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ABSTRACT

This report summarizes data from the regular biennial survey of state elementary and secondary school statistics for the 1969-70 academic school year. Data are reported on a State-by-State basis. The first five tables of the report contain data on school administrative units, pupils, and staff. Data are presented on the number of school systems, the number of public schools, the school age population, enrollment, average daily membership, average daily attendance, length of school term, grade enrollments, postgraduates, high school graduates, and instructional staff. The remaining five tables present data on financing public elementary and secondary school systems. Data included in these tables include revenue and nonrevenue receipts for public schools, total expenditures, account balances on hand, current expenditures, capital outlay, interest on school debt, and expenditures per pupil. 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INTRODUCTION

This preliminary report summarizes data from the regular biennial survey of State elementary and secondary school statistics for the 1969-70 academic school year. It presents selected data for the States and outlying areas that furnished information by May 31, 1972, when the tabulations for this preliminary report were closed. The report is issued to make some of the findings of the survey available as early as possible.

For comparison, national totals are given for the 1967-68 school year, the period of the preceding biennial survey.

METHODOLOGY

Totals for the United States comprise data for the 50 States and the District of Columbia and include estimates for States that did not report all of the data. Reports were not received from California, Montana, and New Jersey. Missing data were obtained from published State reports and from Office of Education records maintained for other purposes. Detailed final figures will be issued later in Statistics of State School Systems, 1969-70.

The data are based on responses to a comprehensive 25-page report-form (OE-2097), completed by departments of education in States and outlying areas. Items conform to the terminology and definitions of Handbook I, The Common Core of State Educational Information, and Handbook II, Financial Accounting for Local and

State School Systems. As the completed report forms were received by the Office of Education, they were examined and verified by comparison with the reports for preceding years and with other data available in the Office of Education.

Data for the Statistics of State School Systems are State summaries of local school system data combined with intermediate area and State data. They represent universe data and are not subject to sampling error, but are subject to error caused by 51 different bookkeeping and reporting systems of the States and the District of Columbia. Since they are year-end data and not estimates, they are considered highly reliable and valid.

The data presented are not directly comparable with other NCES publications: Fall Statistics of Public Schools shows fall data on pupils and teachers and estimated current-year State summary data on expenditures; and the Statistics of Local Public School Systems series shows national totals estimated from a sample of school systems.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

SCHOOL ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS, PUPILS, AND STAFF

The first five tables of this preliminary report contain data on school administrative units, pupils, and staff. These tables will correspond to more detailed tables 1 through 28 in the forthcoming Statistics of State School Systems, 1969-70.

School Systems

The number of local school systems has been decreasing steadily for many years as a result of the reorganization and consolidation of small and nonoperating systems. The total number of local school systems in the United States was 19,200 in 1969-70, compared with 22,000 in 1967-68 and 40,500 in 1959-60. Of the 19,200 school systems in 1969-70, 950 operated no schools but made other arrangements for the education of the children in their jurisdictions.

The average number of school systems for the Nation was 383 systems per State. Four States with more than 1,000 school systems (California, Illinois, Nebraska, and Texas) had an average of 1,336 systems per State. The average for the remaining States was 301.

Number of Public Schools

The steady reduction in the number of elementary schools in recent years is accounted for almost entirely by the widespread consolidation of one-teacher schools. There were only 2,100 one-teacher schools in 1969-70 compared with 20,200 in 1959-60.

During the 10-year period, the number of schools with elementary grades having two or more teachers decreased from 71,600 to 64,700,^{1/} but the number of schools with secondary grades rose from 25,800 in 1959-60 to 26,300^{1/} for 1969-70.

^{1/} Includes 2,310 combined elementary-secondary schools with both elementary and secondary grades in a single organizational unit.

For the second time, data are reported on combined elementary-secondary schools, organized as single units with both elementary and secondary grades. The 66,800 schools with elementary grades represent the 2,310 combined schools plus the 64,500 purely elementary schools; the same 2,310 are added to the 24,000 purely secondary schools to obtain the total 26,300 schools with secondary grades (table 1).

School construction programs, required by rapidly rising enrollment and population mobility, did not materially increase the number of elementary and secondary schools; the new, larger schools would accommodate more pupils than the discontinued schools. From 1959-60 to 1969-70 the average enrollment per school increased from 307 to 511 pupils.

In addition to the public elementary and secondary schools, 76 public junior or community colleges and technical institutions were operated by local school systems in 1969-70 (table 1). Approximately 300 other junior colleges, operated by public educational agencies other than local school systems, are not included in this report of elementary and secondary school systems.

