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This report presents in tabular form a variety of statistics on 17849 nonpublic schools for 1965-66. Highlights of the study include: (1) 13243 schools offered only elementary grades, 2509 offered only secondary grades, and 2097 taught both levels, (2) nonpublic enrollment increased 10 percent, from 5,736,000 to 6,305,000, since 1960-62, (3) 91 percent of the nonpublic elementary schools and 78 percent of the nonpublic secondary schools were religiously affiliated, (4) 147,000 elementary and 76,000 secondary school teachers were employed in the nonpublic schools, and (5) the pupil-teacher ratio of the nonpublic schools averaged 33.5 for elementary students and 18.1 for secondary students. 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HIGHLIGHTS

Schools and Enrollment.--The survey of nonpublic schools in the school year 1965-66 included 17,849 nonpublic schools in the 50 States and D.C. offering elementary and secondary instruction. Of this total, 13,243 offered only elementary grades, 2,509 offered only secondary work, and 2,097 taught both levels.

Enrollment in these schools totalled 6,305,000, or 13 percent of all elementary and secondary school enrollment, public and nonpublic. The 15,340 schools with elementary grades enrolled almost 5 million pupils (16 percent of all elementary), and the 4,606 schools with secondary grades enrolled about 1.4 million students (8 percent of all secondary).

Enrollment trends.--Since the last nonpublic school surveys conducted from 1960 to 1962, nonpublic enrollment increased 10 percent, from 5,736,000 to 6,305,000. This increase was smaller than for public school enrollment during the same 5-year period (13 percent). For two subgroups, the growth in enrollment was considerable:

- a. Enrollments in the non-affiliated schools increased 42 percent, from 240,000 to over 341,000 students.
- b. Enrollments in the Southeast region increased 16 percent, from 499,000 to 577,000 pupils. In each State of this region, with the exception of West Virginia, the increase in nonpublic school enrollment was greater than that in public schools.

Religious affiliation.--Over 91 percent of the nonpublic elementary schools, with 96 percent of the elementary enrollment, reported some religious affiliation. Similarly, 78 percent of the nonpublic secondary schools, with 88 percent of secondary enrollment, reported such affiliation. About 70 percent of all elementary and 60 percent of all secondary schools included in this survey are affiliated with the Roman Catholic church. These schools accounted for 89 and 81 percent, respectively, of all nonpublic elementary and secondary school students.

Teachers.--The equivalent of 147,000 elementary teachers and 76,000 secondary teachers were employed to instruct the pupils of the nonpublic schools.

Pupil-teacher ratios.--The pupil-teacher ratio of the nonpublic schools in the survey was 33.5 for elementary students and 18.1 for secondary students. There was considerable variation in this measure among different types of nonpublic schools. Nonreligious-affiliated schools had a pupil-teacher ratio of 13.6 in elementary and 10.0 in secondary schools; comparable ratios for religious-affiliated schools were 35.5 and 20.3 pupils per teacher. Each of these 1965-66 ratios represents an improvement over the pupil-teacher ratio found in the preceding nonpublic school survey.

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FOREWORD

In recent years, there has been renewed national interest in the activities of the Nation's nonpublic schools. Heightened public interest in the problems of educating all children has necessitated the collection of data from nonpublic schools at more frequent intervals than in the recent past. Measuring the impact of Federal programs of assistance and encouragement to all students, regardless of the schools they attend, makes it necessary for the Office of Education to study the operations of nonpublic schools and their relative role in educating the Nation's young people.

This latest report continues the Office's series of studies on nonpublic schools which was initiated in the school year 1889-90. In order to reach users of these data most expeditiously, the tables are presented without any detailed analysis. Salient findings appear in the Highlights at the beginning of this book.

We gratefully acknowledge the cooperation of the schools which completed the forms, their parent organizations which encouraged the project, and the State education departments which, in many cases, either provided the information directly from their records or served as collection agents for the Office of Education.

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INTRODUCTION

A. Background

Nonpublic schools, i.e., schools not operated by a governmental agency, have always played a significant role in American education, but that role has varied widely in extent and character over the years. Until very late in the 19th century, the private school establishment was much larger than that of the public school. Since that time, however, the public educational system has expanded to serve the vast majority of students, while the nonpublic schools remain to fulfill particular needs which are not met, or are not believed to be met, by the public schools. Some of these needs are:

- a. Religious instruction
- b. Intensive preparation for college entrance
- c. Small classes and individualized instruction
- d. Highly disciplined learning environment
- e. Instruction concerned with ethnic or cultural needs
- f. Social or ethnic homogeneity
- g. Special facilities and services
- h. Experimental teaching techniques
- i. Enriched curriculum

Since the emphasis on each of these needs will vary with the nature of the population and with the characteristics of the public schools in any given locality, there is bound to be wide variation in the nonpublic schools. There are those with one or two pupils per teacher and those with classes of 50 or more. Some of them eagerly promote social and ethnic class integration and others are established primarily to avoid it.

