ABSTRACT

The New England Board of Higher Education conducted a salary survey among the 51 New England Junior College Council member institutions. The questionnaire sought information about salaries of selected administrators, full-time faculty, and fringe benefits for full-time faculty. Of the 35 responding colleges, 20 were public and 15 were private colleges. Minimum, maximum, and mean salaries are provided for the various administrative and faculty positions at public and private colleges as well as the frequency distributions of these salaries. A summary of the fringe benefits includes information on retirement plans, medical plans, life insurance, long-term disability protection, Workmen's Compensation, and "cash tuition" for children. INTRODUCTION

At the request of the Executive Committee of the New England Junior College Council (NEJCC), NEBHE recently conducted a salary survey among the 51 NEJCC member institutions. Three types of information were sought:

- salaries of selected administrators;
- salaries of full-time faculty; and
- fringe benefits for full-time faculty.

A questionnaire requesting this information (Appendix A) was mailed to the NEJCC membership on April 25, 1972, along with a cover letter from NEJCC President Clifton W. Emery explaining the purpose of the survey. A reminder was mailed on May 15, 1972.

RESPONDENTS

By June 5, 1972, a total of 37 (73%) of the NEJCC members had responded to the survey:

Since St. Thomas Seminary is staffed by diocesan priests who do not receive compensation for their educational services per se, it was excluded from the survey. Similarly, the Junior College of Connecticut, a division of the University of Bridgeport, was excluded because most of its faculty and staff have University-wide responsibility. Of the 35 responding colleges which were included in the survey, 20 were public and 15 private colleges. (See Appendix B)

ADMINISTRATIVE SALARIES

Thirty-four of the 35 colleges included in this survey provided data on the salaries of their administrative officers in 1971-72. (The remaining college has a policy against releasing salary data on individuals.)

Table 1 presents a summary of the results of this portion of the survey by control of institution. In addition, Tables 2 and 3 provide frequency distributions of the salaries paid those administrative officers reported by 5 or more public or private institutions respectively.

FACULTY SALARIES

Useable 1971-72 faculty salary data were provided by 33 of the responding colleges. For purposes of this report, each college included was assigned an arbitrary number in order to preserve the confidentiality of individual salaries at individual colleges.

Tables 4 and 5 present the data provided by the 19 public colleges for faculty on 9-10 and 11-12 month contracts respectively. Also shown by rank are the maximum and minimum salaries reported by any institution and the weighted average salary* for the faculty reported at all of the colleges.

^{*} The weighted average for a given rank is derived by summing the dollar salary outlay in that rank (average salary multiplied by the number of faculty) at all of the colleges and then dividing that sum by the total number of faculty reported in that rank at all of the colleges.

Tables 6 and 7 present the above information for 9-10 and 11-12 month contract faculty respectively at the 8 private colleges with academic rank. Table 8 presents this information for the 6 private colleges without academic rank.

PART 1 - SALARIES OF SELECTED ADMINISTRATORS, 1971-72

Report the annual salaries of administrators who are employed on a full-time basis for at least two semesters, three quarters, or two trimesters of the 1971-72 academic year. If an administrator is on sabbatical leave, report his regular salary. If an administrator contributes his services, write "CS" in the "SALARY" column.

Salaries should be reported in strict accordance with both level and function as indicated by the position titles. However, positions in which the level is designated as "Manager" or "Officer" may be substituted for "Director" if these terms are interchangeable at your institution. Do not report assistants, associates, or deputies to any of the positions.
