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ABSTRACT

In fiscal year 1970, the Federal Government spent \$3,668 billion to aid colleges and universities throughout the nation as compared to \$3,782 billion in the previous year. Despite this decline in total Federal aid to higher education, the support awarded to the black college community increased 16% between fiscal years 1969 and 1970. The \$125.5 million that went to traditionally black colleges resulted from a concerted effort by Federal agencies to improve support to these institutions. This document presents discussions of the Administration's policy, institutional assistance, student assistance, distribution of Federal funds, and Federal agency support for fiscal year 1970. In addition, tables are given showing federal funds obligated by agency and program, and black institutions receiving federal funds by state, institution, agency, and program source. {Author/HS}

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## **FOREWORD**

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## INTRODUCTION

In fiscal year 1970, the Federal Government spent \$3.668 billion to aid colleges and universities throughout the Nation as compared to \$3.782 billion in the previous year.<sup>1</sup> Despite this decline in total Federal aid to higher education, the support awarded to the black college community increased 16 percent between fiscal years 1969 and 1970.

The \$125.5 million that went to traditionally black colleges accounted for 3.4 percent of all Federal aid to higher education. In 1969 these institutions received only 2.9 percent of the total Federal support.<sup>2</sup> This increase in the proportion of aid going to black colleges resulted from a concerted effort by Federal agencies to improve support to these institutions.

### *The Administration's Policy*

President Nixon gave leadership to this effort. On August 10, 1970, in a letter to Dr. Herman R. Branson, president of the National Association for Equal Opportunity in Higher Education, President Nixon said:

The present financial plight of many of our small and the overwhelming majority of our predominantly black colleges clearly demonstrates to me that the Federal Government must strengthen its role in support of these institutions.

I have committed this Administration to the vigorous support of equal educational opportunity. At the same time, we are encouraging excellence in all of our institutions of higher education. I am confident that all Americans will richly benefit from this course of action.

In accordance with this policy, Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare Elliot L. Richardson announced that his Department would provide a supplementary allocation of \$29 million in Office of Education funding for black colleges.

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<sup>1</sup> Private market loans for construction and student support, regardless of Federal subsidies or guarantees, are not included in the 1970 total nor in the 1969 total. <sup>2</sup> Total support to black colleges for fiscal year 1969 has been revised to \$107.9 million. A common base has now been established, and comparability for future reports assured.

On February 22, 1971, President Nixon devoted a section of his Message to Congress on Higher Education to "Special Help for Black Institutions." Because of its policy significance, the section is reproduced here:

Colleges and universities founded for black Americans are an indispensable national resource. Despite great handicaps they educate substantial numbers of black Americans, thereby helping to bring about a more rapid transition to an integrated society.

Black institutions are faced with an historic inadequacy of resources. To help these institutions compete for students and faculty with other colleges and universities, the combined help of government at all levels, other institutions of higher learning, and the private sector must be summoned.

This Administration has taken a series of actions to assist these institutions:

- The proposed reform of student aid programs, with its concentration of funds on the neediest students, would significantly aid students at black institutions.
- The National Foundation for Higher Education will direct special efforts toward meeting the needs of black colleges.
- Additional funds for black colleges have been requested for fiscal year 1972 in programs administered by the U.S. Office of Education, the National Science Foundation, and the Department of Agriculture.

The impact of these initiatives will not be fully realized until the process of obligating the funds to colleges and universities is complete. Subsequent surveys in this series will reflect the impact of these efforts to increase the Federal outlay to black institutions.

#### *Institutional Assistance*

Before the passage of the Higher Education Act (HEA) of 1965, with its landmark programs for undergraduate student aid, most black colleges received negligible support from the Federal Government. Since 1965, Federal support to these institutions has improved markedly, although centered largely in student aid. While student aid is essential, it does not contribute to institutional development.

The financial problems which beset American higher education today fall with particular force upon the traditionally black colleges and universities. Mostly private, these institutions generally

lack large endowments. They rely heavily upon student tuition as a primary source of income. Because tuition seldom pays more than half of the educational costs, black colleges—especially the private ones—must locate other sources which provide funds for institutional development. This need is acute in view of the rise in academic salaries, construction costs, and operating expenses.

The major source of institutional funds comes from the Office of Education's program for strengthening developing institutions. This program is the first designed specifically to help institutions, like the traditionally black colleges, which have had limited access to other sources of funds for institution building. During fiscal year 1970, this program allocated 57 percent of its support to black colleges.

Research and development (R&D) grants frequently contribute to institution building through the supplementary payments which accompany the grants. With few exceptions, black institutions have not participated appreciably in the post-World War II boom of Federal scientific research grants and contracts. In fiscal year 1970, only 0.3 percent of R&D funds went to black colleges. This is explained by the fact that the black colleges are largely undergraduate, and few have the laboratories, specialized facilities, and research personnel which enable them to compete against more developed institutions for Federal research and development contracts. This should change as graduate departments and facilities develop. Currently only two black universities, Howard and Atlanta, offer the Ph.D. Fifteen traditionally black institutions offer master's degrees, but primarily in teacher education.

