This preliminary report consisting of 14 statistical tables and a summary of their contents has been prepared by Harold F. Duis of the Division of Vocational and Technical Education, Planning and Evaluation Branch, and includes information relating to enrollments, expenditures, program completions, and job placements. The tables indicate the national norm and each State's relationship to this norm. For certain items, data for previous years are given for comparison. A final annual report of vocational education for fiscal year 1969 will follow.

The summary of the statistical material should prove useful to persons interested in the contributions being made by vocational education and particularly those individuals concerned with evaluation of the vocational education program.

**SUMMARY OF STATE VOCATIONAL EDUCATION STATISTICS,
FISCAL YEAR 1969**

The following State tables have been prepared from State reports submitted for fiscal year 1969. They show wide variations among States, especially relating to vocational education output. A study of the tables will reveal those States with great deviations from other States and from the average and should suggest areas where improvements may be made. For the sake of brevity, the word "State" in this booklet refers to each of the 50 States, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

The following is a list of the tables and the pertinent information contained in each:

Table I - States Ranked on Selected Items, FY 1969

States ranked in about the same order in Federal funds, total expenditures, teachers, enrollment, and persons completing secondary and postsecondary programs. Exceptions are noticeable in several States in the number of teachers and of persons completing programs, and in a few States there are exceptions in total expenditures and enrollment compared with Federal funds. Six of the 10 States ranking highest in the amount of Federal funds were also in the top 10 States in the other categories.

Table II - Percentage Changes in Vocational Education Enrollment From Previous Fiscal Year, FY 1965 - 1969

Total enrollment increased each year nationally but most States fluctuated in this respect, with some decreases each year. In FY 1969, 45 States increased and 9 decreased in total enrollment, with a range from -36.3 percent to +68.0 percent. Thirty States exceeded the national increase of 5.9 percent.

Percentage changes in vocational education enrollments are important primarily to the degree that the reasons for these changes are known. It should also be borne in mind that (1) a reduced rate of increase may signify the same number of additional enrollees as reached the previous year, and (2) in order to overcome a minus change, the rate of increase must be larger than the minus rate of the previous year.

Table III - Percentage Enrollment Change, by Level, FY 1969 vs. FY 1968

In FY 1969 total enrollment increased 5.9 percent over FY 1968, with increases of 6.2 percent, 19.1 percent, and 2.1 percent for the

secondary, postsecondary, and adult levels, respectively. Since considerable emphasis is being given to the expansion of postsecondary vocational education, it is interesting to note that 42 States showed increases ranging from 2.7 percent to 347.4 percent. In 15 States a greater percentage of increase took place in secondary than in postsecondary enrollments.

Table IV - Percentage Distribution of Enrollment in Vocational Education Programs, by Level, FY 1969

In 44 States the largest enrollment is at the secondary level and in 10 States the adult enrollment is the largest. By level, 35 States exceed the national percentage of 51.1 in secondary, 16 States exceed the postsecondary percentage of 8.9, and 26 States exceed the adult percentage of 38.2.

Table V - Percentage Distribution of Enrollment in Vocational Education, by Program, FY 1969

In 34 States home economics had the largest enrollment of any program; in 11 States office education had the largest; in eight States, trades and industry; and in one State, agriculture. Twenty-five States exceeded the national percentage for the occupational area in agriculture, 14 in distribution, 19 in health, 34 in home economics, 21 in office, 23 in technical, and 24 in trades and industry.

Table VI - Secondary Vocational Education Enrollment Compared with Total Enrollment in Grades 9 - 12, FY 1969

The total vocational education enrollment in secondary programs constituted 30.9 percent of the total secondary enrollment. The States varied widely, with a range of 5.1 percent to 56.0 percent. Twenty-four States had a percentage enrollment higher than the national average. Considering only enrollment in programs for gainful occupations (excluding home economics for homemaking), the overall percentage of total secondary enrollment decreased to 18.6 percent. The States ranged from 5.1 percent to 40.8 percent with 18 States exceeding the national average.

Table VII - Percentage Distribution of Total Expenditures for Vocational Education, by Source of Funds, FY 1969

Total State and local funds made up 81.4 percent of total expenditures, and Federal funds the remaining 18.6 percent. What some States report as local funds are reported by other States as State funds, and vice versa. Even allowing for such differences in reporting, it is nevertheless evident that there is considerable variation from State to State in the proportion of State and local support for

vocational education. The percentage of total expenditures from State and local sources ranged from 93.7 percent to 54.7 percent, with 17 States above the average of 81.4 percent. Twenty-two States received more support from State sources than from local sources, including five States where State funds provide all matching funds. In 22 States the major support of vocational education came from local sources.

