DESEGREGATION IN DADE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS
SEPTEMBER 29, 1969

INTRODUCTION

This fifth annual study of the status of desegregation in the Dade County Public Schools bears special significance because of the speed-up in desegregation being required of all school districts in the southeastern United States-- those which at one time operated dual school systems under state laws. More specifically the Dade County school system has been directed by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare and by Federal Court order to complete plans for "total" desegregation.

This report, prepared by the Department of Administrative Research, contains data to assist school officials in preparing the required plans. The report includes the elementary and secondary schools, Headstart program, adult education and all supporting administrative and service departments.

Although previous reports have presented little more than the basic data for use by school officials, other agencies, and the public in whatever way they deemed fit, this report has been expanded to include a set of analytic tables including various comparisons of pupils, classroom teachers and other employee groups.

The classification of pupils into the several minority groups used in this report are as required by the United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare in their reports. An explanation of column headings and symbols can be found on the first page of the basic data tables.

TEN YEARS OF DESEGREGATION

In September 1959, Dade County became the first in Florida to desegregate its schools. Two schools (Orchard Villa Elementary and Air Base Elementary)

opened with a total enrollment of 777 including 25 Negroes. From this token beginning, the Dade County Public Schools have experienced considerable change. This year there are 105 elementary, 33 junior high, 16 senior high, and 6 special school centers having both white and Negro pupils; the total membership in these 169 schools on September 29, 1969 was 179,150 including 43,971 Negroes. This includes 70.2% of the school centers, 74.1% of the Negro pupils and 73.2% of the white (all non-Negro) pupils in the K-12 program.

Rapid changes in community housing patterns quickly converted Orchard Villa to an all-Negro school but by September 1961, without Orchard Villa, there were eight desegregated schools. At the end of the 1962-63 school year, desegregation began to accelerate and in the fall of 1963 some 42 schools had both white and Negro pupils. In the first survey on desegregation made by the Administrative Research Department in October 1965, it was found that 92 of the 208 public schools had been desegregated. In these 92 schools were 15,306 Negro pupils (33%) and 82,727 white pupils (53%). By 1967 the number of desegregated schools had increased to 123 of 213 schools including 30,466 or 56.8% of the Negro pupils.

STATUS OF DESEGREGATION, SEPTEMBER 1969

Although the reports on desegregation in the Dade County Public Schools have included the pupils and employees in all programs and departments of the school system, emphasis has been on pupils in the regular day schools since the primary purpose of the studies has been to determine the extent of racial "mix" between Negro and non-Negro pupils in the K-12 program. Consequently, all non-Negro pupils as well as employed personnel are treated as one classification except where minority groups of pupils (American Indian, Oriental, and Spanish language origin) are shown separately as reported to the United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

Throughout this report combination schools are classified by predominant grade level. Although not included in official attendance reports, Headstart pupils are included in this report. Employee data include part-time as well as full-time personnel. Many teachers work in more than one school although they are full-time personnel; these teachers were reported as part-time instructional personnel by each school and were tabulated with "other instructional" staff members (see definitions, page 9). This provides a better picture of each school's instructional staff but distorts district and countywide totals which include these employees; consequently--certain totals and sub-totals have been omitted.

Tables 1-5 are a tabulation of the basic data obtained in a survey of the entire school system and include data for both pupils and employees. Tables 1, 2, and 3 cover the elementary schools, secondary schools and special centers, respectively. Table 4 covers central administration, district offices, and countywide services, while Table 5 covers the adult education program. In addition to a breakdown of the numbers of pupils by schools into selected minority groups, percents are shown. For employed personnel only the count of Negro and non-Negro at each location was tabulated. Vacancies filled in instructional positions are shown in Tables 1-3, by new staff from out-of-county and by transfers from other Dade County schools.

Analysis of the basic data recorded in Tables 1-5 resulted in several comparisons and special listings which are included in Tables 6-14.

Table 6 brings together the total count of pupils and employees from Tables 1, 2, and 3 by type of group (desegregated, Negro or white) in which they work. It also shows all grade levels combined by type of group and the countywide total of all pupils and employees at the time of the survey. This table reveals that a substantial number of pupils and instructional personnel, both black and white, are in groups with some degree of desegregation.

Table 7 shows the number and percent of schools which have a desegregated student body, faculty, secretarial staff, custodial staff or cafeteria staff. It also shows the number and percent in each category which are all Negro as well as the number and percent which are all white. The table reveals that, of 228 school centers, the student body is desegregated in 160 centers; the faculty is desegregated in 224 centers leaving only one elementary school with an all Negro faculty and two elementary schools and one special center with all white faculties. Other desegregated staff is as follows: secretarial staff in 77 of 228 centers, custodial staff in 165 of 219 centers, and cafeteria staff in 66 of 166 centers.

Table 8 shows the percents from Table 7 together with corresponding percents for September 1968 making possible a comparison of the two years.

Table 9 reveals the exact extent of desegregation. In this table the schools are listed in rank order based on the percent of Negro pupils in each school. Schools having the same percent are listed in alphabetical order. For convenience in reading the table, breaks were made immediately above the 95%, 90%, 85%, 15%, 10%, 5%, and 0% levels. It was found that there were 41 centers in the over 95% group, with the centers in the lower intervals as follows: 3, 1, 41, 6, 14, and 71, respectively; and 51 centers which were all white.

Table 10 is similar to Table 9, with the schools listed in rank order based on the percent of Negro classroom teachers in each school. Only one school is shown in the over 95% Negro group. The largest number of schools was in the over 5% but not over 10% group (78 schools). Seven schools had no Negro classroom teachers; however, four of these had either administrative or other instructional personnel who are Negro.

Table 11 is also similar to *Table 9*. Schools are listed in rank order based on the percent of Negro pupils in each school. However, in this table, the number and percent of Negro pupils in each school are shown with the number and percent of Negro pupils in each school in September 1968 facilitating a comparison between 1968 and 1969 on a school by school basis. There are fourteen school centers, established since the desegregation survey in 1968, one elementary school and five special centers in 1968-69 and eight elementary schools this year, for which there are no comparative data for 1968. Most of the schools show a small increase in the percent of Negro pupils enrolled while a few show a decrease. Some of the schools, however, show a striking change over the previous year.

Table 12 is a tabulation of all present schools which were white before desegregation (September 1959) listed in alphabetical order within grade levels. Shown for each school is the number of Negro pupils enrolled at the time of this survey together with the percent of Negroes in the student body. Included are 98 elementary schools, 24 junior high schools, and 10 senior high schools. It is shown that many of these schools are still all white. Except for two junior high schools these are elementary schools serving small neighborhoods in which no Negroes live. Many of the schools shown in this table have reached a substantial degree of desegregation. Four schools have changed to 99% or more Negro pupils.

Table 13, like *Table 12*, lists schools in existence before desegregation; these were the Negro schools. *Table 13* reveals that all but six of the elementary schools and two of the junior high schools have achieved some degree of desegregation. Shown is the number and percent of white pupils now in these formerly Negro schools.

Table 14 lists all schools which were established after desegregation began in September 1959 including the schools which were opened at that time. Air Base Elementary School, one of the two schools first desegregated, was established as a desegregated school. *Table 14* shows that some of the schools in this list, arranged alphabetically by grade level, are segregated schools -- mostly white elementary schools in all white neighborhoods and a few Negro elementary schools in all Negro neighborhoods. This table shows both Negro and white pupils in 50 elementary schools, 11 junior high schools, 6 senior high schools, and 6 special centers, enrolling 53,901 white and 18,820 Negro pupils, established in or since September 1959.

Several supplementary tables have been added following *Table 14*. This addendum contains the basic pupil data from *Tables 1, 2* and *3* for the schools in the City of Miami (*Table 15*); a summary of the racial composition of the pupil population at school levels, by districts (*Table 16*); a summary of the racial composition of the instructional staff at school levels, by districts (*Table 17*); and the racial composition of the pupil population by districts for the five years of these desegregation reports beginning in 1965 (*Table 18*).

Desegregated: Any mixing of black and white individuals regardless of number, e.g., a desegregated student body includes at least one Negro pupil and at least one non-Negro pupil; a desegregated classroom teacher staff includes at least one Negro teacher and one non-Negro teacher

Desegregated school: Synonymous with desegregated student body

White: Non-Negro pupils and/or employees regardless of ethnic origin

Spanish language origin: Pupils from families whose native language is Spanish

Classroom teachers: Full time instructional personnel whose major assignment is teaching

Other instructional personnel: Teachers assigned to more than one school, serving each school on a part time basis; personnel whose major assignment is other than teaching (librarians, counselors, psychologists, visiting teachers, case-workers, etc.)

New staff: Instructional personnel new to this system since October 1, 1968

Transfers: Instructional personnel from other assignments in this system since October 1, 1968, or from leave

Column heading symbols:
