ABSTRACT

This survey provides current data for school directors and administrators to examine the policies of compensation for professional personnel in the suburban Philadelphia area. The report contains three sections: a) salaries of teachers, b) salaries of instructional specialists, and c) salaries of administrative and supervisory personnel. Mean salaries of classroom teachers in the reporting districts of the Philadelphia area range from \$10,750 to \$8,575 depending on the district and the qualifications of the teacher. Approximately 25 percent of all teachers hold advanced degrees, and the median salary of all teachers in the sample is \$9,710. Salaries of administrators and directors range from \$9,928 to \$35,000 depending on the position. The problems and confusions of the wage-price freeze have created tensions between school districts and their employees. Further study of the situation will hopefully lead to a sound compensation program that will effectively attract and maintain an adequate and qualified staff of competent personnel. INTRODUCTION

The superintendents in Group B of the Philadelphia Suburban School Study Council recently decided to undertake a survey of compensation for professional personnel in their districts. This report is the result of that survey. For the past ten years, a similar study has been conducted annually by Council Group A as a basis for examining the compensation practices in their respective school districts. It is hoped that the school directors and administrators of Group B will find their own survey to be helpful as they analyze the important problem of compensation in their respective districts.

Obviously, compensation programs for professional personnel in our schools are integrally related to the entire complex of financial factors that affect all communities. The problems and confusion caused nationally by the recent wage-price freeze have compounded the tensions between school districts and their employees in Pennsylvania that followed the passage of Act 195. The latter was a major turning point in these relations, and its effects have yet to be fully measured. It is evident that those responsible for the control of schools are confronted with a highly difficult challenge in developing a sound compensation program that will be effective in attracting and maintaining an adequate and well-balanced staff of qualified and competent personnel to serve the children in their communities.

The Study Council gratefully acknowledges the work of David A. Johnston and Richard Shupp, who originated the survey for Group A in 1960. SALARIES OF TEACHERS

PART I

TEACHERS' SALARIES

Median salaries of classroom teachers in the thirteen reporting districts of the Philadelphia Suburban School Study Council (Group B) range from \$10,750 in the highest-ranking district, to \$8,575 in the lowest-ranking district. (FIGURE 7)

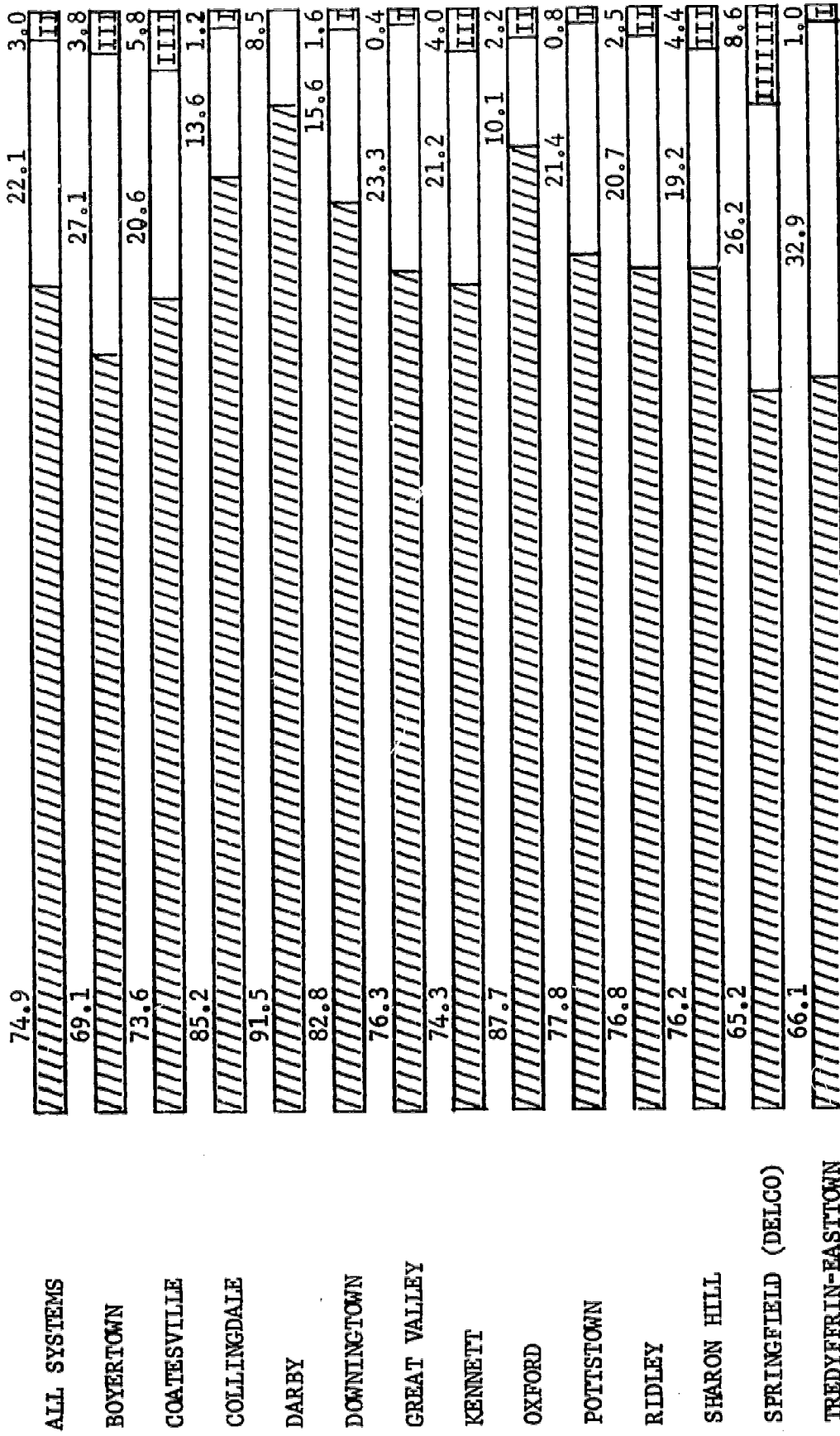
Median salaries of teachers vary with educational qualifications. (FIGURE 7) Approximately 25% of all teachers hold advanced degrees and credits. Salary differentials also relate to the greater length of service of teachers with advanced degrees (FIGURE 6)

