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#### ABSTRACT

This guide is a compilation of teaching and behavioral objectives for lessons and activities of the Peabody Language Development Kit--Level P (PLDK-P). An accompanying checklist for each lesson provides space to record responses and reinforcement given each child. The purpose of the guide is to provide means for teachers to evaluate the effectiveness of their instruction, to identify individual problems and to assess rate of presentation and amount of review necessary. The guide was developed through adaptation of the PLDK-P to a Readimobile project in an experimental program conducted in Wakulla County, Florida, and pilot tested during 1970-71 with teachers and children in the Southeast. Volume I, Lessons 1-90, is PS 005 024. (Author/AJ)
