

Brief descriptive notes on current books, arranged by Dewey Decimal Classification, with full purchasing information. Separate sections on children's books and books for young people. Includes a quarterly review of films. Subscription Books Bulletin, which has been incorporated in the Booklist, contains analytical, detailed reviews of sets sold by the subscription method and other reference books of a general nature.

Books for College Libraries. Chicago, American Library Association. 1967.

"A selected list of approximately 53,400 titles based on the initial selection made for the University of California's New Campuses Program and selected with the assistance of college teachers, librarians, and other advisers." -- Subtitle. he catalog is intended to be supplemented by the reviewing journal <u>Choice</u>.

Books for Public Libraries. New York, Bowker. 1970.

A buying list of approximately 5,000 titles useful in acquiring a basic circulating non-fiction book collection for a small independent library, or a new branch library.

Chicago. University. Library. Center for Children's Books. <u>Bulletin of the Center for Children's Books</u>. Chicago, University of Chicago Press. Monthly except August.

This is a highly critical evaluation of children's and young people's books with useful annotations describing their effects on character, education, home and family life.

Choice: books for college libraries. Chicago, Association of College and Research Libraries. Monthly.

Considered a leading selection tool for current materials, it includes complete bibliographic data for each title as well as an annotation and is arranged by subject. Consultants for each issue are listed.



The Elementary School Library Collection. 5th ed. Newark, New Jersey, Bro-Dart Foundation, 1970.

This collection "is intended to list the basic library materials which should be provided in any elementary school serving kindergarten through sixth grade. Its purpose is to present high quality materials on all topics included in the elementary curriculum and of wide interest to children". The titles are arranged in book catalog format. Section I is a classified catalog with titles divided into six sections: reference, non-fiction, fiction, easy, periodicals, and professional tools. Each title is annotated, and grade level and price are indicated. Section II contains separate indexes by author, title, and subject.

Enoch Pratt Free Library. Reference Books. 6th ed. Baltimore, Maryland, 1966.

A brief guide for students. The highly selective list includes descriptive and evaluative annotations.

Kirkus Reviews. New York, Kirkus. Issued twice a month.

This reviewing service frequently reports on titles in advance of other media. Reviewers try to be clever. Not intended for small libraries with limited budgets.

Library Journal. New York, Bowker. Issued twice a month, September through June; monthly in July and August.

Includes annotations for current adult titles and also reviews for disc recordings. It is valuable for articles as well. See note for <u>School</u> Library Journal.

Michigan Audio-Visual Association. Michigamme, Materials on Michigan. Ann Arbor, 1963.

An annotated list of books, pamphlets, and audio-visual materials divided by subject; e.g., "Prehistoric Life," "Industry," "Settlement and Statehood," "Travel and Recreation," etc.

Michigan Books for Young Readers - A Selected List of Books Which Are In Print, by Mary Ann Hanna. Lansing, Michigan Department of Education, Bureau of Library Services, 1968.

An annotated list of books, including price and age level, divided into fiction, biography, folklore and legends, government and economic resources, history, Great Lakes, and Mackinac and the "Soo" area. The list may be obtained free from the Bureau of Library Services.

National Association of Independent Schools. Library Committee. 4000 Bookfor Secondary School Libraries: A Basic List. New York, Bowker, 1968.

An author and title index to inexpensive reprints and originals, with a selective subject guide.



Paperbound Books in Print. New York, Bowker. Monthly.

An author and title index to inexpensive reprints and originals, with a selective subject guide.

Publisher's Weekly. New York, Bowker.

A weekly trade journal with news of publishing and the book trade. The "Weekly Record" records American books published in the week preceding the date of issue, including the Library of Congress catalog entry, Dewey Decimal Classification number, and subject headings. Annotations are descriptive, not critical.

School Library Journal. New York, Bowker. Monthly.

"SLJ" includes signed reviews of books for the various grade levels, adult books for young adults, recordings, filmstrips, and professional reading. The magazine is reprinted in its entirety in <u>Library Journal</u>.

The Teacher's <u>Library</u>. Washington, American Association of School Librarians, National Commission for Teacher Education and Professional Standards, National Education Association, 1966.

A paperbound which contains a carefully selected and annotated list of books, pamphlets, films, filmstrips, and journals for professional libraries in elementary and secondary schools. Books and pamphlets are arranged by Dewey Decimal Classification with full buying information. Films, filmstrips, and journals are arranged in separate lists, alphabetically by title. Each item is graded from 1-3, with "1" indicating it should be available in large professional libraries.

Weber, Olga S. <u>Paperbound Book Guide for High Schools</u>. New York, Bowker, Annual.

This lists by subject about 7000 paperbacks suitable for high school use.

Wheeler, Helen Rippier. A Basic Book Collection for the Community College Library. Hamden, Connecticut, Shoe String Press, 1968.

