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ABSTRACT

The program authorized under Title IV of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, to provide help with problems incident to school desegregation, operated under an appropriation of \$10,750,000 in fiscal year 1969. During this period, the Division of Equal Educational Opportunities (DEEO) supported five distinct program activities: direct technical assistance from Office of Education (OE) staff; technical assistance and institute training in university school desegregation assistance centers; technical assistance units in State education agencies; grants to local school districts; and, training institutes in universities. DEEO staff located in four OE regional offices and in Washington, 16 university school desegregation assistance centers, and 25 State education agency units responded to more than 6,400 requests for technical assistance from over 1,300 different school systems. Title IV program funds supported training for an estimated 17,500 teachers and other school personnel in the university institutes and local school district inservice programs. Approximately 75 percent of program funds were allocated for activities to assist schools in the 17 Southern and border States. Nearly three-fourths of all school systems receiving technical assistance were located in the Southern States. (Author/JM)

The enclosed report is submitted to the Congress in response to Section 404, Title IV, of the Elementary and Secondary Education Amendments of 1967 (P.L. 90-247). Section 404 includes the following:

"...the Secretary shall transmit to the respective committees of the Congress having legislative jurisdiction over any Act referred to in section 401 and to the respective Committees on Appropriations a report evaluating the results and effectiveness of programs and projects assisted thereunder during the preceding fiscal year, together with his recommendations (including any legislative recommendations) relating thereto."

Sections 403, 404, and 405 of Title IV of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-352), which provide for Federal assistance with problems of public school desegregation, are discussed in this evaluative report.

These sections of the Civil Rights Act have been administered since 1967 by the Division of Equal Educational Opportunities in the Office of Education. Compliance efforts authorized under Title VI of the Act, formerly conducted in conjunction with Sections 403-05 under the Equal Educational Opportunities Program in the Office of Education, have been carried out since 1967 by the Office for Civil Rights in the Office of the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare.

In addition to covering the program for fiscal year 1969, this report summarizes school desegregation activities under Sections 403-05 for fiscal years 1965-68.

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PREFACE

This evaluative report reviews the status and operations during fiscal year 1969 of the program of Federal assistance to public school desegregation authorized under sections 403-05 of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Public Law 88-352). Title IV of Public Law 90-247, the Elementary and Secondary Education Amendments of 1967, calls for submittal to the concerned congressional committees of annual evaluations of Federal education programs, including sections 403-05 of the Civil Rights Law.

As the first report of the Division of Equal Educational Opportunities of the U.S. Office of Education, which has administered the program since 1967, this account also contains historical background information and statistical data covering the period from the inception of the program in fiscal 1965 through fiscal 1968.

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CIVIL RIGHTS EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Title IV of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-352) is designed to provide assistance with problems occasioned by school desegregation. Sections 403 through 405 authorize three discrete types of Federal help with the desegregation of public education--technical assistance, training institutes, and grants to school boards.

Section 403 - Technical Assistance:

The Commissioner [of Education] is authorized, upon the application of any school board, State, municipality, school district, or other governmental unit legally responsible for operating a public school or schools, to render technical assistance to such applicant in the preparation, adoption, and implementation of plans for the desegregation of public schools. Such technical assistance may, among other activities, include making available to such agencies information regarding effective methods of coping with special educational problems occasioned by desegregation, and making available to such agencies personnel of the Office of Education or other persons specially equipped to advise and assist them in coping with such problems.

Section 404 - Training Institutes:

The Commissioner is authorized to arrange, through grants or contracts, with institutions of higher education for the operation of short-term or regular session institutes for special training designed to improve the ability of teachers, supervisors, counselors, and other elementary or secondary school personnel to deal effectively with special educational problems occasioned by desegregation. Individuals who attend such an institute on a full-time basis may be paid stipends for the period of their attendance at such institute in amounts specified by the Commissioner in regulations, including allowances for travel to attend such institute.

