#### ABSTRACT

The Library Services and Construction Amendments of 1970 extend the Library Services and Construction Act for five years. Its aim is to continue, with modification and improvements, the present programs under the act. The bill simplifies the administration of these programs and allows each State more flexibility in assigning Federal funds to its own library priorities. The bill consolidates the library services programs relating to institutionalized persons and handicapped persons under title IV of the act under present law, and with the library services program under title T. Title I is also expanded to include special library services for disadvantaged persons, assistance for strengthening State library administrative agencies, and assistance to strengthen metropolitan libraries as national or regional resource centers. The bill also changes the percentages with respect to the non-Federal share of the cost of carrying out State plans. In the case of titles I and II, the minimum Federal share of the cost is increased from 33 percent to 50 percent, while in the case of title III the Federal share is increased from 50 to 100 percent. # LIBRARY SERVICES AND CONSTRUCTION AMENDMENTS OF 1970

# REPORT

[To accompany S. 3318]

The Committee on Labor and Public Welfare, to which was referred the bill (S. 3318) to extend and amend the Library Services and Construction Act, having considered the same, reports favorably thereon with an amendment and recommends that the bill, as amended, do pass.

The amendment is in the nature of a substitute.

## **EXPLANATION**

The Library Services and Construction Act expires on June 30, 1971. The Library Services and Construction Amendments of 1970 would extend the act for 5 years. Its aim is to continue, with modifications and improvements, the present programs under the act. The bill simplifies the administration of these programs and allows each State more flexibility in assigning Federal funds to its own library priorities.

The bill consolidates the library services programs relating to institutionalized persons and handicapped persons under title IV of the act under present law, with the library services program under title I. Title I is also expanded to include special library services for disadvantaged persons, assistance for strengthening State library administrative agencies, and assistance to strengthen metropolitan libraries as national or regional resource centers.

The bill also changes the percentages with respect to the non-Federal share of the cost of carrying out State plans. In the case of titles I and II, the minimum Federal share of the cost is increased from 33 percent to 50 percent, while, in the case of title III the Federal share

is increased from 50 percent to 100 percent.



## BACKGROUND OF LEGISLATION

The necessity of national support for the improvement of public library services was first demonstrated with the enactment of the Rural Library Services Act of 1956 (Public Law 797, Eighty-fourth Congress). The law was extended for 5 years in 1960 (Public Law 86–679). The 1964 amendments to the basic law (Public Law 88–269) extended participation to urban areas and authorized use of Federal funds for construction of public library facilities. In 1966, the law was extended (Public Law 89–510), and the State library administrative agencies were also made responsible for submitting plans for library development, especially through interlibrary cooperation, and specialized State library services. Technical amendments were enacted in 1967 (Public Law 90–154).

From fiscal year 1957 to fiscal year 1969, \$200 million in Federal funds were provided to extend public library services to areas lacking them. An estimated 85 million people have been benefited by the new or improved library services provided with the aid of these Federal funds, which supplement State and local outlays. The rate at which Federal funds have been matched indicates that every Federal dollar expended under title I has stimulated provision of three State or

local dollars for public library services.

With these local, State, and Federal funds, some 45 million books and other library materials have been purchased since 1957. A total of 650 additional bookmobiles have been put on the road, particularly in rural and outlying communities. Since urban libraries were brought within the scope of the act, "outreach" programs have improved library services available to poor and minority group populations by such means as storefront libraries, cooperation with Headstart and day care centers.

From fiscal year 1965 through fiscal year 1969, about \$135 million in Federal funds has been provided for construction of new library facilities and expansion or modernization of existing structures. State and local matching funds for public library construction totaled \$326 million in this period, in which 1,500 building projects were approved

to serve 50 million people.

Interlibrary cooperation has been stimulated by the act despite limited funding of this program to date. Countywide or regional library systems have been established or expanded. State libraries have opened regional branches. Metropolitan library collections have been augmented to permit service to a larger area. School, public, research, and academic libraries and information centers are sharing their resources. For example, 45 interlibrary networks and centers serving more than 900 libraries were created. The act has also been responsible for support of telecommunications systems connecting 800 libraries, while 14 technical processing centers have been established to serve 300 libraries.

