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ABSTRACT

The series of analytic reports on management and salary data of the academic libraries, paralleling the series titled "Library Statistics of Colleges and Universities, Institutional Data," is continued by this publication. The statistical tables of this report are of value to administrators, librarians, and others because: (1) they help round out the picture of National library resources, (2) they provide a factual basis for comparing library resources and services with ALA - recommended standards, (3) they are useful in the formulation of budgets and self-studies, (4) they provide basic data for further research in the development of academic libraries and (5) they provide guidelines for accrediting associations and academic library consultants. The following items are covered for the first time in this report: (1) volumes withdrawn, (2) physical units of various types of microforms, (3) number of interlibrary loan transactions and (4) library operating expenditure per full-time equivalent (FTE) faculty members. (Author/NH)

HIGHLIGHTS

Although the total number of volumes held by the Nation's academic libraries increased from 177 million to 227 million during the period 1959-60 to 1963-64, enrollment rose at an even faster rate. As a result the number of volumes *per student* decreased from 52 to 47 over the 4-year period.

Meanwhile, operating expenditures of the libraries rose from \$137 million to \$246 million. Such expenditures, taken as a proportion of total institutional expenditures for education and general purposes, rose from 3.0 to 3.3 percent. The share of library operating expenditures attributable to salaries and wages decreased slightly—from 61 to 59 percent—while the portion attributable to books and other library materials increased from 30 to 32 percent. Other expenditures (including binding, but excluding capital outlay) accounted for approximately 9 percent of total library operating expenditures in each year.

Reflecting the shortage of professional librarians, the number of budgeted vacancies increased from 504 to 632 (25 percent) from fall 1960 to fall 1963.

Projections of the Office of Education indicate that by 1974-75 the operating expenditures of academic libraries should approach \$900 million, and total volumes will probably exceed 450 million, or nearly double the 1963-64 holdings.

Data on interlibrary loan transactions were obtained in the 1963-64 survey for the first time in recent years. The total number of such transactions among the 2,140 academic libraries approached 700,000 with the libraries in California alone reporting 87,000 transactions.

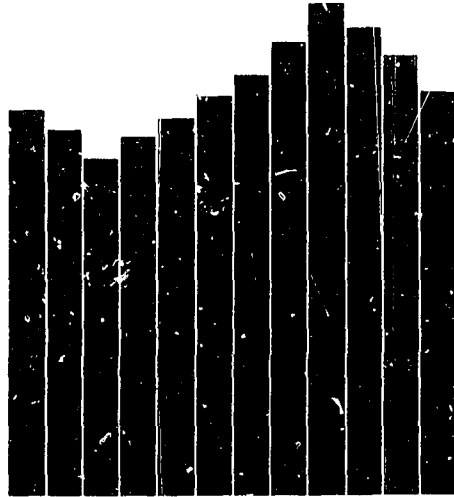
Although the publicly-controlled universities have over twice as many students as the privately-controlled universities (1,328,000 to 630,000), the publicly controlled universities have only 19 percent more volumes. From 1961-62 to 1963-64 the library staffs of all types of institutions, both publicly and privately controlled, showed substantial gains. The gain was largest—25 percent—for the publicly controlled liberal arts college libraries.

Despite the relatively great library holdings of the institutions with larger enrollments, the per student and per faculty expenditures for libraries are significantly larger in the institutions with relatively small enrollments.

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FOREWORD

This publication continues the series of analytic reports on management and salary data of academic librarians, paralleling the series titled *Library Statistics of Colleges and Universities, Institutional Data*. We in the Office of Education have been gratified by the way in which these analytical and institutional reports have been received. In this report some statistical refinements have been made in an effort to present still more meaningful and useful data.

Despite certain limitations of the data, the statistical tables of this report are of value to administrators, librarians, and others for the following reason:

- * The tables help to round out the picture of National library resources.
- * They provide a factual basis for comparing library resources and services with ALA-recommended standards.
- * They are useful in the formulation of budgets and self-studies.
- * They provide basic data for further research in the development of academic libraries.
- * They provide guidelines for accrediting associations and academic library consultants.

We extend our thanks to the many librarians and administrators of institutions of higher education who helped make the publication possible by supplying data to the Office of Education during the annual survey of academic libraries.

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Chapter 1

INTRODUCTION AND DEFINITION OF TERMS

This report provides an analysis of academic library data for the year 1963-64 and selected trend data for the 5-year period 1959-60 through 1963-64.¹ For the 40 largest libraries, data covering the year 1964-65 are also included.

From a statistical standpoint, the basic units of the survey are the institutions' libraries, rather than the institutions themselves. In a few instances, a single institution has two or more libraries which, because of basic differences in administrative structure and in the services they perform, are counted as separate library units (e.g., the main library and the Barnard College Library of Columbia University). The reverse situation also occurs—two or more autonomous institutions are sometimes served by a single library or library system (e.g., the Honnold Library, serving the Claremont Graduate School, Claremont Men's College, Harvey Mudd College, and Pomona College). In these instances, only one library is counted for the several institutions concerned. As a result, the universe of academic libraries covered in the survey was 2,075 in 1962-63, and 2,140 in 1963-64.

For brevity in this report, the terms "management data" and "salary data" are used to distinguish between the two kinds of data requested on the survey form (see the Appendix). Management data concern the items on library resources, personnel, expenditures, and services. Salary data refer to the distributions of salaries paid for *particular positions* (as distinct from the total salary expenditure, regardless of positions, that is included with the management data).

In both 1962-63 and 1963-64 over 95 percent of the universe of libraries submitted usable reports on *management* data; for the non-reporting libraries it was possible to arrive at estimates for the management items through the use of various

other sources, particularly the information provided by the same libraries in earlier surveys.

Usable *salary data* for 1962-63 and 1963-64 were available from approximately 90 percent of the libraries. Since estimates of salary data from other sources were not feasible, the tables on salary items do not represent the whole universe.

Except for certain data on trends, tabulations in this report are by control, type of library, and size of enrollment. Since the number of students enrolled in an institution has a bearing on the size of its library collection and other library resources, comparisons among institutions with enrollments of similar size are of particular interest. Statistical breakdowns are more often shown for the 4-year than for the 2-year institutions, because the 4-year institutions are more numerous and make a relatively large contribution to the total statistical picture.

The following items are covered for the first time in this report:

- Volumes withdrawn.
- Physical units of various types of microform.
- Number of interlibrary loan transactions.
- Library operating expenditure per full-time equivalent (FTE) faculty member.

The data of this report are subject to the following qualifications:

- (a) *Incomplete reporting of component libraries.* Although the survey form requested the inclusion of all library units of the institution, a small number of respondents are unable to collect information on some branch or extension center libraries, so that the data are not complete for a few library systems.
- (b) *Inability to provide requisite breakdowns.* Due to record-keeping practices which vary from one institution to another, some libraries cannot, for example, separate the expenditures for binding from those for books and other library materials.

(c) *Reluctance to report salary data.* A substantial number of institutions did not report salary data. These respondents are either not privileged to disclose salary information or they prefer not to report it.

(d) *Inconsistent or noncomparable reporting.* For example, clear instructions were not provided for reporting microform holdings until 1963-64, nor for periodicals as distinct from other serials until 1964-65. Even when new definitions are provided, however, at least a year is often needed to make appropriate changes in the record systems of some institutions.

Beginning with the 1961-62 analysis, the following statistical measures were used in the management tables: 10th percentile, median, mean and 90th percentile. The lowest and highest values have been omitted from the tables on management data since they are less stable measures of variability than the 10th and 90th percentile values.

The statistical measures for salary tables have been substantially improved over those for 1961-62, so that these tables now utilize statistical measures like those in the management tables; in addition, highest and lowest salaries are shown.

As noted in the 1961-62 report, the use of first and third quartiles was discontinued because those values are not as stable or reliable as the 10th- and 90th-percentile values. The difference between the 10th and 90th percentiles may be termed the "10-90-percentile range, or simply the "10-90 range." Whereas the "interquartile range" (the difference between the first and third quartile) covers the middle 50 percent of the cases, the 10-90 range covers the middle 80 percent and is about 1.9 times as large, on the average, as the interquartile range.

No measure of variability is stable when based on only a few cases, and for that reason the 10th and 90th percentile values are omitted from the tables when the number of cases is less than 20 (e.g. in tables 10B or 27).

