Preface Third Edition

The Thesaurus for Exceptional Child Education, a distillation of the more comprehensive Thesaurus of ERIC Descriptors used by the Educational Resources Information Center Clearinghouses, contains indexing terms (descriptors) selected from the ERIC Thesaurus on the basis of particular need to the Clearinghouse on Exceptional Children. Descriptors selected for inclusion are those which have been found to be most applicable and necessary for indexing professional literature in the field of exceptional child education.

Refinement of the exceptional child indexing vocabulary represented by this Third Edition consisted of elimination of descriptors found to be overlapping or unnecessary and inclusion of additional ERIC descriptors found to be necessary in indexing the subject literature.

Two major goals of the Third Edition were to further clarify terminology and to provide additional cross references. Scope notes which now follow the majority of the descriptors are intended to define the descriptor as it is used in relation to exceptional child education or for indexing purposes. Extensive cross referencing among related descriptors was added to assist users in finding the most appropriate descriptors for their purposes. A general term is usually followed by cross references to more specific terms representing subcategories of the general term and to any other related descriptors.

Italicized entries preceded by an asterisk are terms which are relevant to the field of exceptional child education but which are not part of the controlled exceptional child indexing vocabulary. These terms are followed by referral to an approved descriptor which should be used in place of the asterisked term.

Suggestions regarding possible additions, deletions, or further clarification of terms are welcome and may be forwarded in written form to the CEC Information Center on Exceptional Children.