The act also authorizes provision of library materials and services to residents, patients, and inmates of institutions that are State-operated or supported to a substantial extent by State funds. In this relatively new program, library services have been made available to an estimated 300,000 people. In addition, special materials and services have been provided for physically handicapped persons, including the blind, who cannot use other library materials.

Despite these accomplishments, high-quality public library services and facilities are not yet available to every American. The public



libraries of the Nation, 84 percent of whose support is provided locally, are short of facilities, materials, and staff. Further coordination and sharing of library resources must be fostered. Less than half the State-operated and substantially State-supported institutions, such as mental hospitals, prisons, and homes for the aged or physically handicapped, receive any assistance under the act. Of an estimated 2,250,000 physically handicapped persons who need library service, only about half could be served with talking books, Braille materials, page turners, and the like, under the current budget recommendations. For these reasons, the committee unanimously supports enactment of the bill.

## CONSOLIDATED PLANNING AND ADMINISTRATION

The bill provides for administrative simplicity and requires comprehensive planning to assure best use of library resources. Present categorical programs would be consolidated. In contrast, under the existing act, as the Commissioner of Education acknowledged in his testimony before the Subcommittee on Education:

Each of the five categorical programs has its own authorization; each requires submission of its own State plan; three require the establishment of a separate advisory council.

To benefit fully from the range of assistance available under LSCA, a State must therefore submit five different State plans for Federal approval, keep separate accounts for the five different allocations, and appoint and support three different advisory councils. Obviously, this arrangement imposes unnecessary and duplicative administrative burdens and costs on State and local library personnel.

The bill requires development and submission of only one basic State plan for all allotments under the Library Services and Construction Act. Annual State program-plans would be supplemental to long-range programs, covering at least three but no more than 5 years, for the commitment of local, State, and Federal resources to improve library services for all citizens of the State. Also, the plan would provide for coordination of programs and projects supported under the plan with other public and private library programs, including those of institutions of higher education and elementary and secondary schools with respect to the library assistance provisions of the Higher Education Act, the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, the Higher Education Facilities Act, and other laws.

Together, the basic, annual and long-range plans would enable the States, year by year, to appraise and meet their respective needs and

Together, the basic, annual and long-range plans would enable the States, year by year, to appraise and meet their respective needs and priorities as these are identified respectively, State by State. Each State could develop and evaluate its library plans and programs with the assistance of a broadly representative State Advisory Council on Libraries.

During the first year of operation, it is expected that States desiring full participation under the act will submit five plans: one basic plan, one long-range program plan, and three annual program plans. In subsequent years, only three plans will be submitted—the annual program plans—which can, at the option of the Commissioner, be approved as a group. All of these plans constitute a "State plan" for the purposes of section 411 of the General Education Provisions Act. The following is a description of the various types of plans:



The basic State plan is the document which gives assurances that the officially designated State library administrative agency has the fiscal and legal authority and capability to administer all aspects of the act, provides assurances for establishing the State's policies, priorities, criteria, and procedures necessary to the implementation of all programs under provisions of the act, and submits copies for approval as required by regulations promulgated by the Commissioner.

The long-range program is the comprehensive 5-year program which identifies a State's library needs and sets forth the activities to be taken toward meeting the identified needs supported with the assistance of Federal funds made available under the act, Such long-range programs shall specify the State's policies, criteria, priorities, and procedures consistent with the act as required by the regulations promulgated by the Commissioner, and shall be updated each year in the annual plan.

Annual program plans include the projects which are developed and submitted to describe the specific activities to be carried out annually toward achieving fulfillment of the long-range program. These annual program plans shall be submitted in such detail as

required by regulations promulgated by the Commissioner.

It is the intention of the committee that when annual State plans are submitted in compliance with sections 103, 202, and 303, that these plans be submitted as a single document, and that approval or disapproval of the document constitutes approval or disapproval of all these plans, thereby lessening administrative burdens.

## TITLE I-PUBLIC SERVICES

The bill authorizes specific appropriations for the 5 years beginning with fiscal year 1972. These amounts are \$112 million for fiscal year 1972; \$117.6 million for fiscal year 1973; \$123.5 million for fiscal year 1974; \$129.7 million for fiscal year 1975; and \$137.1 million for fiscal year 1976. The activities authorized for institutionalized library services and special library services for the handicapped under title IV in present law are consolidated into title I.

