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ABSTRACT

Specific data relating to public expenditure and employment for the criminal justice system in the United States are presented in tabular form in this annual survey report. Comprehensive data are supplied in 29 tables for the Federal Government, each of the 50 state governments, city, county, and other local subdivisions of government. Data are shown for the 15 largest standard metropolitan statistical areas. Developed from state estimates of expenditure and employment and a stratified random sample of 6,226 local governments, the report used responses to a special mail canvass questionnaire and field compilation. Major categories of activity covered in the tables are: (1) Police Protection, (2) Judicial, (3) Prosecution, (4) Indigent Defense, and (5) Correctional. Local governments continue to spend more than the Federal and state governments combined for all criminal justice activities. (AG)



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INTRODUCTION

This report presents public expenditure and employment data on criminal justice activities in the United States. Specific data are supplied for the Federal Government, each of the 50 State governments, the aggregate local level of government within each State, each of the 128 counties with a 1970 population of 250,000 or more as well as the 153 cities with a 1970 population of 100,000 or more. In addition, data are shown for the 15 largest standard metropolitan statistical areas. The expenditure data are for fiscal 1969-70 and the employment data are for October 1970.

There are five major categories of criminal justice activity covered in this report: "Police Protection," "Judicial," "Prosecution," "Indigent Defense," and "Correctional," with a residual sixth category, "Other Criminal Justice" shown in some tables. Other tables show a further breakdown of the "Police Protection," "Judicial," and "Correctional" sectors for the 50 States and the large county and city governments.

The definition of concepts, categories, and terms are covered at the end of this report.

EXPENDITURE AND EMPLOYMENT BY LEVEL OF GOVERNMENT

Local governments continue to spend more than State and Federal Governments combined for all criminal justice activities. Table A shows that local governments accounted for 63.6 percent of all direct criminal justice expenditures (\$8,571 million), while State governments contributed 25.0 percent and the Federal Government 11.4 percent. However, when each activity is examined separately, the proportion accounted for by the different levels of government varies throughout the criminal justice system.

Three of the activities, police protection, judicial activities, and prosecution, are supported mainly by the local governments which accounted

for over half the total amount expended for each of the activities. Local governments expended three-fourths (74.9 percent) of the total amount spent on police protection, almost two-thirds (65.5 percent) of the total for judicial activities, and 58.1 percent of the total for prosecution.

The only activity in which the Federal Government expends more than either the state or local governments is indigent defense, (54.6 percent of the total). The remaining funds are contributed mainly by the local level of government (36.2 percent of the total).

Expenditures for the remaining activity, corrections, are concentrated at the state level whose share is 61.6 percent of the total. This large expenditure reflects the States' responsibility for the long-term confinement and rehabilitation of offenders. The Federal Government contributes very little (4.8 percent of the total) to the field of corrections while the local governments accounted for one-third of the total (33.5 percent).

Relationships similar to those found for expenditures by the different levels of government, also apply to employment figures. According to table B, more than 70 percent of the total full-time equivalent criminal justice employees of all governments (774,751 employees) are employed by local governments. However, as in the case of expenditure, the distribution of employees at each level of government varies for each activity.

In general, the level of government which spends the largest amount of the total expenditures for an activity also employs the greatest number of workers for that activity. For example, local governments accounted for over half of the total amount expended on police protection, judicial activities, and prosecution and they employed 80.5 percent, 73.5 percent, and 64.5 percent, respectively, of all employees in each of these

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activities. Also, since correction expenditures are concentrated at the State level, 61.0 percent of all correctional employees are found at the State level government. However, indigent defense activities are an exception to this pattern, due to the use of private counsel on a fee basis. Such fees are reflected in the expenditure amounts though private counsel is not included in public employee counts. Therefore, table B shows that local governments employ 82.2 percent of all indigent defense employees.

The Federal Government (Tables 1, 2, and 4)

In fiscal year 1969-70 the United States government expended \$1,032 million for all criminal justice activities, an increase of \$203 million or 19.7 percent over the previous fiscal year. This amount was 0.6 percent of the 1970 Federal total general expenditure of \$167 billion.