Population

There were 52.5 million school-age children, from 5 to 17 years old on April 1, 1970, 1.8 percent more than the 51.6 million reported for July 1, 1967. During the same period, the estimated U.S. population rose from 198 million to 203 million persons, or 2.7 percent. Thus, the school-age population decreased from 26.1 to 25.8 percent of the total population (table 2)--the first decline since 1949-50.

Enrollment

Total enrollment in public elementary and secondary day schools rose from 44.7 million pupils in 1967-68 to 46.4 million pupils in 1969-70, or 3.7 percent (table 2). The percentage gain in enrollment exceeds the percentage gain for school-age population, reflecting increased high school retention and the closing of many nonpublic elementary and secondary schools.

The enrollment information in this survey generally represents a cumulative count of the total number of unduplicated registrations by pupils during the year in each State. However, pupils enrolled in two or more States during the school year are counted more than once, increasing the total enrollment figure for the Nation. The net enrollment in 1969-70, excluding interstate transfers, was estimated to be 2 to 3 percent less than the cumulative enrollment total given in this report.

Fall 1969 data are reported here for the States unable to report a cumulative but unduplicated State enrollment count. For comparison, table 2 gives both the fall 1969 enrollment and the cumulative State enrollments.

Average Daily Membership

There were approximately 44.7 million pupils in average daily membership in 1969-70, an increase of 3.4 percent over the 43.3 million in 1967-68 (table 2). The average daily membership (ADM) for a school year is the average number of pupils "belonging," whether present or absent, each day.^{2/}

^{2/} It is computed at the State level by dividing the aggregate days' membership by the number of days the schools were actually in session.

The 1969-70 total includes an estimate for the five States that could not report this information.

Average Daily Attendance

The average daily attendance (ADA) rose from 40.8 million pupils in 1967-68 to 41.9 million pupils for 1969-70, or 2.7 percent. The ADA, as a percentage of total enrollment, amounted to 90.4 percent in 1969-70 (table 2). ADA for a State is the sum of ADA for all schools in the State, which may have varying lengths of school terms.

Length of School Term

In 1969-70, the average length of term for the Nation was 178.9 days. The States were asked to compute the average length of the school term by dividing the aggregate days of attendance by the average daily attendance. This quotient indicates the average number of days that schools were in session and pupils were in attendance during the year. Some States reported the State-mandated minimum number of days for the length of the school term rather than the computed average number of days the schools were open.

Grade Enrollments

For fall 1969, 32.6 million pupils were in the nursery or kindergarten through eighth grade (table 3). Of this total, 678,600, or 2.1 percent, were classified as "ungraded." Pupils in kindergarten and grades 1 through 8 (including elementary ungraded) represented 71.5 percent of all students enrolled in the public elementary and secondary day schools.

Thirteen million pupils, or 28.5 percent of the total enrollment, were enrolled in grades 9 through 12, including students reported as "postgraduate" or classified as "secondary ungraded."

Postgraduates

The varying numbers of "postgraduate" students reported by the States suggest different procedures used in reporting these students or State laws or regulations that prohibit student attendance after graduation. Only 20 States reported any postgraduate students, and more than three-fourths of the total were in Massachusetts and Minnesota.

Numbers of "postgraduate" students in the secondary schools are affected by the availability of junior colleges and by policies on the allocation of State and Federal funds. In some States "postgraduate" students taking subjects offered to 12th graders may have been included in the 12th-grade total (table 3).

High School Graduates

From 1967-68 to 1969-70 the number of graduates from public high schools increased 8.1 percent to a total of 2,589,000 (table 4). The increase in the number of graduates far exceeded the 2.9 percent for the preceding 2-year period.

Instructional Staff

In accordance with recent trends, the instructional staff continued to increase between 1967-68 and 1969-70 at a faster rate (8.8 percent) than enrollment (3.7 percent). Accordingly, the pupil-instructional staff ratio decreased from 21.6 pupils per staff member in 1967-68 to 20.6 in 1969-70. Of the 2,253,000 total instructional staff in 1969-70,

2,023,000, or 89.8 percent, were classroom teachers; the others included principals, supervisors of instruction, guidance counselors, psychological personnel, and school librarians (table 5).

SCHOOL FINANCE

Tables 6 through 10 of this preliminary report present data on financing public elementary and secondary school systems, corresponding to tables 29 through 51 in the forthcoming Statistics of State School Systems, 1969-70, where more comprehensive data will be presented.

Total Receipts for Public Schools

During the 1969-70 school year the total public school receipts from all sources amounted to \$43.5 billion: \$40.3 billion, or 92.7 percent, was revenue; \$3.2 billion was nonrevenue receipts (table 6).

