1. Major Activities and Accomplishments During this Period:

The contents and structure of the Providence Public Library's shelf list and authority files were studied in detail. Alternate methods of gathering copy information were explored. Discussions were held to determine how existing Inforonics programs could best be used to accommodate the characteristics of Providence Public Library requirements.

Decisions were made as to the method of gathering branch library copy information and the format of the new shelf list card.

Statistic gathering was examined with an emphasis placed upon the insuring of accuracy and causing the least inconvenience to project workers.

2. Problems:

3. Significant Findings and Events:

The items noted below resulted from activity pursued during October, November and December 1967.

Subject Areas for Conversion

A decision was made to spread the project sample through representative holdings of the Providence Public Library. Thus, the 1000 title sample should indicate potential problem areas in all Dewey Decimal classification ranges.

Procedure Manual

A detailed procedure manual was compiled for all aspects of the project.

Time and Statistic Sheets

Forms were designed to encompass all procedural areas. The compilation and analysis of these sheets will be instrumental in the projection of time requirements and costs for similar library undertakings.

Programming Specifications

Inforonics programs were examined and a Providence Public Library program developed based on MARC 1 codes. An input worksheet was designed.

### Location Symbols

Existing Providence Public Library location symbols were examined and then either accepted, rejected or adjusted for Library of Congress Classification use. A combination of upper and lower case letters were adapted to ensure no confusion with LC upper case "alpha" symbols.

### Catalog Card

A catalog card format was determined.

### Encoding lessons

Three lessons were developed for use in training Providence Public Library Catalog Department professional personnel.

### Staff Orientation

A joint branch librarian and department head meeting was held to instruct the participants in procedures. A similar meeting was held with all Catalog Department personnel.

A letter to the Editor of Library Journal, December 15, 1967 was published to bring the purpose of this project to the attention of professional librarians and to answer a charge brought by Mrs. Marie Henshaw in the Library Journal of October 15, 1967.

Visits by Providence Public Library and Inforonics staff members were made to the University of Rhode Island and Wellsley College for the purpose of examining Library of Congress cataloging and conversion procedures and exchanging information.

Conversion activities at the University of Buffalo were explored as was Input Services', Dayton, Ohio, work in placing the University of Michigan shelf list on machine readable tape. It was determined that no practical use could be made of the output produced by either project.

A. Sample Preparation (Entire Sample)

- A-1 Select (count) the SL titles to be included in the project and remove them from the SL.
- A-2 Check the filing in the sample and record the number of errors found on the Statistics Sheet -- Entire Sample.
- A-3 Compile a chart indicating the Dewey numbers to be in the sample, make xerox copies, and send a copy to each Branch and Department.
- A-4 Branches weed the sample sections of the SL and send the weeded SL cards to Central.
- A-5 Stamp the SL cards with some sort of stamp to distinguish SL cards from AC cards. (It would seem that there would be less chance of error in doing this than in remembering to write something on each AC card that is pulled).
- A-6 Separate the LC SL cards from the non-LC SL cards, count the no. of titles (not cards) in each category and record the numbers on the Statistics Sheet -- Entire Sample.
- A-7 Match the non-LC SL cards against the AC and pull the AC cards, keeping SL cards separate from the AC cards.
- A-8 Interfile the LC SL cards into the AC cards.
- A-9 Send the SL and AC cards to General Microfilm for microfilming.
- A-10 When the SL cards, the AC cards, and the input worksheets are returned, separate the SL cards from the AC cards.
- A-11 Count the number of AC titles (this number should agree with the count in Step A-6), the number of LC AC titles, and the number of non-LC AC titles, and record the numbers on the Statistics Sheet -- Entire Sample.
- A-12 Sort and refile the AC cards.
- A-13 Interfile the SL cards that were microfilmed with the sample SL cards that were not microfilmed (those without LC copy).
- A-14 Weed the sample SL cards.
- A-15 Count the number of titles and volumes weeded (both Central and Branches).
- A-16 Record the copy information for Central on the worksheets using the weeded SL as the source.
- A-17 Record the copy information for each Branch and Department on the worksheets using their weeded SL as the source.
- A-18 Scan each worksheet and remove those which do not contain any copy information.

- A-19 Count the number of titles weeded, the number of titles weeded which were LC copy, and the number of titles weeded which were not LC copy.
- A-20 Number the worksheets that have not been weeded with an automatic numbering machine.

