ABSTRACT

A total of 42 selected publications, dating from 1948 to 1970, are collated and organized under 15 broad categories in this guide to useful materials related to secondary reading. The materials include texts, books, yearbooks, monographs, bibliographies, and a comprehensive research index. The fifteen categories are (1) the nature of reading development, (2) the need for secondary reading programs, (3) developmental and sequential reading, (4) trends and practices in organization of secondary reading, (5) reading programs--kindergarten through college, (6) educational personnel and reading, (7) parents and reading improvement, (8) reading skills and how to teach them, (9) reading in content areas, (10) reading interests--personal development through reading, (11) materials--mass media--mechanical devices in reading, (12) measurement and evaluation in reading, (13) diagnosis and remediation of reading difficulties, (14) research in reading, and (15) reading reference materials.