Total full-time equivalent Federal employment in October 1970 was 2,810,125. Of this number, 59,355, or 2.1 percent, were employed in criminal justice activities. This represents an increase of 3,870, or 6.5 percent, over the previous fiscal year. Payroll amounts for these employees totaled \$68 million; up \$6.1 million, or 9.0 percent, over October 1969.

State Governments (Tables 3 and 5-14)

State government total general expenditure in fiscal year 1969-70 was \$78 billion. Of this amount, \$2,268 million, or 2.9 percent, was expended on criminal justice activities. This represents an increase of \$374 million, or 16.5 percent, over the previous fiscal year.

The corrections field continues to be the area where the most money is spent (48.7 percent), followed by police protection (32.7 percent), judicial activities (12.9 percent), prosecution (3.7 percent), other related criminal justice (1.5 percent), and indigent defense activities (0.5 percent). This is explained by the fact that traditionally the State governments have had the primary responsibility for the long-term confinement and rehabilitation of offenders, but have conducted other criminal justice activities on a smaller scale.

Within the correctional field, States as a whole spent the greatest portion of their money on the operation and maintenance of their institutions. Of the \$1,104 million spent on corrections, \$795 million (72.0 percent) was for the operation of institutions. Lesser amounts were spent for capital outlay, \$121 million (11.0 percent); \$90 million (8.1 percent) for probation, parole, and pardon activities; \$39 million (3.5 percent) for administration; and \$6 million (0.6 percent) for miscellaneous correctional activities. Intergovernmental payments amounted to \$53 million, or 4.8 percent, of the total. These payments are made for activities such as the transportation and boarding of prisoners by local governments.

State expenditure for police protection activities amount to \$741 million. Of this sum, \$634 million, or 85.6 percent, went for current operation. Capital outlay expenditure amounted to \$55 million (7.4 percent), with \$52 million (7.0 percent) for intergovernmental payments.

Judicial expenditure at the State level continues to be concentrated in the operation of the major trial courts (i.e., courts of general jurisdiction, including both civil and criminal activities). In some States, the State government has financial responsibility for all major trial courts, while in other States, these courts are financed on a shared basis with the State government paying all or part of the judges' salaries and the local government financing the remainder of the operating expenses. In another type of arrangement, the State government operates the major trial courts and assesses the local governments for reimbursement. In total, the operation of these courts cost the State governments \$141 million which was 48.1 percent of the \$293 million spent on State judicial activities. The remaining State expenditure for judicial activities was as follows: Other courts, \$44 million (15.0 percent); miscellaneous, \$35 million (12.0 percent); courts of last resort, \$30 million (10.1 percent); intermediate appellate courts, \$23 million (8.0 percent); intergovernmental payments, \$10 million (3.5 percent); capital outlay, \$7 million (2.5 percent); and law libraries, \$2 million (0.8 percent).

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Total full-time equivalent State employment in October 1970 was 2,301,963. Of this number, 172,241 or 7.5 percent, were employed in criminal justice activities. This represents an increase of 6.9 percent over the previous October. Of that number, 90,334 (52.4 percent) were employed in corrections, with 55,846 (32.4 percent) in police protection, 18,464 (10.7 percent) in judicial activities, 6,780 (4.0 percent) in prosecution, 545 (0.3 percent) in indigent defense, and 272 (0.2 percent) in other related criminal justice activities.

State payrolls for criminal justice activities in October 1970, totaled \$134 million, an increase of 13.9 percent over October 1969. Corrections personnel received \$64 million (47.4 percent of the total) in salaries and wages. Police protection personnel received \$43 million (32.2 percent); judicial personnel, \$20 million (15.0 percent); prosecution personnel, \$6 million (4.8 percent); indigent defense personnel, \$663 thousand (0.5 percent); and other related personnel, \$222 thousand (0.1 percent).

Local Governments in the 15 Largest SMSA's (Tables 15 and 16)

For the first time, comprehensive data on all criminal justice expenditure and employment of all local governments within the 15 largest standard metropolitan statistical areas are presented in total and for each of the SMSA's, for each of 67 component county areas, and for 45 large county governments and 31 major city governments in these 15 SMSA's. County area data include figures for the county governments and for all other units of local government within the county. Additional data for the large county and city governments appear in tables 17-26. The Boston SEA (State Economic Area rather than SMSA) is shown due to a difference from the general SMSA concept in New England, where town areas (rather than county areas) are used in defining SMSA's.