B. Copy Preparation

- B-1 Separate LC from non LC copy
- B-2 Write established LC call numbers on slips and sort slips by call number.
- B-3 Search for LC copy, noting call number in LC call # position on bottom of SL card image; (other variations in LC copy?); LC call number for other editions; and the searching report in the space provided on the worksheet.
- B-4 Separate worksheets with "Not found's " from others and set them aside.
- B-5 Interfile worksheets with "Found" and "Found another edition" with the SL's and AC's containing LC copy.
- B-6 Check all subject headings (LC copy and non LC copy) with LC lists and note worksheet where change was found.
- B-7 Review the call numbers on LC copy, checking them in schedules and noting reasons for changes on worksheet.
- B-8 Retrieve books from shelves for titles for which no LC call number information could be found. Note worksheet if book is missing from shelf. (We do not think that seeing the book will be required for most of the titles. If the book is not on shelf, it may be better to delay recalling it until the cataloger has seen the worksheet.)
- B-9 Assign classification numbers. If must have book for reclassification, note worksheet accordingly.
- B-10 Assign Cutter numbers checking slips to avoid conflicts (checking also new LC SL if deemed necessary)
- B-11 Recheck shelves for books required for reclassification, recall if not found, and note worksheet.
- B-12 Tag catalog copy with MARC I codes.
- B-13 Proofread tagging.
- B-14 Check that all worksheets are present (control #'s) and count and record the following.
- LC copy found
  - LC copy found another edition
  - LC copy not found
  - Subject headings updated from 7th ed., and each list.
  - LC call numbers updated
  - Titles missing from shelf at initial reclass. retrieval
  - Titles requiring recall for reclassification
- B-15 Remove all Tally and Statistics Sheet except one used by Inforonics and send worksheets and Inforonics Tally to Inforonics.

