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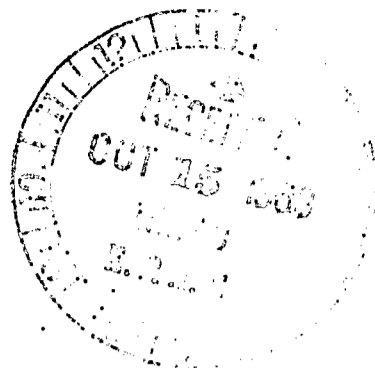

Statistical data on the 158 rural schools of Wyoming are presented, based on information collected in 1967. Data are categorized into 2 types: schools under county superintendents, and schools not under county superintendents. Teacher-pupil ratios are presented for each school. The data indicate that 127 schools were under direct supervision of the county superintendent of schools, while 31 schools were classified as being in a town superintendent. The total school enrollment for the schools included in the survey was 2510 students, taught by 269 teachers. The 158 rural schools included 99 one-teacher schools, 36 two-teacher schools, 14 three-teacher schools, 2 four-teacher schools, 4 six-teacher schools, 1 seven-teacher school, 1 eight-teacher school, and 1 nine-teacher school. WYOMING
RURAL SCHOOLS

THERE WERE A TOTAL OF 158 RURAL SCHOOLS IN OPERATION DURING THE 1967-68 SCHOOL YEAR. OF THIS NUMBER 127 SCHOOLS WERE UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION OF THE COUNTY SUPER-INTENDENT OF SCHOOLS AND 31 WERE IN A TOWN SCHOOL DISTRICT UNDER THE DIRECT SUPER-VISION OF THE TOWN SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT. A TOTAL OF 2,510 CHILDREN ATTENDED THESE SCHOOLS WHICH WERE TAUGHT BY 269 TEACHERS.

THE 158 RURAL SCHOOLS INCLUDED 99 ONE-TEACHERS SCHOOLS, 36 TWO-TEACHER SCHOOLS, 14 THREE-TEACHER SCHOOLS, 2 FOUR-TEACHER SCHOOLS, 4 SIX-TEACHER SCHOOLS, 1 SEVEN-TEACHER SCHOOL, 1 EIGHT-TEACHER SCHOOL AND 1 NINE-TEACHER SCHOOL.

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NEEDS OF RURAL SCHOOLS IN WYOMING

1. WELL PREPARED TEACHERS ARE ESPECIALLY NEEDED IN ALL RURAL SCHOOLS SINCE THOSE TEACHERS DO NOT GET THE SUPERVISION THAT ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS HAVING A PRINCIPAL GET. RURAL TEACHERS MUST COVER ALL AREAS OF THE CURRICULUM FROM GRADES 1-8.
2. THE INSTRUCTION NEEDS TO BE DIRECTED TO THE INDIVIDUAL NEEDS OF THE CHILD TO CHALLENGE HIM TO DO HIS BEST. SMALL ENROLLMENTS WITH LACK OF PUPIL COMPETITION LIMIT SOME OF THE INSTRUCTION TO STRICTLY TEXTBOOK TEACHING.
3. THE CURRICULUM MUST BE FOCUSED ON PRESENT DAY NEEDS OF CHILDREN LIVING IN AN EVER-CHANGING AEROSPACE AGE.
4. LEARNING NEEDS OF ALL CHILDREN MUST BE DIAGNOSED AND PROGRAMS PLANNED TO CARE FOR THESE NEEDS.
5. THE PARENTS AND SCHOOL BOARD MUST BE MORE CONCERNED ABOUT THE QUALITY OF THE PROGRAM GIVEN TO THE CHILDREN RATHER THAN HAVING A SCHOOL IN THE VICINITY WHICH THEIR CHILDREN CAN ATTEND.

 - C. PROVIDING A PROGRAM WHICH MEETS THE INDIVIDUAL NEEDS OF ALL CHILDREN IN THE DISTRICT

CARBON: 5 SCHOOLS - ELLIS AND SEMINOË DAM, ONE-TEACHER SCHOOLS AND ELK MOUNTAIN, A TWO-TEACHER SCHOOL ARE IN THE HANNA DISTRICT (#4); SHIRLEY BASIN AND SHIRLEY RIM, ONE-TEACHERS SCHOOLS ARE IN THE MEDICINE BOW DISTRICT (#6)

CONVERSE: 7 SCHOOLS - DRY CREEK, LIGHTNING CREEK, NACHTMAN, REYNOLDS, WALKER CREEK AND ALLEMAND, ONE-TEACHER SCHOOLS, AND COAL MINE, A TWO-TEACHER SCHOOL, ARE IN THE DOUGLAS DISTRICT (#17)

FREMONT: 3 SCHOOLS - BAR GEE, A ONE-TEACHER SCHOOL IN DUBOIS DISTRICT (#2); GAS HILLS, A THREE TEACHER SCHOOL IN RIVERTON DISTRICT (#25); AND CROWHEART, A THREE-TEACHER SCHOOL IN MORTON DISTRICT (#15)

JOHNSON: 1 SCHOOL - CARIBOU, A ONE-TEACHER SCHOOL IN THE BUFFALO DISTRICT

NIORARA: 9 SCHOOLS - NIOBRARA IS A COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT AND ALL RURAL SCHOOLS ARE IN IT. THEY STILL HAVE A COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT

SHERIDAN: 1 SCHOOL - SLACK, A TWO-TEACHER SCHOOL, IN THE TONGUE RIVER DISTRICT (#24)

SWEETWATER: 1 SCHOOL - MC KINNON, A TWO-TEACHER SCHOOL IS IN THE GREEN RIVER DISTRICT (#2)

WASHAKIE: 1 SCHOOL - UPPER NOWOOD, A ONE-TEACHER SCHOOL, IS IN THE TENSLEEP DISTRICT

WESTON: 2 SCHOOLS - BLACK THUNDER AND CLARETON, ONE-TEACHER SCHOOLS, ARE IN THE NEWCASTLE DISTRICT (#1)

A TOTAL OF 31 RURAL SCHOOLS ARE A PART OF A TOWN SCHOOL SYSTEM. THESE SCHOOLS ARE UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION OF THE TOWN SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT INSTEAD OF THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS. IN MOST CASES, HOWEVER, THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT AND LOCAL SUPERINTENDENT DO WORK TOGETHER WITH THESE SCHOOLS. 21 OF THESE SCHOOLS ARE ONE-TEACHER SCHOOLS.

THREE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENTS HAVE ONLY ONE RURAL SCHOOL UNDER THEIR DIRECT SUPERVISION - GOSHEN, SUBLETTE AND UINTA.

THERE WERE 158 RURAL SCHOOLS IN OPERATION DURING 1967-68 SCHOOL YEAR, IN WYOMING.

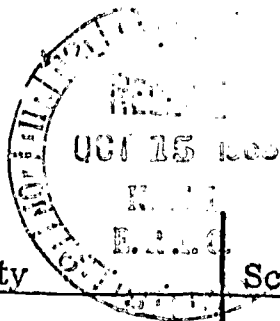

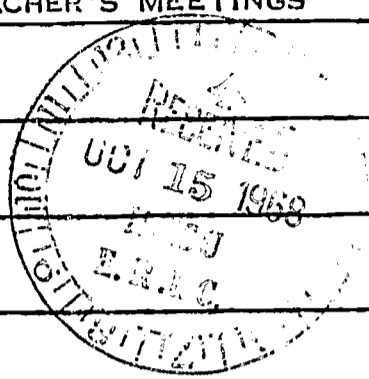
