- The local districts participating in the education media program have 70 percent of the total pupil ADA in the state. There are indications that the percentage of participation will rise next year.

The procedures followed in Texas have been described completely so that a practical illustration could be given of a State initiated program that involved the planning by local districts for the provision of local service by a regional agency. One of the probable results of this planning is the success Texas has experienced in presenting a single "package" proposal for the use of multiple sources of Federal funds in the state.



Options available for the establishment  
of Regional Education Agencies

A general definition of a regional education agency is that it is an organization representing an area comprising two or more local school districts. The options available to the promoters of such a district are outlined below.

The continuum along which the legal status of a cooperative could be established is as follows:

Of the organizations described above the Muscatine-Scott County School System is an Autonomous Public Corporation while the Education Research and Development Council of Northeast Minnesota is an extreme example of the non-profit group, it is not incorporated. The New York BOCES is an illustration of a semi-autonomous public corporation with line functions, the Texas units are without line functions.

It should be emphasized that the movement toward area educational cooperatives is proceeding at various stages of development in many states. There is no one, "best" way to upgrade the education of rural boys and girls. The statutory options available are in four broad categories:

1. The governing board
2. Responsibilities and opportunities of the board
3. Financial arrangements
4. Required and permissive programs

Under Option #1 the follow items need attention:

- 1.1 Who selects board members - how
- 1.2 Qualifications
- 1.3 Number
- 1.4 Terms of Office
- 1.5 Meetings - number



In the prototype organizations mentioned there are several alternatives available on the above options. The Board members may be nominated by petition, from each school district, by a special committee and by other means. The members may be appointed. They may be required to be a member of a local board or they may be required to be disassociated from any similar group. There are many options available and these selected should be chosen to implement best the purposes for which the area agency is being created.

Election procedures vary all the way from special elections on a non-partisan basis to partisan elections held as a part of the regular general election of all public officials. The recommended form is a board of from 5 to 9 laymen elected by all eligible voters of the area at a special election on a non-partisan basis. The terms of the members should overlap to provide continuity.

The powers, duties and responsibilities of any board of this kind determined only by legislative authority. A public corporation does not have residual power. It is, of course, possible for the legislation to specify a single power for a service agency, such as the establishment in Texas of the regional media boards. However, a broader definition of powers and duties which maintain the integrity and independence of the local district is recommended. An illustration of the wording of such a statute is quoted here from the Wisconsin law: "The organization of school districts in Wisconsin is such that there is a recognized need for some type of a service unit between the local district and state superintendent level. There is hereby created such units designed to serve educational needs in all areas of Wisconsin. Such cooperative educational service agencies are created by the state as a convenience for local districts in cooperatively providing special educational services to teachers, students, school boards, administrators and others and may include, but is not restricted because of enumeration, such programs of research; special student classes; data collection, processing, and dissemination; inservice programs; and liaison between the state and local school districts."

The most critical feature of a statute is that which concerns itself with finance. There are only four sources of revenue, possibly five, and only three are at the disposal of a legislature. They are - local taxes, area taxes and state taxes. Federal funds may or may not be available and gifts for special purposes from individuals or foundations are not a consistent way to provide for operation.

In many states, particularly in the Appalachian region, many local districts have reached the statutory limit of taxation for school purposes. Any statute creating an area service unit would, therefore, require either a lifting of this limitation on the local district for the purpose of supporting the area service unit or the granting to the unit a taxing power of its own. In either event, it would be possible for the statute to include a method for the state to participate, probably according to recognized equalization procedures. In any event, the board of the area unit should have fiscal independence within the statutory provisions.

The statute should include a provision for authority of the board to contract with local agencies for special services and to receive gifts. The point should be made that any plan for providing financial assistance to a regional service agency should be made within the context of the financing of all educational activities in a state. It should not be an isolated action.

Other considerations such as the authority to own property and issue bonds are special considerations and depend in part on whether an autonomous public corporation is contemplated or not. There are illustrations of both.

