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ABSTRACT

This study of college language registration and student contact hours presents data for all foreign languages taught in colleges and universities. The body of the report consists of 24 tables, in which the data are summarized, and a directory of the 2,149 institutions that reported registrations in one or more foreign languages. It is the first in the Modern Language Association of America series to include summer school data. A feature new to these surveys is the listing of student contact hours alongside the registration figures. Registration data from 1960, 1963, and 1965 have been incorporated in this report to provide background for the 1968 registration and to chart trends over the nine-year period. A section on foreign language registrations in institutions of higher education by state and institution for fall 1968 is included in an appendix with a sample report form used in the survey. An introductory section discusses the tables and data. (Author/RL)

FOREWORD

The present study of college language registrations, ninth in a series that the Modern Language Association has conducted under contract with the United States Office of Education, is the second to present data for all foreign languages taught in the colleges and universities. The body of the report consists of twenty-four tables, in which the data are summarized, and a directory of the 2149 institutions that reported registrations in one or more foreign languages. It is the first to include summer school data (see Tables 19-24 for Summer 1969 data).

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It should be borne in mind, in consulting the comparative figures, that those for each year are derived from a different base, ranging from 1661 institutions in 1960 to 2149 in fall 1968.

A feature new to these surveys is the listing of "student contact hours" alongside the registration figures. Instructions on the questionnaire requested a count not only of the foreign language registrations but also of total student contact hours, the latter to be computed by multiplying the number of individual registrations in each course by the number of hours of student attendance in a given week (see Appendix II for a reproduction of the questionnaire). The addition of this extra dimension was made at the suggestion of Dr. Gene Brandes, U.S. Office of Education, to whom we express our appreciation for his initiative in the matter.

We wish to record once more our gratitude to Mrs. Julia A. Petrov of the Office of Education, whose zeal and special knowledge proved helpful at every stage of the project. We acknowledge with thanks the splendid cooperation of the registrars who supplied the data upon which the report is based.

**FOREIGN LANGUAGE REGISTRATIONS IN INSTITUTIONS OF
HIGHER EDUCATION, FALL 1968 AND SUMMER 1969**

The basic data for this report were obtained from a questionnaire sent to the 2,599 institutions of higher education—junior colleges, four-year colleges, and universities—listed in the 1967-68 Education Directory, Part 3—Higher Education, published by the U.S. Office of Education, and in the 1968 Directory of Junior Colleges, published by the American Association of Junior Colleges. Replies were received from 2,479 institutions. Questionnaire mailings and returns are summarized below:

Of the institutions reporting foreign languages, 1,328 reported modern languages only, 29 reported classical languages (Latin and Ancient Greek) only, 792 offered both modern and classical.

In the last previous full-coverage survey, for Fall 1965, 2,207 institutions were canvassed and 2,100 replies were received. Of these replies, 1,880 (89.5%) reported registrations in modern foreign languages, and 53 others reported classical languages only, bringing the total number of institutions offering foreign languages to 1,933 or 92% of the total completing the questionnaire.

DISTRIBUTION OF REGISTRATIONS

In 1968 there were 1,127,363 registrations in foreign languages in the 2,149 colleges and universities that supplied registration data for this survey. Five languages—French, German, Spanish, Italian, and Russian—accounted for 92.3% of these registrations, Latin and Greek accounted for an additional 4.8% and the remaining 2.9% were distributed among 105 additional languages, ancient and modern.

The Five Leading Modern Languages

Of the 1,040,284 registrations in these five languages, 93.2% are shared among French, Spanish, and German; 6.8% are divided between Russian and Italian.

French is still the most widely taught foreign language in colleges and universities. It is first in registrations in 31 states and the District of Columbia, and is second in 18 additional states. Spanish, in second place, holds first rank in 18 states and second in 28 others. German leads in one state, North Dakota, and holds second place in five.

French has retained its place at the top of the registration column, but its share of the total, having increased steadily from 38.4% in 1960 to 39% in 1965, has now begun to decline. The figure for 1968 is 37.3%. Spanish has continued to gain ground at the expense of French and German: its share of the total in 1960 was 30% (8.4% lower than French), its share in 1968 is 35.1 (only 2.2% less than French). German has continued to decline since 1960, Italian has increased steadily, and Russian, which declined from 5.1% in 1960 to 3.5 in 1965, has come up to 3.9%.

GRADUATE REGISTRATIONS IN MODERN LANGUAGES

Graduate registrations in the five leading modern languages show a gain of 111.2% between 1960 and 1968. The rate of growth was greatest—77.8%—during the three-year period between 1960 and 1963; between 1963 and 1965 the rate was 15%, between 1965 and 1968, 3.2%. Among the languages, Spanish has consistently shown the highest rate of growth; its total for 1968 represents an increase of 222.3% over that for 1960. French is second with an increase of 117.2%, and Italian is third with a gain of 115.2%. All the languages showed a substantial increase in graduate registrations between 1960 and 1963, but for 1965, and again for 1968, the figures for Russian show a decline; German continued to gain between 1963 and 1965, but decreased by 10.3% between 1965 and 1968.