Intended as a basic list, compiles include 5000 titles arranged according to Dewey Decimal Calssification. No audio visual materials are included but community college libraries are recognized as material centers.

Wilson, H. W. Children's Catalog. 12th ed. New York, H. W. Wilson, 1971.

A standard tool for use in children's book selection.

Wilson, H. W. Fiction Catalog. 8th ed. New York, Wilson, 1971.

The catalog is divided into three parts: Part 1 is an author list with full bibliographical information and annotations; Part 2 is a subject and title index to Part 1; Part 3 is a directory of publishers. Books which are especially suitable for young people are marked with a "y". Annual supplements extend the coverage of this catalog.



Wilson, H. W. Junior High School Library Catalog. New York, Wilson, 1970.

This new member of the Standard Catalog Series includes entries selected by consultants appointed by the American Association of School Librarians. The catalog is organized in the same way as the Senior High School Library Catalog. There are annual supplements.

Wilson, H. W. Public Library Catalog. 5th ed. New York, Wilson, 1969.

A familiar tool with a new title. Formerly known as <u>Standard Catalog</u> for <u>Public Libraries</u>, it is designed to serve as a bibliographic and reference aid as well as a selection guide.

Wilson, H. W. <u>Senior High School Library Catalog</u>. 9th ed. New York, Wilson, 1967.

The upgraded, retitled catalog is divided into three parts: a classified book catalog; an author, title, subject, and analytical index; and a directory of publishers. Full cataloging information, descriptive annotations, prices, and subject headings are included in the catalog section, aw well as stars recommending first and second purchase. There are annual supplements.

Winchell, Constance Mabel. <u>Guide to Reference Books</u>. 8th ed. Chicago, American Library Association, 1967.

Entries for 7,500 basic reference books are arranged by subject. The definitive work in the field. Annotations are descriptive and evaluative. Includes publications through 1964. Biennial supplements begin with 1965/66.

Includes a list of picture books for TV storytelling. Programs combining several stories are suggested. There is a list of stories arranged by subject, and a list of source books for stories.

Weston Woods, Weston, Connecticut can supply audio-visual materials for story hours when stories cannot be told directly. Its products include motical pictures, sound filmstrip sets, and books.

An annotated list arranged by subjects to be used as a guide for a basic collection for school or public libraries.

- Kling, Joseph W. "Books Behind the Bars." <u>Library Journal</u>, April 1, 1967, p. 1423-1425. Service to Multnomah County (Oregon) Jail by the Multnomah County Library. Books were supplied from official discards, Greenaway rejects, gift books and duplicates. A good service with limited resources.
- Meffert, L. J. "A Study of Inmate Reading Habits at Minnesota State Prison."

 Minnesota Libraries, p. 198-210. This study concluded that the inmates' reading interests followed the same pattern as public library readers' interests and that the library should be an integral part of the rehabilitation program.
- Neu, Deborah. "Substandard Prison Libraries: Whose Fault?" <u>Bay State Librarian</u>, October, 1963, p. 3-4, 12. Shows that inmates are responsive to good library service and points out need for adequate annual budgets for library service and points out need for adequate annual budgets for library support. Points to California and New York as pioneers in library service to inmates.
- Spector, Herman K. "...Nor Iron Bars a Cage." <u>California Librarian</u>, April, 1963, p. 105-112. Eleven inmates at San Quentin discuss the impact of reading upon their lives and what a prison library means to them.
- Trautman, Ray L. "Upgrading Library Services in Correctional Institutions."

 AHIL Quarterly, Spring, 1966, p. 9-11. Mr. Trautman points out the need for awareness of library problems in institutions by educational and library leadership. He states that correctional institutions cannot depend on "dedicated" people working as volunteers or for low wages.

 <u>Hospital Topics</u>, August, 1966, p. 59-61, 73-74. Describes the history and services of the National Library of Medicine with emphasis on MEDLARS which is the library's information-storage and retrieval system. Contains good general information.
- Lucioli, Clara E. "Out of Isolation." <u>Library Journal</u>, April 1, 1967, p. 1421-1423. The importance of patients' libraries in hospitals and in reaching the homebound is pointed out.
- Lucioli, Clara E. and Dorr, Mildred. "Begin With One Child." Top of the News, January, 1968, p. 150-153. Working with children in a hospital waiting room, the authors also get parents interested and hope that eventually they will use their local libraries.

An excellent article helpful in showing essential planning necessary for the establishment of a staff library in an institution. Contains many points applicable to patients' libraries as well.
- Moody, Mildred T. "The Reader Who Needs Remotivation." ALA Bulletin, October, 1964, p. 795-797. Shows how remotivation sessions expand the use of an institution's library and suggests the possibility of remotivation techniques in the public library.
