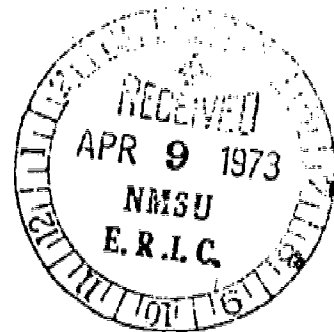

## LEGISLATIVE HISTORY AND FUNDING OF THE MIGRANT HEALTH PROGRAM

Enacted in September 1962, Public Law 87-692 amended the Public Health Service Act to authorize grants for family health service clinics for domestic agricultural migratory workers, and for other purposes to improve the health conditions of such workers and their families.

In August 1965, Public Law 89-109 extended the Migrant Health Program for three years and added necessary hospital care as an available health service under this Program.

The Migrant Health Program was again extended for three years by Public Law 90-574 in October 1968 with no programmatic changes.

Public Law 91-209, in March 1970, further extended the Migrant Health Program for three more years and broadened the coverage of the Program to include seasonal agricultural workers and their families when the extension of such health services to this group would contribute to the improvement of the migratory workers' health conditions. A provision was also added to require that persons broadly representative of all elements of the population to be served, and others in the community knowledgeable about the health needs of the migratory worker and his family, must be given the opportunity to participate in the development and implementation of Migrant Health Projects.

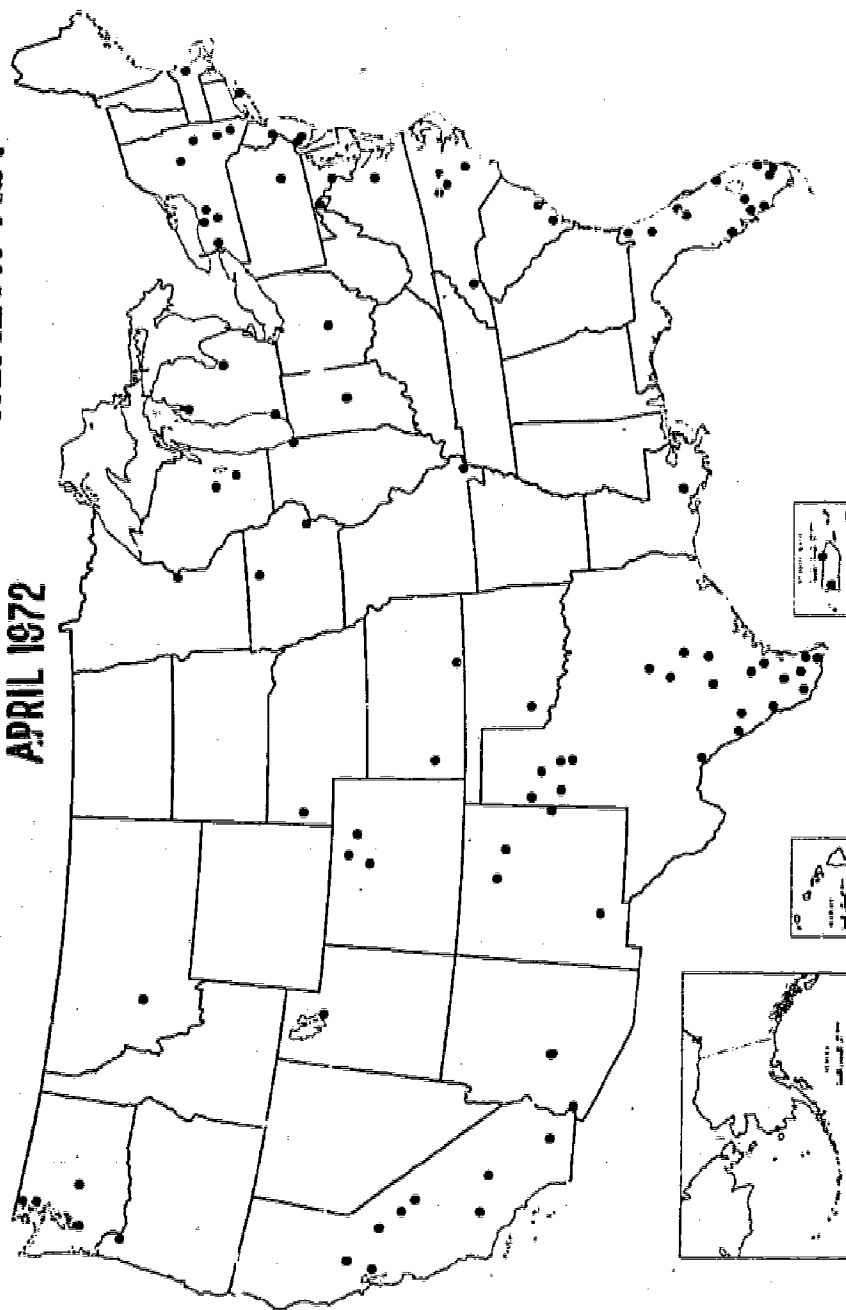
## SERVICES OFFERED

In order to facilitate the description of services provided by the projects, the following classifications were designed. It must be noted, however, that these classifications are not all inclusive. The designated codes shown for each project should be interpreted as being generally reflective of services provided and not as a precise measurement of all the specific services offered.

Code	Description
A	<b>Full Time Comprehensive Health Services</b>  A comprehensive range of diagnostic, therapeutic, and followup medical services offered by the project on a daily and year round basis by full-time medical staff in a center setting. Provisions for dental care, health counseling and outreach services, as well as adequate provisions for preventive services are offered either inside or outside the center.
B	<b>Scheduled Comprehensive Health Services</b>  A scope of medical services similar to those listed above are offered by the project, but through intermittently scheduled clinics (e.g. one or two times a week at two or three hours per session). In general, these clinic sessions are backed by referrals of patients by nurses and outreach workers to local physicians on a free-for-service basis at times when clinics are not in session. Provisions are also made for caring for other health needs such as dental care, health counseling, and outreach services in addition to preventive services. Environmental health activities are an element of the project.
C	<b>Scheduled Medical Services</b>  Although the project offers complete diagnostic, therapeutic and follow-up medical services through intermittently scheduled clinics with referral to private physicians during non-clinic hours, provisions are not necessarily made to offer dental care

C Cont.	services, and other health services mentioned above. Environmental health activities may be an element of the project.
D	<b>Scheduled Categorical Health Services</b>
	The project focuses upon clinics for specific diseases or categorical emphasis (e.g. Tuberculosis Control, Venereal Disease Control, Maternal and Child Health, immunization, etc.) and does not offer a broad range of medical services in a clinic setting. General health care is provided through referral by nurses and outreach workers to private physicians and dentists on a fee-for-service basis. Camp sanitation inspections, and efforts to correct deficiencies may be a component of the project.
E	<b>Non-scheduled Health Services</b>
	All general health care is provided by the project through a fee-for-service referral system to private physicians, and, in some instances, to private dentists. Nursing services provided are primarily outreach and follow-up. Camp sanitation inspections, and efforts to correct deficiencies may be a component of the project.
F	<b>Limited Categorical Services</b>
	The project has a specific objective, usually limited to environmental health services only, and is not directed to the provision of direct general health care. Environmental health activities usually involve camp inspections, enforcement of state codes, and coordinating efforts with other local sanitation programs.
G	<b>Administrative-Consultative Services</b>
	The project does little, if any, in the way of providing direct health care and devotes its efforts to consulting and coordinating the direct health care activities of other groups.
