ABSTRACT

This report presents information on academic libraries of selected institutions of higher education. The institutions are grouped by region: Northeast, Midwest, Southeast, and West and Southwest, and listed by type of control: (1) public and private universities; (2) public and private 4-year institutions with graduate programs; (3) public and private 4-year institutions without graduate programs; and (4) public and private 2-year institutions. For each of the selected institutions data is presented on (1) total enrollment, number of units in collection, and units per FTE students, 1966-67; (2) library operating expenditures, expenditure per FTE student, and expenditure as percentage of educational expenditure, 1966-67; (3) library staff, hourly assistance, and beginning salary of library school graduate, fall 1967; and (4) number and average salary of full-time staff, fall 1967. PRELIMINARY REPORT ON ACADEMIC LIBRARIES, 1966 - 67

- Selected Individual Institutions -

For administrative planning purposes, academic (college and university) librarians have expressed an urgent need for annual statistics on individual libraries by January of the school year. The present report is an experiment in meeting this need by showing limited data for a short list of institutions, so selected as to provide a cross-section of academic libraries.

There has been no annual Office of Education listing of academic libraries since the listing of 1963-64. In the last few years, competing priorities and resource limitations have made necessary a change in the publication pattern.

Under the present plan, this preliminary report is intended to meet the most urgent need for early data by providing information for a limited number of prototype libraries. A more comprehensive report will then be developed and is expected to be published in June 1968.

In four tables, data for each institution are shown on collections (table 1), on finance (table 2), on staff (table 3), and on salaries (table 4). The institutions were chosen in accordance with sampling principles, but alternate returns had to be inserted for reports which were not available at the time of compilation. The results will be tested for representativeness and the possibility of using this technique for preliminary national estimates will be considered next year.

Institutional listing

The institutions are arranged in 32 groups as follows:

- A. The type of institution is shown in 4 categories:
 - 1. Universities
 - 2. Four-year institutions with graduate programs
 - 3. Four-year institutions without graduate programs
 - 4. Two-year institutions
- B. For each of the 4 types, public and privately controlled institutions are shown separately. •



- C. Within each of the above 8 groups, institutions are grouped by 4 geographic regions as follows:

DEFINITIONS

Institutions are classified as universities if (a) they give considerable stress to graduate instruction, (b) confer advanced degrees as well as bachelor's degrees in a variety of liberal arts fields, and (c) have at least two professional schools that are not exclusively technological. This definition of universities is the same as the one employed in previous reports on college and university libraries.

Four-year institutions other than universities are no longer subdivided into liberal arts colleges, teachers colleges, technological schools, etc. Instead they are divided into only two groups, namely, the institutions which do, and those which do not, have graduate programs. For purposes of this classification, a graduate program is defined as a program of academic work reyond the baccalaureate or first professional level.

Two-year institutions are those offering programs of at least two, but less than four, years of work beyond the high school level. This definition, too, is the same as the one previously employed and is synonymous with the terms "junior college" and "community college."

Publicly-controlled institutions include those controlled by local governments or State governments, as well as a few completely controlled by the Federal Government. All other institutions, including religious, independent non-profit, and a few proprietary institutions, are classified as privately-controlled.

Each institution was asked to report consolidated data for all of its library units, including libraries in branches and extension centers. Data were consolidated by the Office of Education when institutions returned separate reports for components within their library systems.

The total enrollment represents the institution's fall 1966 enrollment of full-time and part-time students enrolled in work normally creditable toward a degree, diploma, certificate, or other formal award.



For purposes of estimating an institution's full-time equivalence of enrollment, use was made of the number of full-time resident students, plus 1/3 of the part-time resident students, plus 1/3 of the extension students. This figure, although not exactly comparable with the FTE enrollment used in previous years, is comparable from one institution to another in this publication, and thus the per-student figures based upon it are likewise comparable.

Volumes were defined as physical units of any printed, typewritten, hand-written, mimeographed, or processed work contained in one binding or portfolio, hardbound or paperbound, which had been classified, cataloged, or otherwise prepared for use. Thus, the volume count includes bound periodicals and cataloged government documents, but excludes all microform. The latter was reported separately, as a count of microfilm reels plus the number of physical units of other forms of microtext (microcards, microprints, and microfiche units).

Where library expenditures are taken as a percent of total educational expenditure (table 2, col. 9), the total educational expenditure figure includes the institution's expenditure for instruction, departmental research, and organized research.

Professional librarians are defined as staff doing work that requires training and skill in the theoretical or scientific aspect of library work, as distinct from its mechanical and clerical aspects.

Other professional staff are personnel who, though not professional librarians, are in positions normally requiring at least a bachelor's degree.

In the data on salaries by position (table 4) two categories used in previous reports ("Department and division heads" and "Heads of school, college, and branch libraries") have been combined into the single category "Heads of major library units."

For the Beginning salary of library school graduate, the respondent was asked to report the salary which the institution was paying or would pay to a librarian with a 5-year degree and without experience.

A more detailed description of the survey and of pertinent definitions will be included in the June report.

On page 1, the method of stratification of institutions and of sample selection has been described briefly. Within each of the 32 groups identified in the text, the institutions were arrayed in order according to their rank, as reflected by their total expenditure for library operations. The sample institutions were then systematically selected from this array, and reordered according to enrollment size.

Because the returns for some of the sample institutions were not available at time of tabulation, alternate returns were substituted, wherever possible, from institutions close to the sample institution on the list.

The following table summarizes the 395 institutions listed in this publication for each of the 32 groups:
