


ABSTRACT

This bibliography contains 25 citations of published and unpublished documents ranging in date from 1964 through 1969 on "the means and methods by which school personnel are prepared to work with preschool age children in such settings as Head Start programs and nursery and kindergarten classes." Citations are subsumed under three headings: 1) Early Childhood Teachers and Their Education; 2) Early Childhood Teacher Aides and Their Education; 3) Young Children and Their Education. All citations represent documents which have been abstracted and indexed by the ERIC Clearinghouse on Teacher Education. Citations include the ERIC descriptors assigned to each document. In addition, a list of the descriptors used in compiling the bibliography is supplied. (PT)

PREFACE

One of the priorities guiding the selection of documents for this Clear-inghouse is the "means and methods by which school personnel are prepared to work with preschool age children in such settings as Head Start programs and nursery and kindergarten classes." The following bibliography represents the efforts of the Glearinghouse from July 1, 1968 through December 1969 to acquire and process documents in this area.

The descriptors (ERIC index terms) included in each citation indicate the topics covered in each document. Abstracts of the documents can be located in the appropriate volumes of <u>Research in Education</u> identified by the "ED" (ERIC Document) numbers in the citations. Inclusive ED numbers for those abstracts included in the issue are printed on the covers of monthly issues of RIE as well as those of semi-annual and annual indexes.

In Education and Current Index to Journals in Education. Both RIE and CIJE utilize the same descriptors. This bibliography may also be expanded by checking the entries of other ERIC Clearinghouses in those publications, for example, entries of the ERIC Clearinghouse on Early Childhood Education. All documents processed by a particular clearinghouse are blocked together in RIE according to the alphabetical order of the clearinghouse names, beginning with the the ERIC Clearinghouse on Adult Education (AC) and ending with the ERIC Clearinghouse on Vocational and Technical Education (VT). You can find the blocks of documents processed by each clearinghouse by noting clearinghouse code letters and numbers located near "ED" numbers. "EC" is the letter code for the early childhood education clearinghouse; "SP" (school personnel) designates documents processed by the ERIC Clearinghouse on Teacher Education.

In addition to using the ERIC Thesaurus, RIE, CIJE, and various ERIC indexes, you will find it helpful to be placed on the mailing lists of the ERIC clearinghouses which are likely to abstract and index as well as develop publications pertinent to your needs and interests. The newsletters are provided on a complimentary basis on request to the individual clearinghouses. A listing clearinghouses appears in RIE and CIJE.

Users who become efficient in using ERIC searching tools and techniques can develop their own specialized bibliographies. The indexing system can refine your search to the point that there are only entries that meet your specifications—operationally the documents which have been indexed under as many descriptors as are needed to limit the citations you uncover. In many cases reading abstracts is adequate for your needs; in other cases you may wish to use the information which ERIC provides to secure documents from either the original publishers or from the ERIC Document Reproduction Service. This Clearinghouse has produced a three-part package on ERIC. A six-minute sound-slide presentation is available on a free-loan basis for a week; a set of instructional sheets are available from the Clearinghouse, and a semi-programmed booklet How to Conduct a Search Through ERIC (ED 036 499) is available from EDRS for \$0.25 in microfiche and for \$1.40 in hard copy.

We are pleased to present this bibliography as a part of the Clearinghouse's effort to continually meet the growing needs of the education community.

ERIC SEARCH TERMS

In preparing this bibliography the descriptors, or search terms, listed below were used. To use a descriptor: 1. Look up the descriptor in the SUBJECT INDEX of monthly, semi-annual, or annual issue of Research in Education (RIE). 2. Beneath the descriptors you will find title(s) of documents. Decide which title(s) you wish to pursue. 3. Note the ED number beside the title. 4. Look up the ED number in the DOCUMENT RESUME SECTION of the appropriate issue of RIE. With the number you will find a summary of the document and the document's cost in microfiche and/or hard copy. 5. Repeat the above procedure, if desired, for other issues of RIE and for other descriptors.

6. For information about how to order ERIC documents, turn to the back pages of RIE. 7. Indexes and annotations of journal articles can be found in Current Index to Journals in Education by following the same procedure.

ABOUT ERIC

The Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC) forms a nationwide information system established by the U.S. Office of Education, designed to serve and advance American education. Its basic objective is to provide ideas and information on significant current documents (e.g., research reports, articles, theoretical papers, program descriptions, published or unpublished conference papers, newsletters, and curriculum guides or studies) and to publicize the availability of such documents. Central ERIC is the term given to the function of the U.S. Office of Education, which provides policy, coordination, training, funds, and general services to the 20 clearinghouses in the information system. Scope of Clearinghouse Activities

Users of this guide are encouraged to send to the ERIC Clearinghouse on Teacher Education documents related to its scope, a statement of which follows:

The Clearinghouse is responsible for research reports, curriculum descriptions, theoretical papers, addresses, and other materials relative to the preparation of school personnel (nursery, elementary, secondary, and supporting school personnel); the preparation and development of teacher educators; and the profession of teaching. The scope includes recruitment, selection, lifelong personal and professional development, and teacher placement as well as the profession of teaching. While the major interest of the Clearinghouse is professional preparation and practice in America, it also is interested in international aspects of the field.

The scope also guides the Clearinghouse's Advisory and Policy Council and staff in decision-making relative to the commissioning of monographs, bibliographies, and directories. The scope is a flexible guide in the idea and information needs of those concerned with pre- and inservice preparation of school personnel and the profession of teaching.

ORDERING INFORMATION

Documents cannot be ordered without an "ED" or order number. The "ED" number is listed with each citation. Once the reader has the "ED" number, he must order the document directly from the ERIC Document Reproduction Service (EDRS), 4936 Fairmont Avenue, Bethesda, Md. 20014.

To determine the cost of a document, the reader should look at "EDRS Price" or "Publisher's Price" in the citation. Information such as "EDRS Price: MF-\$0.25; HC-\$0.68" means that the document may be obtained from EDRS in microfiche (MF) for 25 cents or in "hard copy" for 68 cents. A microfiche is a 4 by 6-inch form containing images of the pages of the documents, as many as 60 pages per fiche, each image representing a standard-sized sheet of paper. Microfiche readers, available from many manufacturers, are required to enlarge the images for reading purposes. Hard copy prints are black and white 6 by 9-inch pages.

Payment to EDRS must accompany orders totaling less than \$5. A special handling charge of 50 cents must be added to all orders. Applicable local state sales tax should be added to orders a tax exemption certificate should be submitted.

If an individual or institution would like to subscribe to RIE, a check or money order should be sent to the Superintendent of Documents, Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402. The domestic rate is \$21 per year; foreign, \$26.25. Single issues sell for \$1.75.