Section 405 - Grants to School Boards:

(a) The Commissioner is authorized, upon application of a school board, to make grants to such board to pay, in whole or in part, the cost of--

- (1) giving to teachers and other school personnel inservice training in dealing with problems incident to desegregation, and
- (2) employing specialists to advise in problems incident to desegregation.

(b) In determining whether to make a grant, and in fixing the amount thereof and the terms and conditions on which it will be made, the Commissioner shall take into consideration the amount available for grants under this section and the other applications which are pending before him; the financial condition of the applicant and the other resources available to it; the nature, extent, and gravity of its problems incident to desegregation; and such other factors as he finds relevant.

The Division of Equal Educational Opportunities was established in the Bureau of Elementary and Secondary Education, U.S. Office of Education, on November 17, 1967, to carry out these provisions of title IV. Prior to this date, portions of title IV and of title VI of the Civil Rights Act (under which latter provision Federal funds for programs that discriminate as to race, color, or national origin are prohibited) were administered jointly under the Equal Educational Opportunities Program in the Office of Education. Since 1967, compliance efforts authorized under title VI have been carried out by the Office for Civil Rights in the Office of the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare.

The primary mission of the Division of Equal Educational Opportunities is that of enabling school districts to desegregate their systems successfully. To achieve this goal, the division performs two main functions:

- (1) assisting local school districts in the elimination of school segregation up to and beyond the compliance stage, and
- (2) assisting in bringing about the personal and institutional changes necessary for school desegregation to be permanent.

From fiscal year 1965, when the program began, through fiscal 1967, title IV activities focused primarily on providing funds to local school districts and universities in support of educational personnel training programs, with the major portion being allocated to short-term university institutes. Table I shows the distribution by State of title IV funds during fiscal years 1965-68. Appendixes A, B, C, and D show distribution by State and agency or university, for the same years. Because of staff limitations, very little, if any, technical assistance was rendered directly to school districts.

Evaluation of the title IV program as formerly constituted indicated that institutes had minimal effect on resolving problems of school desegregation. This was because institutes primarily attracted classroom teachers who do not make the decisions to desegregate schools; they tended to be "academic" in

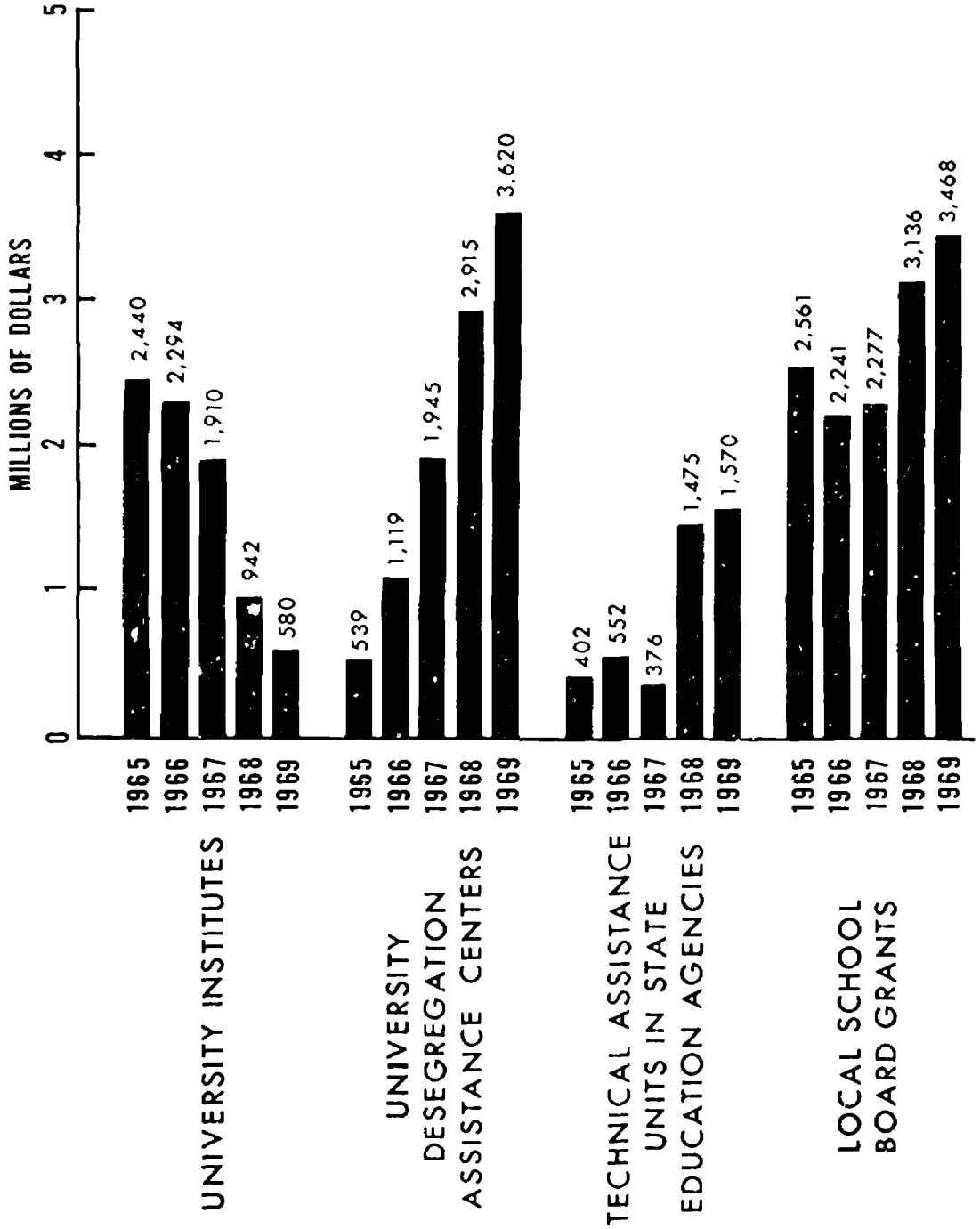
emphasis rather than to have "action-oriented" programs focused on the specific desegregation problems of participating school systems; and the brevity of the training period, coupled with lack of followup or a continuing relationship with specific school districts, caused institute training to be relatively ineffective.

In view of this lack of impact, the decision was made at the beginning of fiscal 1968 to shift program emphasis. It was then determined that technical assistance to school districts should be the major thrust of the program, with grants and institutes serving as means to supplement such assistance in specific school desegregation cases. The overall change in program emphasis since fiscal 1967 is illustrated in figure 1.

Technical assistance provided under title IV is primarily educational in nature. In most instances, division assistance is made available only after the school system seeking such help has accepted responsibility for proceeding with desegregation of its schools.

All assistance available through the program is for the specific purpose of helping public elementary and secondary schools with problems incident to desegregation and is provided only at the request of a school district. It may come from a number of

Help in identifying desegregation facts and problems

Advice on comprehensive desegregation planning

Guidance in obtaining community acceptance of desegregation

Planning of desegregation training programs for school personnel

Supplying of information on the educational implications of desegregation and successful practices to end school segregation

Recommendation of curricular and organizational changes which can help achieve desegregation

Stimulation and assistance in the development of proposals for grants and training institutes directed toward desegregation objectives

Encouragement of university involvement in school desegregation efforts

Aid to State education agencies wishing to provide leadership and assistance for local school desegregation efforts

Coordination with other Federal programs and assistance in effective utilization of funds from programs to advance school desegregation

Office of Education Specialists. Direct technical assistance is available through Office of Education specialists located in the regional offices and in Washington. The professional staff is

made up of trained and experienced educators who are capable of working with school administrators on educational and administrative problems which must be overcome when a school district wishes to desegregate its schools.

State education agency technical assistance units. Technical assistance units in State education agencies may be fully or partially funded under title IV to aid the agencies in carrying out the primary leadership and assistance responsibilities they have in school desegregation matters. These units also help local education agencies in effecting school desegregation.