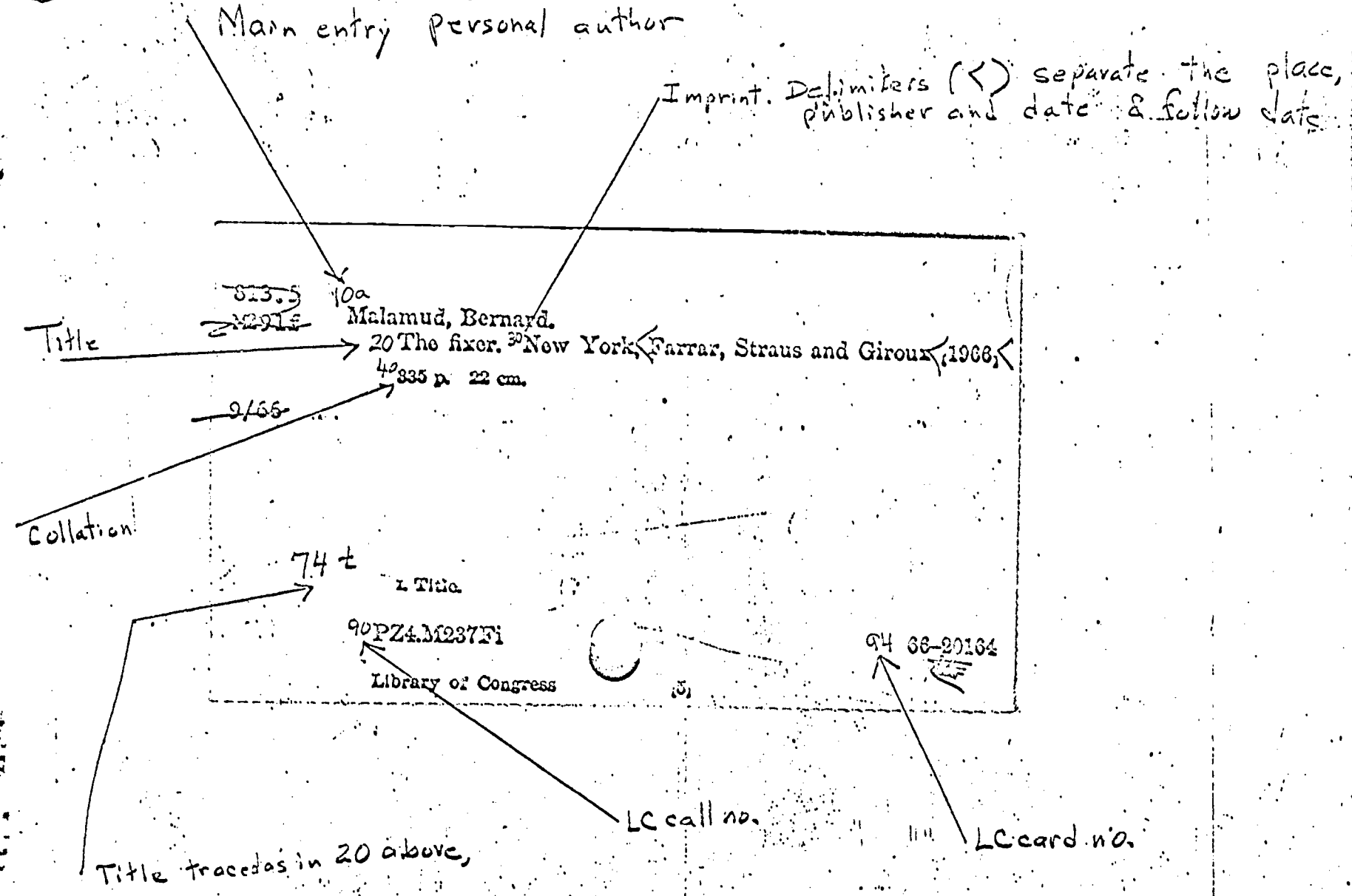

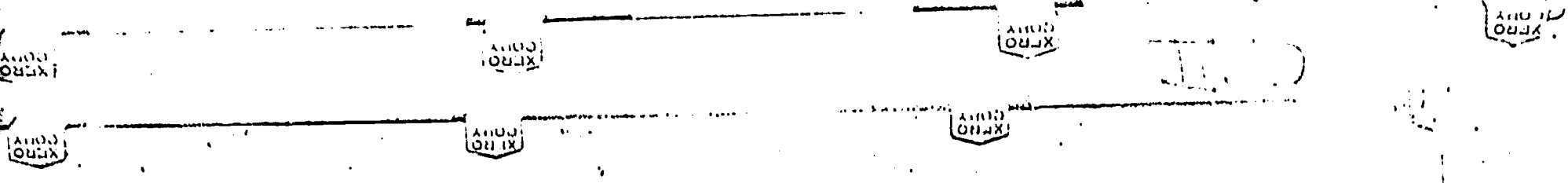

Also, while a letter of introduction or telephone call is recommended for visits to large libraries, I have been warmly welcomed by minor employees of these libraries, once they learned I was an American librarian.

#### A SHAW & DILLON VOTE!

*Gertrude L. Annan, Librarian, New York Academy of Medicine:* I have not added to *LJ* fan mail in some time and I have no controversial topic to liven your pages. However, I do want to thank you for the two leading articles in the September 1 issue ("Quo Vadis?" by Ralph R. Shaw, p. 2881-84; "The Fine Art of Abdicating Responsibility," by Richard H. Dillon, p. 2885-88). They are of equal importance in pointing out today's diversive problems. I am also grateful to the authors for providing a number of very quotable statements.

#### LITTLE MAGS A BARGAIN

*Peter Gellatly, Serials Librarian, University of Washington Libraries, Seattle:*

My article on little mags in Bill Katz's column, as edited, makes me appear to say that little mags are expensive (*LJ*, August, p. 2745). But my feeling is the exact opposite.

It seems to me that little mags are, in general, a bargain. Certainly no one who knows that their usual price is \$3 for four issues is likely to complain that he has to pay too much for them. And considering what he gets for his money (even if it turns out, as sometimes, not to be a full subscription), the bargain is one to "sing" about. The fact is that the little mags are at least as entertaining and useful as the biggest part of their more suspicious and highly-priced competitors.

#### GOLDWATER ANTIDOTE

*Peter Draz, Chief, Bureau of Editorial Reference, Time Inc., New York:*

Personally, I think "Midstream or Midwest" is right on the button (*LJ*, September 1, p. 2861)! I cannot help but observe that for me, this partially makes up for the 1964 Goldwater editorial (*LJ*, October 15, 1964, p. 3926-27).

#### CONVERSION TABLES

*Mrs. Marie M. Henshaw, formerly Assistant Editor, Decimal Classification Office, Library of Congress:*

Pity the poor taxpayer whose pockets are being picked constantly to finance wholly unnecessary schemes!

