ABSTRACT

This volume is a supplement to the first edition of the "International Directory of Population Information and Library Resources," ED 062 185. The format follows that of the first edition, utilizing a short description for each responding organization. Content covers: general information, publications of the organization, library-general information, library publications, library--areas of specialization, library collection, library extension services, and information service. Fifty-eight organizations in 32 countries are reported within the following geographical areas: Africa, North Africa, Caribbean America, Central America, North America, South America, Far East Asia, Middle East Asia, South Asia, South East Asia, Europe, and Oceania. Supplemental material lists new address entries; address changes; the names of organizations listed alphabetically by English name, non-English name, and abbreviation; library publications; and a selected list of periodicals. 

The Ghana National Family Planning Programme publishes a quarter Family Planning Newsletter (English), and a monthly report on the activities of its family planning clinics.

The Programme maintains a small library of family planning materials consisting of 200 books and 30 pieces of audio-visual material. It subscribes to 10 journals and newsletters and 7 newspapers, and acquires about 100 books each year. The first language of the collection is English. The Library will answer requests for information from libraries outside Ghana.

The Ghana National Family Planning Programme has an information service which distributes family planning materials throughout Ghana

The Association publishes the monthly newsletter *The Egyptian Family Planning Association Bulletin* (Arabic) which includes news of the activities of the Association and of its 18 branches in all districts of Egypt, as well as information about family planning. Its collection of statistical materials includes 4000 books, 200 reprints, 100 government documents, and 200 census reports. The Library acquires 900 books and 10 reprints each year, and has a complete collection of the Costa Rican census. The first language of the collection is Spanish, the second English. The Library will answer requests for information from libraries outside Costa Rica.

The Association publishes the Monthly Bulletin of the Honduran Family Planning Association (Spanish) which contains general information regarding the Association's work, new advances in family planning methods, and general population articles. International Population and Urban Research was established in 1956 at the University of California, Berkeley, to carry out research in interdisciplinary population studies, with more specific focus on demography and statistics. IPUR has special interests in Latin America and in world urbanization.

International Population and Urban Research publishes two series of reports: the *Population Monograph Series*, which appear three or four times a year at prices ranging from \$2.00 to \$4.25; and the *Population Reprint Series*, reprints of articles published by IPUR staff members, which appear about four times a year and are given limited complimentary distribution.

Although IPUR's library is for staff use only, annual bibliographies are prepared which can be supplied to other libraries. The collection concentrates on general population materials, demography, and statistics.

The Educational Research Information Center's Clearinghouse for Social Studies/Social Science Education was established in 1970 as an indexing and abstracting organization publishing information analysis materials. The Clearinghouse is interested in population studies as they are related to social studies curricula in the primary and secondary grades. ERIC/ChESS is affiliated with the Social Science Education Consortium.

The Clearinghouse publishes a quarterly newsletter Keeping Up (English), which is distributed free on request and announces curriculum development projects, among which are social studies units on population. ERIC/ChESS also publishes a number of reports on social studies curricula; a list of these publications is available from the ERIC Document Reproduction Service.

ERIC/ChESS uses the Resource and Reference Center of the Social Science Education Consortium, also located at 855 Broadway, Boulder, Colorado. The Resource and Reference Center was established in 1969, and publishes monthly acquisitions lists which are available to other libraries. The Family Planning Program at Emory University was established in 1962 and is affiliated with the Emory University School of Medicine. The Program offers: 1) family planning clinical services to 16,000 different patients per year; 2) training of family planning personnel, including physicians, medical students, nurses and para-professionals in the southeastern region of the United States; and 3) evaluation of the program, including statistical data on such categories as numbers of patients and choices of contraceptives.

The Family Planning Program publishes two newsletters: The Special Newsletter for Physicians (English), which covers the most recent developments in family planning with special reference to the physician's information needs; and The Special Newsletter for Patients (English), which provides patients with information on available clinical services, and answers readers' questions about human sexuality. The Family Planning Program also publishes two magazines: True to Life, a confession-type magazine for adults, and What's Happening, a sexeducation magazine for 13-14 year olds. In addition, the Program publishes medical school manuals, including Sex Education, Contraceptive Technology, Case Histories and Family Planning for Men.