The Nation's 15 largest SMSA's expended \$2,732 million for criminal justice activities in

fiscal year 1969-70. Thus, one-half of the Nation's total local criminal justice expenditures were expended by city and county governments in areas where only 28.5 percent of the United States population resides (see table C). The percent of the total local criminal justice expenditures spent by local governments in the 15 largest SMSA's for the component parts of the criminal justice system are as follows: 50 percent for police protection activities, 45 percent for judicial activities, 39 percent for prosecution activities, 49 percent for indigent defense, and 57 percent for correctional activities.

Selected County Governments (Tables 17-21)

The Nation's 128 largest county governments expended \$1,192 million for criminal justice activities in fiscal year 1969-70, or 11.8 percent of the \$10,067 million total general expenditure. Police protection expenditure comprises 33.5 percent of the total criminal justice expenditures by these counties. County expenditures for the other components of the criminal justice system were: \$359 million (30.2 percent) for judicial activities; \$325 million (27.3 percent) for corrections; \$88 million (7.4 percent) for prosecution; \$20 million (1.7 percent) for indigent defense; and \$90 thousand for other related criminal justice activities.

Selected City Governments (Tables 22-26)

Total criminal justice expenditure in the 153 largest cities amounted to \$2,376 million in fiscal year 1969-70. This represents 13.0 percent of the \$18,350 million total general expenditures of these cities.

Police protection accounted for \$1,908 million, or 80.3 percent of the total. Lesser amounts were spent on corrections, \$207 million (8.7 percent); judicial activities, \$185 million (7.8 percent); prosecution, \$69 million (2.9 percent); and indigent defense, \$7 million (0.3 percent).

Readers should note that in last year's report particular attention was given to 11 "special status" cities in terms of their judicial expenditures. That table has been eliminated this year,

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as data for the cities are given in tables 22 and 23, but not in the same detail. These cities are either independent, being entirely outside any county area, or operate wholly or in part as consolidated city-counties. They are: Baltimore, Boston, Denver, Honolulu, New Orleans, New York, Norfolk, Philadelphia, St. Louis, San Francisco, and Washington, D.C. Data for three additional cities of this type are also included in this report. They are Indianapolis, Jacksonville, and Nashville.

SURVEY METHODOLOGY - SOURCES AND LIMITATIONS OF THE DATA

General

The data presented in this report were gathered in connection with the 1969-70 annual survey of governmental finance and the October 1970 annual survey of public employment. The recurrent series of Bureau of the Census annual publications on governmental finance (series GF) and public employment (series GE) which result from these surveys, provide data on expenditure and employment, by function, including summary figures on police protection, correction, and general control which includes judicial activities.

For this report, State-by-State estimates of local government expenditure and employment for judicial, prosecution, and indigent defense activities were developed, in part from responses to a special mail canvass questionnaire and in part from field compilation. (The survey sample and collection methods are described in detail later in the text.)

The figures presented in this report differ in some cases from those previously published in the series GF or series GE reports, due to a more intensive collection procedure used for this report and to refinements of data involved.

As in previous editions of this annual series, several tables show comparisons of criminal justice expenditures and full-time equivalent employment with the total general expenditure and full-time equivalent employment for all functions of the particular government or level of government. However, in the 1968-69 edition of this report, the total general expenditure and full-time equivalent employment figures used for these comparisons excluded the education function. In this 1969-70 report, education expenditure and employment are included for these comparisons. Further, full-time equivalent employment totals for individual county governments include employees of county utility systems and dependent

school systems, and for individual city governments include all municipal functions (including those described as variable, which were excluded in the 1968-69 report).

Readers should be cautious in comparing governments, since there are various limitations on the comparability of governmental finance and employment data. For example, some State governments directly administer certain activities which elsewhere are undertaken by local governments, with or without fiscal aid. Also, the same variation in the division of responsibilities exists for counties and cities. Hence, caution should also be exercised when comparing governments at the local level. Sampling error and response error are discussed in the following section.