When the statute mentions the duties and responsibilities the purpose of the statute must be kept in mind. If even some of the deficiencies mentioned above are present the board of the regional agency must be left as free as possible to supplement the efforts of the localities to improve the education of pupils. However, experience has shown that local districts must have a measure of freedom in selecting and participating in those extra services which will best help them in providing a better education to their pupils. Local districts should have a mechanism through which they can influence the policy decisions of the regional agency. The state education agency should also be involved in the process in a non-controlling fashion. In other words, the statute should insure that the regional service agency is a part of the entire state system and not simply an accretion on one part of it.

The following chart, taken from a document prepared by the Department of Rural Education of the NEA for the U.S. Office of Education is descriptive of the existence of the possible options

in the regional agencies identified. The progression from left to right is from an autonomous public corporation to the cooperative type of organization.

Since this chart was prepared, the New York State Law concerning BOCES was amended to permit a BOCES to build and own property. It is not, strictly speaking, a bonding authority since the State Dormitory Authority is involved.

### Strategies for Implementation

The strategies required for the establishment of regional service agencies are as varied as the education laws of the various states. The first requirement is to determine the need for this kind of organization. Need in this sense, refers to services for children and youth that will improve their education; that will make it possible for rural high school graduates to compete with the graduate of more affluent communities; that will make it possible for the school system to provide those specialized subjects and services so necessary in modern society.

The State of Virginia is an illustration of the use of Title III, ESEA, centers to promote regional corporation for specific purposes. The State Department of Education has begun a study of the special education needs of the school districts in cooperation with about 40 school systems lacking such classes. Data is currently being collected and a follow-up meeting is to be held to plan for regional programs as indicated by the data. Already ten small school districts in southwest Virginia are planning to install special classes after a survey of need is completed. The Appalachian Education Laboratory of Charleston, West Virginia, is the co-sponsor of the project. Other plans are underway in other areas of the state.

The significant point of this and other efforts is that it is focused on a particular educational program. A definite need is quantified and the local districts may do one of two things (or both at once): the district may pool its resources with its neighbor's and by using its own funds and others, Title III, ESEA for instance, conduct cooperative classes or it may cooperate with a state agency, as in Texas, to pass or amend legislation at the state level that would authorize and finance the program. It appears that the strategy of identifying one or two obvious deficiencies and coupling these with a specific proposal for inter-district action is a successful strategy for promoting a regional education service agency. Kentucky, for instance, with its state-wide network of area vocational schools could institute vocational guidance in the local schools as a function of the vocational school. Texas widened the scope of its media centers even before they were operational.

At the present time it appears that Centers established under Title III of ESEA provide one vehicle for establishing such regional cooperatives. Overton County, Tennessee, is an illustration of a wide number of functions from planning to services that such a voluntary grouping will allow under Title III.



Other funding has been secured. This Center also has established a creative relationship with Tennessee Polytechnic Institute which is providing helpful to both.

Another illustration of the possibilities for cooperation between a Title III Center and an institution of higher education is the 18 county unit in Kentucky funded through Title III, ESEA, housed at and cooperating with Morehead State University.

In some cases additional legislation would not be required, particularly if the decision is to move in the direction of the non-profit voluntary association. Many states have permissive legislation making it possible for school districts to associate voluntarily and to pool public funds for that purpose. In other states, enabling legislation may be necessary particularly if capital outlay is anticipated. No single model statute could apply to all situations because of the variations in state school laws.

Probably the easiest strategy would be the above--by permissive legislation revise the mission of the Title III Centers sufficiently so that a basic functional unit is not dependent on outside source for continued existence.

The second strategy.

If there is resistance to using Title III Centers in this fashion because of a different view as to their mission or for any other valid reason, it appears that the establishment of a voluntary cooperative group of school districts would be the next most practical way of beginning.

It may be that some form of cooperative may already exist in the form of group purchasing of some kind. Many times neighboring school districts pool their fuel oil purchases to secure a lower bid. This voluntary, informal, association could be made formal through a written agreement. Other services could be added as, for instance, the Minnesota group could very well be a prototype for other areas of the state to emulate and might, if proven successful, be the basis for action by the legislature to place such groups within the framework of official education agencies.

