This report is a summary of the State University of New York's (SUNY) response to the Fall 1968 federal census of certain student minority groups. This census is in its second year as a means of institutional certification of compliance with the non-discriminatory provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Data were collected only on full-time credit course students attending institutions of SUNY during Fall 1968. All part-time credit students, as well as those in noncredit programs and other special opportunity and summer programs were excluded. Students from 4 minority groups were included--Negro, American Indian, Oriental, and Spanish-surnamed Americans. Foreign students were not included, regardless of their race or nationality. Tables contain statistics on enrollment, on the students' use of University-owned or University-supported housing, and on the number of recipients of institutionally controlled financial aid. (JS)

## INTRODUCTION

This report is a summary of the State University's response to the Fall 1968 Federal census of certain student minority groups. This census is in its second year as a means of institutional certification of compliance with the non-discriminatory provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

The Federal census does not permit the reporting of several categories of students in these minority groups for whom many institutions have established significant innovative programs. For example, the Federal census excludes all part-time credit students as well as those in non-credit programs such as Urban Centers, S.E.E.K., and other special opportunity programs--even when these special programs have been designed to prepare students for the traditional academic programs. In addition, by collecting data on only the Fall term, special summer programs for orientation, motivation and remedial assistance are not visible.

When we include the students in these special Fall programs, there are 11,773 students from the four minority groups (7.2% of the total). This number is still underestimated because information regarding the minority group status of part-time students is not available this year. However, considering only full-time, credit course students (as in the Federal census), there were 9,076 minority group students (5.7 percent).

## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE TABLES

### Enrollment (Tables 1 and 2)

Excluding part-time students for whom minority group status is not available, 7.2 percent of the students at institutions of the State University of New York were Negro, American Indian, Oriental or Spanish-Surnamed Americans. Foreign students are not included as minority group students, regardless of their race or nationality.

Undergraduate full-time minority group credit course students made up 5.8 percent of their total, in contrast to the full-time graduate student minority group incidence of 3.2 percent. The overall rate was 5.7 percent.

The minority group membership of students in special opportunity programs, S.E.E.K., and Urban Centers was 72.8%.

### Housing (Table 3)

University-owned or University-supported housing was provided for 52,743 full-time students, 2.6 percent of them from the four minority groups.

### Financial Aid (Table 4)

Specifically excluded from the Federal survey were financial aids such as the Regents Scholarships, the Scholar Incentive Program, veterans assistance, etc., for which the institution does not select the recipients.

Institutionally-controlled financial aid appears to favor students from minority groups. There were 11.5 percent of the undergraduate recipients from the minority groups, in contrast to the 5.7 percent minority groups status of the undergraduate full-time enrollment. However, 2.2 percent of the graduate recipients of this type of financial aid were from the minority groups in contrast to 3.2 percent of the graduate enrollment.

The average annual financial aid of this type is as follows:

### COMPARISON OF 1968 WITH 1967

The full-time credit course students from minority groups rose from 4.5 percent in 1967 to 5.7 percent in just one year. During this period, the total full-time credit course enrollment rose only 14 percent while the comparable minority group enrollment rose 45 percent.

The full-time students living in University-owned or University-supported housing rose from 2.1 percent in 1967 to 2.6 percent in 1968. While the total number of full-time students in such housing rose only 36 percent in the one-year period, the number of minority group students rose 68 percent.

Financial aid statistics for 1967 and 1968 are not comparable.

## COMMENT ON THE REPORT'S ACCURACY

The institutions of the State University had for many years avoided the maintenance of racial or ethnic data in student records as a means of avoiding discriminatory practices. For this reason, many of the data reported here are based on sampling, estimation or other methods of approximating what cannot be easily counted. A combination of student self-designation, visual survey, and other means of identification of minority group students has undoubtedly lead to some imprecision; however, these are the best data available.

Because of the heavy use of estimation in the collection of enrollment information, the total enrollment reported by campuses on the Federal questionnaire was occasionally different from the official enrollment already a matter of record. When this discrepancy was substantial, corrective negotiations with the campuses were conducted prior to submitting the questionnaires to Washington. Minor discrepancies were usually sent to Washington without correction because of deadline pressures. However, these minor discrepancies have been corrected in the present report by using the Federal census relationships to apportion the official Fall 1968 enrollment. This problem did not exist in the housing or financial aid statistics.

\* \* \* \* \*

We recognize the difficulties faced by each campus as it collected these data as well as the limitations of using "minority group status" as a significant educational variable. However, we believe that those who plan and those who implement the rapidly-expanding State University programs for disadvantaged students will benefit from this statistical support. Comments regarding this report and recommendations for future surveys of this type are welcomed.
