#### **FOREWORD**

This report summarizes information received from State Research Coordinating Units (RCU's) regarding research activities conducted under Section 131(b) of the Vocational Education Amendments of 1968. This report covers the first six months of fiscal year 1972. The purpose of the report is to provide information that will assist States to be aware of research and development conducted by other States, thus facilitating exchange of information and reducing duplication of effort.

This Semiannual Report has been prepared by Marsha Golden of the Program Development and Operations Branch of the Division of Vocational and Technical Education. This is the fourth in a series of reports on the activities of State RCU's. The first report was entitled Annual Report on State Research Coordinating Unit Activities for Fiscal Year 1970 (ED-053-293), and covered the period from July 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970. The second report was entitled Semiannual Report on State Research Coordinating Unit Activities for the Period July 1, 1970 to December 31, 1970 (ED-052-381). The third report was entitled Semiannual Report on State Research Coordinating Unit Activities for the Period January 1, 1971 to June 30, 1971. #### INTRODUCTION

For fiscal year 1972, the States received \$9 million under Section 131(b) of Part C of the Vocational Education Amendments of 1968. These funds could be used for paying up to 75 percent of the costs of the State Research Coordinating Unit (RCU) and for grants and contracts covering 90 percent of the costs of research and developmental projects. The minimum amount received was \$12,039 by Alaska and the maximum was \$705,568 by California.

The amount of Section 131(b) research funding received by each State for fiscal year 1972 represented a reduction of almost 50 percent from the fiscal year 1971 funding level. This reduction had a serious effect on the impressive research programs which were taking shape in fiscal year 1971. Some States had carried over a portion of their fiscal year 1971 funds to fiscal year 1972, and were able to continue their programs at a fairly high level. Other States, though managing to continue their Research Coordinating Units, found it necessary to cut back their staffs or to reduce the volume of "in-house" and contracted research which was being conducted. Some States which were funding projects of more than one year's duration with Part C funds found it necessary to continue some of these projects with funds from other sources — Part B basic grant funds, Part D Exemplary Program funds, or other State and local resources.

A review of the approximately 250 new projects funded during this six-month period indicates some definite trends in State research priorities. At least 50 projects were funded for development or restructuring of vocational programs, curriculums, and materials. These projects range from those dealing with established areas of vocational education, such as agricultural education, to those relating to "new and emerging" areas, such as oceanic and marine technology.

Many States have shown a concern for evaluation of their existing programs and planning for improvement. Evaluation and followup studies are usually coupled with a set of recommendations for making the programs more relevant to the needs of the student and community. Several studies are being conducted to determine the needs of the State's employers for trained employees in relation to the vocational programs currently being offered.

Career education, especially the important areas of guidance, counseling, and testing, commanded a large amount of research interest during this six-month period. Several States are

experimenting with computerized approaches to assisting the student to investigate his career interests at an early stage of his education. Individualized instruction programs, very important in the implementation of a program of career education, are being developed in several areas of instruction.

In-house activities of the RCU's are constantly expanding. Most States now have some type of information dissemination system in operation, with some systems becoming very elaborate and including such services as computer searches of ERIC, monthly newsletters, and the capability for reproduction of microfiche to fill user requests. Some States now have information centers located throughout the State so that all vocational educators will have easy access to ERIC collections and microfiche viewing and reproduction equipment. Other RCU activities include coordinating Exemplary, Research, and EPDA programs for the State; evaluation of programs, assisting in development of State plans, and operating workshops for the training of researchers.

It appears that, despite the severe reduction in Section 131(b) funds for fiscal year 1972, the RCU's are becoming well-established in their role as the research and development arm of the State vocational education community.

The Semiannual Report which follows is a compilation of Quarterly Research Activity Reports received from the States, covering the first two quarters of fiscal year 1972. Additional information on projects listed under the category of "new projects funded" may be located in the "Research Projects in Progress" section of Abstracts of Research and Related Materials in Vocational and Technical Education (ARM), published quarterly by the ERIC Clearinghouse on Vocational and Technical Education. Final reports of the "projects completed" are abstracted in the monthly issues of Research in Education and/or in the quarterly issues of ARM.