The minimum annual State allotment which must be matched (except in the case of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands) is raised by the bill to \$200,000 for each State, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia, and \$40,000 each for Guam, American Samoa, the Virgin Islands, and the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands. Allotment of the remainder of the appropriation would be on the basis of population. Grants to States under this title may be used to pay the

cost of developing and administering the State plans.

Allotments under these provisions are for the purpose of extending and improving public library services, especially for geographical areas and groups of people without access to these services. In particular those to be served are to include those in general or special institutions operated or substantially supported by States, handicapped persons, the disadvantaged in rural and urban areas, and metropolitan public libraries that serve as national or regional resource centers. Funds under title I may also be used to strengthen the capacity of the State library administrative agencies to serve the people.

At present, the public libraries of the Nation have somewhat less than half as many books as the recognized standard of 3.5 books per capita. The anticipated level of public library income in 1970 is ex-



pected to be \$450 million short of the minimum requirement of \$5 per capita. If the present levels of insufficient support continue, by 1975 an annual gap of approximately \$600 million can be expected. The authorizations set forth in the bill are moderate indeed in comparison to the manifest need for expanded support of public libraries, which are a basic resource for the education of all our people.

## TITLE II-PUBLIC LIBRARY CONSTRUCTION

Specific appropriations are authorized for the 5 years ending June 30, 1976. The amounts authorized are \$80 million for fiscal year 1972; \$84 million for fiscal year 1973; \$88 million for fiscal year 1974; \$92.5 million for fiscal year 1975; and \$97 million for fiscal year 1976. The basic allotment remains at \$80,000 for each State, Puerto Rico,

The basic allotment remains at \$80,000 for each State, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia, and \$20,000 each for American Samoa, the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, Guam, and the Virgin Islands. The amounts appropriated would remain available until

expended.

Current applications for 271 construction projects are awaiting a total of \$51.5 million in Federal funds under the act. These grants would be fully matched by additional State and local funds. The minimal needs of public libraries for construction, remodeling, or acquisition of additional space are much greater, however, than is indicated by the volume of applications on hand. The appropriations authorized in the bill would suffice to stimulate provision of no more than half the public library construction that is required by our growing and increasingly better educated population.

#### TITLE HI-INTERLIBRARY COOPERATION

Specific appropriations are authorized for the 5 years beginning with fiscal year 1972. The amounts authorized are \$15 million for fiscal year 1972; \$15.7 million for fiscal year 1973; \$16.5 million for fiscal year 1974; \$17.3 million for fiscal year 1975; and \$18.2 million for fiscal year 1976. The basic allotment is \$40,000 for each State and \$10,000 each for Guam, American Samoa, the Virgin Islands, and the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands.

These allotments are available for several purposes, at the discretion of the States respectively. They may be used to pay 100 percent of the cost of developing and carrying out the State plan for establishing, expanding, and operating local, regional, and interstate networks or libraries and information centers for improved supplementary service

for their respective clienteles.

The needs to be met with the relatively small sums authorized in the bill are very great. Improved interlibrary cooperation is imperative so that the resources of school, public, and academic libraries and information centers and special libraries may be shared, when necessary, among libraries and information centers of all kinds within communities, regions, States, and nationally. The long-range goal is that every person will find it possible to obtain any book or other library material wherever it may be located throughout the Nation.

# SECTION-BY-SECTION ANALYSIS

Section 1.—Citation

This section stated that the act may be cited as the "Library Services and Construction Amendments of 1970".

Section 2 .- Purpose; Amendment to the Library Services and Construc-

This section states the purpose of the amendments and revises the Library Services and Construction Act.

## PURPOSE

Subsection (a) of section 2 states that it is the purpose of the amendatory act to improve the administration, implementation, and purposes of the programs authorized by the Library Services and Construction Act (hereinafter in this analysis referred to as the "Act") by—

(1) lessening the administrative burden upon the States through a reduction in the number of State plans which must be submitted

and approved annually under the Act;
(2) affording the States greater flexibility in the allocation of funds among the various purposes of the act to meet specific needs of the people of the States for library services; and

(3) providing for-(A) special programs to meet the needs of disadvantaged persons (in both urban and rural areas) for library services,

(B) strengthening metropolitan public libraries which serve

as national or regional resource centers, and (C) strengthening the capacity of State library administrative agencies for meeting the needs of all the people of the States.