Revenue Receipts

Revenue receipts (income from taxes, permanent funds, and other sources that do not incur any debt or liquidate an asset) rose from \$31.9 billion in 1967-68 to \$40.3 billion in 1969-70--an increase of 26.2 percent in the 2-year period. In 1969-70, the three major sources were Federal, 8.0 percent; State, 39.9 percent; and local 52.1 percent (tables 6 and 7).

Although revenue receipts from the Federal Government for public education rose by almost 15 percent, the proportion of total school revenues from Federal sources decreased 0.8 percent. Similarly, the proportion received from local sources decreased 0.6 percent. These declines were offset by an increase of 1.4 percent from State sources (table 7).

The proportions of State and local support in individual States varied widely. In 1969-70, 15 States reported school revenues from State sources above 50 percent. The four highest were Hawaii, 85.8 percent; Delaware, 74.0 percent; New Mexico, 61.3 percent; and Alabama, 60.3 percent. At the other extreme, three States reported less than one-fifth of their school revenues from State sources: New Hampshire, 11.9 percent; South Dakota, 13.6 percent; and Nebraska, 19.3 percent.

Nonrevenue Receipts

Nonrevenue receipts decreased from \$3.7 billion in 1967-68 to \$3.2 billion in 1969-70 (table 6). Nonrevenue receipts include proceeds from the sale of bonds or sale of property and are generally used for capital outlay. Excluded are receipts from short-term loans repaid within the same year in which the loan was made.

Balances Carried Over From Previous Year

At the beginning of the school year 1969-70, balances on hand amounted to \$5.4 billion (table 6). Balances carried over from the previous year are usually earmarked for specific purposes, such as current operating expenses, building reserves, or school bond interest and redemption, and therefore do not necessarily represent a net of income over expenditures. Hence, they should not be regarded as additional funds since they recur annually in the maintenance of continuing cash balances needed for normal operation.

Total Expenditures

Local school systems and intermediate and State educational agencies expended \$41.0 billion from local,

State, and Federal sources in 1969-70, an increase of 23.4 percent over the \$33.0 billion expended in 1967-68. Included in this total were current expenditures for regular elementary and secondary day schools, current expenditures for other programs operated by local boards of education (including summer schools, community colleges, adult education, and community services), capital outlay, and interest on school debt.^{3/}

Current Expenditures

Total current operating expenditures for regular elementary and secondary day schools amounted to \$34.2 billion in 1969-70, or 84.1 percent of total expenditures for all purposes. An additional \$636 million was expended for current operation of other programs provided by the local boards of education (tables 8 and 9).

Of each dollar spent for public elementary and secondary day schools for the 1969-70 school year, 68 cents went for instruction, 10 cents for plant operation and maintenance, 17 cents for fixed charges and other school services, and 5 cents for school administration at all levels. Note table 10 showing percentage distributions of expenditures for public schools.

^{3/} Payments on the principal for the retirement of debts were not included since these amounts have already been accounted for in prior years and a report of repayment of debt would be a duplication of a previously reported expenditure.

Capital Outlay

Capital outlay by local school districts and school building authorities increased from \$4.3 billion in 1967-68 to \$4.7 billion in 1969-70; however, the proportion of total expenditures for all purposes represented by capital outlay decreased from 12.9 percent to 11.5 percent during the period.

Capital outlay expenditures are those that result in the acquisition of school property or additions to fixed assets. They are expenditures for land, buildings, remodeling or additions to buildings, and initial or additional equipment.

Interest on School Debt

Local school districts and State agencies expended \$1.2 billion for interest payments on bonded and non-bonded debt for public school purposes in 1969-70. This amount represented an increase of 19.7 percent over the \$977.8 million expended for interest on school debt in 1967-68. Interest payments in 1969-70 represented 2.9 percent of total expenditures, approximately the same as in 1967-68 (table 8).

Expenditures per Pupil in

ADM

The annual current expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance^{4/} rose from \$658 in 1967-68 to \$816 in 1969-70, an increase of 24.0 percent. The highest State average per pupil expenditure--\$1,327--was almost 3 times the lowest--\$501. States reporting amounts in excess of \$1,000 included New York, \$1,327; Alaska, \$1,123; and New Jersey, \$1,016 (table 9).

Current Expenditures per Pupil in

ADM

Average daily membership (ADM), considered more useful in reporting per pupil expenditures, recognizes the total load that the schools are carrying and provides more realistic information than other pupil measures. Forty-five States and the District of Columbia reported ADM for 1969-70. Since data were not available for five States, the \$765 annual current expenditure per pupil in ADM, reported in table 9, should be regarded as an estimate.

^{4/} Computed by dividing total current expenditures for operation allocable to pupils in day schools by the number of pupils in average daily attendance.
