## AUEC-NUEA DEFINITIONS

### Type of Instruction

Class: A group of students which meets regularly but which has intervening time periods between meetings. It is conducted over a period of several weeks and is given face-to-face instruction by a teacher or lecturer.

Conference, Institute, Workshop: An organized instructional program which meets for three hours or more in continuous session except for meals and recesses.

Correspondence Course: A program, involving a continuing exchange between instructor and student, conducted primarily by written communication.

### Credit

Degree Credit: An activity may be either undergraduate, graduate, or postgraduate. Whenever a course qualifies for both undergraduate and graduate credit, classify the course as graduate only if the majority of students are usually graduate.

Undergraduate: A college-level course that carries credit toward an associate or bachelor's degree.

Graduate: A college-level course that is creditable toward a master's or higher degree or is postgraduate.

Nondegree Credit: A college-level course that is creditable toward a certificate or diploma but not toward an associate, bachelor's or higher degree.

Noncredit: A college-level course which carries no credit toward a credit certificate or diploma, or an associate, bachelor's or higher degree.

### Registration and Student

Registration: One enrollment in a single course or conference program. Registrations refer only to the number of enrollments; they do not refer to individual persons.

Student: The individual person registered in one or more courses. A student may account for more than one registration.

## ACADEMIC SUBDIVISIONS

Academic subjects are grouped under basic headings modeled after those used by the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare.

Registrations for which subject matter information was not available are listed as "Not Categorized."

Agriculture and Natural Resources. Includes subjects related to the production of food and management of natural fiber, plant, forest, and wild life resources such as agriculture, general; agronomy; soils science; animal science; dairy science; poultry science; fish, game, and wildlife management; horticulture; ornamental horticulture; agricultural and farm management; agricultural economics; agricultural business; food science and technology; forestry; natural resources management; agriculture and forestry technologies; range management, etc.

Architecture and Environmental Design. Restricted to subjects in the academic speciality of environmental design, general.

All Other Architecture and Environmental Design. Includes subjects related to designing buildings, communities, parks and other man-made aspects of the physiosocial environment such as architecture, interior design, landscape architecture, urban architecture, city, community, and regional planning, etc.

Area Studies. Includes subjects designed to study cultures indigenous to specific geographic regions such as East Asian studies, African studies, Russian and Slavic studies, Pacific area studies, etc.

Biological Sciences. Restricted to subjects in the academic speciality of ecology.

All Other Biological Sciences. Includes subjects related to the science of life or living matter in all its forms and phenomena especially with regard to the origin, growth, reproduction, and structure of life forms such as general biology, general botany, bacteriology, plant pathology, plant pharmacology, plant physiology, general zoology, human and animal pathology, human and animal pharmacology, human and animal physiology, microbiology, anatomy, histology, biochemistry, biophysics, molecular biology, cell biology, marine biology, biometrics and biostatistics, entomology, genetics, radiobiology, nutrition, scientific, neurosciences, toxicology, embryology, etc.

Business and Management. Includes subjects related to the organization, operation, administration, and control of private and public organizations, such as general business and commerce, accounting, business statistics, banking and finance, investments and securities, business management and administration, operations research, hotel and restaurant management, marketing and purchasing, transportation and public utilities, real estate insurance, international business, secretarial studies, personnel management, labor and industrial relations, business economics, etc.

Communications. Includes subjects related to collection, preparation, and presentation of ideas and information intended for popular consumption through mass media such as communications, general, journalism, radio/television, advertising, communication media, etc.

Computer and Information Sciences. Includes subjects having to do with the design, development, and application of computer capabilities to data storage and manipulation and related computational procedures such as computer and information sciences, general, information sciences and systems, data processing, computer programming, systems analysis, etc.

Education - Except for Special Populations. Includes subjects related to administration and control of educational organizations and institutions and subjects related to instruction and services both within and outside of such formal organizations such as general education, general elementary education, junior high school education, higher education, junior and community college education, adult and continuing education, administration of special education, social foundations, educational psychology, pre-elementary education, educational statistics and research, educational testing, evaluation and measurement, student personnel, educational administration, educational supervision, curriculum and instruction, reading education, art education, mathematics education, music education, science and education, physical education, driver and safety education, health education, business, commerce, and distributive education, industrial arts, vocational, and technical education, etc.

Education - Special Populations. Includes subjects related to administration and control of educational organizations and institutions and subjects related to instruction and services both within and outside of such formal organizations as above, but also includes educational activities either for special populations identified below or in the areas listed above such as general special education, education of the mentally retarded, education of the gifted, education of the deaf, education of the culturally disadvantaged, education of the visually handicapped, speech correction, education of the emotionally disturbed, remedial education, special learning disabilities, education of the physically handicapped, education of the multiple handicapped, etc.

Engineering. Restricted to subjects in the academic speciality of environmental and sanitary engineering.

