ABSTRACT

This report is an annotated bibliography concerning television as a technical aid in education and in pedagogical and psychological research. The main stress is placed on English and German dissertations from the period 1962 to 1969. A third section includes some other published material in the English language. The sub-sections of the three main categories are as follows: instructional television in elementary and high schools; instructional television in college and university; instructional television in teacher training; television as a special research instrument in educational and psychological research; attitudes toward instructional television and educational television; educational television: television: handbooks and technology; television: surveys and bibliographies. Three indexes, of special abbreviations, of standard abbreviations of periodicals, and of authors alphabetically with all of their contributions, are appended. (MM)

TELEVISION AS A TECHNICAL AID IN EDUCATION AND IN PEDAGO-GICAL AND PSYCHOLOGICAL RESEARCH: A BIBLIOGRAPHY

Abstract. - The report is a bibliographic account concerning television as a technical aid in education and in pedagogical and psychological research. The main stress in this bibliography lies on English and German dissertations from the period 1962 to 1969. To some extent other published material in the English language is also included.

INTRODUCTION

At the beginning of the fifties teachers and organizers of educational systems welcomed television as an invaluable aid for education by means of which one might be able to take care of the constantly growing number of students.

Today the development of closed-circuit television systems and videotape-recorders permits the use of these technical aids in schools, colleges and universities. Furthermore, they are utilized in many different fields of education and in pedagogical and psychological research.

A permanent increase of the flow of published material difficult to survey shows the great interest among educators, educational organizers and research workers in this new medium.

On this subject a series of bibliographies have been published (cf. 1.8 and 3.8 in this report).

By studying informative material concerning a specified research problem for which an extensive literature is available, for example the literature on television, one realizes that one's studies of literature must be restricted in some way or other, because otherwise one might get lost in the immense flow of published material. Usually the information one gets from bibliographies is very poor as regards the contents behind the titles. One may want to know more about the publication: is it for example a contribution to the general discussion or is it perhaps a dissertation? To receive such information would indeed be an advantage to one's study of literature.

The purpose of this report is above all to give a survey of dissertations in the English and German language since 1962, usually not within easy reach. To some extent other published material in the English language is also included.



Only to a very limited extent has German literature on this subject been taken into consideration, because there is a comprehensive and periodically published bibliography in German obtainable from the "Dokumentationsstelle des Internationalen Zentralinstituts für das Jugendund Bildungsfernschen" (8 München 2, Rundfunkplatz 1, Germany).

The published material included in this report has been divided into three main categories:

- 1. Dissertations (English)
- 2. Dissertations (German).
- 3. Other published material (English).

Each main category is subdivided into the following sub-sections.

- 1. Instructional Television (ITV) in Elementary and High School
- 2. Instructional Television (ITV) in College and University
- 3. Instructional Television (ITV) in Teacher Training
- 4. Television (TV) as a Special Research Instrument in Educational and Psychological Research
- 5. Attitudes toward Instructional Television (ITV) and Educational Television (ETV)
- 6. Educational Television (ETV)
- 7. Television: Handbooks and Technology
- 8. Television: Surveys and Bibliographies.

The dissertations and articles incorporated in these subcategories are alphabetically arranged in accordance with the author's family name. The author's first name is indicated by means of initials. In the case of a female author the first name is written in full. In addition, as long as the source material has made it possible, the papers and articles are provided with the names of the institutions from which these works are obtainable and their order numbers.

To facilitate the use of this bibliography, three indexes have been included. One lists general abbreviations, another the accepted abbreviations of the periodicals cited. The third index is alphabetically arranged according to authors. If a publication has two or more authors, only the name of the first author on the title-page is included.

Under the name of each author are to be found references to the different sections in which one or several publications by him have been listed. Thus it is fairly easy to get a general idea of what each author in this bibliography has contributed to the problems of educational television.