AMENDMENT TO THE LIBRARY SERVICES AND CONSTRUCTION ACT

Subsection (b) of section 2 amends the act by striking out all that follows the first section thereof, and inserting in lieu of the struck out sections and titles a new text. The reorganized act contains seven sections of general provisions followed by three titles which authorize

three types of library activities. As revised, the act provides:

Section 2 of the act (Declaration of Policy) states that the purpose of
the Library Services and Construction Act is to assist the States in
extending and improving library services, and reserves to the States
the initiative and responsibility to conduct public library services as

defined under such act.

Subsection (a) of such section 2 states that it is the purpose of the act to assist the States in extending and improving public library services in areas of the States (1) which are without such services, and (2) in which such services are inadequate, in public library construction, in

strengthening State library administrative agencies, in promoting interlibrary cooperation, and in improving other State library services, such as library services for the physically handicapped and institu-

tionalized and disadvantaged persons.

Subsection (b) of such section 2 reserves initiative and responsibility in the conduct of public library services, including the selection of books, materials, and personnel and the determination of the uses of the funds, to the States and their local subdivisions.

Section 3 (Definitions) contains definitions for the Library Services

and Construction Act.

(1) The term "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Edu-

cation.

(2) The term "construction" includes construction of a new building and the acquisition, expansion, remodeling, and alteration of existing buildings, and the initial equipment of such building, or other related activities (including archit cts' fees and the cost of land acquisition). The term "equipment" means, for the purposes of this definition, all items necessary to function as a facility providing library services, which may include machinery, utilities, and built-in equipment and

enclosures or structures necessary to house them.

(3) The term "library service" means the performance of library activities relating to the collection and organization of library materials, and making such library materials and information avail-

able to a clientelc.

(4) The term "library services to the physically handicapped" means providing library services, through public or nonprofit libraries, agencies, or organizations, to physically handicapped persons who have been certified by competent authorities as unable to read or use conventional printed materials as a result of physical limitations.

(5) The term "public library" means a library that serves, free of charge, all residents of a community, district, or region and is sup-

charge, an residence of a community, district, or region and is supported in whole or in part by public funds.

(6) The term "public library services" means library services furnished by a public library.

(7) The term "State" includes a State, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samon, the Virgin Islands, or the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands.

(8) The term "State Advisory Council on Libraries" means an advisory council provided for under clause 3 of section 6(a) of the act

- advisory council provided for under clause 3 of section 6(a) of the act, which sets forth the requirements for participation under the act. As defined in paragraph (8), the State advisory council on libraries shall-
- (a) be broadly representative of public, school, academic, special, and institutional libraries, and libraries serving the handicapped, and of persons using such libraries within the State;

(b) advise the State library administrative agency on the develop-

ment and administration of the State plan;

(c) assist the State library administrative agency in the evaluation of

activities assisted under this act; and

(d) submit, through the State library administrative agency, a report to the Commissioner on its activities and recommendations containing such information as the Commissioner shall prescribe by regulation.



(9) The term "State institutional library services" means the providing of books and other library materials, and of library services to those persons confined to or residing in penal institutions, reformatories, residential training schools, orphanages, or general or special institutions or hospitals operated or substantially supported by the State, and students in residential schools for the physically handicapped operated or substantially supported by the State. The parenthetical phrase "including the mentally retarded, hard of hearing, deaf, speech impaired, visually handicapped, seriously emotionally distance in the state of the state of the state. turbed, crippled or other health impaired persons requiring special education" in clause (B) restricts the definition to institutional libraries serving those handicapped persons so mentioned.

(10) The term "State library administrative agency" means the official agency of a State charged by the law of that State with the extension and development of public library services, and which has adequate authority under the law of the State to administer State

plans in accordance with the provisions of this act.

Section 4 (Authorizations and Appropriations) authorizes appro-

priations for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of the act.

