ABSTRACT

The study covered the four principal cotton-growing counties of Arizona - Maricopa, Pinal, Yuma, and Cochise.

Industry Growth Pattern Reports (ASES)+

Special reports covering the historical growth trend, and projection of future growth for a specific industry or an appraisal of the location, and manpower factors of a community with regard to the potential establishment of a specific industry. These reports are prepared at the request of local industrial development groups or firms interested in locating in the area.

Organization Analysis (ASES: 1969)**

A report on methods and purposes in development of organization charts.