Other states have formed education cooperatives for many purposes. New York State has a network of such agencies. One of the first to be formed is the Metropolitan School Study Council, a tri-state, mult-

district, group organized through Teachers College, Columbia University. Other groups of school districts within the state have formed similar councils, the Mid-Hudson Study Council has been a force for planning in its region and one of the newest-- Suffolk County Organization for the Promotion of Education (SCOPE) is both a planning and a service cooperative. These organizations generally encompass a larger area than a BOCES and are more concerned with research and development and long-range planning than they are with providing specific services. SCOPE, for instance, has organized fifty-seven in-service courses in a single year as well as sponsoring school board institutes and other short-term, informational and planning activities.

Other states in the Appalachian Region probably have other illustrations of voluntary cooperation which could form the basis for the formation of a more formal service and planning group. It should be emphasized that successful, voluntary cooperatives generally are formed in conjunction with a college or university.

### The Third Strategy

Several states in the Appalachian Region have decided that a larger school unit of some kind is necessary in order to fill a need throughout the state. The realization of the existence of this need may have come about through experience with the above two types of multi-district organization or it may not.

The Pennsylvania State Board of Education, as reported by Severino Stefanon, Secretary to the Board, has been working toward the establishment of a system of regional agencies, or intermediate districts, since 1959. With the cooperation of many of the superintendents of schools in the state, the Governor appointed a Commission on Education which reported in 1960. This report recognized the need for the reorganization of school districts and intermediate units.

In 1962, a Governor's Committee of 100 for Better Education was established. This was a broad-based Committee which made recommendations for legislation based on all parts of the 1960 report except that section relating to intermediate units.

The legislature followed up the 1960 report on intermediate units in 1965 and authorized a complete study of the formation of multi-county regional agencies by the State Board of Education. This was completed in 1967. Three major committees were organized to make the study, a Legislative Advisory Committee made up of representatives and state senators, a General Advisory Committee made up of selected people from the general public and a Department of Public Instruction Committee. Three task forces worked on the role of the intermediate unit, legislation necessary and methods of finance.

The State Board of Education presented its report in January of 1967. At the present writing, July 1968, the legislation necessary to establish this type of Regional Education Agency in Pennsylvania has been re-reported favorably from committee and appears to be well on the way toward adoption. There have been several revisions of the 1967 report but the final version appears to reflect the desires of all shades of opinion in the State.

The experience of Texas and Pennsylvania seems to show that if a definite need is established and if opportunity is provided for everyone concerned to work on the proposal that state-wide planning can create Regional Education Agencies for the improvement of services to school children.

### Summary

There are basic needs of children and youth that small rural schools cannot provide. By combining the resources and pupils of a number of local districts, it is possible to provide those services the local districts desire. Four types of organizations have been presented which represent the range of possibilities for organizing such districts; they are:

1. Autonomous districts with line functions
2. Semi-autonomous districts with line functions
3. Semi-autonomous districts without line functions
4. Non-profit corporations

The strategy for securing the adoption of these types would be different for each. The one common denominator is services to children and youth; these services can be grouped around the following classifications:

Instructional materials services....curriculum  
Laboratory, books, films, recordings,  
exhibits

Instructional supervision and coordination

Special consultants....reading improvement,  
speech correction, subject matter specialist,  
curriculum development, etc.

Services for exceptional children....gifted,  
retarded, physically handicapped, homebound

Trade and industrial education

Special itinerant teachers....such as art, music, health

Pupil personnel services....attendance supervision,  
guidance and counseling, testing

Psychological and psychiatric services....both diagnostic  
and semi-clinical

Professional personnel services....teacher recruitment,  
substitute teacher pool, policy coordination

In-service education programs....school board members,  
bus drivers, custodians, lunch personnel, teachers

Centralized purchasing

Pupil transportation services....consultative service,  
bus maintenance, driver recruitment

School building services....planning and maintenance  
clinics, architectural services

Financial services....accounting, auditing, financial  
counseling, reporting

Communication services....reports, handbooks, public  
information, radio, television

Research services

Finally, for the benefit to both, an institution of  
higher learning should be associated with the regional agency.

### Recommendations

Since permanent economic development is dependent upon the establishment of a supply of trained manpower, since the base of all manpower development is a good basic education, and since it has been demonstrated that small rural schools are handicapped in this effort, it is therefore recommended that the Appalachian Regional Commission adopt, as a priority, the establishment of Regional Education Agencies and that funds be made available from sections 211, 214, 202 and 302 to assist in accomplishing this purpose.



