**ABSTRACT**

Presented is an instrument (behavior checklist) designed to assess the skill of trainable mentally retarded (TMR) students in performing specific tasks at all levels. Self care, motor, social, and cognitive skills or tasks are categorized according to three levels of competency. The first level includes the development of the very basic performance functions (such as responding to stimuli, first vocalizations). The second level is the building of skills in such basic functions as listening, socializing, motor coordination, dressing, and eating. The third level is using the basic function to specialize (such as to set a table or play games). The checklist is suggested for use at the beginning, middle, and end of the school year to record the student's level of proficiency in each skill area. (KW)

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## ASSESSMENT CHART FOR TRAINABLE STUDENTS

**RATIONALE:** There is a need for an instrument designed specifically for trainable students that can be used to quickly assess and monitor student capabilities to perform specific tasks at all levels. This instrument:

1. Could be used for teacher knowledge of student capabilities and specific objectives toward which students could be moving.
2. Would be valuable in informing and obtaining parent participation in moving the student toward these goals.
3. Would be valuable in helping in the development of a curriculum based upon student needs.
4. Is an attempt to fill these needs and place these objectives in three general categories.

It was felt that the assigning of specific tasks to age levels might be detrimental, because we might ask too much or too little in terms of a student's potential to perform a particular task. However, it was felt that general tasks ought to be categorized according to three levels of competency:

1. **THE FIRST LEVEL** would be those developmental activities that are a part of or are necessary to achieve a first level of functioning. For example, a first step, a first word, a first attempt to relate to someone else.
2. **THE SECOND LEVEL** would be building skill in those basic functions such as listening, talking, socializing.
3. **THE THIRD LEVEL** would be using the basic function to specialize, such as, set the table, play games, respond with name and address.

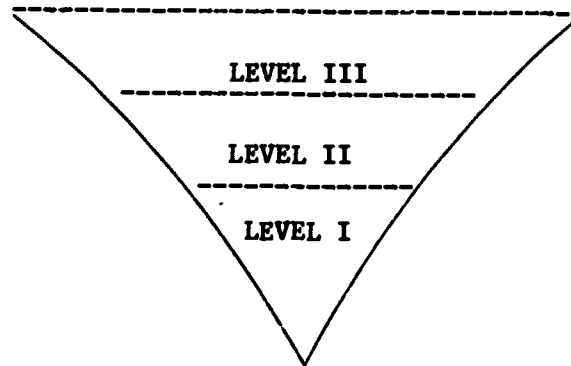
It is recommended that this guide be used at the beginning, middle and end of the school year, and be marked in the following way:

X ... Can be performed with proficiency

- ... Can be performed but not with proficiency

O ... Cannot be performed

Assessment Chart for Trainable Students  
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The framework of the diagnostic guide would look something like the drawing above. The reason for the dotted line is to allow for individual differences. Some students may be able to go beyond skills in the assessment chart in some areas.

The numbers on the skills correspond to the numbers on the chart at different levels.

Following is a sample of some learning skills that can come from this type of assessment.

SAMPLE BEHAVIORAL OBJECTIVES

1. Bill will be able to catch a tennis ball, baseball, and a basketball with 90% accuracy from 20 feet by May 30.
2. When Bill is presented with 25 pictures of various foods, he will be able to identify correctly 23 times whether he should use a fork or a spoon by May 30.
3. Bill shall name four articles of clothing that are laid out on a table.
4. Bill shall be able to lace shoe strings of his own shoes in one minute by May 30.