More than 45% of the teachers in the Group B districts have taught for fewer than five years (FIGURE 2); one teacher in five has taught for more than fifteen years.

The median salary of all teachers in the sample is \$9,710.

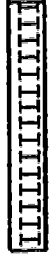
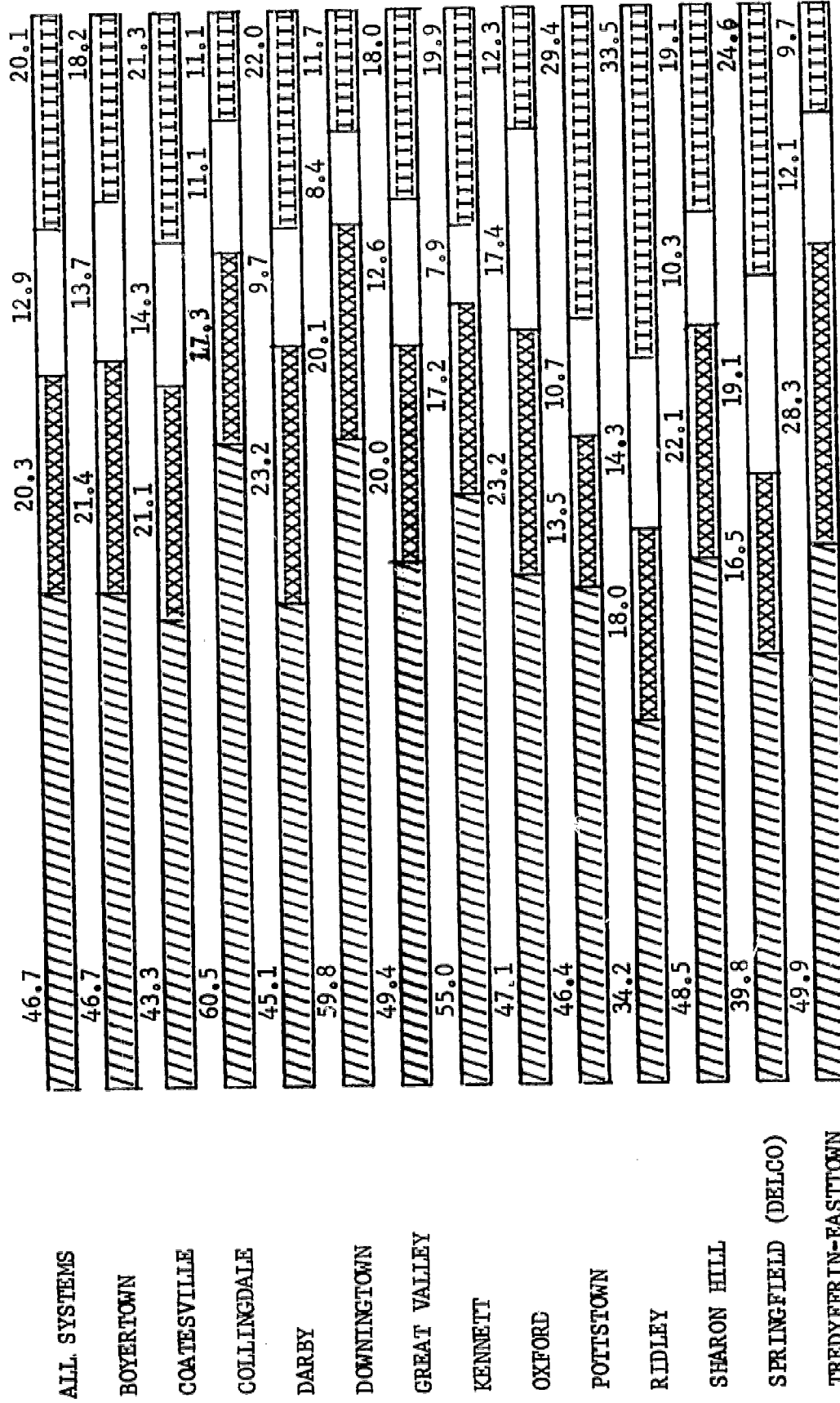