#### *Student Assistance*

A large proportion of black college students depend upon student aid. The 1970 census revealed that median family income for whites is \$10,236, but only \$6,279 for blacks. Thus, it is no surprise to learn from the American Council on Education that 78 percent of black college freshmen in fall 1970 came from families with less than \$10,000 annual income in contrast to 38 percent of all other American college freshmen.

In fiscal year 1970, black colleges received 45 percent of their Federal support in the form of student assistance compared to 21 percent for colleges and universities in general. (See figures A and B, page 5.) Most of these funds came from three programs administered by the Office of Education (OE):



- Educational opportunity grants totaling \$17.3 million assisted approximately 31,000 students enrolled in some 100 black colleges, or 18 percent of the estimated black college enrollment of 177,000. Overall, educational opportunity grants assisted 3.8 percent of the 7.9 million students enrolled in 2,500 colleges and universities.<sup>9</sup>
- College work-study grants totaling \$18.9 million supported 49,671 black college students—29 percent of the black college enrollment. Work-study grants were awarded to 375,000 students, or 4.7 percent of the Nation's college population.
- National defense student loans provided \$11.2 million to 43,399 students enrolled in black colleges—26 percent of the black college enrollment. Nationally, the program aided 481,970 students or 6 percent of all college and university students.

*Distribution of Federal Funds*

Well over a third of the Federal funds awarded to the traditionally black colleges and universities, or some \$45 million, went to 10 institutions:

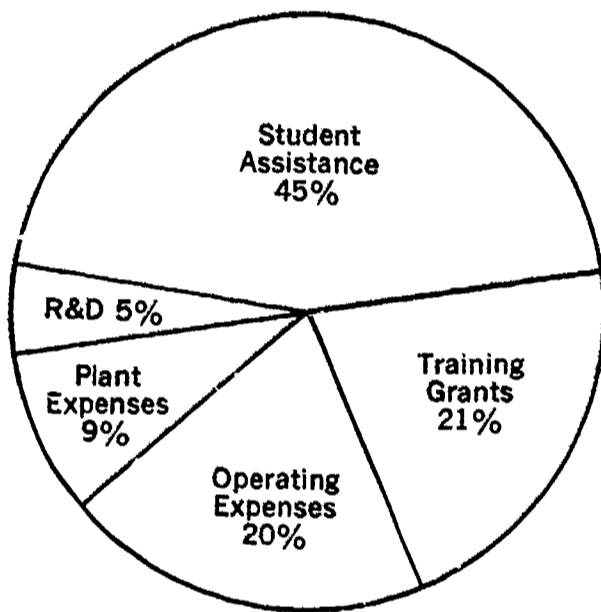

Fiscal Year 1970**

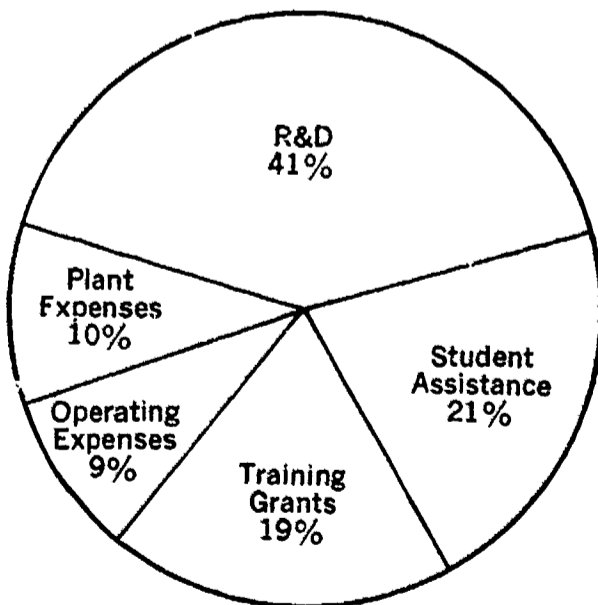

Howard University, Federal City College, and the Washington Technical Institute—all in Washington, D.C.—were chartered by Congress. Howard, founded in 1867, has received a congressional appropriation annually since 1928. The 1970 appropriation totaled \$61,969,000. This amount is excluded from the survey data because it is categorized as endowment income rather than programmatic support. Federal City College, created as a land-grant institution, and the Washington Technical Institute were chartered in 1966.

#### *Federal Agency Support*

Twelve of the 18 Federal agencies reporting assistance to institutions of higher education increased funds to traditionally black colleges, a net rise of \$17.7 million from 1969 to 1970. The bulk of the 1970 funds—about 80 percent—came from the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare (HEW). Within this department, the Office of Education (OE) accounted for 68 percent of all Federal aid to the black college community. (See appendix A.)

In dollar terms, HEW provided \$2.3 billion to all colleges and universities, with more than \$100 million of this amount allocated to black institutions. The Office of Education contributed \$896 million to higher education of which almost 10 percent, or \$85.2 million, went to black colleges. In fact, OE increased its support to black institutions by more than \$7 million despite a reduction of \$361 million in its 1970 budget for higher education.

