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An inventory of continuing education activities in institutions of higher learning in Pennsylvania produced a 92% return of questionnaires (145) from private colleges and universities, junior and community colleges, state aided colleges and universities, state related colleges, and state universities and colleges. Activities were classified by the following program categories: associate degree credit, undergraduate degree credit, graduate degree credit, nondegree credit, noncredit, and conferences-workshops-seminars. Data are tabulated by participation by program categories, distribution of courses by credit categories and academic subject areas, and distribution of programs by subject areas. The appendix includes the questionnaire and a listing of institutions responding to the survey with types of continuing education activities for the period July 1, 1967 - June 30, 1968. (nl)

PREFACE

In July 1966 the State Board of Education of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania presented a Report of Progress on a Master Plan for Higher Education in Pennsylvania. This report had relatively little to say about continuing education for adults. It did reiterate, however, what many adult education leaders have been saying in Pennsylvania for several years — that there is a need to coordinate institutional efforts in continuing education, and that a first step must be basic data collection.

STATEMENT FROM THE PROGRESS REPORT

"Unfortunately, there is no accurate or relatively complete summary of current continuing education and community service activities on the part of colleges and universities in Pennsylvania. It seems clear that if some of the resources of higher education are to be used for this purpose, some coordination of effort is desirable. However, before reasonable steps can be taken, basic data about what is now being done must be developed. Therefore, it is proposed that the State Board of Education establish a task force on continuing education to conduct a state-wide analysis of current continuing education and community service activities on the part of colleges and universities, to study the total resources presently available in Pennsylvania for such education efforts, and to analyze the different kinds of programs needed. The task force should make recommendations concerning the kinds of continuing education and community service programs that should be developed in the Commonwealth's System of Higher Education, the mechanisms for coordinating this effort among the institutions of the state, and approaches to combining federal, state, and local funds to be devoted to these objectives."

After the release of this report on a Master Plan, no specific steps were taken on a coordinated or state-wide basis to implement the recommendations concerning continuing education until an informal and unofficial but interested group of adult education leaders developed the idea of inventorying the continuing education activities in Pennsylvania, on a trial basis.

The group composed of representatives from the Pennsylvania Association for Adult Education, The Department of Public Instruction, and The Pennsylvania State University, devised a pilot plan to inventory continuing education activities, then appointed a task force to implement the plan.

Application was made to the Department of Public Instruction for funds to help conduct the survey. Federal funds under the Vocational Education Act of 1963 were approved and the inventory of continuing education activities in Pennsylvania was started.

On the following pages is a report of the inventory including the method, summary and listings of continuing education activities by type of program and by institution.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

This inventory of continuing education activities in Pennsylvania has required the cooperation of many individuals and many institutions of higher learning. It is with deep appreciation that I attempt to acknowledge those who made this pilot project possible.

The first step towards accomplishing this report came from Dr. Benjamin W. Barkas, then President of The Pennsylvania Association for Adult Education. His interest in adult education in Pennsylvania brought together the small informal group of adult educators who devised a pilot plan to inventory continuing education activities.

The inventory was conducted in two phases: (1) activities offered by institutions of higher learning, and (2) activities offered by secondary school districts. This report presents the results of the institutions of higher learning phase only. A separate report of continuing education activities in the secondary schools is also available.

The group which originated the survey idea consisted of Dr. Barkas, (The Pennsylvania Association for Adult Education); Dr. John W. Struck, Director, Bureau of Vocational, Technical, and Continuing Education; Alfred S. Holt, Chief, Division of Continuing Education; Dr. George W. Hoffman and Dr. Oscar E. Thompson, Bureau of State Colleges and Universities; Dr. Louis W. Bender, Director, Bureau of Community Colleges, (all of the Department of Public Instruction); and Floyd B. Fischer, Director of Continuing Education, (The Pennsylvania State University). This group was assisted by Jack Sittman, Division of Continuing Education; James P. Murphy and Dr. Robert Shephard, Bureau of Community Colleges, (all of the Department of Public Instruction); and Dr. H. LeRoy Marlow, (The Pennsylvania State University).

The inventory of activities was accomplished by a questionnaire developed by a committee of educators. Dr. H. LeRoy Marlow, Head, Department of Planning Studies, Continuing Education, The Pennsylvania State University, administered the inventory and served as project director. Through his department, questionnaires were distributed and all data collected and processed.

Questionnaires were sent to 145 institutions of higher learning in Pennsylvania. The cooperation of these institutions was basic to the development of this report. The many administrators responsible for collecting data at these institutions made possible this first inventory of continuing education activities in Pennsylvania.

The preparation of this report was made possible through federal funds provided by the Vocational Education Act of 1963, and awarded by the Bureau of Vocational, Technical, and Continuing Education, The Pennsylvania Department of Public Instruction.

The outline and basic draft of this report was developed and written by Marcus K. Davis, Assistant to the Director of Continuing Education, The Pennsylvania State University.