The first chart below shows registrations at the graduate level in the five leading modern languages; the second chart shows the rate of growth between surveys, for each language; and the third compares the undergraduate and graduate shares of the total language registration. FOREIGN LANGUAGE REGISTRATIONS IN JUNIOR COLLEGES

The junior colleges continue to grow and become increasingly active as centers of foreign language instruction. In 1960, 455 two-year colleges reported foreign language registrations; by 1968 the number had grown to 754, or 79.4% of the 950 junior colleges that responded to the questionnaire. In the same period their language registration increased to nearly two and one-half times the 1960 figure, and their share of the total college registration in languages increased from one in twelve to nearly one in eight.

Spanish is the leading language in the junior college, accounting for 46.2% of the registrations in the five leading modern languages in 1968. French is in second place, with 34% of the total, and German is third, with 16.1%.

Fifty junior colleges reported a total of 1,450 registrations in Latin in 1968, and forty colleges reported 1,133 in Greek.

Relatively few two-year colleges offer instruction in the less commonly taught languages; 1,266 registrations in such languages were reported by twenty-five junior colleges in 1968—chiefly in Hebrew, Japanese, and Chinese.

Modern language registration figures and trends in four-year colleges and junior colleges are compared in the chart below. (See also Tables 3-13.)

LATIN AND GREEK REGISTRATIONS

Prior to 1965 the MLA did not gather registration data for Latin and Greek; consequently only that year's figures are available for comparison with the figures for 1968. In 1965, 626 institutions reported a total of 39,588 registrations in Latin; 537 institutions reported 19,531 registrations in Greek. In 1968 the figures for Latin are 11% lower than those for 1965, the totals for Greek are only 1.2% lower.

Latin

Of the 2,479 institutions that responded to the 1968 MLA questionnaire, 619 (25%) reported registrations in Latin. The total includes 29 institutions that offer courses in classical languages but not in modern languages. There were 33,522 undergraduate registrations in Latin, plus 1,459 graduate, for a total of 34,981. Of the undergraduate registrations, 1,450 were in junior colleges. (See Table 18 for further analysis of the Latin data.)

Greek

Greek registrations for 1968 were reported by 625 institutions, or 25.2% of the 2,479 that responded to the questionnaire. There were 16,095 undergraduate registrations (including 1,133 in junior colleges), plus 3,190 graduate, for a total of 19,285.

REGISTRATIONS IN OTHER LANGUAGES

Other languages—defined for purposes of this report as all those except the five leading modern languages, Latin, and Greek—accounted for 32,813 registrations in 1968, or about 2.9% of the total college language registration. They were distributed among 105 different languages, ancient and modern. The largest group was registered in Hebrew, taught in 169 colleges; its registrations accounted for more than 30% of the total. Chinese, Japanese, and Portuguese each had more than 4,000 registrations.

Swahili, now offered in twenty-nine colleges, has the highest growth rate among all the languages covered by the survey: it had 22 registrations in 1960, and 608 in 1968. Yiddish increased from 13 to 109 during the same period; the figures for Hindi tripled; and Portuguese had nearly four times as many registrations in 1968 as in 1960.

One institution in seven offers instruction in one or more "other" languages. The largest number of "other" languages taught by a given institution is thirty-six, at Indiana University and the Los Angeles campus of the University of California. Several universities list registrations in twenty or more of the less widely taught languages. These include the University of California at Berkeley and the University of Washington, in the West; the Universities of Chicago, Minnesota and Wisconsin (Madison) in the Midwest; and Columbia and Harvard in the East. SUMMER 1969

Previous surveys in this series have included foreign language registrations for the fall term of the regular session only; in the present survey, 879 institutions reported their language registrations for summer 1969. All of these were among the 2,149 institutions that reported their data for fall 1968; they are indicated by a dagger (†) in Appendix I (please note, however, that the registration figures for the schools thus identified do not include summer figures).

Total foreign language registrations reported for summer 1969 were 141,763. Of these, 133,950 were in the five leading modern languages; Spanish, with 42.7% of this total, was ahead of French, which accounted for 33.8%, thus reversing the order that has always prevailed in the fall surveys. German, in third place with 19.1% of the total, maintained both its rank and its proportion of the total. Italian and Russian shared the remaining registrations, which amounted to just under five percent of the total.

Summer language registrations at the graduate level totalled approximately 17,000, half as large as the fall 1968 graduate enrollment, even though the total summer enrollment in languages was only one-eighth that of the fall. French enrollment at this level was ahead of Spanish.

Both Latin and Greek had fewer registrations in comparison with the modern languages than in the fall; "other" languages, with some 4,000 registrations, maintained their proportionate strength.

Student contact hours averaged 8.0 in the summer, compared with 3.8 in the fall session, a reflection, obviously, of the intensive schedules characteristic of so many summer courses.

Summer registration data are presented in detail in Tables 19-24.
