ABSTRACT

This referral resource directory represents a joint effort by the Division of Guidance and Testing and the Division of Drug Education, Ohio Department of Education. It is intended primarily for use by school counselors and other school personnel who are aware of the referral needs of youth. A subsequent goal is to foster increased coordination and exchange of information about services provided among the various agencies. Not all agencies listed are specifically drug related; however, many are included because of their counseling services and their concern for the behavior and development of individuals. One hundred forty-four programs/agencies providing counseling, rehabilitation, and treatment services are catalogued. Each entry includes agency name, address, telephone number, contact person, services provided, geographic limitations, age limitations, fees, and special referral procedures. Appended are a description of the Ohio Development Drug Education Project and the Division of Drug Education; a bibliography of books and documents available from the local or state library; sources of additional information; and an information chart of various drugs. 

FOREWORD

This referral resource directory represents a joint effort by the Division of Guidance and Testing, and the Division of Drug Education, of the Department of Education. Intended primarily for use by school counselors and other school personnel who are aware of the referral needs of youth, this directory lists those agencies that responded to our request for descriptive information of their services.

It is hoped that the entire school staff will be informed about the availability of this directory, for easy access whenever referral needs arise. It is further hoped that an awareness of the resources available will diminish the possibility of anyone over-extending himself beyond his area of competency, in working with drug related problems.

Many of the agencies listed welcome the opportunity to work cooperatively with the schools. It is suggested that educators who are interested in developing such a working relationship between the school and community agency contact the respective agency to further explore areas which may be mutually benefiting.

A subsequent goal of this directory is to foster increased coordination and exchange of information about services provided among the various agencies. It must be noted that although agencies are listed alphabetically by county, the location of an agency in one county often represents the efforts of surrounding counties. Similarly, the fact that one county may not have any or few resources listed does not necessarily imply services are not provided for the residents of such counties. Occasionally, the services of agencies encompass areas not consistent with county boundaries.

Inclusion in this directory does not imply endorsement by the State Department of Education, nor is exclusion intended to imply judgement of service. For specific information about an agency, it is advisable to contact that agency directly. Not all agencies listed are specifically drug related; however, many such agencies have been included because of their counseling services, and their concern for the behavior and development of individuals.

We are not aware of all of the referral agencies throughout the State of Ohio. In an attempt to make any future revisions of this directory more comprehensive, we would be most appreciative of learning about those agencies which may have been inadvertently omitted.

THE OHIO DEVELOPMENTAL DRUG EDUCATION PROJECT

In the spring of 1968 the Ohio Department of Education commissioned the Educational Research Council of America to conduct a statewide Family Life Education Survey to determine the status of educational programs in the areas of drugs, alcohol and tobacco, human sexuality and aggression and violence. The data received indicated a lack of student knowledge and inadequate teacher background in these critical areas of social and educational concern. As a result of the survey, proposals were submitted and funds granted to the Dayton, Ohio, and Lima, Ohio, Public Schools to work with staff members of the Educational Research Council of America in the design and development of curricula to prevent drug, alcohol, and tobacco abuse. Work had already begun on the development of the program prior to the nationwide attention given to the problem in the spring and summer of 1969.

The drug education program developed in this project is unique in its approach to the problem of drug abuse. As a developmental program in drug education, it recognizes that taking drugs is a form of behavior. Drugs do not enter the body without action by someone. For this reason, an important part of the program deals with human behavior - why people do what they do, what causes some people to abuse drugs, and ways of solving the problems of daily living other than the abuse or misuse of drugs. The student also learns that what one wants to do with his life - his personal goals and values - has a great influence upon the methods he selects to meet the daily tasks of living and the problems that he faces as a human being. Both the complexity and the multiple causality of drug abuse are acknowledged as the student gains insight into human behavior and potential and concurrently develops a knowledge of drugs and their effects.

The Ohio Developmental Program in Drug Abuse is an extension of earlier efforts in preventive mental health pioneered by Dr. Ralph H. Ojemann, project director and director of the ERC Psychology Department. The design of the program was based on Dr. Ojemann's experience research of over the past thirty years in the field of preventive psychiatry and education in human behavior. An awareness of current research and activity in drug education was maintained through the efforts of ERC staff consultants, one of whom participated in the National Leadership Training Institute for Drug Education and served as a member of the Ohio State Training Team. Visits were made to other drug education programs, such as the Laredo Project.

