ABSTRACT

This report provides statistical information on the development of continuing education since 1965. Although there is an increase in the number of part time students at most campuses each year, in many instances evening credit courses are not offered in a pattern which will allow enrollees to make consistent progress toward an undergraduate degree. The state-operated campuses enrolled 1,758 students in the fall of 1968. There was a slight increase in off-campus credit enrollments during 1967 and 1968 due largely to a greater use of technology. In the fall of 1968, 982 students were enrolled for credit in the Independent Study (Correspondence) Program. Currently, new enrollments are being added at an approximate rate of 225 a month and in December, 1969, 4,821 students were enrolled in this program at the 14 participating campuses. The first survey of non-credit programing in continuing education conducted in July 1968 for the 1967-68 academic year showed that 121,563 persons attended 1,786 short courses, institutes, and seminars. A similar study completed in July 1969 indicated that 2,439 short courses, institutes, and seminars were offered during the 1968-1969 academic year with 138,621 persons enrolled. (nl)

Continuing Education in the State University

One measure of the progress which has been made in the development of continuing education programming throughout the State University of New York is the growth of part-time credit and non-credit enrollments. This report provides statistical information relative to the development of continuing education since 1965.

Enrollments in Credit Courses

While some part-time students are actually full-time students carrying less than a full load, a large majority of students represented in the statistics on credit enrollments are of post college age and have jobs and/or family responsibilities. The growth in the number of part-time students in credit courses is due largely to the increased number of courses offered by campuses during evening hours. Although there is an increase in the number of part-time students at most campuses each year, in many instances evening credit courses are not offered in a pattern which will allow enrollees to make consistent progress toward an undergraduate degree.

The State-operated campuses enrolled 1,758 students in courses offered at extension centers in the fall of 1968. There was a slight increase in off-campus credit enrollments during 1967 and 1968 due largely to a greater use of technology, primarily telelecture-telewriter equipment, which makes it possible for instructors to teach classes at remote locations while remaining at the campus.

In the fall of 1968, 982 students were enrolled for credit in the Independent Study (correspondence) Program. Currently new enrollments are being added at an approximate rate of 225 a month. As of December 31, 1969, 4,821 students were enrolled in this program at the 14 participating campuses.

Although the State University is serving an increasing number of part-time students in credit courses at the campuses each year, the number of courses offered at extension centers is relatively small. This reflects the reluctance of faculty members to travel to off-campus sites as well as faculty concern over the lack of library and laboratory resources at extension centers.

Enrollments in Non-Credit Courses

The first survey of non-credit programming in continuing education conducted in July 1968 for the 1967-1968 academic year showed that 121,563 persons attended 1,786 short courses, institutes, and seminars. A similar study completed in July 1969 indicates that 2,439 short courses, institutes, and seminars were offered during the 1968-1969 academic year with 138,621 persons enrolled.

The data gathered indicate that the development of non-credit courses has resulted in a significant number of course offerings both on and off the campus which are apparently well received.

AND INSTITUTE ENROLLMENTS

1967-69 Non-Credit Enrollments

Data are reported relating to non-credit activities conducted by 65 SUNY campuses during the July 1, 1968 to June 30, 1969 period. For comparative purposes, the 1967-68 non-credit activities reported by 59 SUNY campuses also are included.

The 65 campuses sponsored 2,439 non-credit activities during 1968-69 attended by about 138,621 enrollees. Of this total, 113,236 were reported at the 32 state-operated campuses and 25,385 were recorded at the 33 community colleges.

The total budget for 1968-69 non-credit activities sponsored by all 65 campuses was \$4.86 million. Approximately \$3.06 million of this total was expended by state-operated campuses; the remaining \$1.80 million was spent by community colleges.

INDEPENDENT STUDY SURVEY

The Office for Continuing Education is pleased to report the status of the Independent Study Program through June 30, 1969. Data will continue to be gathered on a quarterly basis and periodically reported to the Deans and Directors. This study and enrollment figures since June 30, 1969, indicate that the program is being increasingly well received in the state. The growth in enrollment also indicates that wider campus participation in the offering of courses is both desirable and realistic. If your campus administration is interested in offering independent study courses, please contact Dr. John J. DeRolf, Assistant University Dean.

The following charts deal with the 2,413 credit course enrollments from the program's inception (October 1967) and June 30, 1969. They disregard 560 non-credit enrollments in the program before June 30. It should be noted that between June 30 and October 31, there have been an additional 1,226 credit and 190 credit enrollments in the Independent Study Program. One-third of the course enrollment in this program during its two-year existence has come during the past four months.
