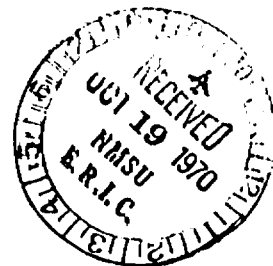

### Outdoor Education

Outdoor Education program developed by the curriculum department and Park Board of Fort Wayne includes field excursions, nature study walks, geology field trips- planned at any time Pupils taken by bus to place of exploration where a naturalist helps children understand purposes of trip, plant, animal, rock and mineral identification. Cookouts are frequent and occasionally an overnight trip. Program funded through school budget. Summer program funded by Title I similar to school year program except activities broader in scope and time allotment

### Outdoor Education for Inner-City Schools

The Indianapolis Public Schools have 43 inner-city schools; 35 have participated in either a one week resident program in spring or fall during the last two years. Facilities used included, Pioneer Camp and Camp Riley at Bradford Woods, Happy Hollow (settlement camp), and Camp Gallahue, (Girl Scout Camp) in Brown County.

We hope to expand our outdoor education program to provide opportunity for each inner-city school in this program.

We also have a six week summer outdoor education program at Eagle Creek Nature Center for four years. Twenty three schools take part in the program. We have daily field trips to outdoor areas in our community. We received excellent cooperation from Metropolitan Parks, Geist Reservoir, Camp Dellwood, Girl Scout Camp, Butler University Holcomb Garden, Camp Belzer, Boy Scout Camp and privately owned farms and nature areas. We have local, county and state assistance from the following groups. Department of Public Instruction, Board of Health, Natural Resources, Soil Conservation, Indiana University, Purdue University, County Extension Agents, Indiana Central College, Indiana University Geological Survey, Marion County Tuberculosis and Respiratory Disease Association and American Red Cross. They all give us resource staff, pertinent printed materials, visual aids and equipment and supplies which enrich our program.