For both the management and the salary data, the distributions tend to be positively skewed, that is, there are more very high values than very low ones. When this is the case, the mean tends to be higher than the median, and it is desirable to present both the mean and the median, if only to indicate that such skewness exists. Thus, when the excess of the mean over the median is large, the reader may assume that high values are disproportionately frequent.

Below are definitions of the terms used in the text and tables of this publication:

Academic library: The library of an institution of higher education.

Binding: The binding, lettering, or other physical restoration or preservation of books and other materials; generally, a library's commercial binding operations.

Books and other library materials: Books, periodicals, newspapers, manuscripts, prints, maps, slides, filmstrips, microprints, microfilms, motion picture films, sound recordings, realia, and other similar material for the organized collection of the library. This does *not* include equipment with which to see, hear, or read the items (e.g., projectors, phonographs, readers, etc.).

Control: An institution's primary source of financial support and the final arbiter of its policies, i.e., city, regional, or State bodies in the case of publicly controlled institutions, and private or church corporations in the case of privately controlled institutions.

Contributed services: Library work performed without compensation by denominational groups, including members of religious orders. Contributed services are evaluated on a par with salaries paid to lay staff in the same institution.

Enrollment, graduate: The aggregate of students working at a level above the bachelor's or first-professional degree, and also special and unclassified students working primarily at the graduate level.

Expenditure percentage: The quotient of the library operating expenditures (see below) divided by the total institutional expenditures (see below). The "expenditure percentage" reported here corresponds to the "percent of total expenditure" used in the 1961-62 report.

Full-time equivalents (FTE): The total number of hours worked per week by all part-time personnel divided by the number of hours in the full-time work week, plus the number of full-time staff.

Junior college: See Types of institution.

Liberal arts college: See Types of institution.

Library operating expenditures: The total amount spent for library salaries, wages, library materials, binding, and "other operating expenditures" (see below).

Other operating expenditures: Expenses for such

items as supplies, transportation, entertainment, printing, etc.—exclusive of expenditures for buildings, sites, equipment for new buildings or additions to old buildings, and the costs of building operation and maintenance.

Other professional school: See Types of institution.

Periodical: A serial publication which constitutes one issue in a continuous series under the same title, usually published at regular intervals over an indefinite period, individual issues in the series being numbered consecutively or each issue being dated. Periodicals are a subdivision of serials (see below).

Professional employee: An employee who performs work requiring education, training, and skill in the theoretical or scientific aspects of library work as distinct from its mechanical and clerical aspects.

Serial: A publication issued in successive parts, usually at regular intervals, and as a rule, intended to be continued indefinitely. Serials include periodicals, newspapers, annuals (reports, year-books, etc.), memoirs, proceedings, transactions of societies, and may include monographic and publishers' series.

Student assistance: The work of student and other assistants who are employed on an hourly basis and who work less than a full-time work week.

Teachers college: See Types of institution.

Technological school: See Types of institution.

Theological school: See Types of institution.

Total institutional expenditures: A dollar figure (also known as total "education and general" expenditures), which includes expenditures by a college or university for general administration, instruction and departmental research, extension and public services, libraries, operation and maintenance of the physical plant, organized research, and organized activities relating to educational departments. The figure also includes expenditures directly related to sales and services of educational departments.

Types of institution:

University: An institution which gives considerable stress to graduate instruction, which

confers advanced degrees as well as bachelor's degrees in a variety of liberal arts fields, and which has at least two professional schools that are not exclusively technological.

Liberal arts college: An institution in which the principal emphasis is on general undergraduate education.

Teachers college: An institution devoted primarily to teacher education.

Technological school: An institution which provides training predominantly in technological and physical science disciplines. The U.S. military-service schools fall under this designation.

Theological school: An institution in which the program offerings are wholly or principally in theology, religion, or religious education.

Other professional school: An institution offering programs of specialization exclusively, e.g., in the fine arts, medicine, law, business, pharmacy, optometry, etc.

Junior college: An institution which offers bachelor's degree-credit programs creditable by transfer to 4-year institutions, and/or programs designed either to prepare the student for immediate employment or to give him general education not chiefly transferable to baccalaureate programs in 4-year institutions. In this report the junior college category includes some technical institutes (primarily engineering-related) and semiprofessional schools (not primarily engineering-related) which offer programs designed to prepare for immediate employment or to provide general education not chiefly transferable to baccalaureate programs in liberal arts or professional education.

