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This report presents the 1966-67 statistics on professional education positions in New York (excluding New York City), detailed by 39 professional fields and 12 economic areas of the state. The data includes distribution of positions, salary, degree status, certification status, and years of experience. Appended are a list of counties in each economic area and a copy of Professional Personnel Report Form ST(S)-6a. (SG)

Data contained in this report were derived from the New York State Education Department's Professional Personnel Report which, up to 1966-67, was filed annually with the Bureau of Statistical Services by each operating school district in the State excluding New York City. New York City data will be included in subsequent publications dealing with professional personnel (beginning in 1967-68).

The analyses contained herein were made possible, in large measure, by the excellent cooperation of the school districts in striving for completeness and accuracy in filing source documents. In addition, computer processing of data assisted immeasurably in obtaining necessary summarizations.

The Professional Personnel Report, initiated several years ago, was an initial step in the establishment of New York State's Basic Educational Data System, which went into operation in the fall of 1967.

The forms which produced the information in this report (ST(S)-6, ST(S)-6a and ST(S)-6b) were discontinued, along with 21 other Education Department forms and reports, after the 1966-67 school year. The Professional Personnel Report for 1967-68, when published, will have been compiled from data contained in the Basic Educational Data System.

The 1966-67 statistics in this report--distribution of positions, salary, degree status, certification status and years of experience--are detailed by 39 professional fields and 12 economic areas of the State. Counties included in each economic area are listed at the end of the report. In reading these summarizations it should be kept in mind that the data deal with professional positions rather than people. If an employee of a district worked in more than one professional field he was reported once in each field. Except for the analyses of salary data, no distinction is made between full- and part-time positions. One final caution: data contained in any single table in this report may be misleading unless viewed in relation to other information presented. For example, table 4 reports median salaries of \$7,625 for the field of English and \$8,200 for Music. Viewed alone, this information indicates, in general, that music teachers received higher salaries than English teachers in 1966-67. However, tables 6 and 7 present evidence that more experienced teachers tended to receive higher salaries than less experienced teachers and table 12 shows that the median years of experience in the field of music was 9 as compared to 6 in English. While it is often necessary to isolate certain factors for statistical analysis, they are not always meaningful unless viewed as parts of a whole.

#### Trends in Selected Characteristics of Professional Personnel

Table 1 reports trends in the salaries, certification status and degree status of professional personnel over the last four years. The

median salary of full-time classroom teachers (outside of New York City) rose steadily in that period. In 1963-64, the median salary was \$7,000; in 1964-65, it was \$7,200; in 1965-66, it was \$7,400; and in 1966-67, it climbed to \$7,950.

The percent of professional positions filled by persons holding permanent certification rose from 63.1 percent to 66.5 percent in the three years from the fall of 1963 to the fall of 1966. In the same period, however, the percent of positions filled by persons without certification rose from 10.7 percent to 12.7 percent.

Analysis of data on degree status revealed a moderate decline from 1963-64 to 1966-67 in the percent of professional positions filled by persons holding less than a bachelors degree (8.3 percent in 1963-64; 7.0 percent in 1966-67). Although there was an increase in the percent of positions filled by persons at some of the more advanced degree levels, there was a moderate decline in the percents of positions filled by persons holding masters degrees and doctorates. While the change in the degree status of New York State school professionals over the four years was not dramatic, its significance lies in the fact that it occurred during a period of rising enrollments and a decline in the pupil/teacher ratio, each creating a demand for more teachers.

#### Distribution of Positions

Table 2 shows the percent distribution of positions\* by professional

field within economic area. In the total State, elementary school teachers (Kindergarten and Common Branch) accounted for 37.0 percent of all positions; secondary school teachers of English, Social Studies, Mathematics, Foreign Language, Science, and Physical Education and Hygiene accounted for 33.0 percent of all positions; the vocational education fields (Agriculture, Business and Distributive Education, Home Economics, Industrial Arts and Industrial and Technical) contained 7.7 percent of all positions.

