This survey sought information regarding the policies of school districts across the nation on entrance requirements to kindergarten and the first grade. The school systems were classified under four strata according to total enrollment size. The most frequently reported minimum entrance age for kindergarten was 5 years of age by December 1. For the first grade, the majority of districts set 6 years by December 1 as the minimum age; a few schools required, in addition, the completion of the kindergarten level. Exceptions to the rules are summarized by district in the study. Chronological age is the principal entrance criterion, with other factors such as sex. I.O., and social maturity becoming more influential. Extensive tables list the district admission requirements and State laws that affect these admission standards. (LN)

ENTRANCE AGE POLICIES

Six years ago the Educational Research
Service surveyed the policies of selected local
school districts governing admission to kindergarten and first grade. The report of the 196263 survey is no longer available, but continuing
requests for copies indicate that a number of
school systems are revising or reviewing their
entrance age policies. To gather current information which reflects recent changes, the questionnaire on page 51 was sent in the spring of
1968 to the 503 school systems operating elementary schools and enrolling 12,000 or more pupils.
Replies were received in each enrollment stratum
as follows:

In the text which follows, some comparisons are made with the 1962-63 study. It should be kept in mind, however, that although the earlier survey covered the same enrollment strata, it included 154 fewer school systems than the present survey. Of the 479 systems in the present study, only 312 were also represented in the 1962-63 Circular.

Responses of the 479 systems regarding 1968-69 minimum entrance age requirements, exceptions to these requirements, and changes in the policies since the 1962-63 survey are reported individually in the system-by-system table beginning on page 7.

State Permissive Attendance Laws

Often, statutes mandate uniformity in minimum entrance age requirements among school districts within a state. For instance, all 68 California school systems in this survey require pupils to be 5 and 6 years of age by December 1 for admission to kindergarten and first grade, respectively. These California districts account

for more than one-half of all the districts in the survey with a December 1 cutoff date. Likewise, 23 of the 26 districts which have established October 15 or 16 as the required birth date are in the state of North Carolina.

Because a number of districts reported that recent or planned changes in entrance age requiraments are the result of new state legislation, a table outlining state permissive attendance laws for kindergarten and first grade has been compiled through correspondence directly with each state department of education. Columns 2 and 3 of this table (page 45) show the state law on minimum permissive entrance age, with planned changes noted. Column 4 is devoted to provisions in the statutes which affect the information reported in Columns 2 and 3, as well as pertinent rulings of state attorneys general and state board resolutions. Column 5 indicates the states which currently have some form of state aid to kindergartens, even if only pilot or partial aid programs.

Age of Admission to Kindergarten

In 1968-69 kindergartens will be operated by 328 (68.5 percent) of the 479 responding systems, a slightly higher percentage than in 1962-63 when 61.5 percent of the 325 systems had kindergartens. Systems which reported operating summer kindergarten programs or school-year programs financed by ESEA or OEO funds have not been tabulated in this group; such programs are noted in Column 5 of the system-by-system table. The questionnaire used in the survey specifically eliminated Head Start programs.



As can be seen from Table A, the most frequently reported minimum entrance age requirement was 5 years of age by December 1, and the second most frequently mentioned age was 5 by Jahuary 1. Thus, 57.4 percent of the responding districts require a kindergarten entrance age of 4 years, 8 or 9 months, by the opening of school. Only 5.2 percent of the systems have cutoff dates after January 1 for fall admission.

While the same rank of frequency also appeared for these two cutoff dates in the 1963 Circular, the percentage of systems with these

dates in that study was greater (65.5 percent) than in the present study (57.4 percent). Percentagewise, the birth date showing the greatest increase since 1963 is October 1. In the earlier study, 6.5 percent of the responding districts reported this date, while in this survey 15.9 percent of the districts set a birth date of October 1.

Age of Admission to First Grade

As shown in Table B, on page 3, 46.6 percent of the responding districts have set either De-

cember 1 or January 1 as the required date by which a child must reach six years of age for fall admission. In 1962-63, 53.5 percent reported these dates.

As will be noted in Table 2, 16 districts which reported a required birth date for kinder-garten admission require completion of kinder-garten for first grade admission. Another district reported that no minimum has been established for first grade admission because each child is evaluated individually to determine his grade placement. With two exceptions, these

York. As can be seen from the table on state permissive attendance legislation, these states have only one permissive attendance requirement—5 years of age by a given date—and all three offer state aid to kindergartens.

Exceptions to Entrance Age Requirements

Reporter by a number of school systems were conditions under which they will accept children whose birthdays fall after the specified cutoff date. As shown in summary table C, about one-

fourth will make exceptions to the kindergarten entrance requirement, while exactly one-half will permit early entrance to the first grade under certain circumstances.

The bases upon which exceptions are made to entrance age requirements are summarized in Table D. It will be noted that transfer from a district with a lower entrance age requirement is the reason cost frequently reported for early admittance to first grade, but at the kindergarten level, transfer ranks second to evidence of advanced maturity and intelligence as a basis for accepting younger children. This is due in large measure to the fact that all 68 California districts in the survey are required by state law to make this exception for first-graders, while only a few apply it to kindergarten transferces since they are not specified in the law. California statutes also account for the majority of the districts accepting completion of kindergarten, regardless of age, as qualification for first-grade admission. One district in New York accepts completion of nursery school as sufficient qualification for kindergarten admission.