Volume: For statistical purposes, a volume is a physical unit of any printed, typewritten, handwritten, mimeographed, or processed work contained in one binding or portfolio, hard-bound or paper-bound, which has been cataloged, classified, and/or made ready for use.

9-10 or 11-12 months: The number of months worked per year, or the number on which the salary contract is based.

Chapter 2

Résumé of National, Regional, and State Data, Including Trends Since 1959-60

Table A summarizes the Nation's college and university library resources over the past five years. It demonstrates steady improvement in some areas, standstill in a few areas, and regression in still others. For example, the number of volumes per student has dropped from 51.9 in 1959-60 to 47.3 in 1963-64, while the number of periodical titles per student has remained at 0.4.

Although the ratio of professional library staff to students has been rising, its 1963-64 level of 1:401 was still substantially below acceptable staffing standards. Also, while total library operating expenditures per student has risen appreciably—from \$40.34 in 1959-60 to \$51.25 in 1963-64—, inflation and rising book prices have attenuated this increase.

Most striking, however, has been the shortage of professional librarians. The data of this series of reports show that in fall 1960 there were 504 budgeted vacancies, while in fall 1963 the number was 632 (table C), an increase of 25 percent.

Due to increases in enrollment, instructional staff, and library use, academic libraries are being hard put to maintain even present levels of library resources and services. The College Library Resources program (Title II, Part A, of the 1965 Higher Education Act, P.L. 89-329) should provide welcome and needed assistance.

The sharpest increases over the 5-year span (table A) have occurred in number of volumes annually acquired, and total operating expenditures. The increase per year for the former averaged over 10 percent; for the latter, over 15 percent. Table B projects these costs through 1975.

It seems inevitable that as more money becomes available, the cost of materials will increase to match the increased availability. For example, during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1966, over

1,800 Federal grants were awarded to academic institutions for the purchase of library materials. The total Federal sum was approximately \$8.2 million. When this amount is added to the usual annual increase of about \$10 million spent for library materials, the cost indexes should show a comparable increase. With the assistance of Federal funds it appears that academic libraries are in a "take-off" stage, and it seems likely that library resources and services 10 years from now will show little resemblance to present conditions. It is also worth noting that new academic institutions and new branches of institutions are being established at an average rate of 100 per year. This should mean at least 1,000 new institutions and branches by the fall of 1975. It also means 1,000 new library facilities, not counting the erection of new ones to replace inadequate facilities.

According to estimates of the Office of Education, expenditures of college and university libraries will total almost \$900 million by 1974-75, and some \$300 million of this sum will go toward purchasing library materials. Academic library resources will total over 450 million volumes, or nearly double the number of volumes reported in 1963-64.

Information about the extent of interlibrary loan activity is of particular interest, if only because data concerning this area are relatively sparse. Table D shows that during 1963-64 an estimated total of 700,000 interlibrary loan transactions occurred among American academic libraries. As is to be expected, the greater number of transactions occurred in States with the greater number of volumes. California reported approximately 87,000 transactions while New York reported 57,000. California appears to have a particularly effective interlibrary loan arrangement.

Table E lists the 40 largest American academic libraries, ranked by size of collection (total volumes, column 3). Within the ensuing year or two, practically all of the libraries in this list will probably be reporting holdings of a million volumes or more.

Despite variations in the method of counting holdings and volumes added (e.g., some libraries do and others do not include microform), a key figure is the number of volumes added, which is

shown in column 4. The highest ranking institution in this respect—as in most others—was Harvard University with nearly 258,000 volumes added in 1964-65. It may be noted that there are only seven States (other than Massachusetts)—California, Illinois, Michigan, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Texas—in which the holdings of all academic libraries in the State are larger than the holdings of Harvard University alone.

The State data in table F show that New York, California, and Massachusetts (tied with Illinois) ranked one, two, and three, respectively, in number of volumes. It is of interest that in 1962, these

same States also ranked one, two, three, and four when measured as recipients of Federal research money awarded to academic institutions. Indeed, these four States held some 70 million volumes or over 30 percent of all volumes reported for the aggregate United States.

