## INTRODUCTION

## PREFACE

The Vigo County Public Library is a service and educational institution which fulfills two major functions for the community. The library acquires, organizes and makes available to the public books, periodicals, newspapers, pamphlets, phono-records, films and other materials. The second major function of the Library is serving as an information center for the community and as a liaison agency for groups and organizations comprising the total community structure.

The Program Resource Handbook is one of the ways the Library fulfills the second major function--by bringing together individuals, groups and organizations who are constantly looking for resource materials for programs and those who are looking for opportunities to present their programs and services to the public. Among the resources listed in the handbook you will find information on speakers, materials, meeting rooms and tours available in Vigo County, often without cost to you or your organization.

Governmental units are listed in the colored pages. Other agencies and organizations are listed alphabetically in the white section, followed by a list of meeting rooms, organizations that offer tours, and cross-reference index. If you are unable to contact any of the people listed, call the Group Services Division of the Library; we will do our best to help you.

We sincerely hope that you will make use of this handbook in your program planning and find it helpful in making your programs more informative and meaningful to the members of your organization.

## SEVEN STEPS IN EFFECTIVE PROGRAM PLANNING

1. Find an interest or need expressed by the greatest number of members. This might be done by a questionnaire, interview, interest check list, or by a representative committee. If programs are planned on state or national level they need to be adapted to the interest or need of the local group.
2. Break interest or need into a group of related topics. Topics are issues, problems, concerns, or areas of content about which the group seeks to learn or questions which the program will seek to answer. This directs the content of the meeting.
3. Set goals. Goals are statements concerning what should happen during the program and what should result from it. They are the guides for choosing resources and techniques, and are essential to evaluation and improvement. Goals are usually stated in the infinitive, in terms of what the group hopes to accomplish.
4. Survey available resources. Resources are information and experience that can be used to explore topics and help meet goals. They may be people, films, books, pamphlets, or other kinds of material. The more fully the resources are explored, the better the chance of a successful program. Don't forget that often the best resources are found within the group itself.
5. Select appropriate techniques. Techniques are ways of presenting and exploring ideas, information and opinions. The panel, the symposium, the lecture (or speech), and group discussion are a few examples. Techniques should be as varied as possible, keeping in mind that the techniques should be appropriate to the task. They are tools to help a group reach its goals and deal with its topics.
6. Outline the meeting(s) and assign responsibilities. It is important to go through a step-by-step blocking out of the program. Whatever will take place should be put in a time sequence. All duties and responsibilities need to be spelled out and assigned. Participants should be thoroughly instructed.
7. Plan for evaluation. Evaluation is judging the effectiveness of a program in terms of its goals. This may be done by check list, written comment, an evaluator or evaluating committee. The purpose of evaluation is to help plan more effectively for future programs and to determine what was effective in the program or how it might have been improved.