As a case in point, consider the project outlined in the August issue of *Library Journal* (p. 2692), where the U.S. Office of Education will donate \$8,588.98 of the taxpayers' money to Stuart C. Sherman "to develop a system to reclassify older books . . . from Dewey to LC." Why, when the Council on Library Resources has already allocated \$2000 to Desmond Taylor and Raimund Matthis to produce a similar device? After all, a conversion table is a conversion table is a conversion table.

Furthermore, consider the fact that the library profession could have had, through the Library of Congress, a device making it possible to convert not only from Dewey to LC, but also from LC to Dewey. Such schedules would eliminate the need to reclassify ever. *LJ* has in its possession the manuscript which the Library of Congress refused to grant permission to publish, even though ALA requested it in a letter from Mrs. Elizabeth Rodell (executive secretary of the Resources and Technical Services Division) dated October 21, 1966.

Frankly, I am confused. Can anyone un-confuse me?

ED. NOTE—The manuscript to which Mrs. Henshaw refers is an article, with examples, on Dewey-LC, LC-Dewey conversion tables. It will be published in the November 1 issue of *LJ*.

#### HEARD IS HEARD

*J. Norman Heard, Hammond, Louisiana:*

The temptation to take issue with the tone, at least, of Sol Malkin's review of *Bookman's Guide to Americana* (*LJ*, July, p. 2540) is great. I feel, however, that after 14 years and four editions, a reference book stands or falls on its usefulness, and the remarks of reviewer or author make little difference. Moreover, I would be out of my league in trading unpleasantries with such a master of invective, so I prefer to permit Mr. Malkin to refute his own diatribe as he did on page 1008 of the *Antiquarian Bookman*, March 9, 1964, by commenting that "a considerable number of bookmen—dealers, collectors, and librarians—have found Heard of great value for quick ready reference."

It is worthy of note that Mr. Malkin had not yet lumped librarians with lost souls, but this was a review of Heard III (as he terms it), not IV.

Did he change his mind because of deterioration in the fourth edition? Not at all, for he had already reversed his field and advised the readers of the 1966 *AB Bookman's Yearbook* to avoid Heard's "so-called" *Bookman's Guide to Americana*. I wrote to him then, not questioning his right to criticize the book, but suggesting that an explanation of what seemed to be a somewhat inconsistent point of view might be in order. Properly for a man of his standing, he did not dignify my letter with a direct reply but published it in *AB* with a comment to the effect that he had done me a favor by deigning to review the book at all. Well, now he has done me another favor and it would be churlish of me to fail to express my warmest sentiments for the review and for the concern he expressed over the state of my soul. The next time I see my confessor I'll tell him Sol sent me.

#### RARE AMERICANA

#### INACCURATE IMPLICATIONS

*James O. Wallace, Librarian, San Antonio College, Texas:*

The article by David Peck in the September 1 issue of *Library Journal* ("Community College Libraries: Problems and Prospects," p. 2898-2901) is quite disturbing because of its title, which does not reflect the extreme limitations of the article to the situation existing only in New York. The casual reader too frequently is misled by such a generalization into false assumptions. Thus the statement that none of the junior college libraries meet ALA standards, coupled with the title and the absence of qualifications linking the statement to implied limitations, would lead some to inter-

edition, unabridged: "Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Where-withal shall we be clothed? (For after all these things do the Nonprofessionals see'k.) For your boss knoweth that ye have need of all these things. But seek ye first the kingdoms of specialized knowledge, high standards of achievement and conduct, continued study, and the rendering of a public service, and all these other things shall be added unto you." (For the phrase "all these other things," you may substitute the word "cash.")

There does seem to be a connection, whether mystical or strictly cause and effect, between the degree to which librarians apply themselves to the goals set forth in my text, and the degree of professionalism (cash) which they ultimately attain.

In the words of another well-known Reverend, "Keep the faith, baby!"

#### TITLES AND INDEXING

*Mary Wilkie, Social Science Department, Kansas City Public Library, Missouri:*

Pertinent titles affixed to a work facilitate the indexing of that work, particularly if optical scanning devices are used. Librarians have urged the writers in technological fields to give titles indicative of the content to works.

Could an indexer possibly see titles such as "A Dime-Store Paul Revere," "Goals, Myths, and Realities," and "Goin' Down the Road Feelin' Bad" (*LJ*, October 1), and have a certain idea what the articles' contents are? Shame on library titlers!

