

ABSTRACT

Sponsored by the Commission on Religion in Appalachia, Inc. (CORA), this 1971 atlas seeks to "facilitate communication and planning among CORA member communions and related agencies" within Appalachia by presenting data on administrative units, members, churches, boards, agencies, and committees of the following: American Baptist Convention, American Lutheran Church, Catholic Church, Christian Church (Disciples), Church of God, Church of the Brethren, Episcopal Church, Friends United Meeting, Lutheran Church in America, Lutheran Church (Missouri Synod), Mennonite Church, Presbyterian Church (U.S.), Reformed Church in America, Southern Baptist Convention Home Mission Board, United Church of Christ, United Methodist Church, and United Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Section A of the atlas contains a county-outline map for each communion, showing judicatory boundaries (at 2 levels where appropriate); a data sheet gives names of individual unito corresponding to boundaries and addresses of administrativ that handle day-to-day business. Distributions of denominational membership and local congregations are also provided on spot maps. Section B shows selected church boards, agencies, committees, and projects operative at the regional or judicatory level. Section C contains non-church data relevant to regional church planning; these data are based on 1970 census information. (MJB)

FOREWORD

Most institutions and agencies in contemporary society are searching for new approaches and structures to accomplish their objectives more effectively. One approach finding increasing favor in many circles - private, governmental and church - is a regional approach to planning, programming and delivery of services. National attention has been given to the mountainous section of the United States stretching across thirteen states from lower New York to northern Alabama, Georgia and Mississippi, called "Appalachia," as a regional model for planning and development. In 1965, seventeen different church bodies established The Commission on Religion in Appalachia, Inc. (CORA) to develop a united approach to the church's mission in Appalachia.

The ATLAS OF THE CHURCH IN APPALACHIA is designed to facilitate communication and planning among CORA member communions and related agencies within the Appalachian region. This 1971 edition has been expanded and revised.

Section A of the ATLAS contains a county-outline map for each communion, showing judicatory boundaries (at two levels where appropriate). Opposite each map is a "data sheet" giving names of individual units corresponding to the boundaries, with addresses of administrative offices that handle day-to-day business. Spot maps showing distribution of denominational membership and local congregations are also included.

Section B lists selected church boards, agencies, committees and projects, operative at the regional or judicatory level.

Section C contains non-church data relevant to regional church planning, updated according to the latest available 1970 census information.

It is our hope that the ATLAS will become an indispensable tool for cooperative planning within church circles; and that it will enable more effective cooperation with community agencies with which the church works.

WHAT IS THE COMMISSION ON RELIGION IN APPALACHIA?

The Commission on Religion in Appalachia, Inc. (CORA) was born in 1965 as a cooperative effort in the church's continuing response to Appalachian needs. Seventeen religious communions, eleven state councils of churches, the Council of the Southern Mountains and related church agencies created the Commission.

CORA is a cooperative effort to develop joint-action-in-mission that is relevant to the region's needs because it is indigenous, innovative and ecumenical. The BASIC PURPOSE is to engage the resources of the Church and other agencies in activities designed to meet the pressing human needs of the people of Appalachia. The goals are to build community and to combat poverty in Appalachia -- and through joint action in this twin mission, to help renew the church.

CORA's origins date back to a consultation in June, 1956 in Berea, Kentucky when fifteen denominations met to discuss cooperative church programs. The need for more comprehensive information as a basis for planning led to establishment of the Southern Appalachian Studies Group, which in 1962 produced the classic document, The Southern Appalachian Region: A Survey, edited by Thomas R. Ford.

CORA was organized...

- ... to deal with the religious, moral and spiritual implications inherent in the economic, social and cultural conditions in the Appalachian region of the inited States;
- ... to develop a united approach to the church's mission in Appalachia by:
 - consultation providing a consultative body for the sharing of information and concern primarily among the religious but also in the social, economic, educational and governmental agencies serving the Appalachian region;
 - research, study, education expanding understanding of the conditions of the Appalachian region and giving guidance to appropriate programs of the churches and church bodies;
 - coordination providing a means of discovering suitable areas of staff and program coordination, recognizing that there is a place for both denominational as well as interdenominational programs in Appalachia;
 - projects engaging in projects that are helpful in fulfilling the church's mission;
- ...to assist its members with new programs and redefinition of goals to meet changing human needs;



- ... to provide a vehicle for the communions and related agencies to plan together and to develop joint-action-in-mission on a regional basis; and
- ... to implement the church's concern as follow-up of the Southern Appalachian Studies.

