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ABSTRACT

Each of the five handbooks contains approximately 40 pages of tabular material derived from results of a mail survey of all dental hygienists licensed to practice in each of the states. The statistical tables are concerned with personal characteristics, education and training, professional history, current professional activity, professional activity during the last 12 months, continuing education, and status of currently inactive hygienists in each state. Other state surveys in this nationwide study have already been conducted, and others will be completed in the near future.

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INTRODUCTION

In December 1966, the Nevada State Board of Dental Examiners conducted a mail survey of all dental hygienists licensed to practice in the State. This survey was conducted concurrently with the hygienists' annual reregistration with the Board.

Statistics presented in this Handbook were tabulated from the information furnished by the dental hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaires. The location of each nonrespondent was obtained from the Board records.

This statistical presentation has been designed to provide most of the basic facts which were collected in the survey. Pertinent cross-tabulations of data have been presented when the number of hygienists in the specific population group was large enough to provide meaningful data.

Since this was a survey of hygienists licensed in Nevada, the data exclude an unknown number of inactive hygienists who reside in the State but are not licensed to practice there. Also excluded may be a few nonlicensed hygienists who are working in the State either for the Federal Government or for some employer in an administrative or other nonclinical position in which licensure is not a prerequisite for employment.

The Nevada survey is part of a national endeavor: Dental examining boards in virtually all of the States are utilizing the same questionnaire printed under their own letterheads, to survey dental hygienists licensed in their respective States. The American Association of Dental Examiners, under a contract with the Division of Dental Health of the National Institutes of Health, USPHS, is coordinating this national survey program to assist States in developing comparable information about their dental manpower resources. The preparation of this Handbook has been made possible through the cooperation of the American Association of Dental Examiners and the Division of Dental Health, Resource Analysis Branch.

EXPLANATION OF SELECTED TERMS USED IN STATISTICAL TABLES

Licensed dental hygienists are divided into three groups according to their location at the time of the survey:

1. Instate hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in the survey State, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in the survey State. (Excludes survey State residents who were active in another State).
2. Out-of-State hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in one of the other 49 States or the District of Columbia, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in another State.
3. Hygienists in foreign countries include all other hygienists surveyed.

Respondents include hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaire and provided sufficient information to determine their current professional status. Nonrespondents include all other hygienists surveyed.

The current professional status of hygienists was determined according to their reported activity in dental hygiene at the time of the survey:

1. Active hygienists include those who were employed as a dental hygienist in any position which required the special training of a dental hygienist, as well as unemployed hygienists who reported they were seeking employment as a dental hygienist.
2. Inactive hygienists include those who were not professionally active. (Includes hygienists who were employed in any occupation other than dental hygiene).

In the presentation of current employment statistics the term practicing hygienists relates specifically to those who were working in a private dental office. However, in statistical presentations relating to inactive hygienists or to trends in professional activity the terms "practicing" or "in practice" are used in a broader connotation referring to all professionally active hygienists.

INTRODUCTION

In October 1966, the State of Utah, Department of Registration conducted a mail survey of all dental hygienists licensed to practice in the State. This survey was conducted concurrently with the hygienists' annual reregistration with the Board

Statistics presented in this Handbook were tabulated from the information furnished by the dental hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaires. The location of each nonrespondent was obtained from the Board records.

This statistical presentation has been designed to provide most of the basic facts which were collected in the survey. Pertinent cross-tabulations of data have been presented when the number of hygienists in the specific population group was large enough to provide meaningful data.

Since this was a survey of hygienists licensed in Utah, the data exclude an unknown number of inactive hygienists who reside in the State but are not licensed to practice there. Also excluded may be a few non-licensed hygienists who are working in the State either for the Federal Government or for some employer in an administrative or other nonclinical position in which licensure is not a prerequisite for employment.

The Utah survey is part of a national endeavor: Dental examining boards in virtually all of the States are utilizing the same questionnaire printed under their own letterheads, to survey dental hygienists licensed in their respective States. The American Association of Dental Examiners, under a contract with the Division of Dental Health of the National Institutes of Health, USPHS, is coordinating this national survey program to assist States in developing comparable information about their dental manpower resources. The preparation of this Handbook has been made possible through the cooperation of the American Association of Dental Examiners and the Division of Dental Health, Manpower Studies Branch.

EXPLANATION OF SELECTED TERMS USED IN STATISTICAL TABLES

Licensed dental hygienists are divided into three groups according to their location at the time of the survey:

1. Instate hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in the survey state, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in the survey state. (Excludes survey state residents who were active in another state).
2. Out-of-state hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in one of the other 49 states or the District of Columbia, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in another state.
3. Hygienists in foreign countries include all other hygienists surveyed.

