ABSTRACT

This handbook provides information on recruiting women and minority group candidates for faculty positions. The first 3 sections give a brief overview of the laws and regulations regarding equal employment opportunity, outline some affirmative action guidelines for recruiting staff, and respond to questions related to affirmative action and equal employment opportunity. The last 2 sections provide information on recruiting women faculty (percentages of women doctorates in the various fields, locations of women graduate students in the last stages of completing graduate degrees, and names and addresses of women's caucuses, committees and professional associations), and recruiting minority faculty (minority enrollments in graduate schools, predominantly black colleges and universities, and national minority group organizations). INTRODUCTION

Colleges and universities are searching for information that will lead them to the identification of qualified women and minority group faculty members. While national and professional organizations are in the process of compiling registries, these will not be completed for another one to two years. This handbook is a compilation of "threads" of information that should prove helpful to institutions of higher education in their search for women and minority group candidates.

The first three sections of the handbook give a brief overview of the laws and regulations regarding equal employment opportunity, outline some affirmative action guidelines for recruiting staff, and respond to some frequently-asked questions related to affirmative action and equal employment opportunity.

The last two sections provide information on percentages of women doctorates in the various fields, locations of women graduate students in the last stages of completing graduate degrees, names and addresses of women's caucuses, committees and professional associations, minority enrollments in graduate schools, predominantly Black colleges and universities, and national minority group organizations.

LAWS AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

Two laws--the Equal Pay Act of 1963 and Title VII of the Civil Rights

Act of 1964--and two Executive Orders--No.'s 11246 and 11375--specifically deal

with discrimination against women and minority group members in employment.

The Equal Pay Act of 1963 amended the Fair Labor Standards Act to require that men and women employed by the same establishment and doing equal work receive equal pay. Bona fide executive, administrative and professional employees are exempted; thus faculty members are not currently covered under this law. However, bills S. 3612, H.R. 16098 and H.R. 18849 are pending Congress to apply the equal pay requirement to those categories previously exempted.

Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 prohibits discrimination in employment because of race, color, sex, religion or national origin. Until recently, educational institutions were exempt, but on March 8, 1972, Congress passed Bill H.R. 1746 which extends the job discrimination ban to educational institutions.

Executive Order 11375 amended Executive Order 11246 (issued in 1965), which prohibits discrimination based on race, religion, color or national origin, to include sex. No. 11375, issued October 13, 1967, and put into effect one year later contains the following key section:

The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. The contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to



post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the contracting officer setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

Chapter 60 of Title 41 of the Code of Federal Regulations as amended by Part 60-2 outlines requirements for Affirmative Action Programs which must be followed by institutions holding contracts with the Federal Government. Order No. 4 of January 30, 1970, was revised December 4, 1971, to include sex.

Over eight percent of the nation's institutions of higher education have contracts with the government and are subject to these laws and regulations. Responsibility for enforcement of the two executive orders rests with the Office of Federal Contract Compliance in the Labor Department. Labor has designated the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare as the compliance agency for all universities and colleges holding Federal contracts. HEW has established a Contract Compliance Division in its Office for Civil Rights to handle this responsibility. Institutions are required to develop "affirmative action programs" to ensure that applicants and employees are treated "without regard to their race, color, religion, sex or national origin." Noncompliance with this requirement could lead to suspension or cancellation of contracts.

On March 8, 1972, Congress completed action on a bill (HR 1746) authorizing the Equal Employment Opportunities Commission to take legal action against an employer who has discriminated against employees on the basis of race, color, sex, religion or national origin.

On March 22, 1972, the Senate completed congressional approval of a constitutional amendment giving women equal rights. The amendment was approved by the House in 1971. Thirty-eight states must ratify the amendment within a period of seven years in order for it to become part of the Constitution. The amendment would become effective two years following ratification.



AFFIRMATIVE ACTION GUIDELINES FOR RECRUITING

In order to insure that recruitment processes follow channels that are likely to locate qualified women and minority group candidates, steps in addition to traditional recruitment procedures will need to be taken. Following are some guidelines:

- Records of efforts to locate and recruit qualified women and minority group members should be kept by office and departmental administrative personnel for periodic review and progress assessment.
- Notices of available positions should be published in local, regional, and national publications.
 - (a) Notices may not specify any preference, limitation or specification based on sex unless sex is a <u>bona fide</u> occupational qualification for the available position.
 - (b) A statement that the institution is an "Equal Opportunity

 Employer" should be included in each notice.
- 3. Application and appointment forms should not require different information for men and women.
- 4. Information requested during interviews shall be the same for both male and female candidates.
- 5. Salaries should be determined on the basis of merit only. Such factors as marital status, number of dependents, spouse's income, or other sources of income shall not be considered in setting salaries.



6. Anti-nepotism regulations and attitudes must be changed so that relatives (husband, wife, child, etc.) are not precluded from working in the same college or department.

Many qualified women and minority group candidates will be overlooked because of not knowing of available positions unless educators are willing to help change the old idea that "the best positions and candidates are found through word-of-mouth procedures and personal contacts." While the trend is occurring slowly, more and more institutions are listing available positions in publications like The Chronicle of Higher Education and appropriate professional journals and newsletters; and the phrase "Equal Opportunity Employer" is gaining respect.