Religious communions hold membership in CORA in a manner most consistent with their own structures. Several relate through judicatories located in Appalachia; and several through boards of missions. Each member-group sends three delegates and three alternates to the semi-annual Commission meetings. These delegates, and especially the "chairman of the delegation," have responsibility for maintaining lines of communication between CORA and its constituent communions and agencies. Perhaps CORA's most important contribution has been to bring churchmen together for dialogue and action on Appalachian needs.

CORA embodies a new style of the church in mission in its approach. It builds regional programs out of learnings in local pilot projects. In <u>programming</u>, it works through informal coalitions and task forces in a flexit le fashion around issues, rather than through pre-structured programs. As an ecumenical <u>organization</u>, CORA represents a unified effort in mission by a widely diverse group of religious bodies.

Key elements of the CORA model are its collegiate staff and its task forces. The collegiate staff includes both full-time and part-time persons assigned by member denominations or cooperating agencies to work on CORA projects. Coordination is provided by CC A's Executive Director, and financial support is furnished by the denominations and agencies.

Task forces are currently working on self-help approaches to poverty; social, economic and political issues; research; youth leadership; and volunteer services. Training and communication task forces are now being organized. The task forces include persons with expertise, who are church leaders and/or representatives of non-church agencies.

The MAJOR PROGRAM THRUSTS are designed: (1) to provide a vehicle for the communions' reassessment of existing mission activities in light of the requirements of the people of the region and the potentials for joint-action-in-mission; and (2) to initiate projects aimed directly at the region's pressing human needs whenever those needs cannot realistically be met solely through a reallocation of the existing mission resources of the member communions.

The Appalachian Mission Renewal Project established in the spring of 1971 was sparked by a request from the United Methodist Board of Missions and the United Methodist Appalachian Development Committee for assistance in an ecumenical study and review of that denomination's mission projects in Appalachia, looking toward joint strategic planning for more effective ministry to human needs. AMRP will include a comprehensive inventory of church resources in Appalachia, and a pilot project in four selected multi-county areas (Local Development Districts). The pilot project is designed to develop a profile of each area, documenting pressing human needs, and establish a review-planning process.

Growing in importance are the experimental projects which CORA undertakes in order build models from which the church may learn for future action.

The Upper Hiwassee Project in North Carolina-Georgia is exploring patterns of multi-county cooperation through research and training.

The region-wide Human/Economic Appalachian Development Project (HEAD) has a pilot-demonstration operation in the Kentucky River Area of Eastern Kentucky. HEAD is a unique blend of human and economic development. It is also a creative partnership combining local people and church, government and volunteer agencies.

The Model Valley project encompassing Bell-Whitley Counties, Kentucky and Claiborne-Campbell Counties, Tennessee is an experiment in total community development.

Increased relevance and service to local churches and to judicatories and agencies at all levels is a major goal of CORA. A major thrust in this direction has been to assist denominations to coordinate their own structures, programs, and agencies as these relate to Appalachia. Work with Appalachian development committees created by many denominations provides a channel brough which CORA fulfills this function.

CORA has also established a creative approach to the media. A directory of more than 150 judicatory publications and appropriate national publications has been compiled by CORA's appalachian Religious Communication Project. APRECOM provides a monthly news service to each of these publications and other communications media on Appalachian issues and needs. APRECOM also provides consultative services to local community groups in developing communication approaches.

Through the encouragement of dialogue and coop rative action among denominations, CORA is helping to forge new patterns of ministry and new styles of ecumenical action.







A-1 AMERICAN BAPTIST CONVENTION: Members 1969










A-4 CHRISTIAN CHURCH (DISCIPLES OF CHRIST): Members 1969















A-5 CHURCH OF GOD (ANDERSON, INDIANA): Members 1970


A-8 FRIENDS UNITED MEETING: Members 1969






A-9 LUTHERAN CHURC I IN AMERICA: Members 1970















A-10 LUTHERAN CHURCH -- MISSOURI SYNOD: Members 1969






A-12 PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN THE U.S.: Members 1969









SOUTHERN APPALACHIA: Industrialization and urbanization occurring rapidly, converting the old agricultural economy into a new industrial one.








C-3 TOPOGRAPHICAL MAP