The available source documents did not consistently provide full itemization of expenditure or employment for the functional subcategories presented in this report. As a result, itemized breakdowns may be incomplete for particular governmental units.

Due to rounding, the detail data in some tables may not add precisely to the totals shown.

The Survey Sample

The annual surveys used to gather basic figures for this report covered the 50 state governments and a stratified random sample of 6,226 local governments. The sample panel comprised 1,858 counties, 3,576 municipalities, and 792 townships.

Coverage included all counties having a 1960 population of 50,000 or more and all municipalities (and townships in New England and Middle Atlantic States) having a 1960 population of 25,000. A sample of the remaining smaller counties, municipalities and townships was chosen based on the relative size of annual expenditures of these units.

The particular stratified random sample selected to develop local government figures is one of all possible samples of the same size that could have been selected using the same sampling design. Estimates derived from these different samples would differ from each other, and also from a complete census using the same data collection procedures. This variation among all possible estimates is sampling error. The statistics in this report that are based wholly or partly on sample data are subject to sampling error.

The relative sample error of the State-by-State estimates of local government expenditures has been calculated at the 95 percent confidence level. For 35 States this error is 1 percent or

smaller; for 12 States it is between 1 and 2 percent; for two States the relative error is 4 percent; and for Maine it is 6 percent. The implication of this calculation is that there is a 19 out of 20 probability that the estimated total is within the stated percentages of the total that would result from a complete enumeration of local governments.

Since all State governments were included in the survey, State figures are not subject to sampling error and comprehensive State-local aggregates shown for individual States are therefore relatively more reliable than the local government estimates they include.

The estimated data are also subject to the inaccuracies in classification, response, and processing which would occur if a complete census had been conducted under the same conditions as the sample. Every effort was made to keep such errors to a minimum through care in examining, editing, and tabulating the data submitted by government officials. Followup procedures were used extensively to clarify inadequate and inconsistent survey returns.

The Survey Period

The State expenditure data presented in this report cover the fiscal year ending June 30 for all States except three whose fiscal years end as follows: New York, March 31; Texas, August 31; and Alabama, September 30. However, there are some State agencies which operate on a different fiscal year basis from the rest of the State government. In such instances, figures shown are for the agency's fiscal year that ended within the State's regular fiscal year.

For local governments, the 1969-70 fiscal years reported are those which closed between

July 1, 1969, and June 30, 1970. Most municipalities and counties ended their fiscal years either on December 31, 1969, or June 30, 1970. Employment data shown are for October 1970.

Data Collection

The survey was accomplished using two methods of data collection; field compilation and mail canvass. Trained field representatives compiled expenditure data for the 50 States, 128 largest counties, and 153 largest cities from the governments' own records, between July 1970 and June 1971. Employment data for these units were collected by mail. All other units in the sample were canvassed by mail (and, if necessary, by telephone) for expenditure and employment data, over a 3-month period beginning in mid-February 1971. Response for the field-compiled units was 100 percent. The response from the mail units was 80 percent.

The field survey efforts and mail canvass were supplemented by reference to a variety of published government documents such as budgets, financial statements, and audit reports. In some cases, such sources were the basis for breakdowns of totals into more detailed employment and expenditure figures.

The Budget of the United States Government for the Fiscal Year 1972, which presents actual data for fiscal year 1970, is the source of the Federal Government expenditure information in this report. Federal employment data were obtained from the U.S. Civil Service Commission. All Federal data were recast as necessary to conform with the Census Bureau classification of governmental statistics.

DEFINITION OF TERMS

Following is a glossary of terms, concepts, and categories, used in this publication and comments concerning their limitations.

The definitions are those applied in the field compilation of expenditure data for the 50 States, 128 largest counties, and 153 largest cities. These definitions were necessarily summarized for inclusion in the survey questionnaires sent to governments on the mail panel.