1. It is recommended that the Commission, *Give preference to*
  - a. Include health services to schools in the 202 demonstration projects;
  - b. the funding of area vocational-technical schools which have, either through a charter or statutory authority, the capability of providing services in addition to vocational-technical courses;
  - ~~c. authorize 211 funds for the construction of administrative buildings for regional services;~~
  - d. without diminishing vocational education funds and where the vocational-technical center has a proper charter or authority make money available for feasibility and planning studies for regional service agencies based on existing LDD boundaries;
  - e. give preference in any of the above funding programs to those regional education agencies which incorporate the active participation of institutions of higher learning; and
  - f. that a statement of guidelines be developed in cooperation with the states of the region.
2. It is recommended that:
  - a. Title III, ESEA, federal guidelines be revised to reflect the need for continuing financial assistance for the planning and operational aspects of regional service centers and that the total appropriation for Title III, ESEA, be increased so that provision can be made to permit the construction of needed facilities of such centers.
  - b. the ARC, through several model projects, demonstrate how several federal funding sources can be used to develop Regional Education Agencies, for instance, the combination of ESEA, Titles I, II, III, IV, and V, EPDA, HEFA, Vocational Education Act of 1963 and Adult Education Act of 1966.

- c. The Office of Education issue guidelines for such packaging of proposals including assurance that Federal auditing procedures would not be made unduly complicated.
  - d. The allocation formulae of all Federal monies to Appalachia be revised to reflect the ability of local districts to provide services rather than the allocation of funds on a "head count" alone.
  - e. The Office of Education, in consultation with the ARC, the Education Commission of the States, other states and other planning jurisdictions, conduct an evaluation of present funding patterns and develop a proposal to implement recommendation 2d. nationally.
  - f. An allocation of more technical assistance be provided through the OE Regional offices to states and localities showing an interest in developing plans.
  - g. It is suggested that guidelines be considered which would require states to indicate how Title III funds would be supplemented by Higher Education Act funds, specifically: Title I, Community Service, to be interpreted as service to the local education community, Title III, Developing Institutions, develop services to schools within the institution and Title VI, Equipment for the Higher Education Institution which would be of assistance in relation to teacher preparation such as "micro-teaching" TV equipment, video tape and the like.
  - h. States and localities should be urged to establish a long term plan to indicate continued funding from state and local sources.
3. It is recommended that the States:
- a. Include provision for Regional Education Agencies by permissive legislation and by inclusion of such agencies in state aid formulae.

- b. Plan for permanent Regional planning and/or service agencies when submitting packaged state plans under various federal funding programs.
  - c. Proceed immediately, where such agencies are not now present, to establish demonstration agencies for multi-district areas so that 1) feasibility studies may be made, 2) financial analysis be accomplished, 3) model organization characteristics can be developed, and 4) a State, overall plan presented for action by the appropriate body or bodies within the State.
  - d. Conduct an assessment of need for services and allow for variations within the State.
4. It is further recommended that the Appalachian Regional Commission propose revisions in its own act and in other appropriate Federal acts to:
- a. Provide assistance to a selected number of states in establishing, constructing and operating a regional education service agency on a demonstration basis. This assistance could come from section 302G, or 214 of the act or a new section added similar to 202 but designed to create demonstration regional education agencies.
  - b. <sup>Study</sup> ~~Abolish~~ the matching provisions of federal grants <sup>to see it</sup> and substitute <sup>an ability</sup> versus need formula <sup>which would be a more equitable method of distribution.</sup>
5. It is finally recommended that the Appalachian Regional Commission provide technical assistance to:
- a. State Education Agencies who request assistance in organizing Regional Agencies.
  - b. Local Agencies who wish to organize Area Cooperatives in the preparation of proposals for Federal funding.
  - c. Local and Area Cooperatives in the preparation of proposals for Federal funding.
  - d. When a local district is isolated from other districts in its own state but not from one or more districts in a neighboring state it may be possible to assist in the formation of a two-state agency so that the isolated district can receive the necessary services.