### Salary

Data on salaries are presented in tables 3 through 7. Table 3 shows selected salary percentiles for full-time teaching positions within economic area. Omitted from this table are the positions of assistant, associate, or deputy superintendent, administrative assistant, assistant principal, physician, and the category Other.\* The State median salary in 1966-67 was \$7,950. Only two economic areas (Long Island and Lower Hudson) had median salaries higher than the State median. The economic area with the lowest median salary was the Niagara Frontier, \$500 below the State median.

Table 4 shows selected salary percentiles by professional field. Excluding the positions of assistant, associate or deputy superintendent, assistant principal, administrative assistant, and physician, the five highest median salaries were found in the fields of Recreation (\$12,915), Psychology (\$10,550), Guidance Counselor (\$10,400), Audio-Visual (\$10,380), and Adult Education (\$10,125). The lowest median salaries were in the fields

of Dental Hygienist (\$6,900), Speech and Hearing Handicapped (\$7,189), Speech (\$7,355), Fine Arts (\$7,550), and English (\$7,625).

Table 5 relates median salaries for full-time teaching positions to degree status within economic area and shows that there were marked differences among economic areas in median salaries for comparable degree levels.

Tables 6 and 7 report selected salary percentiles for full-time teaching positions by degree status, years of experience in district and total educational experience. As would be expected, at a given degree level, teachers with longer experience in a school district generally received higher salaries than those with less experience. Similarly, teachers with longer total educational experience tended to receive higher salaries than those with less educational experience.

### Certification

Respondents to the Professional Personnel Report are asked to indicate certification status appropriate to each professional field in which they are employed. The percent distribution of professional positions by certification status within professional field is shown in table 8; table 9 reports the percent distribution of professional positions by certification status within economic area.

For the total State, 12.7 percent of all positions reported for the 1966-67 school year were filled by persons not certified to work in the professional field to which they were assigned. This figure must be viewed in light of the fact that on the Professional Personnel Report, an individual is reported in a professional field no matter how small a portion of his time is spent in that field. Under present regulations, persons who teach more than five periods a week in an uncertified status are reported as



uncertified teachers. Consequently, the 12.7 percent includes individuals who taught outside of certification only one or two periods more than the allowed five periods a week. However, as reported in table 1, the percent of professional positions filled by uncertified persons has shown a slightly upward trend since 1963-64.

The largest percentages of positions filled by uncertified persons (table 8) were in the fields of Physically Handicapped (37.8 percent), Industrial and Technical (36.2 percent), Mentally Handicapped (32.5 percent), Library (26.3 percent) and Social Worker (24.6 percent). The smallest percentages of positions filled by uncertified professionals were in the fields of Administrative Assistant (4.3 percent), Assistant, Associate or Deputy Superintendent (4.8 percent), Driver Education (5.4 percent), Gifted (5.8 percent), and Guidance Counselor (6.3 percent).

The economic area having the highest proportion of its positions filled by uncertified professionals (table 9) was the Mohawk Valley Area (16.9 percent) while Long Island had the lowest proportion (9.8 percent). In the total State, 66.5 percent of all positions reported were filled by persons holding permanent certification. This percentage has increased moderately in each of the last three years (see table 1).

#### Degree Status

Tables 10 and 11 show percent distributions of professional positions by degree status of the persons occupying the positions. The proportion of professional personnel having achieved, or studied beyond a bachelor's degree was 93.0 percent in 1966-67 as compared with 92.5 percent in 1965-66, 91.6 percent in 1964-65 and 85.6 percent in 1963-64. The economic area having the greatest portion of positions filled by persons with less than a bachelor's degree was the Northern Area (14.3 percent) while the area

having the greatest percentage of positions filled by people with doctorates was the lower Hudson Area (1.2 percent).

### Experience

Table 12 reports selected percentiles of total years of educational experience for professional personnel within professional field. In 26 of the 39 fields, 50 percent of the professional personnel reported had 10 or less years of educational experience. The professional fields showing the highest median years of experience were Assistant, Associate or Deputy Superintendent (20 years), Administrative Assistant (16 years) and Assistant Principal (15 years). The fields with the lowest median years of experience were Speech and Hearing Handicapped (5 years), Social Worker (5 years), and Speech (5 years).