Government Expenditure

Expenditure comprises all amounts of money paid out (net of any correcting transactions) other than for retirement of debt, investment in securities, extension of loans, or agency transactions. It includes only external cash payments and excludes any intragovernmental transfers and noncash transactions, such as the provision of meals or housing of employees. It also includes any payments financed from borrowing, fund balances, intergovernmental revenue, and other current revenue. In several instances, two or more governments share the expense of maintaining a court or other criminal justice agency. In these cases, the allocable direct expenditure amount is reported for each government in the appropriate category. When a government pays pensions directly to retired employees from appropriated funds, or contributes to a retirement system which it does not administer (private or administered by another government), such payments are treated as expenditures of the government concerned. However, State government payments to State administered systems, and local government payments to locally administered systems are not considered expenditures and are not reported as such in this publication. Such transactions are displayed separately in the appropriate tables and are excluded from the various functional categories and the expenditure totals.

Expenditure is divided into two major character and object categories:

1. Direct expenditure comprises all expenditure except that classed as intergovernmental and is further divided into two principal categories:

a. Current operation which includes salaries, wages, fees and commissions, purchase of supplies, materials and contractual services.

b. Capital outlay which includes expenditure for contract or force account construction of buildings and other improvements, and for the purchase of equipment, land and existing structures.

The other object categories, interest on general debt, assistance and subsidies, and insurance benefits are not applied to specific functions.

2. Intergovernmental expenditure comprises payments from one government to another, including grants-in-aid, shared revenues, payments in lieu of taxes, and amounts for services performed by one government for another on a reimbursable or cost-sharing basis (for example, payments by one government to another for boarding prisoners).

Together, applicable direct and intergovernmental expenditure comprise the total expenditure of a government or level of government for criminal justice activities.

Total general expenditure comprises all expenditure of a government or level of government for all governmental functions, including criminal justice activities, but excluding utility system expenditure, liquor store expenditure, and insurance trust expenditure. In this report it is used for comparison with criminal justice expenditure.

Government Employment

Employees includes all persons paid for personal services performed, including all paid officials and persons in paid leave status, and excludes unpaid officials, persons on unpaid leave, pensioners and contractors. Under this definition are two classes:

1. Full-time employees which comprises all persons employed during the pay period including October 15, 1970 on a full-time basis, including all full-time temporary or seasonal workers employed during this pay period as well as persons having permanent status.

2. Part-time employees which includes persons employed during the pay period including October 15, 1970 on a basis other than full-time, and persons paid by more than one government.

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Derived from these two classes are:

Full-time equivalent employees which is the total number of employees, discounted by applying average full-time earning rates.

Payroll is gross payroll before deductions and includes salaries, wages, fees and commissions paid to employees as defined above for the month of October 1970.

Governmental Functions

Police protection is the function of enforcing the law, preserving order, maintaining traffic safety, and apprehending those who violate the law, regardless of whether these activities are performed by a police department, sheriff's department, or other agency. It includes regular police service, traffic control, traffic safety including related traffic engineering (but not highway planning and engineering), and the maintenance of buildings used exclusively for police purposes. Coroners and medical examiners are also included. Vehicular inspection, park police, marine patrols, fish and game wardens, and similar officials and activities are not included unless they are an integral part of the regular police agency.

At the county government level, both county police agencies and the sheriff's department, where such a department exists, are included in the law enforcement category, unless research has indicated that the sheriff has no substantial responsibility for law enforcement. The lack of needed information has prevented the consistent proration of expenditure or employment of the sheriff's office where that office is multifunctional.

Short-term custody and detention have traditionally been considered part of the "Police Protection" function, and in previous editions of this report were treated as such. For this edition, the concept was modified on the basis of information obtained from the 1970 National Jail Census. Data for institutions with authority to hold prisoners 48 hours or more are included in the "Correction" sector. Data for lockups holding prisoners less than 48 hours are included in the "Police Protection" sector.

Expenditure data for the subcategories "law enforcement," "police communications," "police training," and "traffic control," shown separately for States and large counties and cities in the 1968-69 edition of this report, are not shown separately in this edition due to the difficulty of accurately and uniformly segregating these items from available source documents.

Judicial activities comprise all courts and activities associated with courts (for example, law libraries, medical and social service activities, and juries). Since the names of courts with similar functions and legal jurisdiction vary from State to State and even within States, data have been categorized by type of court rather than by court name.

