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## Introduction

This bibliography was compiled with the purpose of acquainting those interested in the improvement of teaching in higher education with various relevant sources. It is hoped that the bibliography will help the reader to attain a clearer understanding of his own particular teaching objectives and needs, in order that he may refine his instructional procedures so that they better meet the academic goals of his students.

The bibliography is divided into four sections. The first section is concerned with sources relevant to instruction at all levels.
