ABSTRACT

This list of 49 sets of teaching materials for Spanish language instruction contains only those available in Britain which have a recorded element on disc or tape and/or visual components. Those listed are designed primarily for teaching language skills. Some reading materials with accompanying discs or tapes are included; however, recordings of literary texts are excluded. Indication of the age and level of instruction for which materials have been designed is given; and printed, recorded, and visual components for each set of materials are noted. An author index is provided. (WB)

SPANISH RECORDED AND AUDIO-VISUAL MATERIALS

This list contains only teaching materials which have a recorded element on disc or tape and/or visual materials. The materials listed are designed primarily for teaching language skills; some reading material with accompanying discs or tapes which meets this criterion may be included. Recordings of literary texts (e.g. of poetry or plays) are excluded.

Where possible an indication of the age and level of instruction for which materials have been designed is given. Longer courses often span several years of work. These may, therefore, cover a wide age-range when the whole course is used. Potential users of courses should, whenever possible, examine material and listen to selected parts for themselves to decide whether they are suitable for particular classes. Selections and examples are available for examination in the audio-visual section of the Language-Teaching Library at the Center for Information on Language Teaching. Teachers should also note that inspection and/or sample materials may be available from the publisher or distributor on request.

One criterion for inclusion in this list has been the availability of courses in Britain. Normally the descriptions given have been based on careful examination of the various parts of the courses; in a few cases this has not been possible and information has been repeated from the publishers' catalogues. Inevitably some descriptions are longer than others because of the complexity of the material. Materials published abroad have been included when agencies to supply them in Britain exist, but some can be obtained by special order only.

Details given were as far as possible correct at the time of compilation of this list, but some may change without previous notice. Before ordering courses it would be wise for purchasers to check the details and the availability of the materials with the publisher or distributor.

Notes of omissions or suggestions for improvement of this list, especially from teachers, will be welcomed and should be addressed to CILT.

For the convenience of teachers consulting this list, the materials have been described by a simple classification, which is set out overleaf. The letters appropriate to each course appear opposite its title (or the title of each separate part) in the Contents List. They indicate the level of student for whom teachers are likely to find the materials useful, and the type of material in question. This is not a rigid classification, but is intended to guide users of the list quickly to materials most likely to interest them.

Items that appear to be suitable for more than one age group or level of instruction are described by as many key letters as seem appropriate, and categories other than those for which the materials were specifically designed may well be mentioned. More detailed information may be found in the full description of the materials.

Two year introductory audio-visual course for use in the early years of the secondary school, consisting of three stages, Stage 1, 2a, and 2b. The material has been carefully graded and tested in schools with the collaboration of practising teachers. Stage 1, which

contains 20 units, is purely oral and can take up to one year to complete. Stage 2a, which contains units 21-30, introduces reading and writing, and makes use of colour filmstrips. Stage 2b, which contains units 31-40, completes the course, developing the work of the previous stages and introducing individual readers for the pupils. The units contain background information on Spanish life, presentation of situational dialogues, development exercises, songs, and wide scope for activities involving oral work. The teacher's manual gives full guidance on using the materials, lists the linguistic



content of the units and contains the text of the recorded material.

Originally intended for American schools and colleges, this course has four levels, each of which contains at least a year's work and can be used independently of the other three. Each unit is built around a dialogue, a series of sentences, or a text, which forms the basis of the exercises and structure drills which follow. New vocabulary and idioms are introduced in context at a carefully controlled pace and reintroduced at later stages for reinforcement.

The course is carefully graded and is audio-lingual in character. It can be used in the classroom with gramophone or tape-recorder, or in a language laboratory where the material can be exploited to the full. Student practice discs are provided for homework and private study.

Student participation in active conversation is encouraged. The text contains twenty-five lessons. Two-thirds of the book is devoted to conversation and reading material and one-third to grammar explanation and exercises. There are also five separate revision sections and eighteen reading sections, dealing with history and literature of Spain and Spanish America. Maps, photographs, two-way vocabularies, and several appendices and verb tables are included. The tapes contain lessons and reviews to be used with the text, and the speakers are from Spain and various South American countries. The tape manual covers all the material on the tapes except the dictations and reviews which are obtainable in a separate supplement. A concept approach to Spanish (No. 11) is a sequel to this course.

Originally conceived as an intensive audio-visual course for businessmen, this course has been developed, after extensive testing in technical colleges, to cater for a wider category of late beginner.

Dialogues centre round a businessman on a trip to Spain. A course for beginners which stresses the aural-oral approach. Each of the first two books begins with a motivating chapter: in Book One written in English, in Book Two written in Spanish. Both books contain a wealth of cultural background material with abundant drawings, photographs, maps and realia items. Spanish and Spanish American civilisation is dealt with in sections entitled 'Materias culturales' (in English). After every five chapters revision exercises and readings are provided.

There are forty basic lessons in the first book, and each lesson has dialogue, vocabulary list, questions, grammar notes, pattern drills, and varied exercises (including translation from English). There are six conversation lessons in addition, with vocabularies and oral exercises. There are appendices dealing with songs, useful expressions for class and laboratory, pronunciation and punctuation, and verb tables. Two-way and vocabularies and a grammatical index are provided.

The series is aimed at home viewers who may be beginners. Each programme begins with two-thirds of the episode dialogue. Then the language is explained and practice is given. Finally the scene is played again with the last third, which contains no new vocabulary or structures.

The book contains the text of the lessons, with grammatical notes and vocabularies. Disc No. 1 contains the basic dialogue of lessons 1–10. Disc No. 2 contains the dialogue of lessons 11–20.