Table VIII - State and Local Expenditures for Vocational Education Per Dollar of Federal Funds, FY 1965 - 1969

In this compilation of matching ratios for a period of five years, an overall trend of increased overmatching of Federal funds is indicated. In FY 1969 the ratio of State and local dollars to Federal dollars was \$4.37, ranging from a low of \$1.21 to a high of \$12.75, with 17 States above the national average. In 12 States, State and local expenditures per Federal dollar were less in FY 1969 than in FY 1965.

Table IX - Secondary Vocational Education Enrollments, Completions, and Placements, FY 1969

The total secondary program showed a completion rate of 20.8 percent, with States ranging from a low of 8.8 percent to a high of 40.7 percent, and with 29 States below the national average. Of the total number completing programs, 36.1 percent were placed in the field for which trained or in a related field. An additional 10.3 percent were employed full-time in a field not related. The States ranged from a low of 5.2 percent being placed to a high of 68.1 percent, with 27 States below the national average.

Table X - Status of Persons Completing Secondary Vocational Education Programs, FY 1969

The number of persons completing secondary programs and continuing in full-time school ranged from 9.2 percent to 53.8 percent, with 29 States exceeding the national average of 24.6 percent. The States ranged in the number of persons completing programs who were available for placement from a low of 13.1 percent to a high of 78.4 percent, with 25 States above the average of 49.3 percent. Of the total number of persons completing programs who were available for placement, 73.2 percent were placed in the field for which trained or in a related field, and 6.0 percent remained unemployed as of October 15, 1969. The States ranged in rate of placement from 27.6 percent to 92.5 percent, with a national average of 73.2 percent. The unemployment rate ranged from 0.4 percent to 12.1 percent, with a national average of 6.0 percent.

Table XI - Expenditures for Secondary Vocational Education Instruction Per Enrollee, Completion, and Placement, FY 1969

All States combined expended for instruction \$136 per secondary enrollee, \$656 per person completing a program, and \$1,818 per person placed in the field trained or a related field. Expenditures per enrollment ranged from a low of \$29 to a high of \$372 among the States (\$873 including the outlying areas), with eight States expending less than \$100 and nine States expending over \$200. Expenditures per completion ranged from a low of \$102 to a high of \$3,419 among the States (\$7,037 including the outlying areas), with 24 States expending less than the national average. Expenditures per placement ranged from a low of \$581 to a high of \$6,977 among the States (\$14,488 including the outlying areas), with 19 States expending less than the national average. It should be noted that expenditures do not consider man-hours of instruction.

Table XII - Postsecondary Vocational Education Enrollments, Completions, and Placements, FY 1969

Total postsecondary program enrollment showed a completion rate of 27.8 percent. The States ranged from a low of 5.4 percent to a high of 93.8 percent, with 18 States below the national average. Of the total number completing programs, 57.7 percent were placed in the field trained or a related field. Placements by State ranged from a low of 20.5 percent to a high of 90.7 percent, with 13 States below the national average.

Table XIII - Status of Persons Completing Postsecondary Vocational Education Programs, FY 1969

The number of persons completing postsecondary programs and continuing full-time schooling showed a range of 1.1 percent to 27.7 percent, with 22 States above the national average of 8.0 percent. Of the number of program completions available for placement, the States ranged from a low of 33.3 percent to a high of 94.4 percent, with 32 States exceeding the national average of 64.9 percent. The national percentage of persons who were available for employment and were placed in the field for which trained or a related field was 89.0 percent, with the States ranging from 60.5 percent to 98.6 percent. As of October 15, 1969, the overall unemployment rate of persons available for placement was 2.9 percent and ranged from 0 to 12.5 percent.

Table XIV - Expenditures for Postsecondary Vocational Education Instruction per Enrollee, Completion, and Placement, FY 1969

All States expended for instruction \$354 per postsecondary enrollment, \$1,253 per person completing a vocational program, and \$2,128

per person placed in the field trained or a related field. Expenditures per enrollment ranged from a low of \$84 to a high of \$1,309, with 14 States below the national average. Expenditures per completion ranged from a low of \$384 to a high of \$4,162, with 18 States below the national average. Expenditures per placement ranged from a low of \$514 to a high of \$8,636, with 18 States expending less than the national average.