1. Appellate courts include courts of last resort and intermediate appellate courts.

a. Court of last resort is the court of final appeal within a State's judicial structure. It is called the "Supreme Judicial Court" in Maine and Massachusetts; the "Supreme Court of Appeals" in Virginia and West Virginia; and the "Court of Appeals" in Kentucky, Maryland, New York, and the District of Columbia (effective August 1971). In Texas and Oklahoma, two courts of last resort are authorized--the "Court of Criminal Appeals" for criminal cases and a "Supreme Court" for civil cases. In every other State the court of last resort is titled the "Supreme Court."

b. Intermediate appellate courts are those which hear cases appealed from trial court decisions prior to review by the court of last resort. In 12 of 21 States with an operating court of this type in fiscal year 1969-70, the name "Court of Appeals" is used. These States are:

Beginning with fiscal year 1969-70, Alabama implemented legislation which abolished the "Court of Appeals" and created a "Court of Civil Appeals" and a "Court of Criminal Appeals."

In Illinois and Indiana, the title is "Appellate Court"; in Maryland, "Court of Special Appeals"; in New Jersey, "Appellate Division of the Superior Court"; in New York, "Appellate Division of the Supreme Court"; in Pennsylvania, "Superior Court"; and in Texas, "Court of Civil Appeals." In Tennessee the "Court of Appeals" hears only civil cases; a separate "Court of Criminal Appeals" reviews criminal cases prior to final review by the "Supreme Court."

*Effective January 1, 1970.

The States of Oklahoma and Washington have passed legislation establishing an intermediate appellate court; however, these legislative actions were not in effect during fiscal year 1969-70.

2. Major trial courts are trial courts of general jurisdiction, the names of which vary considerably. The list below shows the title of the statewide courts of general jurisdiction in each State. Several States are listed more than once because local situations led to the development of separate courts to hear cases involving different types of pleadings. Arkansas, for example, has a "Circuit Court" system to hear cases at law and a separate "Chancery Court" system to hear pleadings in equity. In States such as New Mexico, where both the State government and the local governments share the salary expense of major trial court judges on a formula basis, but the total salary is paid through the State, an attempt was made to allocate the expenditure amount for each government. Judges paid in this manner are reported as part-time employees of each responsible government.

3. Probate courts are also called Orphans Courts, Surrogate's Courts, or Courts of Ordinary. The subject jurisdiction varies from place to place, but generally includes estate settlement, probate and contest of wills, adoption, commitment of the insane, administration of the affairs of orphans, mental defectives, and incompetents, guardianship of minors, apprenticeship, receivership, change of name proceedings, and administration of trusts. Data were tabulated only for independent probate courts. Where probate matters are handled by some other court, no attempt was made to segregate the data.

4. Juvenile and family courts deal primarily with juvenile cases and are sometimes called juvenile courts or juvenile and domestic relations courts. The jurisdiction of these courts can include crimes of persons under legal age, offenses against children, probation of minor delinquents, adoption, custody, or disposition of minor and mentally incompetent children, child neglect or abandonment, child and wife support, and paternity. Data were tabulated only for independent juvenile or family courts. Where juvenile, family, or domestic relations matters are handled by some other court, no attempt was made to segregate the data.

5. The Other courts category, used only in the State tables, includes statewide courts of limited civil and criminal jurisdiction, where they exist.

6. Other courts of restricted jurisdiction, used only in the county tables, includes municipal courts, the minor judiciary (justices of the peace, trial magistrates, and the like), traffic

courts, or other local courts of special jurisdiction. It may include probate, juvenile, and family courts as well if it was not possible to separate these items.

7. Law libraries include expenditures for separately maintained law libraries, identifiable law book expenditures for the various individual courts, or that portion of the total expenditure of the general State library made for the law library collection.

8. Miscellaneous judicial includes data on judicial councils, jury and witness fees, court administrators (in those cases where they could be identified), clerical operations, and other miscellaneous items which could not be classified under one of the other judicial sub-categories.