Academic institutions in two States are acquiring volumes at a remarkable rate—California with 1.5 million and New York with 1.4 million. No other State comes even close to these figures. Illinois is third with 781,000 volumes.

The data on trends in table A are extensively supplemented by the data in tables G–N, which present median values of management items for 4-year institutions (tables G–K) and 2-year institutions (tables L–N), by control and enrollment size. Of interest is the perceptible drop in the median number of volumes held by public university libraries between 1961–62 and 1963–64. In 1961–62 half of all public universities reported at least 463,000 volumes; in 1963–64 the median had dropped to 434,000, a decrease of 7 percent.

Chapter 3

Analysis of Management Data

Summary data on academic library resources, services and expenditures in 1963-64 are shown in tables 1 and 2. In table 1 the data are classified by *type of institution*, and the 2-year institutions (junior colleges) are included. In table 2 the data are classified by *enrollment size*, and the table covers only the 4-year institutions.

Table 1 shows that although the public universities include a somewhat disproportionate share of students, volumes and staff, the private universities more than match their public counterparts on a per student basis in library resources. For example, although the public universities have over twice as many students as the private universities (1,328,000 to 630,000), the public universities have only 19 percent more volumes.

For each of the items in tables 1 and 2, the averages (median and mean) and the 10th- and 90th-percentile values are shown in tables 3-15. These tables are in two sets, with tables 3-9 giving data by *type of institution* (as in table 1), and tables 10-15 giving data by *enrollment size* of institution (as in table 2). In both these sets of tables, each table is in three parts, with parts A, B, and C giving the data, respectively, for the public and private institutions *combined*, for the *public* institutions only, and for the *private* institutions only. An exception is table 7, since it concerns theological schools and they are exclusively under private control.

Column 2 of tables 3-15 shows the number of institutions which answered the particular item on the survey form. The variations in this number should be taken into account in evaluating the data. In table 3A, for example, 170 universities reported on the number of volumes added during 1963-64, while only 156 universities reported on the number of volumes withdrawn. For the universities that did not report on volumes withdrawn, it seems likely that some, if not all, actually withdrew at least some volumes, but failed to report that fact. On that general assumption it has

seemed soundest, for the purposes of these tables, to base the statistics in columns 3 to 6 on the number of institutions reporting at least some quantity of each of the given items.

Comparison of the data in tables 3-9 with the analogous figures in the 1961-62 analytic report (Publication OE-15031-62) has shown that the median number of total (FTE) staff in public liberal arts colleges rose from 10.5 to 13.0, or almost 25 percent, over the 2-year period. There was a comparable jump in the median for private liberal arts colleges—from 4.0 to 5.0. Indeed, all types of academic libraries, both public and private, showed substantial gains in total staff.

The data on expenditures per FTE faculty member are of interest because they show the highest median—\$1,352—for the theological schools, and the lowest median for the “Other professional school” libraries—\$426, or less than a third of the figure for the theological schools.

It is apparent from tables 10-15 that institutions with large enrollments have much greater library resources than institutions with small enrollments. Yet institutions with small enrollments expend proportionately much more on libraries than those with larger enrollments, particularly as regards the expenditures per FTE student and FTE faculty member (see tables 10-15).

The data support the following additional generalizations:

- (1) Institutions with small enrollments acquire more volumes per dollar expended than institutions with large enrollments. This is probably due to the fact that larger institutions buy proportionately more hard-to-get and expensive items, such as books in the less-frequently taught languages.
- (2) The libraries of the public institutions spend more than their private counterparts, but they enroll many more students than pri-

private institutions. On a per student or per faculty basis the libraries of private institutions spend as much as, if not more than, the libraries of the public institutions.

Although not shown here, frequency distributions have been tabulated for selected management items by control and type of institution. The tabulations showed that over a third (738) of all academic libraries acquired between 2,000-4,999 volumes during 1963-64. Also, while 70 of

the libraries acquired less than 200 volumes in 1963-64, 48 added 50,000 volumes or more to their holdings. The distributions for the number of hours per week when the various types of libraries were open showed that most of the public academic libraries are open considerably longer hours than the private academic libraries.