All Other Engineering. Includes subjects related to the practical application of basic scientific knowledge to the design, production, and operation of systems intended to facilitate man's control and use of his natural environment such as general engineering, aerospace, aeronautical, and astronautical engineering, agricultural engineering, architectural engineering, bioengineering and biomedical engineering, chemical engineering, petroleum engineering, civil, construction, and transportation engineering, electrical, electronics, and communications engineering, mechanical engineering, geological engineering, geophysical engineering, industrial and management engineering, metallurgical engineering, materials engineering, ceramic engineering, textile engineering, mining and mineral engineering, engineering physics, nuclear engineering, engineering mechanics, naval architecture and marine engineering, ocean engineering, engineering technologies, etc.

Fine and Applied Arts. Includes subjects having to do with the creation and appreciation of the diverse modes of communicating ideas and emotions by means of stylized, visual, and non-visual representations and symbols such as general fine arts, art, art history and appreciation, music, music history and appreciation, dramatic arts, dance, applied design, cinematography, photography, etc.

Foreign Languages. Includes mastery of a language other than English or subjects related to the study of a foreign culture through exploration of the literature of that culture as expressed in the vernacular language such as general foreign languages, French, German, Chinese, Japanese, Greek, Hebrew, Arabic, African languages, etc.

Health Professions. Includes subjects having to do with the maintenance and restoration of physical and mental health and related to the professions listed such as hospital and health care administration, nursing, dentistry, dental specialties, medicine, medical specialties, occupational therapy, optometry, osteopathic medicine, pharmacy, physical therapy, dental hygiene, public health, medical record librarianship, podiatry or podiatric medicine, bio-medical communication, veterinary medicine, veterinary medicine specialties, speech pathology and audiology, chiropractic, clinical social work, medical laboratory technologies, dental technologies, radiologic technologies, etc.

Home Economics. Includes subjects related to the theory and practice of family and home care including the science of foods, home decoration and management, and child care. Exclude consumer economics and home management which are separately reported under consumer economics and home management. List home economics, home decoration and home equipment, clothing and textiles, family relations and child development, foods and nutrition, institutional management and cafeteria management, etc.

Consumer Economics and Home Management. Includes subjects concerned with the economic welfare of the consumer and consumer groups that revolve around the everyday matter of getting one's money's worth such as money management and family budgeting, banking practices and savings for the family, consumer credit and rates of interest, role of advertising, reading of labels, consumer protection services, consumer legislation, insurance, evaluation of consumer research projects and product testing, appliance repair comparison of pricing, basic principles in buying housing, including an analysis of financial resources available and government sponsored programs for low income housing, use, care, repair, and maintenance of equipment related to the house and surroundings.

Law. Includes subjects relating to instruction in the legal customs, practices, and rules of society and states.

Letters. Includes subjects relating to the English language and literature and value systems related to ancient and modern cultures such as general English, English literature, comparative literature, classics, linguistics, speech, debate, and forensic science, creative writing, teaching of English as a foreign language, philosophy, religious studies, etc.

Library Science. Includes subjects related to skills required to organize collections of books and related materials and the training necessary for providing services related to them.

Mathematics. Includes subjects related to the science of numbers and space configurations and their operations, measurement, relationships, and abstractions such as general mathematics, mathematical and theoretical statistics, applied mathematics, etc.

Military Sciences. Includes subjects having to do with techniques and skills unique to the pursuit of a professional career as a military officer such as army military science, navy and marine naval science, air force aerospace science, etc.

Physical Sciences. Includes subjects related to the basic nature of matter, energy, and associated phenomena such as general physical sciences, general physics, molecular physics, nuclear physics, general chemistry, inorganic chemistry, organic chemistry, physical chemistry, analytical chemistry, pharmaceutical chemistry, astronomy, astrophysics, atmospheric sciences and meteorology, geology, geochemistry, geophysics and seismology, general earth sciences, paleontology, oceanography, metallurgy, etc.

Psychology. Includes subjects related to behavioral and mental processes such as general psychology, experimental psychology, clinical psychology, psychology for counseling, social psychology, psychometrics, statistics in psychology, industrial psychology, developmental psychology, physiological psychology, etc.

Public Affairs and Services. Includes subjects related to developing and improving competencies in the management and operation of governmental agencies such as general community services, public administration, parks and recreation management, social work and helping services, law enforcement and corrections, international public service, etc.

Social Sciences. Includes subjects related to all aspects of the past and present activities, conduct, interactions and organizations of humans. Exclude civic and community affairs which are reported in the following group. Include general social sciences, anthropology, archeology, economics, history, geography, political science and government, sociology, criminology, international relations, Afro-American studies, American Indian cultural studies, Mexican-American cultural studies, urban studies, demography, etc.

