ABSTRACT

This publication is the result of a detailed task analysis study of the ornamental horticulture industry in New York State. Nine types of horticulture businesses identified were: (1) retail florists, (2) farm and garden supply store, (3) landscape services, (4) greenhouse production, (5) nursery production, (6) turf production, (7) arborist services, (8) wholesale florists, and (9) golf courses. Specific suggested uses of the task data in this publication include: (1) describing the nature and requirements of tasks to prospective employees who express an interest in horticulture, (2) assisting prospective employees to realistically assess their qualification for and interest in, the performance of horticulture tasks, (3) guiding worker recruitment from the employment service, and/or other sources based on tasks to be performed on the job, and (4) providing a direct basis for development of performance objectives. Task statements are provided for each of the nine areas. Related documents are available as VT 016 042 and VT 016 114 in this issue. (GEB)

HOW TO USE THIS PUBLICATION

INTRODUCTION

The data in this publication is the product of a detailed task analysis study¹ of the ornamental horticulture industry in New York State. Nine types of horticulture businesses were identified in the study:

1. Retail florist
2. Farm and garden supply store
3. Landscape services
4. Greenhouse production
5. Nursery production
6. Turf production (sod farms)
7. Arborists services
8. Wholesale florists
9. Golf courses (public and private)

A selected sample of employers in each type of business was interviewed. These employers provided data as to which tasks were performed and the conditions of performance. The task information presented is the modal or most common response received from the employers interviewed.

SUGGESTED USES

The task data in this publication have a data vintage base of 1971. Use of the data should, therefore, incorporate procedures to provide for any changes in tasks and/or task conditions that might have occurred due to changing technology in the horticulture industry.

The suggested uses for the task data are as follows:

1. Describing to prospective employees who express an interest in horticulture the nature and requirements of horticulture tasks.
2. Assisting prospective employees to realistically assess their qualification to, and interest in, performing horticulture tasks.

3. Guiding worker recruitment from the Employment Service and/or other sources based on tasks to be performed on the job.
4. Providing a direct basis for development of performance objectives for:
 - a. Employee in-service training programs.
 - b. Pre-service educational programs preparing workers for employment in the horticulture industry.
5. Determining job opportunities for handicapped and/or disadvantaged persons interested in horticulture work through identification of tasks they may be able to perform.
6. Allocating job assignments to employees based on the nature of the tasks to be performed and employee qualifications. Situations which may indicate the need to assess allocation of job assignments include:
 - a. Where employee efficiency is limited due to task assignments.
 - b. Changes in tasks and/or the task conditions due to changing industry technology and/or business structure.

PROCEDURES FOR USE

Turn first to the appropriate type of horticulture business. The tasks, and conditions for task performance in that business area are listed by logical groupings or "functions" (e.g. sales, design, management).

The task performance conditions are indicated by headings at the top of the page. The conditions are keyed to individual tasks by a capital letter which indicates that the condition applies to the performance of the task. Where no capital letter is present, this indicates that the condition is not applicable to the task. For example, for task 1001 in the retail florist business area, the blank under "Equipment" indicates that no equipment is involved in the task. The "L" under "strength" indicates light (up to 20 pounds) lifting is entailed in performing the task.

Some tasks were found to be common to more than one type of horticulture business although conditions for task performance may vary. These common tasks may be identified by the last three digits of the task number (in column at left of task statement) which remain the same for a given task in all of the business areas.

Tasks keyed with an asterisk (*) were reported to be performed by less than a majority of employers interviewed in the business area. A "+" is used to indicate tasks added by one or more employers. These tasks, therefore, were rated only by employers by which they were added.
