

ABSTRACT

This specialized bibliography is intended to fill a definite student need to the scarcity of literature on this topic. Total entries number about 128 and are limited to materials in English available at the University of Pittsburgh. Two main sections of the bibliography are: 1) Education in Korea, and 2) Korean Studies. Cited in the former are book annotations, journal articles, government documents, pamphlets, research studies, dissertations and reports. Journals and newspapers, and other major bibliographies are listed for general area studies; the entries on Korean culture are arranged by subject: history and geography, general works, politics and economy, and literature. Still the best and most detailed history of Korean art available in Western languages. Covers all art forms and has numerous illustrations.--s.

/He/ tried to see Korean art historically and comprehensively in his Geschicte der Koreanischen Kunst, under the heads of architecture, painting, and ceramics...Eckhardt could not help speaking highly of Korean art in the Orient as harmoniously natural and plain, and stove to find the Korean's superior artistic susceptibility, while trying hard to grasp their feelings. Thus the book has been matchless in the field. Unfair and blindly criticism was corrected by Eckhardt.--h.

He especially paid much attention to falsifications which appeared in the reports of the Japanese Government-General, and he made the picture of colonial Korea quite clear. The injustice and falsification of the Japanese and the resultant misunderstandings by the Westerners were corrected in his book.--h.