Civic and Community Affairs. Includes subject content centering on issues or solutions to problems that affect a group or the community as a whole. The concept of the community is broadly defined here; it could be the local, state, national, or international community. However, the problem of environmental quality is treated elsewhere. Issues or problems include citizen participation in community affairs, community services and welfare, crime prevention, drugs and drug abuse, education crisis, housing and urban renewal, population control, poverty--urban and rural, race relations and minority groups, transportation, urban crisis, training of emerging core-city political leaders, etc.

Theology. Includes subjects related to religion such as general theology, religious music, Biblical languages, religious education, etc.

Interdisciplinary Studies. Restricted to environmental quality. Includes subject content of a technical and/or nontechnical nature that focuses on the quality of the physical environment and the development, protection, use, and management of all our natural resources such as conservation of natural resources, soil, and water; development of natural resources, pollution--air, noise, and water, pesticide residues, waste disposal--animal and/or crop, and industrial domestic processing, food and feed contaminants, etc.

All Other Interdisciplinary Studies. Involves more than one major discipline without concentration in any one area. Thus an institute in Health Systems Planning should be reported as health professions if public health aspects are stressed, but as computer and information sciences if systems analysis is stressed; if no single area is the focus, then interdisciplinary would be appropriate.

## OCCUPATIONAL SPECIALTIES OR TECHNOLOGIES

The subject content of the technologies is generally undergraduate in level of instruction and is specifically associated with the development of skills for entrance into occupations at the semiprofessional level. Usually two years of preparation beyond high school are sufficient for entrance into the occupational fields presented in this part.

Business and Commerce Technologies. Includes subject fields specifically associated with development of skills required for commercial, business, or secretarial occupations such as general business and commerce technologies, banking and finance technologies, marketing, distribution, purchasing, business and industrial management technologies, secretarial technologies including office machines training, personal service such as stewardess, cosmetologist, etc., photography, communications, and broadcasting such as radio-television, newspapers, printing and lithography, hotel and restaurant management, transportation and public utility, applied arts, graphic arts, and fine arts including advertising design, etc.

Data Processing Technologies. Includes subject fields specifically associated with development of skills required for data processing such as general data processing, key punch operator and other input preparation technologies, computer programmer, computer operator and peripheral equipment operation technologies, data processing equipment maintenance, etc.

Health Services and Paramedical Technologies Associated with Environmental Quality Occupations. Includes only those subject fields in the technologies that are preparatory for environmental quality occupations such as drug quality control, hospital engineering, etc.

All Other Health Services and Paramedical Technologies. Includes subject fields specifically associated with development of skills required for health services such as dental assistants, dental hygiene, dental laboratory.



technologies, medical or biological laboratory assistants, animal laboratory assistants, radiologic technologies such as X-ray, nursing, R. N. less than 4-year program, occupational therapy, surgical technologies, optical technologies including ocular care, ophthalmic, optometric, medical record technologies, medical assistant and medical office assistants, inhalation therapy, psychiatric technologies including mental health aide programs, electrodiagnostic technologies including E. K. G., E. E. G., etc., institutional management, physical therapy, etc.

Mechanical and Engineering Technologies Associated with Environmental Quality Occupations. Includes only those subject fields in the technologies that are preparatory for environmental quality occupations such as accident prevention, air pollution, housing hygiene, industrial hygiene, noise control, radiation control, etc.

All Other Mechanical and Engineering Technologies. Includes subject fields specifically associated with development of skills required for mechanical and engineering related occupations such as mechanical and engineering, aeronautical and aviation, engineering graphics as tool and machine drafting and design, architectural drafting, chemical technologies including plastics, automotive, diesel, welding, civil including surveying, photogrammetry, etc., electronics and machines as television, appliance, office machine repair, electromechanical, industrial, textile, instrumentation, mechanical, nuclear, construction and building as in carpentry, electrician, plumbing, sheet metal, air conditioning, heating, etc.

Natural Science Technologies Associated with Environmental Quality Occupations. Includes only those subject fields in the technologies that are preparatory for environmental quality occupations such as food sanitation, milk inspection, natural disaster control, pesticides control, public health inspection, rodent control, sanitation, solid waste disposal, vector control, waste water, water pollution control, water supply treatment, etc.

All Other Natural Science Technologies. Includes subject fields specifically associated with development of skills required for natural science related occupations as agriculture including horticulture, forestry and wildlife including fisheries, food services, home economics, general laboratory, etc.

Public Service Related Technologies Associated with Environmental Quality Occupations. Includes only those subject fields in the technologies that are preparatory for environmental quality occupations such as community health, etc.

All Other Public Service Related Technologies. Includes subject fields specifically associated with development of skills required for public service related occupations such as Bible study or religion related occupations, education--teacher aide and 2-year teacher training programs, library assistants, police, law enforcement, corrections, recreation and social work, fire control, public administration and management, etc.