As a guide to measuring the adequacy of resources and services, the American Library Association has recommended the following minimum quantitative standards:

For libraries of 4-year institutions (recommendations issued in July of 1959):

1. A minimum of 50,000 volumes for an enrollment up to 600 students; for every additional 200 students, 10,000 more volumes.
2. A professional staff that includes at least three librarians. It is assumed that total staff will vary with the size of the institutions, and several formulas are suggested for determining adequate staffing.
3. A library budget of not less than 5 percent of the total educational and general budget, i.e., an expenditure index of at least 5 percent.

For libraries of 2-year institutions (recommendations issued in May of 1960):

1. A minimum of 20,000 volumes for an enrollment up to 1,000 students; for every additional 500 students, 5,000 more volumes.
2. A professional staff that includes at least 2 librarians. The size of total staff is assumed to vary with the institution's size.
3. A library expenditure index of at least 5 percent.

In reviewing certain measures of quality in higher education that are generally considered to be objective, Allan Cartter has stated:

"On reflection, however, it is evident that they are for the most part subjective measures once

removed. Distinguished fellows, Nobel laureates, and National Academy members are selected by peer groups on the basis of subjective assessments, faculty salaries are determined by someone's subjective appraisal, and endowments are the result of philanthropic judgments."

"Number of volumes in the library, though more readily quantifiable, is a factor of little value in measuring institutional resources unless one can make a qualitative judgment about the adequacy of the holdings."¹

At the same time Cartter emphasized the marked association between effectiveness of graduate programs and adequacy of library resources. He pointed out:

"A few universities with poor library resources have achieved considerable strength in several departments, in some cases because laboratory facilities may be more important in a particular field than the library, and in other cases because the universities are located close to other great library collections such as the Library of Congress and the New York Public Library. But institutions that are strong in all areas invariably have major national research libraries. The 17 universities among the first 20 institutions in our study (omitting the three leading institutions of science or technology) had total

library holdings ranging from 1.3 million to nearly eight million volumes; the average holding was 2.7 million volumes. The bottom 20 institutions among the 106 in the survey had libraries ranging from 125,000 to one million volumes, averaging 465,000." (Cartter, *Op. Cit.*, p. 114).

The statistical data of this report are believed to be of interest and value in relation to Cartter's observation regarding Federal aid:

"Since the current tendency in Federal aid is to

increase the number of institutions which are strong centers of graduate education rather than to expand support for already outstanding institutions, such an evaluation of present strengths may be viewed with greater objectivity. (At least one major university has spent considerable time recently trying to convince a Federal agency that it is not one of the top twenty universities in the country and thus is eligible for support as a 'university of promise')." (Cartter, *Op. Cit.*, p. 4).

Chapter 4

Library Positions and Salaries

The basis for the tables in this chapter (tables 16-28) was Part II of the survey form, in which data on staff positions and salaries were requested. Since a number of libraries did not complete Part II, the total number of chief librarians shown in the tables is less than the total number of libraries (table A), and the numbers in the other positions do not represent all positions in the libraries concerned.

Tables 16-18 indicate the number of reported positions by control and *type of institution*, separately for staff employed 11-12 months, for contributed service staff, and staff employed 9-10 months.

Tables 19-21 show the comparable breakdown of reported positions in 4-year institutions by control and *enrollment size*. (These tables on enrollment size do not include data on the 2-year institutions, because they are believed to be represented sufficiently well by the data on junior colleges in column 9 of tables 16-18.)

Tables 22-28 show data on 11-12-month salaries for those groups in which a substantial number of libraries provided the requested information. (Data were reported by only 1 private teachers college, by only 3 public and 2 private technological schools, and by no public professional school.) The lowest salary, 10-percentile value, median, mean, 90-percentile value, and highest salary are shown for each of the 6 types of positions.

Public institutions generally pay somewhat higher salaries than private institutions, but this is not true for all types of positions. Table 22 shows, for example, that the highest salaries (column 9) which private universities pay to associate librarians and department heads are somewhat above the highest salaries paid for the same positions by the public universities.

The most marked difference between salaries paid by public and private institutions occurs among junior colleges. With one exception (non-professional assistants) the salaries paid by the public junior colleges are relatively high.