Paragraph (1) of such section 4(a) provides authorizations for the appropriations of \$112 million for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972; \$117,600,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1973; \$123,500,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1974; \$129,657,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1975; and \$137,150,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1976, for the purpose of making grants to States for library

services, as provided in title I of the act.

Paragraph (2) of such section 4(a) provides authorization for the appropriations of \$80 million for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972; \$84 million for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1973; \$88 million for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1974; \$92.5 million for the fiscal year ending June 30; 1975; and \$97 million for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1976, for the purpose of making grants to States for public

library construction, as provided in title II of the act.

Paragraph (3) of such section 4(a) provides authorization for the appropriations of \$15 million for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972; \$15,750,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1973; \$16,500,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1974; \$17,300,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1975; and \$18,200,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1976, for the purpose of making grants to States to enable them to carry out the interlibrary cooperation programs authorized by title III of the act.

Subsection (b) of such section 4 provides that any funds appropriated under paragraphs (1), (2), and (3), of such section 4(n) of

the act shall remain available for expenditure until expended.

Section 5 of the act (Allotment to States) allots sums appropriated among the States.

Subsection (a) of such section 5 requires that the Commissioner shall allot a minimum allotment to each State and any sums remaining after such allotments shall be allotted according to the ratio of the population of the State to the population of all the States.

Paragraph (3) of such section 5(a) defines minimum allotment.

(a) The minimum allotment for the purposes of title I shall be \$200,000 for each State, excepting Guam, American Samoa, the Virgin Islands, and the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands, to each of which \$40,000 shall be allotted.

(b) The minimum appropriation for the purposes of title II shall be \$100,000 for each State, excepting Guam, American Samoa, the Virgin Islands, and the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands to each of which \$20,000 shall be allotted.

(c) The minimum appropriation for the purposes of title III shall be \$40,000 for each State, excepting Guam, American Samoa, the Virgin Islands, and the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands to each

of which \$10,000 shall be allotted.

If the sums appropriated under paragraph (1), (2), or (3) of section 4(a) for any fiscal year are insufficient to fully satisfy the aggregate of the minimum allotments for that purpose, each of such minimum allotments shall be ratably reduced.

Paragraph (4) of such section 5(a) states that the Commissioner shall determine the State population on the basis of the most recent

satisfactory data available.

Subsection (b) of such section 5 states that sums allotted to each State under section (a) which the Commissioner deems will not be required for the period and purpose for which such allotment is available for carrying out the State plan pursuant to section 6 of the act, shall be available for the reallocation and reallotment at such times as the Commissioner shall fix. Such amounts shall first be available to that State for another purpose under the act, and then shall be available for reallotment to other States in proportion to the original allotment prescribed under paragraph (2) of subsection (a).

Section 6 (State Plans) sets forth requirements for State plans for participation in programs authorized under the act. Any State desiring to receive its allotment for any purpose of the act for any fiscal year shall (1) have in effect a basic State plan, as prescribed under subsection (b)(2), submit an annual plan, stating the purposes for which allotments are desired, which shall include a long-range program plan for the purpose of carrying out programs set forth in the act, and (3) establish, if so desired, a State Advisory Council on

Libraries pursuant to section 3(8) of the act.

Subsection (b) of such section 6 states that a basic State plan shall:
(1) provide for the administration, or supervision of the administration of the program authorized by the act by the State

library administrative agency;

(2) provide that any funds paid to the State for an approved long-range program plan shall be expended solely for the purposes for which funds have been authorized and appropriated, and that such fiscal controls and accounting procedures have been adopted as are necessary to assure proper disbursement of, and account for, Federal funds paid to the State under the act, which includes any funds paid by the State to any other agency;

(3) provide satisfactory assurance that the State agency administering the plan will report to the Commissioner, containing such information as the Commissioner may require to carry out his functions under the act, and determine and evaluate the effectiveness of funds provided under the act in carrying out the

purposes of the act;

(4) set forth policies and procedures of accepting, reviewing, and approving applications for assistance under the act, which shall insure that such policies and procedures shall not face final



approval or disapproval without (1) affording the agency or agencies submitting such applications reasonable notice and opportunity for hearing, and (2) affording interested persons an opportunity to present their views.

Subsection (c) of such section 6 sets forth the conditions for approval

of any basic, or annual program plan pursuant to the Act.