Information requested during interviews and on application and appointment forms must be the same for male and female candidates in order to ensure that marital status, number of dependents or children, and age are not factors used to discriminate against either sex. All standards of employment and bases for selection must be applied equally to members of both sexes. In addition, women should not be penalized for requiring time away from work for childbearing.

SOME QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

QUESTION: What is the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC)?

ANSWER: Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 established the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission composed of five members appointed by the President and approved by the Senate. The Commission is concerned with discrimination by four major groups: public and private employment agencies, employers, labor organizations, and joint labor-management apprenticeship programs. The Commission receives and investigates charges of employment discrimination and as of March 8, 1972, (Bill H.R. 1746) was authorized by Congress to sue an employer in Federal district court if it finds the employer has discriminated against employees on the basis of race, color, sex, religion or national origin. E.E.O.C. has thirteen regional offices located throughout the United States.

QUESTION: What is a "bona fide occupational qualification" (BFOQ)?

ANSWER: According to Title VII and the EEOC, all jobs must be open to both sexes unless the employer can prove that sex "is a bona fide occupational qualification reasonably necessary to the normal operation of that particular business or enterprise." BFOQ has been defined by the EEOC and the courts with the burden of proof falling on the employer.

Jobs may be restricted to members of one sex--

For reasons of authenticity (actress, actor, model).

Because of community standards of morality or propriety (restroom attendant, lingerie sales clerk).



In jobs in the entertainment industry for which sex appeal is an essential qualification.

Jobs may <u>not</u> be restricted to members of one sex for any of the following reasons:

Assumptions related to the applicant's sex; e.g., some or most of the members of one sex are unable or unwilling to do the job.

Preferences of co-workers, employers, clients or customers.

The job was traditionally restricted to members of the opposite sex.

The job involves heavy physical labor, manual dexterity, latenight hours, overtime, work in isolated locations, or unpleasant surroundings.

The job involves travel, or travel with members of the opposite sex.

Physical facilities are not available for both sexes. Only in cases where the expense of providing additional facilities is prohibitive, can this be used as an excuse.

The job requires personal characteristics not exclusive to either sex such as tact, charm, or aggressiveness.

The responsibility for most jobs being made available to both sexes lies with both the employer and the employment agency -- the employer with regard to hiring; the employment agency with regard to receiving, classifying or referring applications for employment.

To the extent that some university and college offices have occasion to post notices concerning employment for staff and students, they may be considered as "employment agencies" in the above context and hence are obligated to see that such notices meet the standards set forth above.



RECRUITING WOMEN FACULTY

This section contains information on women doctorates, women graduate students, and women's caucuses, committees and professional associations.

When trying to locate qualified women candidates for faculty positions, a common complaint is "there just aren't any women in the field." The first table in this section, Proportion of Doctorates Earned by Women, by Area and Field, 1960-1969, illustrates there are women with appropriate educational training and background in most fields. The problem of locating these women is a real one, however. Some of these women are teaching at institutions appearing in the second table in this section: Institutions with Female Enrollment for Advanced Degrees, by Areas or Field of Study. Others are included on rosters currently being compiled by various national women's organizations and academic associations. (See the third table in this section, Women's Caucuses, Committees and Professional Associations.)

The graduate student enrollment information included in this section was compiled from Students Enrolled for Advanced Degrees, Fall, 1970, published by the National Center for Educational Statistics. Only those institutions having considerable numbers (relative to the total number of women in a given field) of full-time women students beyond the first year of study were included.

Employers making "good faith" efforts to recruit qualified women candidates will want to contact several institutions and organizations listed in the tables in this section in addition to using the more traditional channels of organizations within given disciplines, selected departments, colleges and universities, and selected individual persons well-known in a particular field.

RECRUITING MINORITY FACULTY

Three kinds of information which may be useful as "leads" to locating minority group members for faculty positions are presented in this section: graduate school enrollments of Negroes and other minorities, predominantly Black colleges and universities, and some national minority group organizations.

The first table, Graduate School Enrollments of Negroes and Other Minorities, was compiled from information collected by the Office for Civil Rights of the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare and printed in The Chronical of Higher Education, April 12, 1971. Statistics on the ethnic composition of full-time graduate and professional enrollments at 715 institutions were derived from unedited 1970 compliance reports and are subject to correction. The category "Other Minorities" includes

American Indians, Orientals, and Spanish-surnamed Americans. Only those institutions having enrollments of 50 or more Negro or other minority group graduate students are included in the list printed here. Frequently, but not always, institutions having enough students in one category to be included in this list also had a considerable number of students in the other category, although that number may not have been 50+ and thus does not show on the chart.

The second table in this section, Predominantly Black Colleges and Universities, was compiled from the <u>Directory of Traditionally Black Colleges and Universities in</u>
the <u>United States</u> and <u>Predominantly Black Institutions</u>.

The national minority group organizations included in this section are not intended to be a complete listing. The few organizations listed were selected as contact organizations to write for further information.