As the program moves from the kindergarten to the high-school level, it draws increasingly from the areas of anthropology, physiology, history, philosophy,



sociology, and individual and social psychology to provide the student with adequate resources to encourage the selection of more effective alternatives in the solution of human problems than drug abuse or other personally or socially destructive behaviors.

The concepts of the program apply to other areas of social concern, such as aggression, violence and human sexuality, and can be integrated into existing curricular patterns. The implementation of both the concepts and the practices are economically feasible and have a considerable potential for positive effect upon other programs within the schools. Successful program implementation depends more on the training of the teacher in the adoption of the causal, humane approach to human behavior than on expensive equipment and technology.

In-service education of the teachers in this approach is strongly recommended to insure that teacher-student relationships developed in the program be open rather than closed, supportive rather than excessively critical, and based upon understanding and concern rathern than arbitrary judgmentalism and prejudice.

The materials were developed and tested at each level through the cooperative relationship between local project teachers and ERC consultant staff members. The strategies for the development of the materials have differed at each level. The junior-high materials, the first developed in the program, were characterized by the extensive use of local project teachers as writers and curriculum developers. An ERC staff consultant who had been active in national, state and local drug education programs was the primary writer for the senior-high program. It was field tested and evaluated by local project teachers. At the elementary-school level, local project teachers, other teacher consultants, and ERC staff members are cooperating in developing material and field testing.

Evaluation procedures were initiated to determine the quality and effectiveness of the program concurrently with the development of the curriculum. Experimental editions of the program prototypes contain feedback sheets so that both teachers and students can communicate their evaluations of program content and effectiveness. At each level the materials have been or are now being submitted to panels of specialists, including Drs. Charles Winick, Allan Cohen, Sam Wiggins, and Merl Bonney.

At each level performance (behavioral) objectives were used both in the development of learning activities and in the evaluation of program effectiveness. Pre- and post-testing of experimental and control groups at the junior-high and the senior-high levels has provided data for revision of the materials to be used for extensive field testing this coming school year. Pre- and post-testing of experimental and control groups will be coupled with the student and teacher feedback sheets in the evaluation of the results of the broad field testing of the program in selected Ohio schools.

Few projects have had as extensive planning, development, and field testing as the program described in the above paragraphs, and few have resulted in such close cooperation between local education agencies, the State Department of Education, and a non-profit research and development agency. The uniqueness of the program itself, its concern for the human individual and his selection of ways for more effective living, commend it for your serious consideration as a most effective means to provide the experiences and understandings necessary for dealing with the problems giving rise to and resulting from drug abuse.

THE DIVISION OF DRUG EDUCATION

The Division of Drug Education was organized in 1970 within the Ohio Department of Education, in recognition of the growing problems of drug abuse. The Division provides assistance to boards of education who, under Section 3316.60 of the Ohio Revised Code, are required to include instruction in the harmful effects, and legal restrictions against the use of drugs of abuse, alcoholic beverages, and tobacco.

The program of assistance consists of providing in-service training for school personnel; aid in developing school curricula; the provision of current listings of instructional materials and their sources of availability; and encouraging in-depth training of school personnel through programs developed in conjunction with universities and colleges and State Departments.

A State Training Team consisting of specially trained personnel has been developed to assist the Division in the provision of workshop programs of one, two, or three-day length for in-service training of school personnel. The Department has developed and distributed a series of curriculum guides embracing kindergarten through grade 12. The National Institute of Mental Health has designated the Division as a distribution center for drug abuse prevention materials developed and/or disseminated through that federal agency.

An Ad Hoc Advisory Committee of representatives of State Departments and state level agencies working in drug abuse prevention has been assembled to assist the Division and to provide an exchange of information about prevention programs. Presently, summer programs for graduate and undergraduate credit are being developed at Ohio universities and colleges to provide more extensive education and training or school personnel.