Clause (A) of such subsection (c)(1) states that the plan must fulfill the conditions specified in subsections (b) and (d) of this section and the appropriate title of the Act.

Clause (B) of such subsection (c)(1) states that the plan prior to its submission to the Commissioner has been made public and interested persons have had ample opportunity to make comment thereon.

Clause (C) of such subsection (c)(1) states that the Commissioner must make specific findings as to the compliance of such plan with the requirements of the Act and be satisfied that adequate procedures are set forth therein to insure that any assurances and provisions of such plan will be carried out.

Paragraph (2) of such subsection (c) states that the State plan shall be made public upon approval.

Paragraph (3) of such subsection (c) states that the Commissioner shall not finally disapprove any plan submitted pursuant to subsection (a), or any modification thereof, without affording the State reasonable notice and opportunity for hearing.

Subsection (d) of such section 6 sets forth the requirements for the State long-range program plan. Such plan shall be developed in consultation with, and the approval of, the Commissioner and shall—

(1) set forth a program under which the funds received by the

State will be used to carry out a long-range plan of library services and construction for a period of not less than 3 years nor more than 5 years;

(2) be annually reviewed and revised in accordance with changing needs for assistance under the Act and the results of the evaluation and surveys of State library administrative agencies;

(3) set forth policies and procedures for the periodic evaluation of the effectiveness of, and for appropriate dissemination of the results of such evaluations and other information which

pertain to, programs and projects supported by the Act;
(4) set forth effective policies and procedures for the coordination of programs and projects supported under the State plan with library programs and projects operated by institutions of higher education or local elementary or secondary schools and with other public or private library services programs; and

(5) set forth the criteria to be used in determining the adequacy of public library services in geographical areas and for groups of persons in the State, including criteria designed to assure that priority will be given to programs or projects which serve urban and rural areas with high concentrations of low income families.

Before such programs are adopted, they shall be made public, and a reasonable opportunity shall be afforded to interested persons for comment thereon. Such programs shall be made public as they are finally adopted.



Subsection (e) of such section 6 provides that whenever the Commissioner, after reasonable notice and opportunity for hearing to the State agency administering a State plan which has been approved under the act, finds that such State plan has been so changed that it no longer complies with the provisions of the act, or that the administration of the plan fails to comply substantially with any such provisions contained in the plan, then, until he is so satisfied that there is no longer any such failure, after appropriate notice to such State agency, he shall make no further payments to the State under the act or shall limit payments to programs or projects under the State plan which are not affected by the failure, or shall require that payments by such State agency under the act shall be limited to local or other public library agencies not affected by the failure.

Subsection (f) of such section 6 states that any State, if dissatisfied with the Commissioner's final action with respect to the approval of a plan submitted under the act or with his final action under subsection (e), may file, within 60 days after notice of such action, with the U.S. court of appeals for the circuit in which such State is located a petition for review of that action. A copy of the petition shall be transmitted by the clerk of the court to the Commissioner, and the Commissioner shall file in the court the record of the proceedings on which he based his action as provided in section 2112 of title 28, United States Code.

Paragraph (2) of such subsection (f) provides that the findings of the Commissioner shall be conclusive, if supported by substantial evidences but the court for read source sharp and a supported by substantial evidences but the court for read source sharp and supported by

Paragraph (2) of such subsection (f) provides that the findings of the Commissioner shall be conclusive, if supported by substantial evidence; but the court, for good cause shown, may remand the case to the Commissioner to take further evidence, and the Commissioner may take new or modified findings of fact and may modify his previous action, and shall certify to the court the record of further proceedings.

Paragraph (3) of such subsection (f) provides that the court shall have the jurisdiction to affirm or to set aside, in whole or in part, the action of the Commissioner. The judgment of the court shall be subject to review by the Supreme Court of the United States upon certiorari or certification as provided in section 1254 of title 28, United States Code.

Section 7 (Payments to States) provides the rate of payments to States from the allotments available under section 5 from the appropriations pursuant to paragraph (1), (2), or (3) of section 4(a).