Since most black colleges are liberal arts institutions, they qualify most readily for those assistance programs administered by human resource agencies. These agencies provided an average of 5 percent of their higher education budgets to black colleges and universities. Outside HEW, the largest contributors were the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), \$10 million, and the Office of Economic Opportunity, \$5.2 million. The Department of Labor provided \$1.5 million. Large proportions of the educational budgets of the National Endowment for the Arts and the National Endowment for the Humanities were directed to black colleges, although the amounts contributed were relatively small.

Science-oriented mission agencies allocated smaller proportions of their total educational budgets to black colleges, but the contribution was appreciable in dollar terms. Thus, the National Science Foundation awarded almost \$3.2 million, and the Department of Agriculture awarded \$1.1 million to black institutions of higher education.

Several agencies took notable strides in expanding black college participation in their programs. Significant gains were made by the Atomic Energy Commission, the Departments of Agriculture (USDA), Commerce, Housing and Urban Development, the Interior, Justice, Transportation, and the Peace Corps. For example, Agriculture has placed a USDA liaison staff member, fully financed, at each of the 16 black land-grant institutions and at Tuskegee to build and strengthen cooperative programs and to serve better the people of the respective States. Despite limited relationships with universities, other agencies have begun intensive planning for ways to involve black institutions in their activities. Among these are the Department of State and the Agency for International Development.

The policy decisions of the Federal Government were reinforced by the private sector during the year. The Carnegie Commission on Higher Education published the most extensive report, *From Isolation to Mainstream*, with its companion study, *Between Two Worlds* by Frank Bowles and Frank A. DeCosta. The Ford Foundation published *Minority Access to College* by Fred E. Crossland.

A primary fact emerging from these reports was the extent of the educational deficit incurred by institutions which have traditionally enrolled large proportions of disadvantaged minority students. The academic handicaps which have been imposed on minority students in the past pose expensive challenges to colleges. The extent of compensatory education required varies by individual, but the institutional costs are nonetheless substantial. This is a critical factor which drives efforts to improve funding for institutions whose role includes a high level of minority participation.

Efforts in the last 5 years by the United States to promote educational opportunities for minority citizens have been productive. Recent statistics indicate that the proportion of black Americans attending college in the United States in 1970 was three times the proportion of all eligible students attending college in Europe. However, this achievement carries concomitant responsibilities. The sociocultural background of minority students is different from that of the cultural and socioeconomic majority. The special response to this unique background places heavy burdens on black colleges and universities which must design programs to serve their students.

Strengthening the educational structure of an institution cannot be accomplished by student aid which pays only part of the oper-

ating expenses. This is not to say that student assistance should be supplanted; it must be supplemented. It is to this end that President Nixon has directed the expansion of Federal programs designed for faculty and curriculum development.

The significance of black institutions of higher education to American cultural pluralism is great. They are more integrated in terms of national student bodies than traditionally white institutions. Black campuses enroll an average of 8 percent white students, compared to 4 percent black students on white campuses. These colleges nonetheless provide a critical focus of black leadership and identity. The process of intellectual development for young black Americans is allied with unique cultural norms on a predominantly black campus. No other educational institution is so well prepared to discharge this function.

#### *Scope and Limitations of Data*

Total Federal funding is reported by educational program and its contribution to each traditionally black institution of higher education. The categories of support were reduced to five major components:

- Student Assistance — A loan or grant program designed primarily to defray students' personal educational expenses.
- Training Grants — A grant provided to train selected students in an academic discipline.
- Plant Expenses — Support for construction and equipment at institutions of higher education.
- Operating Expenses — A grant for institutional program development costs other than student aid or construction.
- R&D — Support for either basic or applied research.

Data were reported by 18 Federal agencies which allocated support to traditionally black colleges. The Agency for International Development was added to the 1970 survey. Two agencies, the Civil Service Commission and the Smithsonian Institution, were omitted because they do not customarily award grants to institutions of higher learning. The Department of State was not included in this survey, although its Bureau of Educational and Cul-

tural Affairs routinely involves the black colleges in programs of cross-cultural exchange and encourages these institutions to participate in international educational activities.

With the exception of the Atomic Energy Commission, which reported in terms of costs, dollar amounts represent actual obligations incurred by the agencies during the fiscal year regardless of when funds were actually expended. Obligations data include total Federal aid awarded directly to colleges and universities, including repayable Federal loans.

Excluded from this report are obligations to Federally Funded Research and Development Centers (FFRDC's). These are independent organizational units managed by universities and colleges or other nonprofit institutions which were established to meet the particular mission of a Federal agency.<sup>4</sup>

Data were provided by Federal agencies on 111 traditionally black colleges and universities enrolling 177,000 students, or approximately 2.1 percent of total college enrollment.<sup>5</sup> These institutions are listed in appendix B. No definitive listing of the entire universe can be constructed because of the pace at which these institutions are becoming integrated. Similarly, institutions enrolling a rising proportion of black students are gradually becoming predominantly black, although they were not traditionally or historically so.