State education agency technical assistance units are needed because (1) the primary State role in school desegregation is crucial to the ultimate achievement of truly equal educational opportunities; (2) such support helps strengthen State education agencies for providing leadership and assistance in desegregation to local school districts; and (3) these units help make it possible for the State education agency to coordinate its programs and services to aid districts that are desegregating and for carrying out the State agency's own compliance requirements.

University school desegregation assistance centers. These centers, located in colleges and universities, provide a continuing source of consultation and training expertise to school districts in the university's service area. They are concentrated in States where the need for desegregation assistance has been greatest. Besides consulting with and assisting school boards and superintendents of schools, each center provides training programs specifically related to desegregation plans and problems of the districts served.

University school desegregation assistance centers have been created to make competent advisory assistance readily available to desegregating school districts; to benefit from and build upon the cooperative relationships which exist between university schools of education and school districts in the same region, in order to cope with problems related to desegregation; and to utilize the many resources of a university which can help school districts with desegregation.

Grants to local school boards (or local education agencies).

Grants are awarded for proposals from local school boards to support inservice training or advisory specialist programs that (1) identify and deal with specific problems associated with school desegregation as opposed to dealing with broad problems

of quality education for which other Federal assistance funds are available; (2) make optimum use of available local, State, and university resources; (3) show that significant results can be economically achieved within a limited time, permitting title IV support funds to be phased out of the program during that period; (4) include the use of advisory specialists for the planning phase of desegregation and/or inservice training clearly aimed at implementing and supporting a comprehensive school desegregation plan; (5) provide for continuing support and assistance to the inservice training participants; and (6) demonstrate innovative programs of school desegregation.

University institutes for school personnel. These are short-term and regular session programs sponsored by institutions of higher education. These programs, which are held for school personnel--teachers, administrators, and school board members--from several districts in a region, attempt to enable the participants to solve the problems incident to desegregation in their schools. Institutes currently being funded must (1) be action-oriented, (2) involve a continuing relationship between the school districts served and the sponsoring college or university, (3) provide for followup between the institute staff and participants, and (4) select participants who can train or influence others in the school districts served.

ADMINISTRATION OF TITLE IV IN FISCAL YEAR 1969

General

During FY 1969, the Division of Equal Educational Opportunities sponsored five distinct program activities:

1. Direct technical assistance was provided through division staff assigned to four of the nine OE regional offices -- Charlottesville, Atlanta, Dallas, and San Francisco -- and to the Washington office. Division staff totaled 86, 40 of which were located in the regional offices and 28 in Washington. Eighteen additional staff were used for indirect support services.
2. Technical assistance services and institute training were provided through 16 university school desegregation assistance centers.
3. Technical assistance services were available through title IV units which have been established in 25 State education agencies.
4. Grants were awarded to 81 local education agencies for inservice training or advisory specialists.
5. University institutes for short-term training were supported at 11 institutions of higher education.

Fiscal 1969 appropriation for the division totaled \$10,750,000. Of this amount, \$1,500,000 was allocated for Administration and \$9,250,000 for Program Activities. Funds to support direct

technical assistance rendered by regional office and Washington staff were provided out of the Administration allotment. Of the \$9,250,000 allocated for Program Activities, \$9,238,032 (99.9 percent) was expended as indicated below:

Tables 2, 3, 4, and 5 show the distribution of these amounts by State and agency or university.

In fiscal 1969, as had been the case in prior years, approximately three-fourths of total program funds were expended for projects in the 17 southern and border States, the remainder being allocated to assist school systems in the northern and western sections of the country. Nearly \$7 million was distributed among the southern and border States, with the major

portion, \$5,404,349 -- almost 78 percent -- going to projects in the 11 Deep South States alone.

With regard to the allocation of FY 1969 funds for technical assistance services and for training programs, the largest share of total program funds, about 61 percent, was used for training programs. Of the total of \$5,654,413 expended for training, grants to school boards for inservice training accounted for 59.5 percent (\$3,364,193), center institutes 30.3 percent (\$1,709,794), and university institutes 10.2 percent (\$580,426). Approximately 39 percent (\$3,583,619) of program funds were used for technical assistance. The major portion of this amount, 53.3 percent (\$1,910,042) was allocated to university centers, 43.7 percent (\$1,569,530) to State education agency units and about 3 percent to local school boards for grants to hire advisory specialists.