#### CONSULTANT DILEMMA

*Alta Parks, Assistant Director, Gary Public Library, Indiana:*

Was Kenneth Shaffer quoted correctly in the "Inept Library Consultants . . ." news story in the November 1 *Library Journal* (p. 3946)? If no consultant is to be employed unless he has been a consultant, where do we get a new supply? There are some ways other than mentioned, which might include building a good system or planning and developing a new building, according to needs of the library needing a consultant.

#### SUBJECT HEADING FILE

*Phyllis Joyce, Associate Reference Librarian, University of Massachusetts, Amherst 01003:*

We are interested in hearing from any library which is indexing a metropolitan newspaper. Specifically, we would like any information available on setting up a subject heading file.

#### STOKES ADVOCATES

*H. Vail Deale, Director of Libraries, Beloit College, Wisconsin:*

"The Trading Stamp Mentality," written by our friendly critic from overseas, Roy Stokes (*LJ*, October 15, p. 3595-3600), is the kind of responsible journalism that we have come to expect from *Library Journal* in recent years. It is a thoughtful, provocative, and challenging discussion of one of the most significant problems facing American librarianship.

I particularly enjoyed Mr. Stokes' paragraphs on "the value of the doctorate," since I share his appraisal that "As things now stand, there is no valid academic reason for demanding the doctorate for any post in librarianship." Librarianship needs to come into the mainstream of academic life, and it cannot effectively do so by ignoring change, alienation of other disciplines, and the pursuit of outmoded programs.

*Lesley M. Heathcote, Director of Libraries, Montana State University, Bozeman:*

Three cheers for Roy Stokes' article! He has said many things that need to be considered very seriously by all of us in the profession. The quarter (or semester) system does make for a hodge-podge, but it would, no doubt, be difficult for the library school to deviate from the practice of its parent institution.

As for the doctorate in library science, I have long thought it an exercise in futility. The only reason for an advanced degree in librarianship would be in the case of a reference librarian who needs more depth, but in a broad field, and I am still not convinced that a doctorate is the answer.

I am fully in accord with Mr. Stokes that if a librarian is determined to have a doctorate, it should be in one of the conventional fields where there is scope for worthwhile research.

#### RECLASSIFICATION STUDY

*Stuart C. Sherman, Librarian, Providence Public Library, Rhode Island:*

I am writing in response to a letter from Mrs. Marie M. Henshaw, which appeared in the October 15 *Library Journal* (p. 3572). The letter referred to the study in which the Providence Public Library is engaged with a grant of \$8,588.98 from the U. S. Office of Education to develop a system to reclassify older books in public libraries from Dewey to Library of Congress.

Mrs. Henshaw expressed concern that the Council on Library Resources

had already allocated \$2000 "to produce a similar device." I want to reassure Mrs. Henshaw and your readers that this study is concerned neither with producing a "device" nor with conversion tables.

The four objectives of this study, as stated in the proposal submitted to the U. S. Commissioner of Education, are as follows:

To uncover the problems of reclassification and processing;

To apply data processing techniques to the task;

To establish procedures for the Providence Public Library and other public libraries to follow;

To provide an accurate cost estimate for the conversion of a large public library collection of books and to determine costs of processing new books.

It is hoped that the following information may be obtained from the results of the pilot study: the actual cost of reclassifying books; the actual cost of processing new books; the practicability of performing the operations outside the library; the costs to be saved by using Providence Public Library personnel for the labor tasks; the costs to be saved by using LC MARC data; the costs to be saved by using data obtained by other reclassified projects. I trust that this will clear up the confusion expressed regarding the study.

#### MOLZ MALADY

*Henry M. Kapenstein, Department of Library Science, Drexel Institute of Technology:*

I can only guess why you would want to continue to hold Kathleen Molz up to ridicule by reprinting her article on censorship in the October 1 issue of *LJ* ("The Public Custody of the High Pornography," p. 3373-76). The article was embarrassing to read, first in its original source, then in the "Reference Shelf" reprint, and now in *LJ*, too.

A mistake need not be harped on lest we believe you subscribe to its error also. One cannot weave a pattern of words, salted with uncomfortably-crudite phrases for the Phi Beta Kappa scholar, and keep the woven fabric held together by a reduction of the argument to one factor, then unravel that factor alone in triumph. The intermixture of moral judgments does not make for universality of morality.

Undoubtedly, the trap of setting up conditions of argument, defining the situation without objective standards, and then proceeding to demolish, or at least to limit, the scope of the argument's factors as if that was all there was to it, is easy to succumb to.