The Family Planning Program maintains a small collection of family planning materials.

The East-West Communication Institute was founded in 1970 as one of the five Institutes established at the East-West Center to focus the Center's resources in education, research, and training on seeking solutions to common problems of East-West concern. The EWCI concentrates on the use of communication in economic and social development and on international communication. Part of its resources are devoted to training, research, and other services in the area of population/family planning information, education, and communication (IEC). The Regional Library of Medicine of the Pan American Health Organization was established in 1967 in affiliation with the Escola Paulista de Medicina. Its major concern is the dissemination of scientific information to biomedical professionals in Latin America. Translating facilities are available.

The Regional Library publishes a quarterly Boletin Informativo (Spanish, Portuguese, and English) which is available without charge and gives general information about programs of the Library. It also publishes a series of bibliographies on population dynamics.

The Regional Library employs 30 full-time and 3 part-time workers. Since 1971 the Regional Library of Medicine has been developing programs of selective dissemination of information in different fields, one of which is Health and Population Dynamics. Bibliographies and copies of scientific articles are regularly sent to about 70 selected professionals and researchers in several Latin American countries.

The Office of the Registrar General of India was established in 1872 and made a permanent body in the Ministry of Home Affairs of the Government of India in 1948. The Office collects vital statistics and conducts the national decennial census of population. Data on public health, economic and social development, family planning, and other related fields are also collected. Translation facilities are available.

The Office of the Registrar General publishes the quarterly Sample Registration Bulletin (English), which presents vital rates and other demographic data yielded by the Sample Registration System, as well as certain technical, operational and analytical notes and articles on the System. (The Sample Registration System is the primary source of vital rates at state and national levels for India.) The Office also publishes the quarterly Registrar General's Newsletter (English) which contains news of major developments and activities of the Office and of the State Census Offices and other State Agencies concerned with vital statistics, civil registration, etc. In addition, the Office of the Registrar General publishes such annual reports as Vital Statistics of India (English), Annual Report on Sample Registration of Births and Deaths in India (English), and Model Registration: Report on Survey of Cause of Deaths (English). A number of ad hoc reports on various aspects of the Sample Registration System, Manuals of Instructions, etc., are also published.

Publications of the Office of the Registrar General are announced in bulletins which may be requested from the Publications Section of the Census Division, West Block 1, Wing No. 2, IInd Floor, R. K. Puram, New Delhi 22. Orders must be pre-paid; foreign orders should be accompanied by British or U. S. currency. Publications may also be supplied on an exchange basis; such requests should be accompanied by a list of the publications which the purchaser offers in exchange.

The Center collaborates with the Center for Migration Studies, Staten Island, New York, USA, and the Centro do Estudos Migratórios, São Paulo, Brazil.

Publications of the Center include two journals: Studi Emigrazione (Italian, with summaries in English, Spanish, French, and German), which appears quarterly at a foreign subscription cost of approximately \$8.00 and contains sociological studies of migration, notes and discussions of sociological and pastoral problems of migrations, historical documentation, and reviews of articles and books; and Selezione CSER (Italian, with summaries in English, Spanish, French, and German), a monthly publication of migration news which also costs approximately \$8.00 a year. Demographic materials make up a significant portion of its collection of 3000 books. The Library receives 400 journals and newsletters and 50 newspapers, and acquires about 200 books each year. The first language of the collection is Italian, the second French.

Among the reports published by the Center in its Sussidi e Documentazioni series is Migrazioni: Catalogo della Biblioteca CSER by L. Bertelli, G. Corcagnani, and G. F. Rosoli, published in January 1972, and available at a cost of approximately \$16.00. This catalogue lists all printed non-periodical material of the CSER Library on migratory movements in their national and international aspects. 