Prosecution includes the activities of the attorneys general and their staffs involving legal advice to the Governor, representation of the State in all law suits, and prosecution of violators of criminal law. If the State pays the salary of the county attorney, district attorney, State's attorney or their variously named equivalents, the data are included under "Prosecution" at the State level. Expenditure for both civil and criminal activities are included.

At the county and city levels this category includes locally paid prosecutors, legal advice to the chief executive of the government, and representation of the government in lawsuits.

Indigent defense includes activities associated with the right of accused persons to have legal counsel and representation, office of the public defender, and other government programs which pay the fees of court-appointed counsel. If attorney fees are paid by the court, the data are included under this heading after having been deducted from the judicial data. Government contributions to private legal aid bureaus and bar association programs for defense of the indigent are included in expenditure data.

Correction is that function of government involving the confinement and rehabilitation of adults and minors convicted of offenses against the law, and the confinement of persons suspected of a crime and awaiting adjudication.

Data for institutions with authority to hold prisoners 48 hours or more are included in this sector. Data for lockups holding prisoners less than 48 hours are included in the "Police Protection" sector.

Also included under correction are probation, parole, and pardon activities. Where the courts control the probation programs, probation expenditure is shown with correction data, if it can be separately identified.

1. Correctional institutions include prisons, reformatories, houses of correction, jails, and other institutions for the confinement and correction of convicted adults and juveniles. When an institution maintains a prison industry program, data on the cost of production or the value of prison labor used by agencies of the same government, if identifiable, are excluded (and classed as expenditure for the function using the products or prison services). Expenditures for the manufacture, sale, and distribution of goods produced for sale or use outside the government are included under this heading.

a. Institutions for youthful offenders are those under the control of a youth authority, or a similarly designated administrative body, as well as independently administered institutions where examination of supplementary documents have indicated that the institution primarily houses persons under 21. Where the cost of administration is separable from expenditure for the operation of the institution, it has been included under the "Correctional administration" category.

Owing to the great variability of the age limits for defining juveniles (for example, "16 and up," "16 to 21," "15 to 30," "17 to 25"), an allocation to this category was sometimes relatively arbitrary and sometimes not possible because data items could not be separated into their elements.

b. Institutions for women include identifiable expenditure and employment data for an institution for adult female offenders. Where segregable, administrative expense is included in the "Correctional administration" category. Where there is no separate women's prison, women offenders are either maintained in a prison complex that also houses other offenders or are boarded in private facilities or institutions in another State. Examples of the latter: New Hampshire and Rhode Island board their female offenders in the Massachusetts Correctional Institution for Women; Vermont operates a split system, housing some females and contracting with Massachusetts for the rest; South Dakota and Wyoming house all of their female offenders in the Nebraska Reformatory for Women; and Idaho contracts with the State of Oregon for boarding of its female offenders in that State's Women's Correctional Facility.

c. Other institutions include institutions which hold only adult males and institutions which hold combinations of adult males, adult females, and youths. In cases where expenditures for physically separate institutions for adult males, adult females, and youths were not separable by institution, the entire expenditure for all institutions was put into "Other institutions." This was the case in the States of Colorado, Delaware, Louisiana, Nevada, New Mexico, New York, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, and Texas.

2. Correctional administration consists of expenditure data for administration of the correctional system. This category includes expenditure data for the overall administration of a correction department or other general administrative body (for example, a youth authority administering many institutions for youthful offenders) as well as the administration of each individual institution. Correctional administration employment data could not be segregated and are included in the miscellaneous category.

3. Probation, parole, and pardon includes data on boards of pardons, boards of parole, probation agencies, and their variously named equivalents. Although probation agencies frequently function under the administration of the major trial court, the data are presented here, after having been deducted from the judicial data, because of the correctional nature of the probation function. The overlapping character of the probation and parole functions prevent the separate presentation of these data.

4. Miscellaneous correction includes expenditure and employment data which could not be classified under one of the other correctional subcategories.

The Other Criminal Justice category shown in some tables, includes expenditure or employment data not elsewhere classified, data which cuts across more than one category, or is unallocable to separate categories; e.g., expenditures on a general criminal justice curriculum in educational institutions, the operation of State criminal justice planning agencies, crime commissions, etc. Such data are included in the totals, where they are not shown separately.