Respondents include hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaire and provided sufficient information to determine their current professional status. Nonrespondents include all other hygienists surveyed.

The current professional status of hygienists was determined according to their reported activity in dental hygiene at the time of the survey:

1. Active hygienists include those who were employed as a dental hygienist in any position which required the special training of a dental hygienist, as well as unemployed hygienists who reported they were seeking employment as a dental hygienist.
2. Inactive hygienists include those who were not professionally active. (Includes hygienists who were employed in any occupation other than dental hygiene).

In the presentation of current employment statistics the term practicing hygienists relates specifically to those who were working in a private dental office. However, in statistical presentations relating to inactive hygienists or to trends in professional activity the terms "practicing" or "in practice" are used in a broader connotation referring to all professionally active hygienists.

INTRODUCTION

In January 1967, the South Carolina State Board of Dentistry conducted a mail survey of all dental hygienists licensed to practice in the State. This survey was conducted concurrently with the hygienists' annual reregistration with the Board.

Statistics presented in this Handbook were tabulated from the information furnished by the dental hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaires. The location of each nonrespondent was obtained from the Board records.

This statistical presentation has been designed to provide most of the basic facts which were collected in the survey. Pertinent cross-tabulations of data have been presented when the number of hygienists in the specific population group was large enough to provide meaningful data.

Since this was a survey of hygienists licensed in South Carolina, the data exclude an unknown number of inactive hygienists who reside in the State but are not licensed to practice there. Also excluded may be a few nonlicensed hygienists who are working in the State either for the Federal Government or for some employer in an administrative or other nonclinical position in which licensure is not a prerequisite for employment.

The South Carolina survey is part of a national endeavor: Dental examining boards in virtually all of the States are utilizing the same questionnaire printed under their own letterheads, to survey dental hygienists licensed in their respective States. The American Association of Dental Examiners, under a contract with the Division of Dental Health of the National Institutes of Health, USPHS, is coordinating this national survey program to assist States in developing comparable information about their dental manpower resources. The preparation of this Handbook has been made possible through the cooperation of the American Association of Dental Examiners and the Division of Dental Health, Manpower Studies Branch.

EXPLANATION OF SELECTED TERMS USED IN STATISTICAL TABLES

Licensed dental hygienists are divided into three groups according to their location at the time of the survey:

1. Instate hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in the survey state, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in the survey state. (Excludes survey state residents who were active in another state)
2. Out-of-state hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in one of the other 49 states or the District of Columbia, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in another state.
3. Hygienists in foreign countries include all other hygienists surveyed

Respondents include hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaire and provided sufficient information to determine their current professional status. Nonrespondents include all other hygienists surveyed.

The current professional status of hygienists was determined according to their reported activity in dental hygiene at the time of the survey:

1. Active hygienists include those who were employed as a dental hygienist in any position which required the special training of a dental hygienist, as well as unemployed hygienists who reported they were seeking employment as a dental hygienist.
2. Inactive hygienists include those who were not professionally active. (Includes hygienists who were employed in any occupation other than dental hygiene)

In the presentation of current employment statistics the term practicing hygienists relates specifically to those who were working in a private dental office. However, in statistical presentations relating to inactive hygienists or to trends in professional activity the terms "practicing" or "in practice" are used in a broader connotation referring to all professionally active hygienists.

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INTRODUCTION

In early 1966, the New York State Board of Dental Examiners conducted a mail survey of all dental hygienists licensed to practice in the State. This survey was conducted concurrently with the hygienists' annual reregistration with the Board.

Statistics presented in this Handbook were tabulated from the information furnished by the dental hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaires. The location of each nonrespondent was obtained from the Board records.

This statistical presentation has been designed to provide most of the basic facts which were collected in the survey. Pertinent cross-tabulations of data have been presented when the number of hygienists in the specific population group was large enough to provide meaningful data.

Since this was a survey of hygienists licensed in New York, the data exclude an unknown number of inactive hygienists who reside in the State but are not licensed to practice there. Also excluded may be a few nonlicensed hygienists who are working in the State either for the Federal Government or for some employer in an administrative or other nonclinical position in which licensure is not a prerequisite for employment.

