There are undoubtedly gaps in this first selection of paperback titles. Many new titles are planned for publication in the Fall. It is expected that, if there is a demand for such a collection for display on an annual or a continuing basis, arrangements may be made to provide a "permanent" or "traveling" exhibit to meet the growing demand.

Our resources, both human and material, can supplement and support anti-poverty activities, the work of the Urban Coalition, model cities programs and urban renewal and development projects. Library materials can and should be used to promote racial pride and ethnic identity. But they must also be used to develop interracial understanding, community stability and a true sense of the oneness of mankind.**

**"The warnings have been eloquent and unmistakable. Our institutions must be responsive to the needs of the people. The increasing polarization of society between the whites and the blacks, separate and unequal, must be dissolved. The educationally dispossessed, the economically disenfranchised, must share with all a sense of personal worth, of human dignity and the opportunity to seek individual self-fulfillment. This is the promise held out by the American dream and each of us has a terribly high stake in making that promise come true."**