The Office of Education has been collecting data on the characteristics of nonpublic secondary schools since the school year 1889-90. Between 1890 and 1930, some data on private secondary schools had been compiled or estimated from various sources annually or biennially. Since that time, data collection for both the secondary and the elementary schools in the private sector has been occasional and irregular. The last published nonpublic statistical reports are for 1960-61 for secondary schools and 1961-62 for elementary schools.

B. Coverage and Scope

This report is based on reports from 18,001 nonpublic institutions operating in the Fall of 1965, which offered some type of general

education between grades 1 and 12. Of this total, 17,849 reports were received from schools in the 50 States and the District of Columbia and 152 reports from outlying areas of the United States.

The following are not included in the survey:

- a. Schools financed by any unit of government
- b. Schools offering only nursery and/or kindergarten programs
- c. Schools offering only "postgraduate" instruction (beyond grade 12)
- d. Business and vocational schools
- e. Specialized schools such as reading clinics, rehabilitation centers, foundations, and tutorial establishments
- f. Schools operated by public institutions of higher education 1/.

Forms were mailed to 19,898 institutions. However, 1,258 proved to be duplicates, discontinued schools, or institutions outside the scope of the survey. Our net universe, therefore, consisted of 18,640 institutions. Of this total, reports were received from 17,130 and estimates of key data were obtained for 871. Thus, a total of 18,001 institutions, or 97 percent of the net universe, were included in the study. Of the 639 institutions for which we obtained no information, there is evidence that most were small schools, many of which are probably no longer in operation. In essence, this survey represents the nonpublic sector of education in this country.

For the most part, data are as of a date in the school year 1965-66. However, the figures from New York State are for the 1966-67 school year.

C. Method of Presentation

Unlike the most recent studies in this field, in which elementary and secondary schools were canvassed separately, this survey covered both types of schools simultaneously. A distribution of the 18,001 institutions in the study into those offering elementary grades only, secondary grades only, and both elementary and secondary grades, is given in Table 1.

The user should note that some tabulations are based on the school concept (tables 2-17) and others on the institutional concept (tables 18-23).

Under the school concept the categories are "elementary schools" and "secondary schools". An "elementary school" is defined as a school

offering elementary grades. Thus, the count of elementary schools consists of the 13,309 institutions offering elementary grades only and the 2,165 institutions offering both elementary and secondary grades for a total of 15,474 schools offering instruction at the elementary level. "Secondary schools" are similarly defined. Therefore, 2,527 secondary institutions plus 2,165 combined elementary and secondary institutions come to a total of 4,692 offering instruction at the secondary level. In other words institutions offering both elementary and secondary grades are included in both the elementary and the secondary school counts. Consequently, the sum of "elementary schools" and "secondary schools" will exceed the number of institutions. This definition is consistent with those used in the previous nonpublic school studies and is comparable with the definitions used in categorizing public schools.

The institutional concept is used for tables involving characteristics of institutions for which there was no way of knowing from the report whether the characteristic pertains to elementary grades only, secondary grades only, or both. In these tables, institutions are distributed into "Elementary only", "Secondary only", and "Combined elementary and secondary."

Elementary and secondary grades are defined as follows: All enrollments below grade 7 are considered to be "elementary", while all those above grade 8 are always classed as "secondary." For grades 7 and 8, respondents were asked to designate enrollment as "elementary" or "secondary", according to the type of program offered. Where a departmentalized situation existed, instruction was generally considered to be "secondary".

As indicated above, 871 of the total 18,001 institutions included in the study did not submit reports. Instead, estimates of some of the basic data on enrollment and staff were made from earlier reports and other sources. Because estimates could not be made for all of the survey variables, some tables are based on only the 17,130 institutions (or a subgroup thereof) which actually submitted reports. This limitation is indicated in a table headnote. Distributions of schools and enrollments for reporting schools and schools for which data were estimated are shown separately in Appendix Tables I and II, respectively.

The tables giving data by region and State show two total lines--a "U.S. Total" line which includes the 50 States and the District of Columbia, and a "Grand Total" line which includes outlying areas also. The "U.S. Total" line should be used for comparison with totals for public schools published in such Office of Education series as the "Statistics of State School Systems" and the "Fall Statistics of Public Schools". Tables 17-23, which show national distributions only, include data for the outlying areas.

All of the survey items on the report-form were tabulated with the exception of items 8 and 11, which were very poorly reported. A copy of the report form is shown in the Appendix. The printed copy for many of the tables was made directly from the computer printout. To simplify the data processing, regional subtotals and the national totals are printed below the detail lines rather than above, as is customary in statistical tables.