Table 6 provides data for each region, by amount and percentage, on the distribution of FY 1969 program funds. Table 7 shows amounts expended, by State within each region, for each type of program.

Technical Assistance

Direct technical assistance rendered by division staff, university school desegregation assistance centers, and State education agency title IV units constituted the major portion of title IV activity in FY 1969. More than 6,000 requests for

various types of technical assistance from over 1,300 different school districts were serviced. Approximately three-fourths of these calls were received from nearly 1,000 school districts in the 17 southern and border States.

A major service rendered by technical assistance resources is that of assisting school systems, especially those in the southern States, with the development of comprehensive desegregation plans. During calendar year 1969, division staff and center and SEA title IV personnel developed 892 such plans for 569 different school districts throughout the Nation. To date, nearly one-third of these plans have been accepted and implemented by their respective school boards.

Prior to January 1, 1969, the Division of Equal Educational Opportunities had been involved in assisting less than a dozen school districts, under court orders, with desegregation plan development. In calendar year 1969, the number of requests for aid with plan development in such districts increased markedly. Of the total 892 plans developed, 278 were for districts desegregating under court orders, the majority of which were located in the 11 Deep South States. (See table 8.)

Although requests for assistance with plan development increased sharply in 1969, a substantial number of calls were received for those other aspects of technical assistance which are necessary

to facilitate plan implementation and the orderly disestablishment of the dual school system. More than 5,000 requests from school districts for services other than plan development were serviced through the division's assistance resources.

Requests for technical assistance help are received from local education agencies, the Office for Civil Rights, the U.S. Department of Justice, and State education departments. Most of the requests come from local education agencies. During the period under review, 4,847 calls for assistance, representing three-fourths of the total of 6,456, came from local school districts. Additional information is provided in table 9.

Training Programs

In FY 1969 the division supported training programs for school personnel, to help them cope with problems incident to desegregation, through local education agency inservice programs, university school desegregation assistance center institutes, and university institutes. Approximately 10,500 school personnel received inservice training under grants awarded to local school boards. About 700 such personnel were trained in university institute programs.

University school desegregation assistance centers sponsor a variety of training programs ranging from 1-day "drive-in" workshops to short-term (6-8 week) summer institutes. During calendar

year 1969, the 16 centers reported a total of 678 training programs involving nearly 53,000 participants from 661 different school districts (see table 10).

SUMMARY

The program authorized under title IV of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-352), to provide help with problems incident to school desegregation, operated under an appropriation of \$10,750,000 in fiscal 1969.

During this period, the Division of Equal Educational Opportunities supported five distinct program activities: (1) Direct technical assistance from Office of Education staff, (2) technical assistance and institute training in university school desegregation assistance centers, (3) technical assistance units in State education agencies, (4) grants to local school districts, and (5) training institutes in universities.

Division staff located in four OE regional offices and in Washington, 16 university school desegregation assistance centers, and 25 State education agency units responded to more than 6,400 requests for technical assistance from over 1,300 different school systems. These requests included assistance in the development of 892 comprehensive desegregation plans, 278 of which were prepared for districts desegregating under court orders.

Title IV program funds supported training for educational personnel through institutes sponsored by 16 university school desegregation assistance centers, grants to 81 local education agencies for inservice programs, and 11 university institutes other than those in the centers. It is estimated that approximately 17,500 teachers and other school personnel received training in the university institutes and local school district inservice programs. More than 50,000 such personnel were reported to have been included in diverse kinds of training programs sponsored by the centers.

In FY 1969, as in previous years, the bulk of the division's effort was expended in the southern States. Approximately 75 percent of program funds were allocated for activities to assist schools in the 17 southern and border States; the balance was used to aid school districts in the remainder of the country. Nearly three-fourths of all school systems requesting and receiving technical assistance services were located in the southern States.