The New York survey is part of a national endeavor: Dental examining boards in virtually all of the States are utilizing the same questionnaire printed under their own letterheads, to survey dental hygienists licensed in their respective States. The American Association of Dental Examiners, under a contract with the Division of Dental Health of the National Institutes of Health, USPHS, is coordinating this national survey program to assist States in developing comparable information about their dental manpower resources. EXPLANATION OF SELECTED TERMS USED IN STATISTICAL TABLES

Licensed dental hygienists are divided into three groups according to their location at the time of the survey:

1. Instate hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in the survey state, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in the survey state. (Excludes survey state residents who were active in another state).
2. Out-of-state hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in one of the other 49 states or the District of Columbia, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in another state.
3. Hygienists in foreign countries include all other hygienists surveyed.

Respondents include hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaire and provided sufficient information to determine their current professional status. Nonrespondents include all other hygienists surveyed.

The current professional status of hygienists was determined according to their reported activity in dental hygiene at the time of the survey:

1. Active hygienists include those who were employed as a dental hygienist in any position which required the special training of a dental hygienist, as well as unemployed hygienists who reported they were seeking employment as a dental hygienist.
2. Inactive hygienists include those who were not professionally active. (Includes hygienists who were employed in any occupation other than dental hygiene).

In the presentation of current employment statistics the term practicing hygienists relates specifically to those who were working in a private dental office. However, in statistical presentations relating to inactive hygienists or to trends in professional activity the terms "practicing" or "in practice" are used in a broader connotation referring to all professionally active hygienists.

INTRODUCTION

In December 1966, the Montana State Board of Dental Examiners conducted a mail survey of all dental hygienists licensed to practice in the State. This survey was conducted concurrently with the hygienists' annual reregistration with the Board.

Statistics presented in this Handbook were tabulated from the information furnished by the dental hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaires. The location of each nonrespondent was obtained from the Board records.

This statistical presentation has been designed to provide most of the basic facts which were collected in the survey. Pertinent cross-tabulations of data have been presented when the number of hygienists in the specific population group was large enough to provide meaningful data.

Since this was a survey of hygienists licensed in Montana, the data exclude an unknown number of inactive hygienists who reside in the State but are not licensed to practice there. Also excluded may be a few nonlicensed hygienists who are working in the State either for the Federal Government or for some employer in an administrative or other nonclinical position in which licensure is not a prerequisite for employment.

The Montana survey is part of a national endeavor: Dental examining boards in virtually all of the States are utilizing the same questionnaire printed under their own letterheads, to survey dental hygienists licensed in their respective States. The American Association of Dental Examiners, under a contract with the Division of Dental Health of the National Institutes of Health, USPHS, is coordinating this national survey program to assist States in developing comparable information about their dental manpower resources. The preparation of this Handbook has been made possible through the cooperation of the American Association of Dental Examiners and the Division of Dental Health, Resource Analysis Branch.

EXPLANATION OF SELECTED TERMS USED IN STATISTICAL TABLES

Licensed dental hygienists are divided into three groups according to their location at the time of the survey:

1. Instate hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in the survey state, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in the survey state. (Excludes survey state residents who were active in another state).
2. Out-of-state hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in one of the other 49 states or the District of Columbia, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in another state.
3. Hygienists in foreign countries include all other hygienists surveyed.

Respondents include hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaire and provided sufficient information to determine their current professional status. Nonrespondents include all other hygienists surveyed.

The current professional status of hygienists was determined according to their reported activity in dental hygiene at the time of the survey:

1. Active hygienists include those who were employed as a dental hygienist in any position which required the special training of a dental hygienist, as well as unemployed hygienists who reported they were seeking employment as a dental hygienist.
2. Inactive hygienists include those who were not professionally active. (Includes hygienists who were employed in any occupation other than dental hygiene).

In the presentation of current employment statistics the term practicing hygienists relates specifically to those who were working in a private dental office. However, in statistical presentations relating to inactive hygienists or to trends in professional activity the terms "practicing" or "in practice" are used in a broader connotation referring to all professionally active hygienists.

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INTRODUCTION

In December 1966, the Board of Dental Examiners-State of Hawaii conducted a mail survey of all dental hygienists licensed to practice in the State. This survey was conducted concurrently with the hygienists' annual reregistration with the Board.

Statistics presented in this Handbook were tabulated from the information furnished by the dental hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaires. The location of each nonrespondent was obtained from the Board records.

This statistical presentation has been designed to provide most of the basic facts which were collected in the survey. Pertinent cross-tabulations of data have been presented when the number of hygienists in the specific population group was large enough to provide meaningful data.