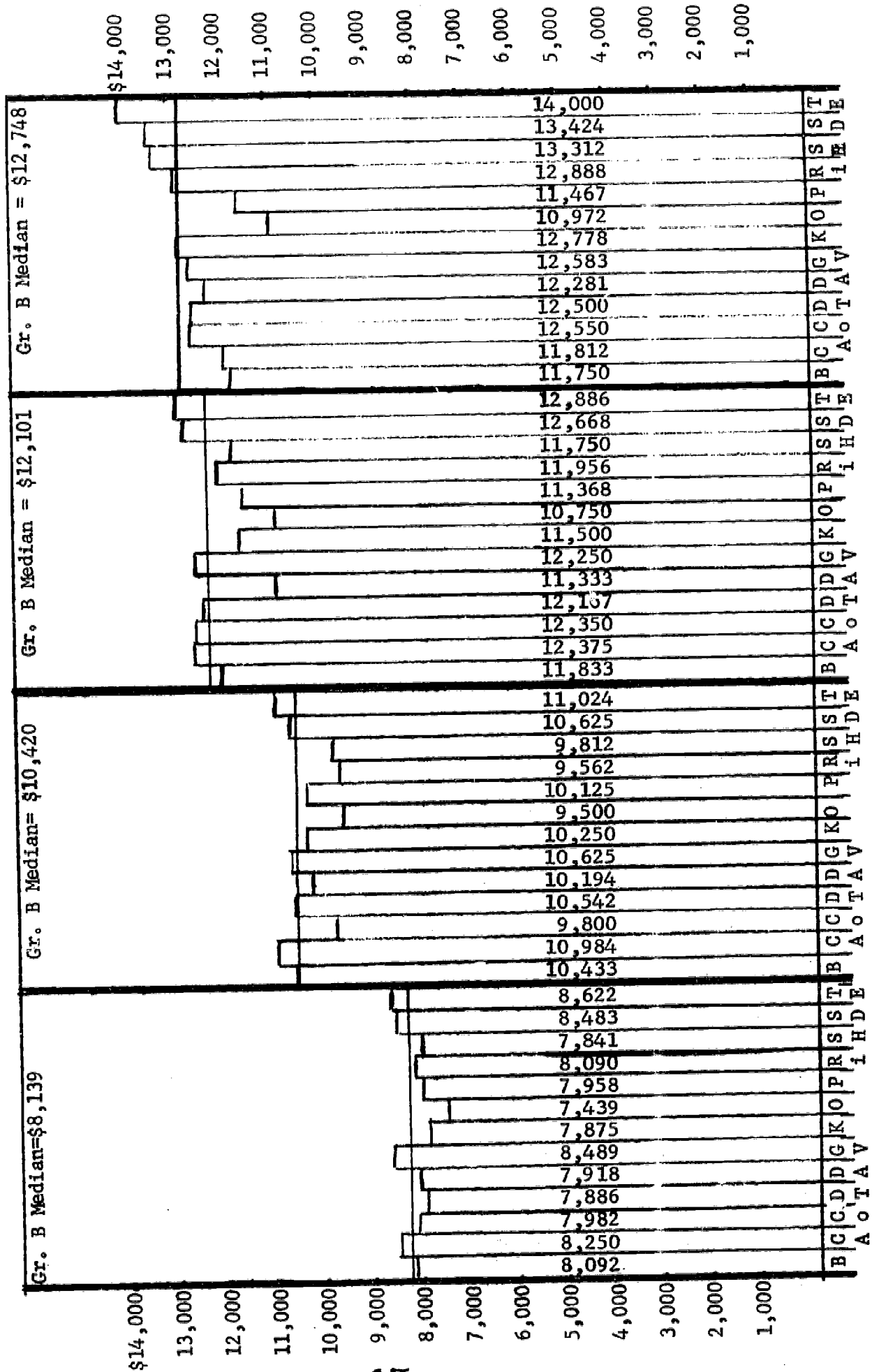