Subsection (a) of such section 7 states that the Commissioner shall pay to each State which has the appropriate State plans approved under section 6 and title I, II, or III an amount equal to the Federal share of the total sums expended by the State and its political subdivisions in carrying out such plan. Before payments shall be made from appropriations pursuant to paragraph (1) for the pruposes of library services to any State (other than the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands) for any fiscal year, the Commissioner shall determine that there will be available for expenditure under the plan from State and local sources, (1) sums sufficient to enable the State to receive not less than its minimum allotment, and (2) not less than the total amount actually expended, for the purposes of such plan, in the second preceding fiscal year.

Subsection (b) of such section 7 provides that the "Federal share," for the purposes of this section, for any State shall be, unless provided otherwise in title III, 100 per centum less than the State percentage, and the State percentage shall be that percentage which bears the



same ratio to 50 per centum as the per capital income of such State bears to the per capita income of all the States (excluding Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the Virgin Islands, and the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands). The Federal share shall in no case be more than 66 per centum, or less than 50 per centum. The Federal share for Puerto Rico, Guam, American Sumoa, and the Virgin Islands shall be 66 per centum and the Federal share for the Trust Territory

of the Pacific Islands shall be 100 per centum.

Paragraph (2) of subsection (b) requires the Commissioner to promulgate the "Federal share" for each State within 60 days after the beginning of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1971, and of every second fiscal year thereafter. Such promulgation shall be based on the basis of the average per capita incomes of each of the States and of all the States (excluding Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the Virgin Islands, and the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands), for the three most recent consecutive years for which satisfactory data are available from the Department of Commerce, and shall be conclusive for each of the 2 fiscal years beginning after the promulgation.

# TITLE I-LIBRARY SERVICES

Section 101 requires the Commissioner to carry out a program of making grants from sums appropriated pursuant to section 4(a)(1) to States which have had approved basic State plans under section 6 and annual program plans under section 103 for the extension of public library services to areas without such services, and the improvement of such services in areas where such services are inadequate, for making library services more accessible to persons who, by reason of distance, residence, or physical handicap, are unable to receive the benefits of public library services regularly made available to the public, for adapting public library services to meet particular needs of persons within the States, and for improving and strengthening library administrative agencies,

Section 102 sets forth the purposes which funds, appropriated

pursuant to paragraph (1) of section 4(a), shall be used,

Subsection (a) of such section 102 states that sums appropriated pursuant to such paragraph (1) shall be available for grants to States from allotments under section 5(a) for the purpose of paying the Federal share of the cost of carrying out State plans submitted and approved under section 6 and section 103. Except for those purposes provided for in subsection (b), grants under title I may be used for—

(1) planning for, and taking other steps leading to the develop-

ment of, programs and projects designed to extend and improve

library services; and

(2) extending public library services to geographical areas and groups of persons without such services and improving such services in such areas and for such groups as may have inadequate public library services, establishing, expanding, and operating programs and projects to provide (1) State institutional library services, (2) library services to the physically handicapped, and (3) library services for the disadvantaged in urban and rural areas, and strengthening metropolitan public libraries which serve as national and regional resource centers.



Subsection (b) of such section 102 provides for an additional use of grants under title I. Such grants, subject to limitations and criteria that the Commissioner shall establish by regulation, may be used to (1) pay the cost of administering the State plans submitted and approved under this act (including obtaining the services of consultants), statewide planning for the evaluation of public library services dissemination of information concerning library services, and the activities of such advisory groups and panels as may be necessary to assist the State library administrative agency in carrying out its functions under title I, and (2) strengthen the capacity of State library adminis-

trative agencies for meeting the needs of the people of the States.

Section 103 provides that any State desiring to receive a grant from its allotment for the purposes of title I for any fiscal year shall, in addition to having submitted, and having had approved, a basic State plan under section 6, submit for that fiscal year an annual program plan for library services.

Such plan, submitted at such time, in such form, and containing such information as the Commissioner shall prescribe by regulation, shall-

(1) set forth a program for the year submitted, under which funds paid to the State from appropriations pursuant to paragraph (1) of section 4(a) for that year will be used, consistent with its long-range plan, solely for the purposes set forth in

section 102;

(2) set forth the criteria used in allocating such funds among such purposes, which criteria shall insure that the State will expend from Federal, State, and local sources an amount equal to the amount expended by the State from such sources for State institutional library services, and library services to the physically handicapped during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1971;
(3) include such information, policies. In proceedings as will

assure that the activities to be carried out during that year are

consistent with the long-range program plans; and

(4) include an extension of the long-range plan, taking into consideration the results of evaluation.

# TITLE II-PUBLIC LIBRARY CONSTRUCTION

Section 201 authorizes the Commissioner to make grants to States which have had approved basic State plans under section 6 and State annual plans under section 202 for the construction of public libraries.

Section 202 provides that any State desiring to receive a grant from its allotment for the purposes of title II for any fiscal year shall, in addition to having submitted, and having had approved, a basic and a long-range State plan under section 6, submit for that fiscal year an annual program plan for the construction of public libraries.

Such plan shall be submitted at such time, in such form, and containing such information as the Commissioner shall prescribe by

regulation, and shall-

(1) set forth a program for the year submitted, under which funds paid to the State from appropriations pursuant to paragraph (2) of section 4(a) for that year will be used, consistent with its long-range plan, solely for the construction of public libraries in areas of the State which are without the library facilities necessary to provide adequate library services;



(2) set forth the criteria, policies, and procedures for the approval of applications for the construction of public library

facilities under the program set forth in clause (1)

(3) set forth policies and procedures which will insure that every local or other public agency whose application for funds under the plan with respect to a project for construction of public library facilities is denied will be given an opportunity for a hearing before the State library administrative agency;

(4) include such information, policies, and procedures as will insure that the activities to be carried out during that year are

consistent with the long-range program plan; and

(5) include an extension of the long-range plan, taking into consideration the results of evaluations.

# TITLE III—INTERLIBRARY COOPERATION

Section 301 authorizes the Commissioner to make grants to States which have approved basic State plans under section 6 and annual program plans under section 303 for interlibrary cooperation.

Section 302 states that funds appropriated pursuant to paragraph (3) of section 4(a) shall be available for grants to States from allotments under paragraphs (1) and (3) of section 5(a) for the purpose of carrying out the Federal share of the cost of carrying out State annual program plans for interlibrary cooperation submitted and approved under section 303.

Subsection (a) of such section 302 sets forth that such grants shall

be used for-

(1) planning for, and taking other steps leading to the devel-

opment of, cooperative library networks; and

(2) establishing, expanding, and operating local, regional, and interstate cooperative networks of libraries, which provide for the systematic and effective coordination of the resources of school, public, academic, and special libraries and information centers for improved supplementary services for the special clientele served by each type of library or center,

Subsection (b) of such section 302 provides that the Federal share, for the purposes of title III, shall be 100 per centum of the cost of carrying out the State plan.

Section 303 provides that any State desiring to receive a grant from its allotment for the purposes of title III for any fiscal year shall, in addition to having submitted, and having had approved, a basic State plan under section 6, submit for approval for that fiscal year an annual program plan for interlibrary cooperation.

Such plan, submitted at such time, in such form, and containing such information as the Commissioner shall prescribe by regulation

shall-

(1) set forth a program for the year submitted, under which funds paid to the State from apprrpriations pursuant to paragraph (3) of section 4(a) will be used, consistent with its longrange plan, solely for the purposes set forth in section 302, and set forth specific procedures, policies, and objectives which will insure that funds available to the State under title III will be used to meet such purposes;



(2) set forth the criteria which the State agency shall use in evaluating applications for funds under this title and in assigning

priority to project proposals;

(3) set forth such procedures and policies as will provide assurance that all appropriate libraries, agencies, and organizations are that all appropriate libraries agencies and organizations. tions eligible for participation in activities assisted under this title will be given the opportunity to participate to the extent of their eligibility;

(4) include such information as will assure that the activities to be carried out during that year are consistent with the long-

range program plans; and
(5) include an extension of the long-range plan, taking into consideration the results of evaluations.

# CHANGES IN EXISTING LAW

Since S. 3318 repeats all of the existing law on Library Services and Construction and proposes to insert a new body of law, the committee is of the opinion that it is necessary to dispense with the requirements of subsection 4 of rule XXIX of the Standing Rules of the Senate to expedite the business of the Senate, and offers the section-by-section analysis in this refort in lieu of a print in which existing law proposed to be omitted is enclosed in black brackets and new matter is shown in italic.