Since this was a survey of hygienists licensed in Hawaii, the data exclude an unknown number of inactive hygienists who reside in the State but are not licensed to practice there. Also excluded may be a few nonlicensed hygienists who are working in the State either for the Federal Government or for some employer in an administrative or other nonclinical position in which licensure is not a prerequisite for employment.

The Hawaii survey is part of a national endeavor: Dental examining boards in virtually all of the States are utilizing the same questionnaire printed under their own letterheads, to survey dental hygienists licensed in their respective States. The American Association of Dental Examiners, under a contract with the Division of Dental Health of the National Institutes of Health, USPHS, is coordinating this national survey program to assist States in developing comparable information about their dental manpower resources. The preparation of this Handbook has been made possible through the cooperation of the American Association of Dental Examiners and the Division of Dental Health, Resource Analysis Branch.

EXPLANATION OF SELECTED TERMS USED IN STATISTICAL TABLES

Licensed dental hygienists are divided into three groups according to their location at the time of the survey:

1. Instate hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in the survey state, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in the survey state. (Excludes survey state residents who were active in another state).
2. Out-of-state hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in one of the other 49 states or the District of Columbia, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in another state.
3. Hygienists in foreign countries include all other hygienists surveyed.

Respondents include hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaire and provided sufficient information to determine their current professional status. Nonrespondents include all other hygienists surveyed.

The current professional status of hygienists was determined according to their reported activity in dental hygiene at the time of the survey:

1. Active hygienists include those who were employed as a dental hygienist in any position which required the special training of a dental hygienist, as well as unemployed hygienists who reported they were seeking employment as a dental hygienist.
2. Inactive hygienists include those who were not professionally active. (Includes hygienists who were employed in any occupation other than dental hygiene).

In the presentation of current employment statistics the term practicing hygienists relates specifically to those who were working in a private dental office. However, in statistical presentations relating to inactive hygienists or to trends in professional activity the terms "practicing" or "in practice" are used in a broader connotation referring to all professionally active hygienists.

INTRODUCTION

In January 1967, the Connecticut Dental Commission conducted a mail survey of all dental hygienists licensed to practice in the State. This survey was conducted concurrently with the hygienists' annual reregistration with the Board.

Statistics presented in this Handbook were tabulated from the information furnished by the dental hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaires. The location of each nonrespondent was obtained from the Board records.

This statistical presentation has been designed to provide most of the basic facts which were collected in the survey. Pertinent cross-tabulations of data have been presented when the number of hygienists in the specific population group was large enough to provide meaningful data.

Since this was a survey of hygienists licensed in Connecticut, the data exclude an unknown number of inactive hygienists who reside in the State but are not licensed to practice there. Also excluded may be a few nonlicensed hygienists who are working in the State either for the Federal Government or for some employer in an administrative or other nonclinical position in which licensure is not a prerequisite for employment.

The Connecticut survey is part of a national endeavor: Dental examining boards in virtually all of the States are utilizing the same questionnaire printed under their own letterheads, to survey dental hygienists licensed in their respective States. The American Association of Dental Examiners, under a contract with the Division of Dental Health of the National Institutes of Health, USPHS, is coordinating this national survey program to assist States in developing comparable information about their dental manpower resources. The preparation of this Handbook has been made possible through the cooperation of the American Association of Dental Examiners and the Division of Dental Health, Resource Analysis Branch.

EXPLANATION OF SELECTED TERMS USED IN STATISTICAL TABLES

Licensed dental hygienists are divided into three groups according to their location at the time of the survey:

1. Instate hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in the survey state, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in the survey state. (Excludes survey state residents who were active in another state).
2. Out-of-state hygienists include respondents who were professionally active in one of the other 49 states or the District of Columbia, as well as inactive respondents and all nonrespondents who resided in another state.
3. Hygienists in foreign countries include all other hygienists surveyed

Respondents include hygienists who completed and returned their questionnaire and provided sufficient information to determine their current professional status. Nonrespondents include all other hygienists surveyed.

The current professional status of hygienists was determined according to their reported activity in dental hygiene at the time of the survey:

1. Active hygienists include those who were employed as a dental hygienist in any position which required the special training of a dental hygienist, as well as unemployed hygienists who reported they were seeking employment as a dental hygienist.
2. Inactive hygienists include those who were not professionally active. (Includes hygienists who were employed in any occupation other than dental hygiene).

In the presentation of current employment statistics the term practicing hygienists relates specifically to those who were working in a private dental office. However, in statistical presentations relating to inactive hygienists or to trends in professional activity the terms "practicing" or "in practice" are used in a broader connotation referring to all professionally active hygienists.