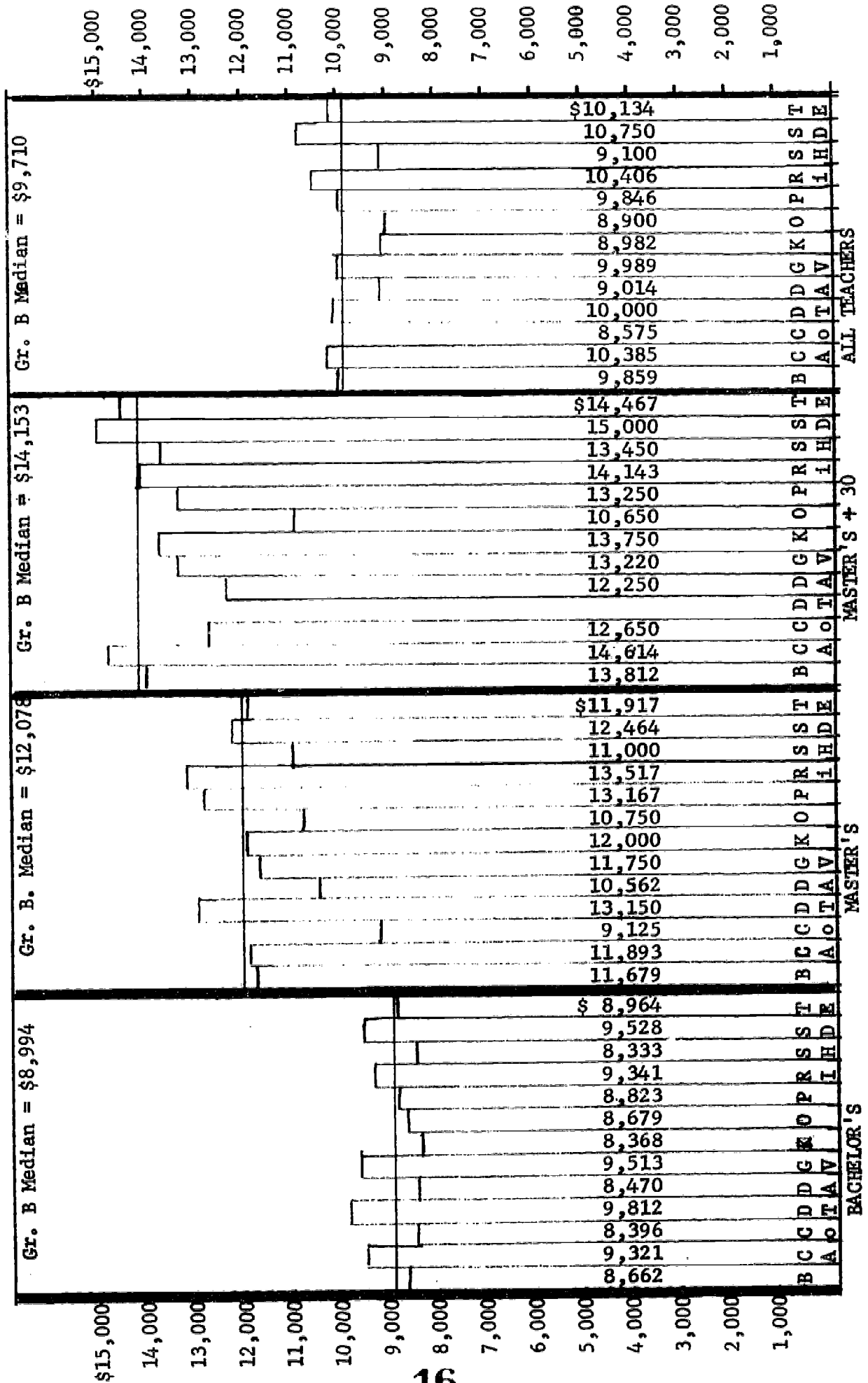
