ABSTRACT

This report summarizes the characteristics of the teachers participating in the Social Learning Curriculum: Characteristics covered here are teacher age, sex, years of teaching experience, educational background, and the type and amount of supervision, with each item broken down into several subcategories for frequency counting. The data are grouped by test sites: Connecticut, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, New Jersey, several cities in New York, Pennsylvania, Florida, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Alaska, Idaho, and Utah. The totals for all the sites combined are also included. This is not a formal analysis of the variables; however, a summary is provided at the end of the report. The data presented should be useful for any further analysis of the curriculum evaluation performed to solve specific curriculum problems, and for evaluation of the effect of teachers' variables on utilization of the curriculum. A copy of the Teachers' Data Form is appended. The rationale for this evaluation phase is described in SO 000 138. The characteristics of the participating students are reported in SO 000 141. SO 000 139, SO 000 156, SO 000 157, and SO 000 158 cover other facets of the curriculum evaluation. SO 000 004 and SO 000 099 are other related documents. (SBE)





INTRODUCTION

This report summarizes the characteristics of teachers who participated in the 1968-1969 field test of the Social Learning Curriculum.

The data for this report were collected on the Teacher's Data Form. A copy of this form is provided in the Appendix. The Teacher's Data Form was filled out by all teachers who agreed to participate in the Field Test. The data were coded and keypunched on cards for computer analysis.

The characteristics covered in this report are sex, age, years of teaching experience, educational background, and the type and amount of supervision. Each item is broken down into several subcategories, and the frequency count for each subcategory is given. Teachers are grouped according to different test sites, such as New York City, New Jersey, etc. In addition to the grand total for all the areas combined, profiles of active and inactive teachers are also presented. Active teachers are those who returned the evaluation forms and actively participated in Curriculum evaluation. Inactive teachers included those who dropped out of the project during the field test and those who did not complete most of the evaluation forms.

Data presented in this report should be useful for any further analysis with regard to the effect of teachers' variables on the utilization of the Curriculum. This report does not present a formal analysis of these varibles, but a summary is provided at the end of the report in order to point out several important characteristics which are worth special attention.

A final note should be made concerning the Title Of Supervisor. Some teachers had more than one supervisor, therefore, the frequency count in this category may exceed the total number of teachers.

SUMMARY AND REMARKS

The following observations can be made of the overall field test sample.

- 1) The great majority of the teachers sampled was female. This is true of the great majority of EMR and elementary school teachers as well.
- 2) Most of the teachers sampled were either under 30 or over 40 years old. Evidently middle-aged women tend to stay home and raise families.
- 3) The great majority of teachers sampled had received at least some training in special education.
- 4) More than one fifth of the teachers had received Masters degrees. Evidently most of the teachers sampled were still seeking professional improvement.
- 5) Most teachers were experienced in teaching special classes.

 The great majority of teachers had at least one year of experience in teaching special classes; and most teachers had five to nine years of experience. A significant number of teachers had no previous experience in teaching normal classes.
- 6) Almost all of the teachers sampled were teaching full time.
- 7) Most of the teachers received some form of supervision. In general, supervision came from the Director of Special Education. When the Director of Special Education was not available, teachers were supervised by the principal. Most teachers received supervision at least once a month.

The above observations apply to each of the field test sites with the following exceptions.

1) Teachers in the Northeastern field-test network had received more education. In New York City, Mt. Vernon and Massachusetts



- the number of teachers with Masters degrees exceeded the number of teachers whose highest degree was the Bachelors.
- 2) In the Northeastern field-test network supervision was generally carried out by special personnel. In other areas teachers were generally supervised by the school principal.

 Also, supervision was less frequent outside the Northeastern area with the exception of Iowa.

The comparison of active and inactive field-test teachers revealed only one difference of any significance: active teachers tended to receive more frequent supervision.