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BACKGROUND AND PROCEDURES

Problem

Within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the institutions of higher learning are serving the needs of the adult population of Pennsylvania through many continuing education activities. Presently each institution is developing the activities it believes are needed by the population with no complete means of determining the availability of similar activities. As a result much effort is wasted, on the part of educational personnel, by the preparation and duplication of continuing education programs. There is no central source or complete inventory of such state-wide activities available.

Objectives

The objectives of this project were to plan, design, and conduct an inventory of continuing education activities which should assist the educators of the Commonwealth to better program their adult continuing education programs and eliminate costly duplication of effort. It is hoped, as the result of this project, that a basic inventory of continuing education activities can be established and that it can be maintained on an annual basis as one means of meeting the needs of educators in the rapidly expanding field of continuing education.

Procedures

A questionnaire was developed and forwarded to 145 institutions. Replies were received from 133 institutions (92%). Table 1 explains the distribution of the questionnaires by types of institutions.

The questionnaires returned by the 133 institutions showed that 89 institutions of higher learning (67%) in Pennsylvania conducted some type of continuing education activity during 1967-1968.

SURVEY RESULTS

On the following pages are presented the data as reported by the participating institutions.

Program Categories

The institutions were instructed to classify their activities by the following program categories: Associate Degree Credit, Undergraduate Degree Credit, Graduate Degree Credit, Non-Degree Credit, Non-Credit, and Conferences-Workshops-Seminars. Table 2 shows the number of institutions offering activities by program categories. The definition of terms is included in the questionnaire (Appendix A, page 19).

Credit Categories by Subject Areas

A complete listing of continuing education programs offered by institutions of higher learning in Pennsylvania was one objective of this inventory. However, some institutions failed to list courses by title or credit category. Some institutions reported continuing education activities on the Higher Education General Information Survey, OE Form 2300-8, used by the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare. The Health, Education, and Welfare form was only partially compatible with the survey instrument used for this inventory.

Of the 89 institutions that reported some type of continuing education activity, 57 institutions (64%) listed courses by title and credit category. These titles have been grouped by subject areas established by the National University Extension Association and the Association of University Evening Colleges and are shown in Table 5. Explanation of categories is presented in Appendix B, page 20.

Conferences, Workshops, and Seminars

Sixty (67%) of the 89 institutions who conducted continuing education activities sponsor some conference activity (conferences, workshops, and seminars). Participation in these activities totaled 86,643 registrations.

Institutions reported conference activities by program titles. These titles have been grouped in Table 6 by the same AUEC-NUEA definitions previously explained.

GENERAL COMMENTS

This project has been only an initial attempt to compile much needed information. The results are not complete and the data compiled are not conclusive; however, the experience gained through this pilot project will make the results of future inventories more meaningful and useful to institutions conducting continuing education activities.

It is hoped that an inventory of continuing education activities can be established and maintained on an annual basis. However, such an annual inventory will be a valuable and useful tool only to the degree that the institutions provide the data as requested.

This study has shown that a glossary of continuing education terms — acceptable to all institutions — is urgently needed if meaningful reporting is to occur. The definitions of the Association of University Evening Colleges and the National University Extension Association should be expanded and other definitions established so that institutions can descriptively indicate the nature and extent of their continuing education activities.

A central clearing house for collecting and coordinating information about the continuing education resources of the Commonwealth should be established. Such a service would improve planning procedures, help eliminate duplication in activities and assist the citizens of Pennsylvania in locating needed educational programs.

APPENDIX A

Instructions:

For the purpose of this questionnaire Continuing Education will be defined to include all educational activities conducted by your institution except programs of resident instruction.

In order to simplify the completion of the questionnaire and to standardize reporting procedures the following definitions, developed by the Association of University Evening Colleges and the National University Extension Association will be used.

Class

A group of students which meet regularly but which has intervening time periods between meetings. It is conducted over a period of the same or fewer weeks as in the semester, quarter, or session in which it is offered, and the contact-hour workload is average or less than the scholastic period involved. A class is given face to face instruction by a teacher or lecturer. Although the format and setting are in general those of a standard classroom a class may utilize the informal atmosphere of a discussion group or lecture discussion group, emphasizing intellectual inter-action among group members under the direction of an academically trained leader, and may meet in a private home or other non-institutional setting.

Degree Credit Programs

A college-level course that carries credit toward an associate, bachelor's or higher degree or equivalent recognition, whether in the given institution, or by transfer to another institution.

Non-Degree Credit Programs

A college-level course that is creditable toward a certificate or diploma, but not toward an associate, bachelor's or higher degree.

Non-Credit Programs

A college-level course which carries no credit toward an associate, bachelor's or credit to a higher degree or a credit certificate or diploma, but which may be used to satisfy requirements for a non-credit or informal certificate.

Registration

One enrollment in a single educational activity. Registrations refer only to the number of enrollees; they do not refer to individual persons.

Conference, Institution and Workshop

An organized instructional program which meets for three hours or more in continuous session except for approved free periods of coffee, meals and afternoon and evening recesses.