Only a few more districts have established a policy to permit early admission to kindergarten on the basis of advanced maturity and intelligence (49) than have such a policy for first grade (46). Of course, in most districts where early admission to kindergarten has been granted, admission to first grade is automatic the following year; such districts are not tabulated among the 46 making exceptions on the basis of testing and observation.

While not strictly an exception to entrance age requirements, the possibility of acceleration from kindergarten to first grade, usually during the early part of the fall term, was reported by 65 districts; many of the 65 are in California, which has permissive legislation to this effect.

Of the 16 districts which require completion of kindergarten instead of specifying a minimum age for admission to first grade (see Table B), nine will make exceptions to this rule

in unusual circumstances, and three require students without this experience to enroll in kindergarten but will move the child to first grade if observation indicates that he is ready.

Several systems reported admitting handicapped students to special education classes at a younger age than required by policy. Since there are undoubtedly many more systems which follow this practice, this exception has not been noted in the system-by-system table.

Recent Changes in Entrance Age Policies

The final inquiry on the questionnaire used in this survey asked respondents to report any changes in entrance age policies within the past six years. The replies to this question are shown in Column 5 of the system-by-system table. In the few cases where the respondents checked "no change," but the cutoff date reported for 1968-69 was different from that reported in



1962-63, this fact has been noted in Column 5. Comparison of the two studies also revealed that the operation of kindergartens has begun within the past six years in some districts, and this fact likewise has been noted. A summary of the recent changes is presented in Table E.

Many of the changes reported in Table E are the results of state legislation enacted since 1962-63. All state legislation which changed permissive attendance ages has moved the requirement back; that is, a child now has to be older than previously to be admitted. Also, most of the 48 systems reported in Table E as having recently initiated provision for acceleration from kindergarten to grade 1 are in California, where legislation permitting such a policy has been enacted since 1962-63.

It is interesting to note that an almost equal number of districts have adopted early admission policies (13) as have abandoned them (11).

The initiation of kindergartens is in some districts the result of recent legislation to provide state aid for kindergartens, notably in Maryland and Virginia.

Although the facts revealed by the 1963 and 1968 studies cannot be used for exact comparisons, this survey does seem to indicate a few trends. For example: (1) Where changes are being made in the age required for admission to kindergarten and first grade, it is being raised. (2) Policies permitting acceleration to grade 1 of youngsters who show exceptional ability in kindergarten are being adopted by an increasing number of school systems. (3) Also on the in-

crease is the policy of considering completion of a full year of approved kindergarten as qualification for entering first grade.

An Observation

while the variety of new technological and instructional practices often make it possible for a child, regardless of age, to be successful in school, only one district indicated that because the ungraded arrangement exists in grades one and two in the district, no early admission or acceleration policies have been adopted.

"On what basis should a child be admitted to kindergarten and first grade?" is a question to which many pages of educational research have seen devoted. Attempts to identify accurate predictors of readiness to begin the learning program provided by the school have identified several variables which seem to be related to the age at which readiness is achieved, such as sex, father's occupation, I.Q., social maturity, but none of these studies has conclusively proved that any one indicator should replace the long-followed practice of admission based on chronological age. The vast majority of districts still use chronological age as the primary criterion for school entrance. However, it is clear that more and more consideration is being given to what to do with the child once he has been admitted. Instruction is being tailored to the developmental, environmental, and ability level of each child, thus making the question of "right age" largely an administrative device.

<u>Footnote</u>:

a/ STATE OF CALIFORNIA Section 5302 of the California Education Code reads as follows:

"A child who has been lawfully admitted to the public school kindergarten as defined by the State of California, in Californ... or any other state, and who has completed one year therein shall be admitted to the first grade of an elementary school regardless of age.

"A child who has been lawfully admitted to a public school kindergarten in California and who is judged by the administration of the school district, in accordance with rules and regulations adopted by the State Board of Education, to be ready for first-grade work may be admitted to the first grade at the discretion of the school administration of the district and with the consent of the child's parent or guardian regardless of age.

"Where a child has been legally enrolled in the public schools of another district within or out of the State, he may be admitted to school and placed in the grade of enrollment in the district of former attendance, at the discretion of the school administration of the district entered.

"No child shall be admitted to the first grade of an elementary school pursuant to this section unless the child is at least five years of age."

The second paragraph of Section 5302, permitting the local school administration, at its own discretion, to provide for acceleration to grade 1 from kindergarten, was adopted in 1963. Adopted that same year was the State Board regulation governing the implementation of the new policy by the local districts (California Administrative Code, Title 5, Section 65.1). This regulation states that the procedures adopted by the local board "shall insure that a kindergarten pupil placed in the first grade meets the following criteria:

- "(1) The child is at least five years of age.
- "(2) The child has attended a public school kindergarten for a long enough time to enable school personnel to make an evaluation of his ability.

- "(3) The child is in the upper five percent of his age group in terms of general mental ability as determined by appropriate tests.
- "(4) The physical development and social maturity of the child are consistent with his advanced mental avility.
- "(5) The parent or guardian of the child has filed with the school district a written statement approving placement in the first grade."

Where it appears from a school system's response to the questionnaire that, in accordance with the above state policy and regulation, the local board has established procedures for acceleration from kindergarten to grade 1, the phrase "may be accelerated from kindergarten" appear in column 4.

The third paragraph of Section 5302, permitting the local school administration to place a child entering from another district "in the grade of enrollment in the district of former attendance" apparently is interpreted in most California districts as applicable to grade 1 only. However, a few of the responses seemed to indicate that the policy applies also to kindergarten; where this is so, it has been noted in column 4.
